None of the other words fit in the blank appropriately.

Hence, none of the word fits in the blank in context of the paragraph as it can be understood that a meeting cannot be called off because of decrease in threats and counterthreats. It will be the opposite case. Hence, the word that should fit here is 'escalated' which is not one of the options.

Session and **Rendezvous** are the words that will fill the blank most appropriately in reference of the paragraph as it can be understood from the lines that 'the appetite for rapprochement was clearly more' which indicates that both the leaders were eager to meet each other, hence the arrangement was back on track.

Steadfast, Unswerving and Unwavering are the words that will fill the blank most appropriately in reference of the paragraph as the blank is preceded by the word 'firm' which means that the word that should fill the blank should be close in meaning to 'firm' to emphasize on the commitment.
