

Solutions

Sol. Premeditated means 'think out or plan (an action, especially a crime) beforehand'. All the three **Statement (I), (II) & (III)** fit the sentence grammatically correct and contextually meaningful manner. Hence, **option (e)** is the right answer choice.

Sol.

Hedge means -A way of protecting oneself against financial loss or other adverse circumstances. **Statement (III)** uses **'Hedge'** in a grammatically correct and contextually meaningful manner. Hence, **option (c)** is the right answer choice.

S3. Ans. (e)

Sol.

Intermediary means -a person who acts as a link between people in order to try and bring about an agreement; a mediator.

All the sentences have correct usage of the word making the sentence grammatically correct and contextually meaningful. Hence, **option (e)** is the right answer choice.

Impropriety means -failure to observe standards of honesty or modesty; improper behaviour or character.
