

Solutions

S1. Ans. (b)

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Sol. Here, "interpretation" makes the statement grammatically incorrect which will thus be replaced with "gatherings". Hence, option (b) is the most suitable answer choice.

S2. Ans. (d)

Sol. Here, "diffident" makes the statement grammatically incorrect which will thus be replaced with "optimism". Also the word 'bulled' will be replaced by 'impact'. Hence, option (d) is the most suitable answer choice.

Diffident means -modest or shy because of a lack of self-confidence.

Bulled means - push or move powerfully or violently.

S3. Ans. (c)

Sol. Here, "filled" makes the statement grammatically and contextually incorrect which will thus be replaced with "underlying". Hence, option (c) is the most suitable answer choice.

S4. Ans. (d)


Sol. Here, "refresh" makes the statement grammatically incorrect which will thus be replaced with "refunds". Also the word 'propagated' will be replaced by 'advised'. Hence, option (d) is the most suitable answer choice.

S5. Ans. (e)

Sol. Here, the sentence is absolutely correct. Hence, option (e) is the most suitable answer choice.

S6. Ans. (b)

Sol. Here, "making" makes the statement grammatically incorrect which will thus be replaced with "**focus**". Hence, option (b) is the most suitable answer choice.



S7. Ans. (d)

Sol. Here, the given paragraph mentions. Here, "guard" makes the statement grammatically incorrect which will thus be replaced with "declared". Also the word "return" will be replaced by "epidemic". Hence, option (d) is the most suitable answer choice.

S8. Ans. (c)

Sol. Here, "identify" makes the statement grammatically incorrect which will thus be replaced with "traumatic". Hence, option (c) is the most suitable answer choice.

S9. Ans. (e)

Sol. Here the sentence is absolutely correct. There is no interchange required. Hence, option (e) is the most suitable answer choice.

S10. Ans. (d)

Sol. Here, the given paragraph mentions. Here, "annul" makes the statement grammatically incorrect which will thus be replaced with "precedent". Also the word "curious" will be replaced by "served." Hence, option (d) is the most suitable answer choice.

S11. Ans. (d)

Sol. Here, the given paragraph mentions. Here, "entity" makes the statement grammatically incorrect which will thus be replaced with "**plunged**". Also the word "avails" will be replaced by "**snuffed**". Snuffed out means - To snuff out something such as a disagreement means to stop it, usually in a forceful or sudden way. Hence, option (d) is the most suitable answer choice.

Sol. Here, "latent" makes the statement grammatically incorrect which will thus be replaced with "crashed". Hence, option (a) is the most suitable answer choice.



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
