

# S1. Ans. (d)

Sol. Adversary means one's opponent in a contest, conflict, or dispute. Statement (I) uses Adversary in a grammatically correct and contextually meaningful manner. Hence, option (d) is the right answer choice.

## S2. Ans. (e)

Sol. Vagary means an unexpected and inexplicable change in a situation or in someone's behaviour. Both Statement (I) and (II) use Vagary in a grammatically correct and contextually meaningful manner. Hence, option (e) is the right answer choice.

#### S3. Ans. (c)

Sol. Only (III) statement uses 'Deliberation' in a grammatically correct and contextually meaningful manner. It means Long and careful consideration or discussion.

Thought, Thinking, Consideration, Reflection, Contemplation Hence, option (c) is the right answer choice.
