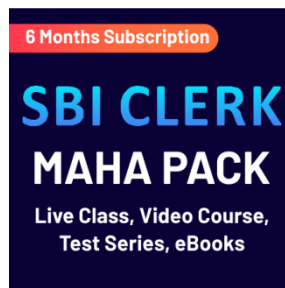
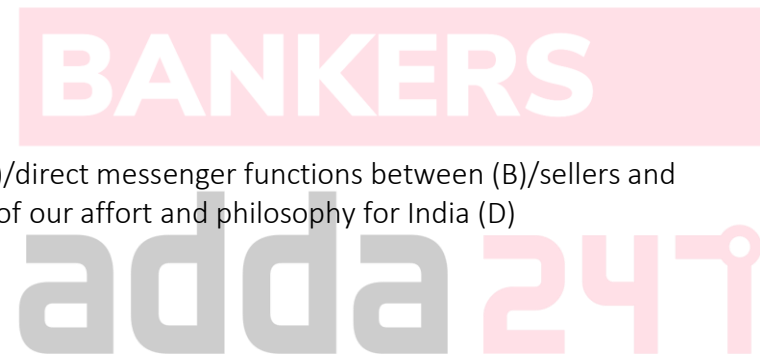

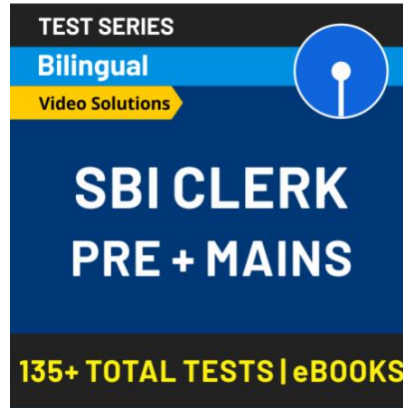

Solutions

S1. Ans. (b)

Sol. A-D contains spelling and grammatical error respectively. In part (A), “Seemless” will be replaced by “Seamless”. In part (D), “Process” will be replaced by “Processes”. Hence, option (b) is the right answer choice.

S2. Ans. (c)

Sol. C-D contains grammatical error. In part (D), “accessing” will be replaced by “Accessible”. In part (C), “Meditating” will be replaced by “Meditation”. Hence, option (c) is the right answer choice.

S3. Ans. (a)

Sol. B-D contains grammatical error. In part (A), “Protecting” will be replaced by “Protect”. In part (D), “Purchase” will be replaced by “Purchasing”. Hence, option (a) is the right answer choice.

S4. Ans. (c)

Sol. C-D contains grammatical error. In part (C), “run” will be replaced by “Runs”. In part (D), “Upsetting” will be replaced by “Upset”. Hence, option (c) is the right answer choice.

S5. Ans. (e)

Sol. The given sentence is correct and there is no error. Hence, option (e) is the right answer choice.

S6. Ans. (b)

Sol. A-D contains grammatical error. In part (A), “Initials” will be replaced by “Initial”. In part (D), “Original” will be replaced by “Originality”. Hence, option (b) is the right answer choice.

S7. Ans. (d)

Sol. A-C contains grammatical error. In part (A), "Educate" will be replaced by "Educating". In part (C), "Inundated" will be replaced by "Inundating". Hence, **option (d)** is the right answer choice.

S8. Ans. (c)

Sol. C-D contains grammatical and spelling error respectively. In part (C), "Is" will be replaced by "Are". In part (D), "Affort" will be replaced by "Effort". Hence, **option (c)** is the right answer choice.

S9. Ans. (d)

Sol. B and C are the statements where both the given words grammatically and contextually fit in the given statements. Hence, **option (d)** is the right answer choice.
