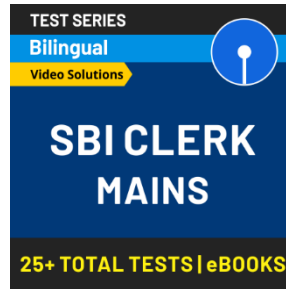

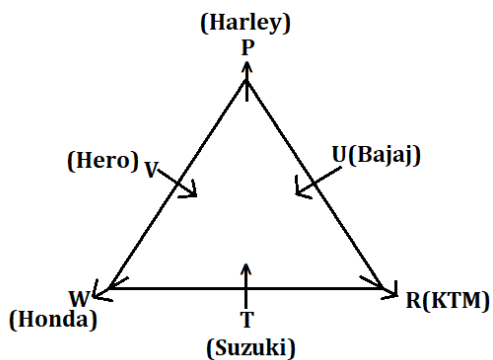

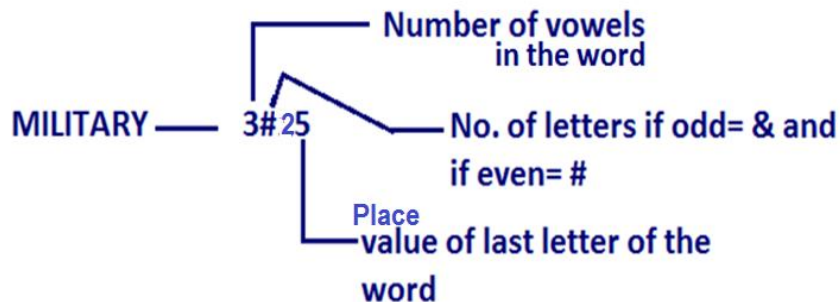
Solutions (11-15):

(ii) If the number of letters in the word is even then “#” symbol is used and if the number of letters in the word is odd then “&” symbol is used.

(iii) The number at the end of the code is the place value of the last letter in the given word according to alphabetical order.
