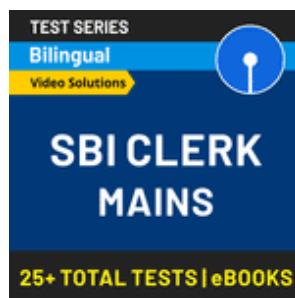

Solutions

S1. Ans. (c)

Sol. Here, error lies in part (II) and (III) of the statement. In part (II), “**above**” will be used instead of “**before**”. In part (III), “**Worsened**” will be used instead of **worse**. Hence, **option (c)** is the right answer choice.

S2. Ans. (c)

Sol. Here, the error lies in part (I) and (IV) of the statement. In part (I), **country**s will be replaced by “**country’s**”. In part (IV), “**plans**” will be replaced by “**plan**”. Hence, **option (c)** is the right answer choice.

S3. Ans. (d)

Sol. Here, error lies in part (I) and (IV) of the statement. In part (I), “**reach**” will be replaced by “**reached**”. In part (IV), “**digital**” will be replaced by “**digitally**”. Hence, **option (d)** is the right answer choice.

S4. Ans. (b)

Sol. Here, the error lies in part (III) of the sentence. “**due**” will be replaced by “**dues**”. Hence, **option (b)** is the right answer choice.

S5. Ans. (a)

Sol. Here, error lies in part (I) of the statement. “**has**” will be replaced “**have**”. Hence, **option (a)** is the right answer choice.

S6. Ans. (c)
