Lower chief executive officer integrity is associated with higher audit fees at large public corporations and (A) performance, according to a recent academic study published in The Accounting Review. Researchers poured through over 30,000 shareholder letters, scrutinizing the words used by CEOs, according to the study, titled "CEO Behavioral Integrity, Auditor Responses, and Firm Outcomes," from the University of Virginia, INSEAD, Duke University and Yale University. (B) The research team align (1) on language to measure CEO behavioral integrity or whether the executive "walks the talk" by the deeds (2) to which the CEO's extent (3) and words failed to focused (4) and required explanation.
