S1. Ans.(b)

Sol. 'announces, met', fits the two blanks most appropriately. The meaning of some other words is:
Promulgate means promote or make widely known (an idea or cause).
Merged means combine or cause to combine to form a single entity.

S2. Ans.(c)

Sol. 'endeavour, preserving', fits the two blanks most appropriately.
Endeavour means to try hard to do or achieve something.
Preserving means to maintain (something) in its original or existing state.

S3. Ans.(a)

Sol. 'growth, continues' fits the two blanks most appropriately.
Increment means an increase or addition, especially one of a series on a fixed scale.
Abolishes mean to formally put an end to (a system, practice, or institution).

Sol. 'welfare, deceived' fits the two blanks most appropriately.
Deceive means to deliberately cause (someone) to believe something that is not true, especially for personal gain.

Sol. Use 'has' in place of 'had' as present perfect passive verb should be used because 'an old house' in the past is converted into a 'flat' now.

Sol. Use 'hopes' in place of 'hope' as in the sentence the subject 'campaign' is singular.

Sol. Use 'awarded' as the subject 'A cash prize' is passive hence verb should be passive too.
