

Sol. The term 'bewail' means 'express sadness or regret'. 'Mourn' and 'Rejoice' are synonym and antonym respectively of the given term. Hence, option (a) is the right answer choice.

S2. Ans. (b)

Sol. The term 'smattering' means 'a slight superficial knowledge of a language or subject; small amount of something'. 'Modicum' and 'comprehensive' are the synonyms of the given word. Hence, option (b) is the right answer choice.

S3. Ans. (c)

Sol. The term 'sordid' means 'dirty or unclean'. 'Unsullied' and 'filthy' are antonym and synonym respectively of the given word. Hence, option (c) is the right answer choice.

S4. Ans. (d)

Sol. The term 'meddle' means 'to interfere'. 'Neglect' and 'disregard' are antonyms of the given word. Hence, option (d) is the right answer choice.

S5. Ans. (e)

Sol. The term 'Bucolic' means 'pleasant aspects of countryside or country life'. 'Rustic' and 'Urban' are synonym and antonym of the given word. The given options do not contain synonym or antonym of this word. Hence, option (e) is the right answer choice.

Sol. The term 'wretched' means 'unhappy or unfortunate state'. 'Anguished' and 'Desolate' are the synonyms of the given word. Hence, option (a) is the right answer choice.

S7. Ans. (b)

Sol. The term 'indigenous' means 'occurring naturally in a particular place or native'. 'Domestic' and 'Alien' are synonym and antonym respectively of the given word. Hence, option (b) is the right answer choice.

S8. Ans. (c)

Sol. The term 'derisive' means 'expressing contempt or ridicule'. 'Scornful' and 'Respectful' are synonym and antonym respectively of the given word. Hence, option (c) is the right answer choice.

Sol. The term 'Indubitably' means 'Too evident to be doubted; Unquestionable, Certain.' Statement (II) uses indubitably in grammatically correct and contextually meaningful manner. Hence, option (b), [Only II] is the right answer choice.

Sol. The term Reaffirm means 'State again strongly; Confirm, Reiterated'.

Statement (I) and III) use **Quantifiable** in grammatically correct and contextually meaningful manner. Hence, **option (e), [Both I and III]** is the right answer choice.

Sol. The term **Budge** means 'Change an opinion'.

Statement (II) uses **Budge** in grammatically correct and contextually meaningful manner. Hence, **option (b), [Only II]** is the right answer choice.
