For some years now, the so-called JAM trinity (Jan Dhan-Aadhaar-Mobile) has been _____ (1) _____ infrastructure for India. The term “trinity” itself gives a sense of the faith and fervor this project sought to inspire. It was born in chapter 3 of the Economic Survey 2015, titled “Wiping every tear from every eye: The JAM number trinity solution”. This early JAM promo humbly concluded that “nirvana today seems within reach”. JAM’s virtues were praised again in the following year’s Economic Survey.

What JAM really means, in practical terms, is conveniently vague. The original formulation, in 2015, mentioned _____ (2) _____ mobile banking and post office payments. The second option never made much headway, perhaps because _____ (3) _____ for private profit. So Aadhaar-enabled mobile banking became the supreme goal. An illusion emerged that India had developed an ideal infrastructure for UBI, _____ (6) _____.

It took the novel coronavirus crisis for the bubble to burst. In the early days of the crisis, JAM was often invoked _____ (7) _____. But when the time actually came to make cash transfers to the poor, JAM turned out to be of little use. For all the excitement it had generated, JAM had not gone beyond some fancy digital-payment systems for the privileged. Poor people, far from using the “thumb in thirty seconds” method to cash in, _____ (8) _____ to collect their meagre benefits from old-fashioned bank accounts (some also use the services of “business correspondents”, but those have little to do with JAM). Sure enough, long bank queues have started emerging, especially in rural areas where the density of banks is relatively low. The crowds are all set to swell further as and when the lockdown is lifted.



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Solutions

S1. Ans. (c)

Sol. Read the next statement after the blank, **“The term “trinity” itself gives a sense of the faith and fervor this project sought to inspire.”** It refers that the JAM was considered to be an inspirational and remarkable step. So, **option (c)** fits in the blank appropriately.

S2. Ans. (a)

Sol. Read that next statement after the blank, **“mobile banking and post office payments”** which means that these two must be mentioned as two innovations coming out of the trinity. Hence, **option (a)** fits in the blank appropriately.

S3. Ans. (d)

Sol. Read the initial part of the statement having the blank, **“The second option never made much headway, perhaps because.....”** Why it would never made any further progress? Because, there must be some flaw in it. So, **option (d)** is the right answer choice and it fits in the blank appropriately.

S4. Ans. (b)

Sol. The paragraph is about replacing conventional banking with advanced and cash less transactions. It is also mentioned in the next part of the sentence, **other than mobiles: “... in the next two-and-a-half years, India will make all its debit cards, credit cards, all ATM machines all POS machines totally irrelevant... because every Indian will be doing his transaction just by using his thumb in thirty seconds.**

So, **option (b)** will fit appropriately in the blank.

S5. Ans. (e)

Sol. Read the second part of the sentence after the blank, **“flourishing narrative— universal basic income (UBI).”** It indicates that something must have tried to overpower UBI that is why the **“Said intoxication”** increased. In this scenario, **option (e)** fits the blank appropriately.

S6. Ans. (c)

Sol. Now with the JAM latching on to the UBI, it is quite obvious that UBI could be deployed at any time because there will be no need of it. So, **option (c)** fits in the blank appropriately.

S7. Ans. (b)

Sol. Read the previous statement before the blank, “It took the novel coronavirus crisis for the bubble to burst. In the early days of the crisis, JAM was often invoked.....” here, it is clear that due to the coronavirus crisis, JAM was invoked as a tool for providing emergency relief. Also, **bubble to burst** here means that the illusion of thinking that JAM would be a perfect infrastructure came to an end as soon as coronavirus hit the country. So **option (b)** fits the blank appropriately.

Sol. Read the sentence with the blank in it “Poor people, far from using the “thumb in thirty seconds” method to cash in, _____ (8) _____ to collect their meagre benefits from old-fashioned bank accounts”. Here, the ground reality for poor is quite different from “using thumb in thirty seconds”. The sentence is stating the difficulties faced by the poor to withdraw cash. “To run from Pillar to post” means being forced to keep moving from one place to another. So, **option (d)** fits the blank appropriately.
