The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has **steadily (1)** banks from maintaining cash reserve ratio (CRR) for loans to retail and micro, small and medium enterprises for five years, if these loans are extended between January 31 and July 31, 2020. "An amount equivalent to the sentinel (2) credit outstanding from the fortnight beginning January 31, 2020 and up to the fortnight ending July 31, 2020 will be eligible for deduction from NDTL (net demand and time liabilities) for the purpose of computing the CRR for a period of five years from the date of origination of the loan or the tenure of the loan, whichever is earlier," the RBI said. During the monetary policy review last week, the central bank said lenders will not have to maintain CRR for loans extended between the above mentioned time period."...the Reserve Bank is actively engaged in testifying (3) the flow of bank credit to productive sectors having multiplier effects to support growth impulses," the RBI said. This exemption was available for incremental credit attested (4) as retail loans to automobiles, residential housing, and loans to micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs). At present, CRR is 4% of net demand and time liabilities. Banks do not earn any interest for maintaining CRR with the RBI. CRR is the proportion of deposits of deposits that a bank has to park with RBI in cash. "Banks are advised that they can claim the first such deduction from the NDTL of February 14, 2020 for the amount equivalent to the incremental credit extended to the sectors indicated above over the outstanding level of credit as at the end of the fortnight ended January 31, 2020," the RBI said in a notification. The move is expected to make loans durable (5) to these particular segments.

India has quadrupled its imports of lithium-ion (Li-ion) batteries and more than tripled its import
bill on the product, vital for (6) a range of devices from cellphones to electric
vehicles, from 2016- <mark>2018, the Un</mark> ion Science Ministry said in the Lok Sabha <mark>last Fri</mark> day.
Responding to a query, the Ministry said 175 million (7) batteries were imported in
2016, 313 million in 2017, 712 million in 2018 and 450 million from January 1, 2019, till
November 30 of that year. The cost of these imports rose from \$383 million (₹2,600 crore
approx) in 2016 to \$727.24 million (₹5,000 crore approx.) in 2017, \$1254.94 million (₹8,700
crore) in 2018 and \$929 million (₹6,500 crore) in 2019. Indian manufacturers source Li-ion
batteries from China, Japan and South Korea and the country among the largest importers in the
world. The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) manufactures such batteries but
(8) are limited and they are restricted for use in space applications. In June 2018, Central
Electro Chemical Research Institute (CECRI) in Tamil Nadu's Karaikudi, under the Council of
Scientific & Industrial Research (CSIR) and RAASI Solar Power Pvt Ltd signed a Memorandum of
Agreement for transfer of technology for India's first lithium-ion (Li-ion) battery project. To
promote (9) development of such batteries, the Union Cabinet in 2019 approved a
programme, called a National Mission on Transformative Mobility and Battery Storage in the NITI
Aayog to "drive clean, connected, shared, sustainable and holistic mobility initiatives." China
dominates the Li-ion battery market. According to a report by BloombergNEF " Around three-
quarters of battery cell manufacturing capacity is in China, and Chinese companies have


