S12. Ans.(b)

Sol. Throughout the passage the author supports socialism but talks about 'confusion' regarding the means to achieve it hence option

(b) is the correct choice for the given question.

S13. Ans.(a)

Sol. The author supports collectivism and thus, is against the approach favoring individualism, thus option (a) is the correct choice for the given question.

S14. Ans.(b)

Sol. The philosophy of 'Fascism' advocates a strong central authority and no individual freedom; Marxism favors the state's control over the means of production.

S15. Ans.(e)

Sol. Capitalism means an economic and political system in which a country's trade and industry are controlled by private owners for profit, rather than by the state and throughout the passage author seems to be against the individualism, hence option

(e) is the correct choice for the given question.

S16. Ans.(c)

Sol. Sentences (with logical sequence **baed**) forms a coherent paragraph. The paragraph talks about the failure of demonetization policy by the government. It was a poor push by the government as it led to newer forms of corruption. Going through all the given sentences, we find that sentence

(c) is not in harmony with the other sentences as here 'Bentham' is mentioned who is unknown in the paragraph. Hence sentence

(c) is the right choice.

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S17. Ans.(e)

Sol. (c**adb**) forms a coherent paragraph while sentence

(e) is not a part of the paragraph. The paragraph talks about the Aadhaar and the scrutiny of the residents by Aadhaar databases. Here we find that sentence

(e) is something different from the theme as it talks about Nationalism which is being confused with obedience of the state. Hence sentence

(e) is the right option.

S18. Ans.(d)

Sol. The paragraph here is about electing the head of Nepal's government by political parties through collective consent. After going through all the sentences, we find that sentences EACB forms a coherent paragraph while sentence

(d) is not forming a part as it talks about taking oaths of the judges. Hence sentence

(d) is the right choice.

Now if we see sentence (e) we find that it talks about MP's agri-performance while other sentences is all about the contribution from MP, there is a comparison in statement

(c) but it is in terms of production and not performance and thus introduction of performance was abrupt which makes it correct choice for the given question. Hence sentence

(e) is the right choice.
