The one who likes Pink sits third to the right of H. The one who likes Green sits at one of the extreme ends and faces north. Neither E nor G sits at any end. C likes Pink and is not a neighbor of A. A neither likes Green nor White. Those who like Yellow faces same direction. E, who sits to the immediate left of G does not like Pink. B neither sits to the left of D nor faces north.


Q15. Statement: Irregularity is a cause for failure in exams. Some regular students fail in the examinations.


C's rank from bottom is 16th so, from top= 30+1-16= 15th So, A's rank from top in the class= 13th


