RBI's 2nd Bi-Monthly Monetary Policy Statement 2020-21 Released

The Monetary Policy Committee of **the Reserve Bank of India** met on 4th, 5th and 6th August for its second meeting of 2020-21. During the second Monetary Policy meet, the MPC analysed the current & evolving macroeconomic and financial conditions and has decided to continue with the accommodative stance to revive growth as well as to mitigate the impact of COVID-19. With its decisions, MPC aims to keep inflation within the target and hence to preserve financial stability.

Also, for the year 2020-21, as a whole, real GDP growth is expected to be negative.

The key decisions taken in the Monetary Policy Committee meeting are:

- The repo rate under the liquidity adjustment facility (LAF) has been kept unchanged at **4.00%**.
- The reverse repo rate under the LAF has been kept unchanged at 3.35%.
- The marginal standing facility (MSF) rate and the Bank Rate have been kept unchanged at **4.25%**.

About Monetary policy:

What is Monetary policy?

Monetary Policy is the central bank's policy which uses the monetary instruments like Repo rate, Reverse repo rate, Liquidity Adjustment Facility and many others, to achieve the goals stated in the Act. In India, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has been given the responsibility of conducting monetary policy as mandated under the Reserve Bank of India Act, 1934.

Objectives of monetary policy?

- The monetary policy has the prime objective of maintaining the price stability in India along with the objective of growth. Price stability is stated as a necessary precondition to achieve the sustainable growth.
- The Reserve Bank of India is also given the task of flexible inflation targeting framework along the Government of India as per the amendment in the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) Act, 1934 which was done in May 2016. This is done once in every five years. Government of India has notified the 4 per cent Consumer Price Index (CPI) inflation as the target for the period from August 5, 2016 to March 31, 2021 in the Official Gazette. The target is stated with the upper tolerance limit of 6 per cent and the lower tolerance limit of 2 per cent.

The Monetary Policy Framework:

The amendment in the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) Act, 1934 provides the Reserve Bank of India a legislative mandate to operate the monetary policy framework of the country. This framework aims to set the policy (repo) rate after the assessment of the current and evolving macroeconomic situation, and modulation of liquidity conditions to anchor money market rates at or around the repo rate.

What is the Composition of the Monetary Policy Committee?

The Central Government has constituted the six-member monetary policy committee (MPC) in September 2016, according to the Section 45ZB of the amended RBI Act, 1934.

The composition of the Monetary Policy Committee is as follows:

- 1. Governor of the Reserve Bank of India Chairperson, ex officio: Shri Shaktikanta Das
- Deputy Governor of the Reserve Bank of India, in charge of Monetary Policy
 – Member, ex officio: Dr. Michael Debabrata Patra
- 3. One officer of the Reserve Bank of India to be nominated by the Central Board Member, ex officio: Dr. Mridul K. Saggar
- 4. Dr. Chetan Ghate, Professor, Indian Statistical Institute (ISI): Member
- 5. Dr. Pami Dua, Director, Delhi School of Economics: Member
- 6. Dr. Ravindra H. Dholakia, Professor, Indian Institute of Management, Ahmedabad: Member.

Some important instruments of Monetary Policy:

The RBI's Monetary Policy has several direct and indirect instruments which is used for implementing the monetary policy. Some important instruments of Monetary Policy are as follows:

Repo Rate: It is the (fixed) interest rate at which banks can borrow overnight liquidity from the Reserve Bank of India against the collateral of government and other approved securities under the liquidity adjustment facility (LAF).

Reverse Repo Rate: It is the (fixed) interest rate at which the Reserve Bank of India can absorb liquidity from banks on an overnight basis, against the collateral of eligible government securities under the LAF.

Liquidity Adjustment Facility (LAF): The LAF has overnight as well as term repo auctions under it. The term repo helps in the development of the inter-bank term money market. This market sets the benchmarks for pricing of loans and deposits. This helps in improving the transmission of monetary policy. As per the evolving market conditions, the Reserve Bank of India also conducts variable interest rate reverse repo auctions.

Marginal Standing Facility (MSF): MSF is a provision which enables the scheduled commercial banks to borrow additional amount of overnight money from the Reserve Bank of India. Bank can do this by dipping into their Statutory Liquidity Ratio (SLR) portfolio up to a limit at a penal rate of interest. This helps the banks to sustain the unanticipated liquidity shocks faced by them.

Accommodative stance of RBI's Monetary Policy Statement:

Accommodative stance is taken by the RBI's Monetary Policy Committee to expand the overall money supply to boost the economy when the growth is slowing down.

India-UN Development Partnership Fund: India contributes USD 15.46 mn

India gives USD 15.5 million to the India-UN Development Partnership Fund, under its commitment to supporting developing nations in their developmental priorities across all the Sustainable Development Goals. This fund of USD 15.46 million including USD 6 million for the overall fund, in which all developing countries are eligible for partnership, and USD 9.46 million is dedicated to Commonwealth countries. The cheque was handed over by India's Permanent Representative to the UN Ambassador T S Tirumurti to the United Nations Office for

South-South Cooperation (UNOSSC) Director Jorge Chediek.

About India-UN Development Partnership Fund:

- The India-UN Development Partnership Fund was formed in 2017, to promote multilateralism and shared prosperity to support developing countries towards the realization of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.
- The fund is supported and led by the Government of the Republic of India, managed by the United Nations Office for South-South Cooperation (UNOSSC), and implemented in collaboration with the United Nations system.
- Till date, 55 projects and proposals have been approved with a total contribution of USD 41.8 million towards a USD 150 million multi-year pledge to the India-UN Development Partnership Fund.

PM Modi addresses on New Education Policy 2020

Prime Minister Narendra Modi has addressed the nation on 7th August to deliver his speech on the New Education Policy 2020. PM's speech began with address at the conclave on 'Transformational Reforms in Higher Education under National Education Policy' is being organised by the University Grants Commission and Ministry of Education. The new National Education Policy was approved in the Cabinet on July 29. It replaces 34-year-old National Policy on Education framed in 1986 and is aimed at paving the way for transformational reforms in school and higher education systems to make India a global knowledge superpower.

Key highlights and updates on PM's speech:

- National Research Foundation will work closely with National Educational Technology Forum (NETF) to enable scientific steps to include technology in the education system.
- K Kasturirangan, an Indian space scientist who has played a crucial role in drafting the New Education Policy 2020.
- National Education Policy was approved after extensive discussions over 3-4 years and deliberation over lakhs of suggestions
- New Education Policy is the foundation of strengthening the 21st century India. Every student will be future-ready and will contribute to nationbuilding.





- The holistic approach was needed to improve education in India and NEP is doing this successfully.
- Multidisciplinary course Multiple entry and exit options will allow the students to study what they want to study and how much to study. Students can leave the course whenever they want.
- Students can re-skill and upskill. NEP allows the student to learn the skill they are interested in.
- India has the capacity to provide talent and technology to the world. Technology has given us the medium to reach even the last person in the country. Technology will help in better content and course.
- New education policy will help curb the gap between education and research.
- Government has started giving autonomous status to various institutions. We will give autonomy to many more institutions in future.
- NEP focusses on upskilling of teacher and teachertraining. When a teacher learns, a nation leads.

Electronic Vaccine Intelligence Network: Strengthening Immunization Supply Chain Systems

The Electronic Vaccine Intelligence Network (eVIN) is an innovative technological solution implemented under National Health Mission (NHM) by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW). This innovative technological solution has strengthend the immunization supply chain systems across India during the COVID pandemic. It also ensured the delivery of essential immunization services and protecting our children as well as pregnant mothers against the vaccine preventable diseases.



The Electronic Vaccine Intelligence Network solution combines the following three resources for its better implementation:

- It utilizes the Human Resources to empower the state cold chain network by setting up the capacities of government cold chain handlers. It also uses the vaccine and cold chain managers deployed in every district for constant assistance to evaluate the vaccine requirements, supervise cold chain handlers and synchronize with cold chain technicians across the dilstrict.
- It utilizes the technology to offer evidence-based decision-making by providing online real-time information about vaccine stocks and storage temperature with the help of eVIN application software and temperature loggers.
- It also takes advantage of the governance to ensure efficient vaccine logistics management with systemized record keeping via standardizing stock and distribution registers.

Nation observes 100th death anniversary of Lokmanya Bal Gangadhar Tilak

A two-day international webinar on 'Lokmanya Tilak – Swaraj to Self-Reliant India' was inaugurated by Union Home Minister Shri Amit Shah. The webinar was organized on the occasion of 100th death anniversary of great freedom fighter Lokmanya Bal Gangadhar Tilak. The webinar was organised by the Indian Council for Cultural Relations in New Delhi.

Contribution to Indian Struggle for Independence:

- One of the earliest and the most vocal proponents of complete independence or swarajya (self-rule).
- Gave the slogan of "Swaraj is my birthright and I shall have it!" during Indian struggle for independence.
- Along with Lala Lajpat Rai and Bipin Chandra Pal, he was part of the Lal-Bal-Pal trio of leaders with extremist outlooks.
- A book 'Indian Unrest' written by Valentine Chirol, an English journalist, stated Tilak the 'father of Indian unrest'.
- Joined the Indian National Congress (INC) in 1890.
- Propagated swadeshi movements and encouraged people to boycott foreign goods.



- Indian Home Rule Movement was started in 1916, it is believed to have set the stage for the independence movement under the leadership of Annie Besant and Bal Gangadhar Tilak for the educated English speaking upper class Indians.
- The **All India Home Rule League** was founded by Tilak in April 1916 at Belgaum.
- It worked in Maharashtra (except Bombay), the Central Provinces, Karnataka and Berar.Lucknow Pact (1916) was signed between the INC headed by Tilak and All-India Muslim League led by Muhammad Ali Jinnah for hindu-muslim unity in nationalist struggle.
- Started newspapers namely, Kesari (Marathi) and Mahratta (English) and wrote books namely, Gita Rhasya and Arctic Home of the Vedas.

Nation observes 78th anniversary of Quit India movement

The 78th anniversary of the August Kranti Din or Quit India Movement, which is considered as one of the important milestones in the history of freedom struggle of our country, is being observed. On 8 Aug 1942, Mahatma Gandhi gave a clarion call to end the British rule and launched the Quit India Movement at the session of the All-India Congress Committee in Mumbai.

After the failure of Cripps Mission, Gandhiji gave the call to "Do or Die" in his Quit India speech delivered at the Gowalia Tank Maidan in Mumbai. The grateful country is paying homage to the freedom fighters and remembering the supreme sacrifices of the martyrs during the freedom struggle.

Nation observes 79th Death Anniversary of Rabindranath Tagore

Rabindranath Tagore is one of those great masters of literature whose works hardly left any human emotion untouched. The poet, novelist, essayist, philosopher and musician is being remembered on his 79th death anniversary on 7th August 2020. Tagore's thoughts and ideas motivate people and keep their love for the country alive even now. Tagore's death anniversary is known as 'Baishe Shrabon' (Shravan 22, in the Bengali calendar) in Bengal.

Rabindranath Tagore has penned over 2000 songs, which are known as 'Rabindra Sangeet'. He won the Nobel Prize for Literature in 1913 for his collection Gitanjali published in London in 1912. His works include hundreds of novels, short stories, dance-dramas, poems, essays and travelogues. Gora, Gitanjali, Rakta Karabi, Ghare Baire, Shesher Kobita, Raja O Rani, Tasher Desh, Dena Paona, Shanchayita are some of his best works, many of which have been translated into several languages. He composed the National Anthems of two nations – "Jana Gana Mana Adhinayaka Jaya He" for India and "Amar Shonar Bangla" for Bangladesh.

- Union Minister for Health and Family Welfare, Dr. Harsh Vardhan has launched 'Vidyarthi Vigyan Manthan, 2020-21'. It is a national programme which has been launched to popularize science among school students of Class 6th to 11th.

International Affairs


- The United Arab Emirates became the first Arab country to open a nuclear power plant, when the Unit 1 of the Barakah Nuclear Plant in Abu Dhabi, got operational on 31 July 2020. It will produce 5.6 gigawatts of electricity and meet up to 25% of the UAE's electricity needs.
- Former Guyanese housing minister, Mohamed Irfaan Ali has been named as the President of the country.
 He is a member of the opposition People's Progressive Party (PPP). He succeeds David Arthur(A.) Granger.
- Former Chief-of-Staff of the Guyana Defence Force, Brigadier (retired) Mark Anthony Phillips has been sworn in as Prime Minister of Guyana.

- Educationist Professor, Pradeep Kumar Joshi has appointed as the chairman of the Union Public Service Commission (UPSC). He will succeed Arvind Saxena who completes his term as UPSC chairman.
- Odisha cadre IPS officer, P S Ranipse has been appointed as Inspector General (IG), in Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF). He will hold the post on Central deputation for a period of five years from the date of joining.
- **PNB** Housing Finance has announced the appointment of the former SBI Card head, Hardayal Prasad as its new managing director and chief executive officer.

- The Indian Government has provisionally granted permission for the 13th edition of Indian Premier League's (IPL's) 2020 to be rescheduled in the United Arab Emirates (UAE) from September 19 to November 10, 2020, due to COVID-19 outbreak. BCCI has also decided to host a Women's T20 Challenge to be held from November 1 to 10 in UAE.
