Sol. Use 'for' in place of 'of'. Perfect tense takes preposition 'for' or 'Since' in case of the period of time.
E.g. I have worked with this company for the last ten years. She has been ill since Monday.

S9. Ans.(c)
Sol. Use 'unable' in place of 'disabled'. Disable (v) means to injure somebody permanently. E.g., He was disabled in a car accident. And 'unable' (adj.) means 'not able to do something.' E.g., The train was unable to move.
S10. Ans.(c)
Sol. Use 'has' in place of 'have' because subject (idea) is singular.
S11. Ans.(c)
Sol. Use 'jumped' in place of 'jumping'. We can use the past perfect to show the order of two past events.
The past perfect shows the earlier action and the past simple shows the later action
S12. Ans.(c)
Sol. Replace 'for' with 'to' because here an infinitive is required. [(To +V1) is used for Purpose implying future time.] i.e. I need a lot of money to buy a villa.
S13. Ans.(b)
Sol. Use 'sent' in place of 'send'. [S+ Had/Has/ Have +V3] e.g. She has sent me a letter.
S14. Ans.(c)
Sol. Use 'than' in place of ' then' because only 'than' is used after an adjective or adverb in comparative form. E.g., I am better than you.
S15. Ans.(e)
Sol. No error.
