PETA India's 2022: Sonakshi Sinha named as 'Person of the Year' title

PETA India's 2022 Person of the Year title:

Bollywood actress, Sonakshi Sinha has been awarded PETA India's 2022 Person of the Year title. Sonakshi's actions helped save the lives of many animals killed for fashion, but her strong advocacy for dog and cat rights earned her the title. She is actively involved in animal welfare activities and regularly voices out the need for stronger animal protection laws. The international animal rights non-profit group endorsed the title and celebrated the actions of the "Dabang" actress for saving animal lives in India.

Last year, **Alia Bhatt** was awarded the same title. Previously PETA India Person of the Year winners include former Supreme Court Justice KS Panicker Radhakrishnan, cricketer Virat Kohli, comedian Kapil Sharma; and actors John Abraham, Anushka Sharma, Sunny Leone, R Madhavan, Jacqueline Fernandez, Hema Malini, and Sonam Kapoor Ahuja, among others.

Rafael Nadal and Iga Swiatek crowned ITF **World Champions 2022**

ITF World Champion Awards:

Spanish Tennis Player, Rafael Nadal has been named the Men's International Tennis Federation (ITF) World Champion 2022 for the 5th time after an outstanding 2022 season. Previously, He has been named the men's ITF World Champion in 2008, 2010, 2017 and 2019. Polish tennis player, Iga Świątek, has been named Women's ITF World Champion 2022 for her performance in 2022 winning 2 Grand Slam titles and 8 titles. The winners will be honoured at the annual ITF World Champions Awards event which will be held on 8th July 2023 at Victoria and Albert Museum, London, United Kingdom(UK). The event is usually held in Paris France.

ITF World Champion Awards is annually presented under 4 categories:

- **ITF Singles World Champions**
- **ITF Doubles World Champions**
- ITF Wheelchair World Champions
- ITF Junior World Champions

ITF World Champions 2022:

- Barbora Krejcikova and Katerina Siniakova have been named ITF Women's Doubles World Champions for the 2nd straight year and the 3rd time overall, having won the title in 2018 and 2021.
- Rajeev Ram and Joe Salisbury have been named ITF Men's Doubles World Champions for the 1st time.
- Japan's Shingo Kunieda and Netherlands' Diede de Groot were honoured in the men's and women's wheelchair categories
- At junior level, two-time Grand Slam boys' singles runner-up Gilles Arnaud Bailly of Belgium has been rewarded for a season of consistent performances, while Roland Garros girls' singles champion Lucie Havlickova of Czech Republic was crowned as ITF Girls World Champion.

Sahitya Akademi:

- Sahitya Akademi is India's National Academy of Letters.
- The Government of India established the Sahitya Akademi on 12 March 1954.
- Sahitya Akademi was set up by the Government but functions as an autonomous organisation.
- On 7 January 1956, it was registered as a society under the Societies Registration Act, 1860.
- Sahitya Akademi has recognised English and Rajasthani apart from the 22 languages enumerated in the Indian Constitution.



General Rules and Eligibility Criteria for the Sahitya Akademi Award:

- The book must be a remarkable contribution to the language and literature to which it belongs.
- The literary work or book should be first published in any of the languages recognised by the Sahitya Akademi during the five years prior to the year, immediately preceding the year of the award.
- The literary work should be written by an Indian and published in India.
- The book or literary work should not be a work of translation or an anthology of multiple authors
- When two or more books are equally good, the total literary contribution and standing of the authors of the books will be considered to decide the award.

Rabindranath Tagore Literary Prize 2021-22

Rabindranath Tagore Literary Prize: The Rabindranath **Tagore Literary Prize** has been jointly won by **Sudeep Sen** for his genre and formbender Anthropocene: Climate Change, Contagion, Consolation (Pippa Rann Books & Media, 2021) and **Shobhana Kumar** for her haibun collection A Sky Full of Bucket Lists (Red River, 2021). The winners, awarded \$10,000 and a Rabindranath Tagore statuette, were picked from a shortlist of 11 at India International Centre, with the Tagore Prize for social achievement going to Sanjoy K Roy, producer of the Jaipur Literature Festival.

About the Awards:

The Rabindranath Tagore Literary Prize was started in 2018 to annually recognise literary and social accomplishments. In 2020, the award was won by Raj Kamal Jha, Chief Editor, The Indian Express, for The City and The Sea (2019, Penguin Books), and in 2019, it was awarded posthumously to Kabir for One Hundred Poems of Kabir, translated by Rabindranath Tagore.

BBC Sports Personality of the Year 2022 Award

Beth Mead has been awarded the BBC Sports Personality of the Year for 2022 as she was the player of the tournament and top scorer at Euro 2022. Beth Mead defeated Germany in the finals at Wembley to win England's first major women's football trophy. The 27-year-old competed against Ben Stokes and Ronnie O'Sullivan for the BBC Sports Personality of the Year for 2022 award.

Beth Mead Awarded BBC Sports Personality of the Year 2022 Award-Key Points

- Beth Mead defeated eight-time champion **Germany** with her six goals and five assists at the Wembley finals.
- England secured their first major trophy for the first time since 1966.
- They also won the team of the year and coach of the year for Sarina Wiegman.
- England's Cricketer Ben Stokes was second with winter Olympics curling champion **Eve Muirhead Third**.
- Seven-time snooker world champion Ronnie O'Sullivan, gymnast Jessica Gadirova, who won the floor title and 1,500 m athletics World Champion Jake Wightman were also shortlisted for the award.
- Beth Mead won the player of the tournament and won the **Golden boot** with six goals and five assists.
- She has been also named Arsenal's player of the season.
- Her international goal tally for the **2021-22 season** was 20 in 19 matches, beating the record of 13 scored by Jimmy Greaves in 1960-61.

About Beth Mead

Bethany Jane Mead was born on 9th May 1995. She is an English Professional footballer who plays forward for the women's super league club Arsenal and the England national team. At UEFA Women's Euro 2022, she became the Golden Boot Winner, Player of the Tournament, and top assist provider, leading England to win a major tournament for the first time.


