Wimbledon 2023 Final: Carlos Alcaraz beats Novak

Djokovic

Wimbledon Championships 2023

The <u>Wimbledon</u> Championships 2023 is a Grand Slam tennis tournament that takes place at the All England Lawn Tennis and Croquet Club in Wimbledon, London, United Kingdom. The tournament will be played on grass courts, with all main draw matches to be played from Jun 26–Jul 16, 2023, at the All England lawn tennis and croquet club, Wimbledon. The 2023 Championships is the 136th edition, the 129th staging of the Ladies' Singles Championship event, the 55th in the Open Era and the third Grand Slam tournament of the year.

13.5 crore Indians escape Multidimensional Poverty in 5 vears

According to the latest **NITI Aayog** report, India has achieved a remarkable feat in its efforts to reduce multidimensional poverty. Between **2015-16** and **2019-21**, a staggering 13.5 crore people moved out of multidimensional poverty, showcasing the country's commitment to sustainable and equitable development.

Comprehensive Methodology and Progress

The report, 'National Multidimensional Poverty Index: A Progress Review 2023,' draws its data from the latest **National Family Health Survey (NFHS-5)** conducted between 2019 and 2021. It builds upon the baseline report launched in 2021 and follows a methodology aligned with global standards. The National MPI measures deprivations in health, education, and standard of living through **12 SDG-aligned indicators.**



Striking Improvements Across Indicators

India has witnessed marked improvements in all 12 indicators, including nutrition, child and adolescent mortality, maternal health, education, sanitation, and access to basic amenities like drinking water and electricity. The results indicate a decline of 9.89 percentage points in the number of multidimensionally poor, reducing from 24.85% in 2015-16 to 14.96% in 2019-2021.



Rural Areas Leading the Way

The report highlights that the decline in multidimensional poverty was most prominent in rural areas, decreasing from 32.59% to 19.28%. Urban areas also witnessed a reduction, going from 8.65% to 5.27%. Uttar Pradesh showed significant progress, with 3.43 crore people escaping multidimensional poverty, marking the largest decline among all states.

Path Towards SDG 2030

India's progress is commendable as the MPI value has nearly halved from **0.117 to 0.066**, and the intensity of poverty has reduced from **47% to 44%**. This puts India well on track to achieve SDG Target 1.2 of reducing multidimensional poverty by at least half much ahead of the **2030 timeline**. The government's strategic focus on inclusive development and poverty eradication has played a pivotal role in this achievement.

Government Initiatives Driving Change

Flagship programs like Poshan Abhiyan, Anaemia Mukt Bharat, Swachh Bharat Mission, Jal Jeevan Mission, Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana, PMAY, PMJDY, and Samagra Shiksha have significantly contributed to improving access to healthcare, sanitation, nutrition, cooking fuel, financial inclusion, housing, and education. The efforts have resulted in reduced deprivations across various indicators, showcasing the impact of consistent implementation of well-linked initiatives.

Tamil Nadu topped NITI Aayog's Export Preparedness Index 2022

Context:

Tamil Nadu topped the **third edition** of the **NITI Aayog's Export Preparedness Index 2022** with an overall score of **80.89**, piping **Maharashtra (78.20)** and **Karnataka (76.36)**.

Overview of the Export Preparedness Index 2022:

The third edition of the NITI Aayog's Preparedness Index 2022 has released on 17th July 2023. According to the report, out of the 680 districts engaged in exports, the top 100 districts contribute about 87% of the total exports from India. To promote exports, 647 districts have formed a District Export Promotion Committee, while 557 have formulated a District Export Action Plan.

- According to the Export Preparedness Index 2022, Tamil Nadu topped the ranking with an overall score of 80.89 while Maharashtra with a score of 78.20 was second and Karnataka was third with a score of 76.36.
- Gujarat scored fourth position with a score of 73.22 followed by Andhra Pradesh, Odissa, West Bengal and Kerala in the ranking of coastal areas.

- Among hilly/Himalayan states Uttarakhand topped the ranking with a score of 59.13 followed by Himachal Pradesh, Manipur, Tripura, Sikkim, Nagaland, Meghalaya, Arunachal Pradesh and Mizoram in that order.
- Among the landlocked regions, Harayana topped the ranking with a score of 63.65 followed by Telangana, Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, Madhya Pradesh and Rajasthan.
- In the category of Union Territories/small states, Goa topped the ranking with a score of 51.58 followed by Jammu-Kashmir, Delhi, Andaman and Nicobar and Ladakh.
- Among export districts, Jamnagar in Gujarat topped the chart which was followed by Surat, Mumbai Suburban, Mumbai, Pune, Bharuch, Kanchipuram, Ahmedabad, Gautam Buddha Nagar and Bengaluru Urban.
- Gujarat has **8 districts**, the highest number of districts in the top 25 export districts in the country.

About the Export Preparedness Index:

- The Export Preparedness Index is a comprehensive assess the export preparedness of the States and UTs in the country.
- The index conducts a comprehensive analysis of States and UTs across export-related parameters to identify their strengths and weaknesses.
- The methodology of the index is an evolving process that constantly incorporates stakeholder feedback.

Objectives of Export Preparedness Index:

- To provide a comprehensive and objective assessment of the export preparedness of the States and UTs.
- To highlight the achievements and best practices adopted by the States and UTs to improve their ranking in the index.
- To foster a competitive spirit among States and UTs.
- To enhance cooperation between them and the Centre, to achieve sustainable growth and development for India.





Pillars of Export Preparedness Index:

The index uses 4 pillars to assess the export preparedness and the performance:

- Policy Pillar: This pillar evaluated how well the states and UTs adopted and implemented export related policies at state and district level.
- Business Ecosystem: This pillar assesses the quality and availability of business supportive infrastructure such as power, water, land and logistics as well as the transport connectivity of the States and UTs to domestic and international market.
- **Export Ecosystem:** This pillar focuses on the export supportive infrastructure and trade services provided by the States and the UTs.
- Export Performance: This pillar measures the actual export outcomes of the states and UTs such as export growth, diversification and competitiveness.

Singapore Passport Tops Henley Passport Index 2023 as World's Most Powerful

According to the Henley Passport Index, Singapore now holds the title of the world's most powerful passport, granting visa-free access to 192 out of 227 global travel destinations. Three European countries, namely Germany, Italy, and Spain, have moved up one rank to share the second position, with visa-free access to 190 destinations. For the first time in five years, Japan has been dethroned from the top spot and now ranks third, with its passport providing visa-free access to 189 destinations.

India's ranking in Henley Passport Index

India has made significant progress in the Henley Passport Index, improving its ranking by 5 spots compared to the previous year. It currently shares the **80th position** on the index with **Togo and Senegal.** Indian passport holders now enjoy visafree access to 57 countries, reflecting the country's enhanced global travel privileges.

Overview of the Henley Passport Index

- The United States, formerly the top-ranked country almost a decade ago, has now slipped to the eighth position in the Henley Passport Index. It shares this position with Lithuania, with both countries offering visa-free access to 184 destinations.
- On the other hand, the United Kingdom has made significant progress, jumping two places to claim the fourth spot in the index. British passport holders can now access 188 countries without a visa, a position they last held in 2017.

- At the opposite end of the spectrum, Afghanistan holds the lowest rank in the ranking, with its passport holders having visa-free access to only 27 destinations. Just above Afghanistan are Iraq with a score of 29 and Syria with 30, making them the three weakest passports in the world.
- The influx of migrants into Singapore, driven by a crackdown on private enterprise in China and concerns over geopolitical tensions, has resulted in increased citizenship grants in the nation. Approximately 23,100 people were granted Singaporean citizenship last year.

About the Henley Passport Index

Invented nearly 20 years ago by **Dr Christian H Kaelin, Chairman, Henley & Partners,** the index is based on the exclusive and official data from the **International Air Transport Association (IATA).** It is the original ranking of all the passports according to the number of destinations their holders can visit without a prior visa. It's worth noting that the Henley Passport Index relies on data from the International Air Transport Association to calculate its rankings. The methodology used by this index differs from other passport rankings, such as the one published by financial advisory Arton Capital, which placed the United Arab Emirates in the top position last year.



- The Reserve Bank of India, in its monthly bulletin, has outlined the significant growth targets India must achieve over the next 25 years to become a developed economy with high per capita income. Currently estimated at \$2,500, India's per capita income needs to surpass \$21,664 by 2047, as per World Bank standards, to be classified as a high-income country. To achieve this ambitious goal, the country must maintain a compounded annual growth rate (CAGR) of 7.6% in real GDP during 2023-24 to 2047-48. (Click here to read the article)
