UDAN Scheme

In a landmark announcement on October 21, 2024, Civil Aviation Minister K. Rammohan Naidu declared that the government will extend the UDAN (Ude Desh ka Aam Nagrik) scheme for an additional 10 years. The decision, made during a special event celebrating eight years of the scheme, reinforces the government's commitment to enhancing regional air connectivity and making air travel accessible to every citizen of India.

The UDAN scheme, launched on October 21, 2016, has been instrumental in not only boosting regional airlines but also creating thousands of jobs and significantly contributing to the growth of tourism across India. With 601 air routes and 71 operationalized airports under the scheme, UDAN has drastically improved air travel infrastructure in underserved and remote regions.

The UDAN Scheme's Journey: 2016-2024

The UDAN scheme was initially launched for a period of 10 years in 2016. Its core objectives include:

- Enhancing regional air connectivity by offering subsidies to airlines that operate flights on unserved or underserved routes.
- Boosting tourism and trade by connecting smaller cities and remote regions with major hubs.
- Making flying affordable for the common citizen by capping airfares on specific routes.

Over the past eight years, UDAN has seen remarkable growth, operationalizing more than 601 air routes and making 71 airports fully functional. This has not only bridged the accessibility gap between India's metropolitan and non-metro areas but also revolutionized the nation's aviation sector by reducing airfares on regional routes.

Extension for Another 10 Years

- In his address, Civil Aviation Minister K. Rammohan Naidu highlighted the success of the UDAN scheme and the reasons for extending it for another decade. He noted that UDAN has made substantial contributions to connecting the hinterlands of India to urban centers, thus boosting regional development and contributing to the overall economy. With the scheme set to expire in 2026, this extension signals a continued commitment to sustainable regional aviation growth.
- Additionally, Civil Aviation Secretary Vumlunmang Vualnam emphasized that while the extension is welcome, the ministry is also looking into the financial viability of the scheme, with an aim to streamline the subsidy and operational procedures. Ensuring that the scheme remains fiscally sustainable is critical to maintaining the affordability and frequency of flights across the country's remote regions.

India's Aviation Infrastructure: From 74 to 157 Airports

- One of the most notable successes of the UDAN scheme has been the exponential increase in the number of operational airports across India. When the scheme was launched in 2016, India had only 74 airports in service. By 2024, this number has more than doubled to 157, a clear testament to UDAN's success in boosting India's aviation infrastructure.
- This growth is a part of the broader vision to ensure that aviation infrastructure in India continues to expand, with a goal of 350-400 operational airports by 2047. This ambitious target aligns with India's 100th year of independence, positioning the nation as a global leader in aviation connectivity and infrastructure.

Milestones in RCS-UDAN Development

UDAN Versions

- UDAN 1.0: Awarded 128 flight routes to five airline companies across 70 airports, including 36 newly operational airports.
- UDAN 2.0: Announced connections to 73 underserved and unserved airports; included helipads for the first time.
- UDAN 3.0 : Introduced tourism routes and connected water aerodromes with seaplanes, focusing on the Northeast Region.
- **UDAN 4.0**: Emphasized operations in the Northeastern regions, hilly states, and islands, incorporating helicopters and seaplanes.

UDAN 5.0

- Launched with improvements based on stakeholder feedback, focusing on Category-2 (20-80 seats) and Category-3 (>80 seats) aircraft.
- Removed the 600 km distance cap, allowing airlines to operate without distance restrictions.
- Airlines must commence operations within 4 months of route award.







Prime Minister Narendra Modi marked the 8th anniversary of the UDAN (Ude Desh ke Aam Nagrik) scheme, celebrating its transformative impact on India's aviation sector. Launched in October 2016, UDAN aimed to make air travel affordable for the common man and boost regional connectivity.

BRICS Summit 2024

The 2024 BRICS Summit, held in Kazan, Russia, from October 22-24, marks a significant turning point for the group as Egypt, Ethiopia, Iran, and the UAE join its ranks following their inclusion at the 2023 summit. The event centers around the theme, "Strengthening Multilateralism for Fair Global **Development and Security,"** with key discussions on alternative global payment systems, dedollarization, and enhanced cooperation. The summit witnessed the adoption of the BRICS Kazan Declaration, endorsing UN reforms and investigating cross-border financial solutions to reduce reliance on the US dollar.

16th BRICS Summit: Key Outcomes

- **BRICS Pay**: A new payment system introduced to facilitate financial transactions among member nations, providing an alternative to SWIFT for international settlements.
- Kazan Declaration: Adoption of reforms to the UN, support for Palestine's full UN membership under the two-state solution, and deliberations on using national currencies for trade.

Key Bilateral Meetings

- China-Russia: Presidents Xi and Putin reaffirmed their strategic partnership, advancing the Belt and Road Initiative and Eurasian Economic Union integration.
- India-China: PM Modi and President Xi resolved a four-year military standoff, aiming to bolster relations between the two ancient civilizations.
- India-Iran: Discussions focused on Chabahar Port. Afghanistan, Central Asia, and the Israel-Palestine conflict.
- Russia-South Africa: President Ramaphosa acknowledged Russia's support during apartheid, reinforcing their ties.

Global Participation

Leaders from several nations, including South Africa, China, India, and UAE, attended, with Brazilian President Lula da Silva participating online due to health reasons. Other countries such as Armenia, Belarus, and Uzbekistan also sent delegates, contributing to the growing influence of BRICS on global geopolitics.

15th BRICS Summit

The 15th BRICS Summit, held in Johannesburg, marked a significant milestone with the group's expansion by inviting six new members: Argentina, Egypt, Ethiopia, Iran, Saudi Arabia, and the UAE. The expansion highlights BRICS' aim to strengthen its global influence and increase representation from the Global South, effective from January 2024. Leaders reaffirmed their commitment to multilateralism, international law, and sustainable development, pushing for reforms in global governance bodies like the UN.

Key Developments

- **BRICS** Expansion and Influence
- The summit saw invitations extended to nations across Africa, Latin America, and West Asia, enhancing the group's geopolitical weight. Over 40 nations have expressed interest in joining BRICS, reflecting the bloc's growing relevance. The inclusion of energy-rich countries like Saudi Arabia and Iran also bolsters BRICS' strategic resources.

Common Currency and Space Cooperation

The BRICS leaders agreed to explore the possibility of creating a common currency for trade and investment, aiming to reduce reliance on the US dollar. India proposed the formation of a BRICS space consortium, with particular significance following its successful lunar mission.

India's Role and Challenges

While India stands to benefit from a more diverse BRICS, it faces challenges, including managing its relationships with China, navigating trade imbalances, and ensuring a balanced approach within the group. India advocates for global governance reforms in the UN and other multilateral organizations, warning that without reforms, these institutions may become obsolete.

A Platform for Global Reform

India, along with other BRICS members, seeks to use the bloc's expansion to push for broader reforms in global institutions. The expansion sets the stage for BRICS to play a pivotal role in reshaping 21st-century global governance, ensuring that developing nations have a stronger voice on the world stage.

Pravasi Bharatiya Divas

Odisha is set to host the 18th Pravasi Bharatiya Divas from January 8th to 10th next year in its capital city, Bhubaneswar. The event, which celebrates the contributions of the Indian diaspora, will take place at Janata Maidan.

Pravasi Bharatiya Divas

Significance and History

Overview

- Pravasi Bharatiya Divas (PBD) is celebrated annually on January 9th to honor the contributions of the overseas Indian community towards the development of India.
- The date was chosen to commemorate Mahatma Gandhi's return to India from South Africa in 1915, marking the start of his role in India's freedom movement.

Key Historical Milestones

First Celebration

PBD was first celebrated in 2003 to recognize the contributions of the Indian diaspora.

Biennial Event

Since 2015, Pravasi Bharatiya Divas has been held every two years to engage the Indian diaspora in developmental initiatives.

Last Edition

The previous PBD was held in Indore, Madhya Pradesh.

Significance of January 9th

- Mahatma Gandhi's Return to India (1915)
- January 9 was chosen for the PBD celebration to honor Mahatma Gandhi's return to Mumbai from South Africa in 1915.
- Gandhi's return marked a significant turning point in India's freedom struggle, symbolizing the potential of the Indian diaspora in shaping the nation's future.

Importance of Pravasi Bharatiya Divas

- PBD recognizes the invaluable contributions of the Indian diaspora to the nation's socio-economic, cultural, and political progress.
- The event serves as a platform for overseas Indians to reconnect with their roots and contribute to India's development through investment, knowledge sharing, and policy collaboration.
- The celebration offers an opportunity for the Government of India to engage with the global Indian community, understand their needs, and foster relationships that support India's global outreach.

COP on United Nations Biodiversity Conference

The two-week United Nations Biodiversity Conference (COP16) commenced today in Colombia, bringing environmental leaders from nearly 200 countries to evaluate historic commitments aimed at halting and reversing the loss of biodiversity.

Conference Objectives

- Delegates in Cali will discuss strategies to combat the rapid rate of destruction of natural habitats and ensure compliance with the 2022 biodiversity accord.
- Countries are expected to commit to setting aside 30% of their territories for conservation purposes and to reduce subsidies for businesses that negatively impact the environment.
- The conference aims to establish mandatory reporting for companies on their environmental impact, promoting transparency and accountability.
- Countries were expected to submit their biodiversity plans by the start of the summit, but as of Friday, only 31 out of 195 countries had filed plans with the UN biodiversity secretariat.

About United Nations Biodiversity Conference

- The UN Biodiversity Conference is the regular meeting of the countries who have signed (and are therefore 'parties to') the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD).
- CBD is an international agreement for conserving biodiversity with the vision of "living in harmony with nature by 2050".
- The convention was adopted at the Rio Earth Summit in 1992.
- The first Conference of the Parties to the convention (COP 1) took place in Nassau, Bahamas in 1994.
- The COP is the arena for international governments to meet and review progress on the convention and establish new measures needed to support its goals.

Objectives

- The conservation of biological diversity,
- The sustainable use of its components,
- The fair and equitable sharing of the benefits of biological diversity.

How many countries are part of the Convention on Biological **Diversity?**

- A total of 196 countries (including India) are party to the Convention on Biological Diversity – although the United States is notably absent.
- Each country is required to set National Biodiversity Strategies and Action Plans (NBSAPs) detailing how the principles of the conservation and sustainable use of biological resources will be integrated into their country's national policies.

Secretariat

The CBD Secretariat is based in Montreal, Canada.



INDIA-CHINA LAC Agreement

India recently announced a pivotal agreement regarding patrolling along the Line of Actual Control (LAC) with China. This development is seen as a potential stepping stone toward normalizing relations between the two nations following tensions that escalated in 2020. The pact entails a structured approach to disengagement and resolution of the long-standing border disputes, specifically in areas like the Depsang Plains and Demchok.

Key Highlights of the Agreement

Restoration of Patrolling Rights

The agreement allows both nations to restore mutual patrolling rights in the Depsang Plains and the Demchok region, areas where disputes existed even before the 2020 border incursions. Indian troops will now be permitted to patrol up to Patrolling Points (PP) 10 to 13 in the Depsang Plains and the Charding **Nullah in Demchok.** Notably, areas where previous disengagements occurred—such as Galwan Valley, Pangong Tso, and Gogra-Hot Springs—are explicitly excluded from renegotiation.



India-China LAC Agreement: What this means, Implications and Cautions

Three-Step Process: Disengagement, De-escalation, and Demilitarization

The agreement outlines a phased process focusing on:

- 1. Disengagement: Immediate withdrawal of troops from frontline positions.
- 2. **De-escalation**: Gradual reduction of military presence along the LAC, currently estimated at 50,000 to 60,000 troops from each side.
- 3. **Demilitarization**: Long-term objective of reducing military hardware and personnel in sensitive border areas.

This structured approach aims to prevent future incidents, particularly those akin to the deadly clashes in Galwan Valley, which claimed the lives of 20 Indian soldiers and at least four Chinese soldiers.

Background: The Road to Agreement

Modi's Call for Improved Relations

In April 2024, Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi emphasized the importance of addressing the prolonged border situation to normalize India-China relations. His call for constructive dialogue was met with a positive response from Beijing.

Positive Chinese Response

Chinese officials acknowledged that the relationship between India and China transcends the border dispute, indicating a willingness to engage in constructive dialogue.

Focus on Patrolling Rights

In May 2024, Indian External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar articulated optimism regarding the resolution of remaining border disputes, particularly highlighting the significance of patrolling rights in the Ladakh region.

Significance of the Patrolling Pact

The patrolling arrangement is a cornerstone of the agreement and is critical for maintaining order and stability along the LAC. In the absence of a clear physical demarcation, regular patrols are essential for asserting territorial claims. The Indian troops typically patrol to their perceived borders and leave behind markers, such as Indian-made items, to indicate their presence.

Guidelines for Troop Conduct

The agreement also reaffirms commitments made in the 2005 Border Pact, specifically Article 4, which outlines guidelines for troop conduct during face-offs. This includes self-restraint in encounters, prohibition of force, and mutual courtesy, aiming to prevent escalation during incidents along the border.

Diverging Interpretations Post-Agreement

Following the announcement, there were noticeable differences in how India and China interpreted the agreement:

Indian Perspective

official statement emphasized India's disengagement and resolution of issues" arising from the 2020 confrontations. Indian leaders reiterated that a comprehensive resolution of border standoffs is a prerequisite for normalizing bilateral relations.

Chinese Perspective

In contrast, China described the agreement as "important progress" but maintained that broader relations should not be held hostage to the border dispute. This reflects a preference for a compartmentalized approach to diplomatic relations.

Planned Steps for Future Resolution

Both countries have indicated plans for future dialogue to seek a fair and mutually acceptable solution to the boundary question. India's Special Representatives are set to meet soon, while China aims for diplomatic discussions at various levels to restore relations.





Conclusion: Cautious Optimism in India's Strategic Circles While there is cautious optimism regarding the path forward, strategic circles in India are mindful of the complexities involved. The phased process of disengagement, de-escalation, and eventual troop reduction is anticipated to take several years, contingent on both nations' adherence to the agreement. The future remains uncertain as to whether these steps will unfold in parallel or sequentially, but the initial steps have initiated a trust-building process between two historically adversarial neighbors.

Future Implications of the LAC Agreement

The LAC agreement holds significant implications for both countries. While it serves as a catalyst for trust-building and aims to prevent future clashes, India's cautious approach, in contrast to China's broader focus on ties, hints at the complexities ahead. The path to lasting resolution may require extensive negotiations, underscoring the delicate balance that both nations must navigate as they seek to redefine their bilateral relationship.

Centre Appoints 29 Joint Secretaries

In a significant move aimed at strengthening various departments, the Government of India has appointed 29 officers as Joint Secretaries across different ministries and sectors. The reshuffle, orchestrated by the Centre, involves officers from a range of central services, including the Indian Defence Accounts Service (IDAS), Indian Railway Service of Electrical Engineers (IRSEE), Indian Audit and Accounts Service (IA&AS), and Indian Revenue Service (IRS), among others. This reshuffle reflects the government's commitment to optimizing governance by assigning experienced and specialized personnel to pivotal roles.

Key Appointments in the Ministry of Home Affairs

Three officers have been designated as Joint Secretaries in the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA):

- Praveen Kumar Rai and Rakesh Kumar Pandey, both officers from the Indian Defence Accounts Service (IDAS), have been entrusted with Joint Secretary roles in the Home Ministry.
- Rajesh Gupta, from the Indian Railway Service of Electrical **Engineers** (IRSEE), has also been appointed as Joint Secretary in the MHA, bringing his engineering expertise to the table.

Additionally, Raj Kumar, a 1999-batch officer from the Indian Audit and Accounts Service (IA&AS), has been appointed as Director (Finance) in the Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF), where he will serve a five-year tenure under the Ministry of Home Affairs.

Strategic Roles in Economic and Cooperative Sectors Several senior officers have been assigned to roles critical to India's economic growth and cooperative development:

- Deepak Agarwal, a 2000-batch Indian Administrative Service (IAS) officer from the Uttar Pradesh cadre, has been appointed as Managing Director (Joint Secretary level) at the National Agricultural Cooperative Marketing Federation of India (NAFED). NAFED plays a crucial role in cooperative marketing, and leadership is expected to enhance its efficiency.
- Premjit Lal has taken the role of Executive Director at the India Trade Promotion Organisation (ITPO), where his leadership will focus on promoting Indian trade and organizing events to enhance global trade engagement.

Appointments in Administrative and Personnel Management To improve administrative efficiency and streamline personnel management, two experienced IAS officers have been appointed to significant positions:

- Chauhan Sarita Chand has been appointed as Joint Secretary in the Department of Administrative Reforms & Public Grievances, an essential department focused on improving governance mechanisms and addressing public grievances.
- P Bala Kiran, another IAS officer, has been appointed as Joint Secretary in the Department of Personnel & Training, where he will play a role in overseeing personnel policies, training, and human resource management across government departments.

Key Roles in Social Welfare and Women Empowerment

In a move that underscores the government's commitment to social welfare and women's empowerment, the Centre has appointed Bhavna Saxena, a 1996-batch Indian Police Service (IPS) officer of the Andhra Pradesh cadre, as the CEO of the Central Adoption Resource Authority (CARA). CARA, under the Ministry of Women & Child Development, is responsible for the adoption process in India, and Saxena's experience in the police service is expected to bring operational discipline to this sensitive area.

Appointments in Petroleum, Commerce, and Corporate Affairs Key appointments were made in departments critical to India's industrial and economic landscape:

Anjan Kumar Mishra, a 1998-batch officer from the Indian Ordnance Factories Service (IOFS), has been designated as Secretary of the Petroleum & Natural Gas Regulatory Board (PNGRB) under the Ministry of Petroleum & Natural Gas. This role is crucial in regulating India's oil and gas sector, which has strategic importance for the country's energy security.



- Kesang Yangzom Sherpa, a 1995-batch IRS (Income Tax cadre) officer, has taken on the role of Joint Secretary in the Department of Commerce. Her experience in taxrelated fields will bring valuable insights to the department responsible for regulating and promoting India's international trade.
- Balamurugan D has been appointed as Joint Secretary in the Ministry of Corporate Affairs, where he will be tasked with overseeing corporate governance, frameworks, and the facilitation of business in India.

Environmental and Agricultural Roles

Recognizing the importance of environmental conservation and sustainable agriculture, the Centre has appointed senior bureaucrats in relevant roles:

- Rajat Agarwal and Ved Prakash Mishra have been appointed as Joint Secretaries in the Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change. Their roles will involve tackling issues related to environmental policy, climate change initiatives, and forest conservation, which are critical to India's ecological future.
- Rama Shankar Sinha has been appointed as Joint Secretary in the Department of Animal Husbandry & Dairying. His role is pivotal in supporting the livestock sector, ensuring food security, and providing livelihood to millions in rural areas.

Enhancing Development in the North Eastern Region

As part of the government's ongoing efforts to foster development in India's North Eastern states, Niraj Kumar, an officer from the Central Secretariat Service (CSS), has been appointed as Joint Secretary in the Ministry of Development of North Eastern Region (DoNER). States in the News

- Chennai is set to witness a significant advancement in its public transportation system with the upcoming trial run of the first three-coach driverless train for the Phase II **project** of the Chennai Metro Rail.
