## Immigration and Foreigners Bill, 2025: Key Provisions, Impact and Significance

In a significant move to modernize India's immigration framework, **Minister of State for Home Affairs, Nityanand Rai**, introduced the **Immigration and Foreigners Bill, 2025** in the Parliament. The proposed bill aims to replace colonial-era laws with a more structured and stringent immigration system to enhance **national security, regulate foreign nationals, and introduce stricter penalties** for violations of entry and stay conditions.

### Existing Laws to be Replaced

The bill proposes to repeal four existing laws that currently govern India's immigration and foreigner management system. These laws are:

- **The Passport (Entry into India) Act, 1920**
- **The Registration of Foreigners Act, 1939**
- **The Foreigners Act, 1946**
- **The Immigration (Carriers' Liability) Act, 2000**

The government justifies the introduction of this new bill by stating that it aims to remove overlapping provisions, ensure a **simplified legal framework**, and provide better control over foreign nationals in the country.

### Key Provisions of the Immigration and Foreigners Bill, 2025

#### 1. Entry Restrictions for Foreigners

The bill specifies that **any foreigner who poses a threat to national security, sovereignty, or the integrity of the nation will be denied entry** into India or will not be permitted to stay in the country. This provision reinforces India's stance on **tightening border security and immigration control**.

#### 2. Mandatory Registration and Movement Restrictions

Under the new bill, foreign nationals will be required to **register upon arrival** in India. Additional regulations include:

- Restriction of **movement within India**, preventing access to **protected and restricted areas** without prior permission.
- Limiting **name changes and identity modifications**.
- **Educational institutions, hospitals, and nursing homes** will be obligated to **report foreign nationals' presence** to immigration authorities.

#### 3. Stricter Penalties for Violations

The bill introduces **severe punishments** for foreigners who violate entry and stay conditions in India. The penalties include:

- **Illegal entry without a valid passport or visa**: Up to **5 years of imprisonment** and a **fine of ₹5 lakh**.
- **Usage of forged documents**: Jail term of **2 to 7 years**, with fines ranging from **₹1 lakh to ₹10 lakh**.
- **Overstaying or violating visa conditions**: Up to **3 years of imprisonment** and a **fine of ₹3 lakh**.
- **Trespassing in restricted areas**: Strict legal action, including detention and deportation.

#### 4. Liability of Transport Carriers

The bill places significant responsibility on **transport carriers**, including **airlines, shipping companies, and other means of transportation**. Key provisions include:

- Carriers transporting foreigners **without valid documents** will be subject to a **fine of up to ₹5 lakh**.
- If a foreigner is denied entry into India, the carrier will be **responsible for their immediate removal**.
- Failure to comply could lead to **seizure of the transport vehicle** if penalties are not paid.

#### 5. Powers of Immigration Officers

The bill enhances the authority of immigration officials by granting them the power to:

- **Arrest individuals without a warrant** if they are found violating immigration laws.
- Regulate the **movement and stay of foreigners**.
- **Restrict exit** from India if a foreigner's presence is required for investigation or security purposes.

#### 6. Advance Passenger Data Requirement

To bolster security measures, airlines and vessels will be **required to share passenger and crew data** with immigration authorities before arrival in India. This provision aims to:

- Identify **potential security threats** in advance.
- Enable **real-time monitoring** of incoming and outgoing travelers.

### Impact and Significance of the Immigration and Foreigners Bill, 2025

#### 1. Strengthening National Security

The bill aligns with India's objective of ensuring **stronger border control and monitoring foreign nationals** to prevent **illegal immigration, espionage, and terrorism-related activities**.

#### 2. Simplification and Modernization of Immigration Laws

By replacing four separate laws with a **comprehensive legal framework**, the government aims to remove legal ambiguities and create a **streamlined system** that is easier to implement and enforce.

#### 3. Better Control Over Foreigners in India

Mandatory registration, stricter penalties, and movement restrictions will ensure that foreign nationals **comply with Indian laws** and do not pose a threat to **national security and public order**.

#### 4. Increased Accountability of Transport Carriers

By holding airlines, shipping companies, and other carriers accountable, the bill seeks to **prevent human trafficking, illegal immigration, and visa violations**.

#### Statistics on Foreign Visitors to India

According to the latest government data, a total of **9,840,321 foreigners** visited India between **April 1, 2023, and March 31, 2024**. The new bill is expected to have a significant impact on the way India regulates and manages such large numbers of foreign nationals.

**Top 10 Largest Arms Importing Countries (2020–2024): SIPRI Report**

The latest report from the **Stockholm International Peace Research Institute (SIPRI)** has unveiled the **top 10 largest arms-importing countries** from **2020 to 2024**. A key highlight of this report is the emergence of **Ukraine as the world's largest arms importer**, surpassing all other nations due to its ongoing war with Russia. Additionally, **India continues to be a dominant player**, ranking as the **second-largest arms importer** globally.

This period has witnessed a **significant increase in arms imports** across European nations, a trend largely influenced by geopolitical conflicts, particularly the **Russia-Ukraine war**. The global arms trade continues to be dominated by a few major suppliers, with the **United States leading in arms exports**.

**Global Surge in Arms Imports**

According to SIPRI, **European countries have significantly increased their arms imports**, with a staggering **155% rise** between **2020-2024** compared to the previous period (**2015-2019**). This surge is primarily driven by the **Russia-Ukraine war**, prompting nations to bolster their defense capabilities. Prior to **2022**, Ukraine **imported very few major arms**, but the war with Russia, which began in **February 2022**, led to a **massive spike in arms imports** in **2023 and 2024**. At least **35 countries** have supplied major arms to Ukraine as part of military aid, solidifying its position as the world's **top arms importer**.



The World's Largest Arms Importers (2020-2024)

The report identifies the **top five largest arms importers**, which together account for **35% of global arms imports** among **162 nations** classified by SIPRI.

Key Observations

- **Ukraine** emerged as the **largest arms importer** due to the **Russia-Ukraine war**.
- **India**, despite being the **second-largest importer**, has witnessed a **decline in arms imports**.
- **European countries** saw a **155% increase** in arms imports, driven by security concerns.
- **The United States** remains the **dominant supplier**, with **Russia, France, and China** playing significant roles in global arms trade.

India: The Second-Largest Arms Importer

India's Share in Global Arms Imports

India accounted for **8.3% of total global arms imports** between **2020 and 2024**, making it the **second-largest importer** after Ukraine. However, this marks a **9.3% decline** compared to the **2015-2019** period. This decline is attributed to India's efforts to **reduce dependency on foreign weapons** by focusing on **domestic defense manufacturing**.

Key Suppliers to India

India's top three arms suppliers during this period were:

1. **Russia** – Constituting **36% of India's total arms imports**.
2. **France** – Increasingly becoming a key defense supplier.
3. **Israel** – Strengthening defense ties with India.

Additionally, **India has been diversifying its sources** by engaging with **Western nations like the USA** to ensure strategic independence and reduce reliance on a single country.

India's Shift Towards Self-Reliance in Defense

The decline in India's arms imports is **not due to a reduction in defense needs** but rather a reflection of its **growing indigenous defense manufacturing capabilities**. The Indian government has introduced initiatives such as:

- **'Make in India' and 'Atmanirbhar Bharat' (Self-Reliant India) initiatives.**
- **Defense Procurement Policy (DPP) reforms** to encourage local production.
- **Increased investment in domestic defense technology** to reduce dependence on imports.

These efforts have led to India **manufacturing its own fighter jets, missiles, and naval warships**, decreasing reliance on foreign suppliers.

Global Trends in Arms Imports

Geopolitical Factors Influencing Arms Trade

Several key geopolitical factors have shaped the **global arms trade from 2020 to 2024**:

- **Russia-Ukraine War (2022-Present):** The conflict has driven **Ukraine's demand for weapons**, with **Western nations supplying arms in large numbers**.
- **China's Growing Influence in Asia:** Countries like **India, Japan, and Australia** are strengthening their military capabilities to counterbalance **China's military expansion**.
- **Middle East Conflicts:** Nations like **Saudi Arabia, Qatar, and Kuwait** remain key importers due to **regional security concerns**.
- **European Military Buildup:** Rising tensions with Russia have led to **increased defense spending** in Europe.

PM Narendra Modi's Historic Visit to Mauritius

Prime Minister **Narendra Modi** embarked on a **two-day state visit to Mauritius** on **March 11, 2025**, reinforcing India's long-standing ties with the island nation. During his visit, PM Modi participated in various diplomatic, cultural, and economic engagements, highlighting the **deep-rooted relationship** between the two countries. His visit was marked by significant announcements, including the **Overseas Citizen of India (OCI) cards** for Mauritian leaders, the **inauguration of over 20 India-funded projects**, and receiving **Mauritius' highest civilian honor**, The **Grand Commander of the Order of the Star and Key of the Indian Ocean**.



### Mauritius: A Bridge Between India and the Global South

During his address, **PM Modi emphasized Mauritius' role as a bridge between India and the Global South**, reaffirming the strong historical and cultural ties that unite the two nations. He stated that Mauritius is not just a **partner country** but a vital part of **India's extended family**. #### Ceremonial Welcome and State Visit Highlights

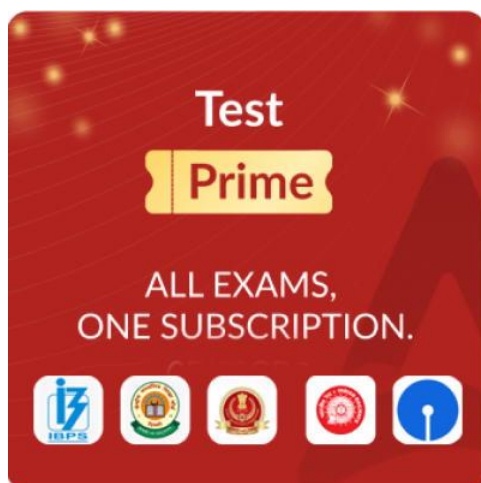
PM Modi commenced his visit with a **ceremonial welcome in Port Louis**, the capital of Mauritius. His itinerary included:

**Government Notifies Revisions to MSME Investment and Turnover Criteria: Effective April 1, 2025**

The Government of India has announced a major revision in the investment and turnover criteria for the classification of Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs). The changes, which will take effect from April 1, 2025, are aimed at enhancing business opportunities and providing greater financial flexibility to MSMEs. Under the revised criteria, investment limits have been increased by 2.5 times, and turnover limits have been doubled, as per the announcement made by Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman during the Union Budget 2025. These revisions will allow larger businesses to qualify as MSMEs, facilitating better access to credit, government incentives, and support schemes.

Introduction: A Historic Budget for Delhi

**RBI Revises Priority Sector Lending (PSL) Norms Effective April 1, 2025**

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has issued revised **Priority Sector Lending (PSL) guidelines**, which will come into effect from **April 1, 2025**. The new norms aim to enhance credit accessibility to priority sectors, including **agriculture, MSMEs, renewable energy, housing, education, and social infrastructure**. These revisions introduce higher loan limits, expand the 'Weaker Sections' category, and revise the PSL targets for urban cooperative banks (UCBs). The changes are designed to boost financial inclusion and promote economic growth in critical areas.



**Key Highlights of RBI's Revised PSL Guidelines**

**1. Enhancement of Loan Limits**

- **Education Loans:** Increased limit to ₹25 lakh per individual (including vocational courses).
- **Social Infrastructure:** Up to ₹8 crore per borrower for setting up schools, drinking water facilities, etc.
- **Housing Loans** (Priority sector classification based on population size):
  - ₹50 lakh – Centers with a population of 50 lakh and above.
  - ₹45 lakh – Centers with a population between 10 lakh and 50 lakh.
  - ₹35 lakh – Centers with a population below 10 lakh.

**2. Focus on Renewable Energy**

- Loans up to ₹35 crore for renewable energy-based power generators and public utilities (e.g., street lighting systems, remote village electrification).
- Loan limit for individual households: ₹10 lakh per borrower.

**3. Revised PSL Targets for Urban Cooperative Banks (UCBs)**

- **Total PSL target:** 60% of Adjusted Net Bank Credit (ANBC) or Credit Equivalent of Off-Balance Sheet Exposures (CEOBSE).
- **Micro Enterprises:** 7.5% of ANBC.
- **Advances to Weaker Sections:** 12% of ANBC.

The revised definition now includes transgenders, in addition to,

- Scheduled Castes (SC) & Scheduled Tribes (ST).
- Persons with disabilities.
- Minority communities notified by the Government of India.
- Individual women beneficiaries up to ₹2 lakh (The limit is not applicable to UCBs).



**Lok Sabha Passes Finance Bill 2025: Key Highlights and Implications**

On Tuesday, March 25, 2025, the Lok Sabha passed the Finance Bill 2025 along with 35 government amendments. One of the key amendments includes the abolition of the six per cent digital tax on online advertisements. The passage of the Finance Bill 2025 marks the completion of the Budgetary approval process in the Lower House. Now, the bill moves to the Rajya Sabha for further consideration, after which the Budget process for FY 2025-26 will be formally concluded.

**Finance Bill 2025 and Budgetary Overview**

The Union Budget 2025-26 outlines a total expenditure of ₹50.65 lakh crore, reflecting a 7.4 per cent increase over FY 2024-25. The government has proposed a capital expenditure of ₹11.22 lakh crore, with an effective capital expenditure of ₹15.48 lakh crore. The projected gross tax revenue collection stands at ₹42.70 lakh crore, while the estimated gross borrowing is ₹14.01 lakh crore.

**Key Announcements in Finance Bill 2025**

Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman highlighted that the Finance Bill 2025 aligns with India's vision for Viksit Bharat by 2047 and ensures tax certainty. She emphasized the following objectives:

- **Rationalization of tax provisions** to enhance ease of doing business.
- **Unprecedented tax relief** measures for individuals and businesses.
- A strong focus on **increasing tax mobilization** from individuals with foreign assets.

According to budget documents, the allocation for Centrally Sponsored Schemes for FY 2025-26 is ₹5,41,850.21 crore, a substantial increase from ₹4,15,356.25 crore in FY 2024-25. Similarly, Central Sector Schemes will receive ₹16.29 lakh crore compared to ₹15.13 lakh crore in the previous fiscal year.

**Budget Estimates for FY 2025-26**

The budget estimates have been revised upwards due to several economic and strategic factors:

- **Rise in interest payments** on market loans, treasury bills, external loans, and provident funds.
- Increased capital expenditure for the Armed Forces.
- Provisions for employment generation schemes.

**State Allocations and Fiscal Deficit**

The total resource transfer to states in Budget 2025-26, including state share devolution, grants/loans, and Centrally Sponsored Schemes, stands at ₹25,01,284 crore. This marks an increase of ₹4,91,668 crore compared to the actuals of 2023-24.

The fiscal deficit for FY 2025-26 is projected at 4.4 per cent of GDP, down from 4.8 per cent in the current fiscal. Additionally, the GDP for FY 2025-26 is estimated at ₹3,56,97,923 crore, a 10.1 per cent increase over the Revised Estimates for FY 2024-25 (₹3,24,11,406 crore) released by the National Statistical Office (NSO).



### 5 Years of National Technical Textiles Mission

India's textile industry plays a crucial role in the national economy and has evolved into a hub of innovation. The country ranks as the **6th largest textile exporter globally, holding a 3.9% share in world textile exports**. Contributing nearly 2% to the GDP, the sector is projected to expand to \$350 billion by 2030, generating approximately 3.5 crore jobs. While traditional textiles remain fundamental, the rise of technical textiles is transforming the industry. These specialized fabrics prioritize functionality over aesthetics and are categorized into 12 types, serving diverse industries such as agriculture, healthcare, construction, and safety.

To accelerate this sector's growth, the **National Technical Textiles Mission (NTTM) was launched in 2020**, with a budget of Rs. 1,480 crore for 2020-2026. The mission aims to strengthen research, boost exports, foster skill development, and position India as a global leader in technical textiles.

#### Framework for the National Technical Textiles Mission (NTTM)

##### Four key components of NTTM

Component I – Research, Innovation, and Development

- Focuses on research and innovation in technical textiles.
- Supports R&D projects to develop new materials and technologies.
- 168 research projects worth Rs. 509 crore have been approved.

Component II – Promotion and Market Development

- Encourages the adoption of technical textiles in various industries.
- Strengthens market linkages through trade shows, exhibitions, and global collaborations.

Component III – Export Promotion

- Aims to enhance India's exports of technical textiles.
- Works through a dedicated Export Promotion Council to boost international trade.

Component IV – Education, Training, and Skill Development

- Develops skill-training programs to create a skilled workforce.
- 50,000 individuals are being trained in technical textiles.
- Promotes specialized courses in technical textiles across educational institutes.
- Since its launch, Rs. 517 crore has been allocated, with Rs. 393.39 crore utilized for research, market development, exports, and skill development.

1. Grant for Internship Support for Technical Textiles (GIST 2.0)

- Provides hands-on learning opportunities for students and professionals.

- Enhances industry-academia collaboration to foster innovation.

2. Grant for Research & Entrepreneurship across Aspiring Innovators in Technical Textiles (GREAT) Scheme
- Launched in August 2023 to support commercialization of new textile technologies.
  - 8 startups have received Rs. 50 lakh each for innovations in medical, industrial, and protective textiles.
  - IIT Indore and NIT Patna have received Rs. 6.5 crore to introduce specialized courses.

- Targets training of 50,000 individuals in the field of technical textiles.

## NATIONAL NEWS

Cabinet Approvals

- The Union Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, has approved the Revision of the Livestock Health and Disease Control Programme (LHDCP) with a total outlay of Rs. 3,880 crore for 2024-25 and 2025-26. The scheme comprises three components: National Animal Disease Control Programme (NADCP), LH&DC, and the newly introduced Pashu Aushadhi. LH&DC includes Critical Animal Disease Control Programme (CADCP), Establishment and Strengthening of Veterinary Hospitals and Dispensaries - Mobile Veterinary Unit (ESVHD-MVU), and Assistance to States for Control of Animal Diseases (ASCAD). Pashu Aushadhi aims to provide quality and affordable veterinary medicines with a Rs. 75 crore provision. The scheme focuses on reducing livestock productivity losses caused by diseases like Foot and Mouth Disease (FMD), Brucellosis, Peste des Petits Ruminants (PPR), Classical Swine Fever (CSF), and Lumpy Skin Disease through immunization, vaccination, and improved healthcare access. It also ensures doorstep veterinary services via Mobile Veterinary Units and enhances the availability of generic medicines through PM-Kisan Samridhhi Kendras and Cooperative Societies. By preventing and controlling livestock diseases, LHDCP will boost productivity, generate employment, encourage rural entrepreneurship, and minimize economic losses for farmers.
- The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CCEA), chaired by Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, has approved the construction of a 12.4 km ropeway from Govindghat to Hemkund Sahib Ji in Uttarakhand at a total capital cost of Rs. 2,730.13 crore under the Design, Build, Finance, Operate, and Transfer (DBFOT) mode. Currently, the 21-km uphill trek to Hemkund Sahib Ji is challenging and covered on foot, ponies, or palanquins, but the proposed ropeway will provide all-weather last-mile connectivity, benefiting both pilgrims and tourists visiting the Valley of Flowers. Developed through a public-private partnership, the ropeway will feature Monocable Detachable Gondola (MDG) technology from Govindghat to Ghangaria (10.55 km) and Tricable Detachable Gondola (3S) technology from Ghangaria to Hemkund Sahib Ji (1.85 km), with a design capacity of 1,100 passengers per hour per direction (PPHPD), accommodating 11,000 passengers daily. This project will create employment opportunities in construction, operations, and allied tourism sectors like hospitality, travel, and food & beverages, fostering socio-economic growth in the region. Hemkund Sahib Ji, a revered pilgrimage site at 15,000 ft in Chamoli district, is open for about five months annually and attracts 1.5 to 2 lakh pilgrims. The trek also serves as a gateway to the Valley of Flowers, a UNESCO World Heritage site in the pristine Garhwal Himalayas.

- The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CCEA), chaired by Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, has approved the construction of a 12.9 km ropeway from Sonprayag to Kedarnath in Uttarakhand at a total capital cost of Rs. 4,081.28 crore under the Design, Build, Finance, Operate, and Transfer (DBFOT) mode. Developed through a public-private partnership, the ropeway will feature the advanced Tri-cable Detachable Gondola (3S) technology with a design capacity of 1,800 passengers per hour per direction (PPHPD), carrying 18,000 passengers daily. This project will significantly benefit pilgrims by offering an environment-friendly, comfortable, and fast alternative, reducing travel time from 8-9 hours to just 36 minutes. It will also create employment opportunities in construction, operations, and allied tourism sectors like hospitality, travel, and food & beverages, boosting socio-economic growth. Currently, the 16-km uphill trek from Gaurikund to Kedarnath is covered on foot, ponies, palanquins, or helicopters, but the ropeway will ensure all-weather connectivity and enhance accessibility. Kedarnath, one of the 12 sacred Jyotirlingas, is located at an altitude of 3,583 m (11,968 ft) in Rudraprayag district and remains open for about 6-7 months annually, attracting around 20 lakh pilgrims each season.

State-wise March Month Important Events**Andhra Pradesh**

- The **Government of Andhra Pradesh** will sign an **MoU** with the **Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation** to integrate **Artificial Intelligence (AI), digital technologies, and data-driven governance** in sectors like **healthcare, education, agriculture, and employment**.
- Andhra Pradesh CM **N. Chandrababu Naidu** announced a **58-foot statue of Potti Sriramulu** in **Amaravati** to honor his **sacrifice for Andhra Pradesh's formation in 1953**. Along with a **memorial**, his **native house in Padamatipalli** will be converted into a **museum**, and a **modern health center and high school** will be established in his village. The project will be completed before his next **birth anniversary**.

**Assam**

- The **Assam government** has named the upcoming **Electronics City in Jagiroad** as **Ratan Tata Electronic City**, honoring **Ratan Tata's contributions** to the state's **industrial and economic growth**. Announced after **Advantage Assam 2.0 Summit (Feb 2025)**, the move recognizes the **Tata Group's impact** in **semiconductors, electronics manufacturing, and investment** in Assam.





- The **Assam** state government announced plans to launch its own satellite, **ASSAMSAT**, to enhance data access for **socio-economic initiatives** and **border security**. Announced by **Assam Finance Minister Ajanta Neog** in the **2025-26 state budget**, ASSAMSAT will support **agriculture, disaster management, infrastructure development, and security operations**, making Assam the first Indian state to launch its own satellite.
- **Union Home Minister Amit Shah** inaugurated the **Lachit Barphukan Police Academy** in **Dergaon, Assam**, on **March 15, 2025**. Named after the legendary Ahom general **Lachit Barphukan**, the academy aims to strengthen **policing** in the **Northeast** and become a premier training institution. The event was attended by **Assam CM Dr. Himanta Biswa Sarma** and **Union Minister Sarbananda Sonowal**.
- The **Union Cabinet**, chaired by **Prime Minister Narendra Modi**, approved the establishment of the **Namrup-IV Brownfield Ammonia-Urea Complex** in **Assam**. The ₹10,601.40 crore project, with an annual capacity of **12.7 LMT**, will be developed under a **Joint Venture** and is expected to boost **domestic urea production**, improve fertilizer availability in **Eastern India**, and create employment. The plant will be commissioned in **48 months**.

#### Bihar

- The **Nitish Kumar-led NDA** government in **Bihar** presented the **₹3,16,895 crore Budget for the financial year 2025-26 on March 3, 2025**. Deputy Chief Minister and Finance Minister **Samrat Choudhary** highlighted a significant increase in the state's Budget size over the years and emphasized allocations for **education, health, rural development, and welfare schemes**. The Budget also introduced several measures for **women's empowerment and employment generation** while maintaining fiscal discipline within FRBM limits.

#### Chhattisgarh

- The **Chhattisgarh government** has unveiled its **Budget for the financial year 2025**, prioritizing **capital expenditure, digital governance, infrastructure development, and welfare schemes**. The budget, amounting to **₹1,65,000 crore**, was presented by **State Finance Minister O.P. Choudhary** in the **Chhattisgarh Legislative Assembly on March 4, 2025**.
- The **Chhattisgarh government**, led by **CM Vishnu Deo Sai**, plans to introduce a stricter **anti-conversion law** to prevent illegal religious conversions. The new law aims to stop conversions through **coercion, inducements, or faith healing** gatherings. While the opposition claims conversions are rising, **Home Minister Vijay Sharma** assured strict action against illegal conversions, and concerns were raised about NGOs allegedly using **foreign funds** for conversion activities.

#### Himachal Pradesh

- Himachal Pradesh Chief Minister **Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu** presented the **annual budget for FY 2025-26**, amounting to **Rs 58,514 crore**. The budget emphasizes **tourism, rural development, and green energy**, while also addressing financial challenges such as a **reduction in the Revenue Deficit Grant** and the **withdrawal of GST compensation**.

#### Karnataka

- **Karnataka CM Siddaramaiah** announced that **Bangalore City University** will be renamed as **Dr. Manmohan Singh Bengaluru University** in honor of the **late former PM Manmohan Singh**. The government plans to develop it into a **model university**, incorporating **Government Arts College and Government RC College** as constituent institutions.

#### Kerala

- **Kerala CM Pinarayi Vijayan** inaugurated the **Advanced Cybersecurity Operations Centre (SOC)** of the **Kerala Police Cyber Division** to strengthen cybersecurity infrastructure. Developed by **C-DOT**, the **TRINETRA** system enhances police system security and critical infrastructure protection. This initiative highlights **India's commitment to indigenous cybersecurity solutions**.
- **Kerala** has become the first state in India to establish a **Senior Citizens Commission** by passing the **Kerala State Senior Citizens Commission Bill, 2025**. This statutory body, focused on safeguarding the **rights and welfare** of elderly citizens, will also serve as an advisory body for policymaking, highlighting Kerala's commitment to the **protection, rehabilitation, and empowerment** of senior citizens.

#### Maharashtra

- The **Maharashtra Budget 2025-26** was tabled by **Deputy Chief Minister Ajit Pawar**, who holds the **Finance portfolio**. This budget comes after the **landslide victory of the Mahayuti government** in the assembly elections and is marked by severe financial constraints. The state is facing its **highest-ever debt projection of Rs 9.3 lakh crore** and the **steepest revenue deficit**, estimated at **Rs 45,891 crore** for the fiscal year 2025-26. Due to these financial challenges, the budget does not introduce any **big-ticket schemes** and instead focuses on sustaining existing initiatives.
- **Maharashtra CM Devendra Fadnavis** inaugurated the **state's first temple** dedicated to **Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj** in **Bhiwandi, Thane**, on his birth anniversary. The temple honors Shivaji Maharaj's **heroism, valour, and enduring legacy**, providing a sacred space for devotees to pay tribute to his contributions to **India's history**.



**Madhya Pradesh**

- On **March 3, 2025**, Chief Minister **Mohan Yadav** announced that **farmers in Madhya Pradesh** will receive **permanent power connections** for just **Rs 5**, aiming to provide **affordable electricity** and boost **agricultural productivity**. The initiative, implemented through the **Madhya Pradesh Central Power Distribution Company**, underscores the government's commitment to improving **rural infrastructure** and promoting **sustainable farming practices**.
- Madhav National Park** in **Madhya Pradesh** has been officially declared as **India's 58th Tiger Reserve** on **March 9, 2025**. The announcement was made by **Union Environment Minister Bhupender Yadav**, marking another milestone in the country's ongoing efforts to protect and conserve its rich biodiversity. With this recognition, Madhya Pradesh now boasts **nine tiger reserves**, further solidifying its reputation as the **'Tiger State' of India**.

**Meghalaya**

- Meghalaya CM Conrad K. Sangma** inaugurated the state's **first scientific coal mining block, "Saryngkham-A"**, at **Byndihati, East Jaintia Hills**, marking a shift from **rat-hole mining**, which was **banned by the NGT in 2014** due to **safety and environmental concerns**. This initiative promotes **safe and sustainable coal mining** in the **coal-rich Jaintia Hills region**.

**Odisha**

- A **UK Skills and Chartered Bodies Mission** delegation is visiting **Odisha** to explore **partnerships in vocational education and skill development**. Discussions focused on **industry-led skilling, UK-style apprenticeships, and training in advanced manufacturing, renewable energy, digital skills, and sustainable infrastructure**. **Minister Sampad Chandra Swain** and **British Deputy High Commissioner Andrew Fleming** emphasized collaboration to build a **globally competitive workforce**.

**Punjab**

- Punjab's **Social Security, Women, and Child Development Minister Dr. Baljit Kaur** launched **'Project Hifazat'** on **March 7, 2025**, to enhance **women and child safety**. The initiative features a **24x7 helpline (181)**, coordinated government support, and rapid response mechanisms to combat **gender-based violence**. Dr. Kaur urged women to use the helpline, emphasizing **empowerment and swift action** against crimes.

**Telangana**

- The **Telangana Government** has presented its most ambitious budget to date, crossing the **₹3 lakh crore** mark for the first time since the state's formation. The budget, which amounts to **₹3.04 lakh crore**, reflects the government's commitment to **welfare programs, economic growth, and infrastructure development**. Deputy Chief Minister **Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka**, who also holds the Finance portfolio, presented the budget in the state assembly, emphasizing inclusivity and equitable resource distribution. The financial plan outlines significant allocations for **agriculture, education, backward classes, and flagship welfare schemes**, all while balancing fiscal challenges.
- The **Padmaja Naidu Himalayan Zoological Park** in **Darjeeling** has become **India's first zoo** to preserve **wildlife DNA** from snowy regions. In collaboration with **CCMB Hyderabad**, the project aims to support **conservation and genetic research**. **60 DNA samples**, including from **red pandas and snow leopards**, have been collected and cryogenically preserved. This initiative ensures long-term **genetic material** preservation for endangered species.

**Tamil Nadu**

- The **Tamil Nadu government's** decision to replace the **Indian Rupee symbol (₹)** with the **Tamil letter '₹'** in the **state budget logo** has reignited the **language debate** in India. Led by **Chief Minister M K Stalin**, this move aligns with Tamil Nadu's stance against the imposition of **Hindi** and reflects ongoing resistance to the **National Education Policy (NEP)**, which the state views as "saffronized."
- Prime Minister **Narendra Modi** will inaugurate the new **Pamban rail bridge** connecting **Ramanathapuram** and **Rameswaram Island** on **April 6, 2025**, coinciding with **Ram Navami**. The bridge, costing **₹531 crore**, aims to boost **connectivity and railway infrastructure** in the region. The Prime Minister will also flag off a new **train service** between **Tambaram** and **Rameswaram** and address a public gathering.

**Uttarakhand**

- Uttarakhand Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami** announced the development of **corridors** along the **Ganga** and **Sharda rivers** to boost **religious tourism** in the state. The initiative will enhance **infrastructure** and facilities for pilgrims while preserving **cultural and spiritual heritage**. CM Dhami also highlighted the significance of **ancient Indian scriptures** in shaping both **scientific and spiritual thought** at the **62nd All India Shastraotsav** in **Haridwar**.



**Uttar Pradesh**

- **Uttar Pradesh** has launched the 'Rapid Immunisation Skill Enhancement' (RISE) app to strengthen its immunization program. Designed for nurses, ANMs, and health workers, the app enhances vaccination tracking, training, and safety management. It provides real-time updates on vaccination schedules, cold chain management, and adverse effect monitoring, replacing traditional training with digital learning for improved efficiency and outreach.

**West Bengal**

- The **West Bengal Police** has launched a mobile app to ensure a transparent and corruption-free transfer process for personnel, from constables to sub-inspectors. Integrated with e-HRMS software, the app aims to eliminate malpractices like bribery and favoritism. Transfer requests must be submitted digitally by **April 11**.

**Union Territories of India**

- On **March 18, 2025**, the **Delhi government** will sign an MoU with the **Ministry of Health and Family Welfare** to implement the **Pradhan Mantri Ayushman Bharat Health Infrastructure Mission (PM-ABHIM)**. The scheme will establish **1,139 Urban Ayushman Arogya Mandirs (U-AAMs)** in Delhi, upgrading **553 mohalla clinics** and setting up **413 new U-AAMs** to strengthen primary healthcare services and address future pandemics. This follows a legal battle and political changes in Delhi.
- The **Delhi Police** has launched 'Shishtachar' squads across all districts to enhance women's safety in public spaces. These anti-eve-teasing squads focus on harassment prevention through active patrolling, surprise checks, and public outreach. Each squad consists of an **Inspector, Sub-Inspector, 4 female officers, 5 male officers, and a technical personnel for surveillance support**. Supervised by the **ACP of the Crime Against Women (CAW) cell**, the initiative aims to create a secure environment for women.
- **Delhi Health Minister Pankaj Kumar Singh** launched six mobile dental clinics on **World Oral Health Day** to provide free oral healthcare. The initiative, a collaboration between the **Delhi government** and **Maulana Azad Institute of Dental Sciences (MAIDS)**, targets underserved areas like slums. The clinics are equipped with modern dental chairs, X-ray machines, and sterilization units, offering fluoride treatments and dental care to residents.

**October Month Launches & Inaugurations:**

- India has inaugurated its first **World Peace Center** in **Gurugram, Haryana**, established by **Ahimsa Vishwa Bharti** under the guidance of **Jain Acharya Lokesh**. The center aims to promote non-violence, spiritual awareness, human values, and universal brotherhood.

- **Prime Minister Narendra Modi** inaugurated **Vantara**, an advanced animal rescue, conservation, and rehabilitation center in **Gujarat's Jamnagar district**. The event was attended by **Mukesh Ambani, Nita Ambani, Anant Ambani, and Radhika Merchant**. PM Modi explored the state-of-the-art facilities, interacted with rehabilitated animals, and observed medical procedures at the center's **wildlife hospital**, highlighting **wildlife conservation** and efforts to protect endangered species in India.
- **President Smt. Droupadi Murmu** inaugurated the **second edition of Vividhta Ka Amrit Mahotsav** at **Rashtrapati Bhavan** on **March 5, 2025**. The festival celebrates India's cultural heritage, with this edition highlighting the **Southern states of Karnataka, Kerala, Tamil Nadu, Telangana, Andhra Pradesh, and the Union Territories of Lakshadweep and Puducherry**.
- Union Minister **Ashwini Vaishnaw** launched key initiatives under the **IndiaAI Mission** to boost AI research, innovation, and skill development. The initiatives include **AIKosha: IndiaAI Datasets Platform**, a secured hub for datasets, models, and AI use cases with sandbox capabilities, encryption, and secure APIs. Additionally, the **IndiaAI Compute Portal** offers AI compute, storage, and cloud services with up to **40% subsidy** on high-end GPUs (**NVIDIA H100, AMD MI300x, AWS Tranium**) to support AI development in India.
- **Indian Railways** is contributing to **Mission Amrit Sarovar**, launched in April 2022, to address water scarcity and enhance groundwater recharge. The mission focuses on rejuvenating 75 ponds in each district with community participation and climate resilience. By October 2024, over 68,000 ponds were rejuvenated. In **Phase 2**, Indian Railways will assist in desilting, excavating, and constructing new water bodies near railway lines, using the excavated material for railway embankments.
- The **Ministry of Panchayati Raj** has launched two initiatives — **Sashakt Panchayat-Netri Abhiyan** and **Model Women-Friendly Gram Panchayats (MWFGP)** — to empower **Women Elected Representatives (WERS)** in Panchayati Raj Institutions (PRIs). The **Sashakt Panchayat-Netri Abhiyan** focuses on capacity building to enhance leadership and decision-making, aiming to eliminate the "Mukhiya Pati" culture. The **MWFGP** initiative seeks to establish gender-sensitive, girl-friendly governance in every district.
- **Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman** launched a mobile app for the **Prime Minister's Internship Scheme (PMIS)** in **New Delhi**. The app aims to streamline registration, provide real-time updates, and offer an intuitive interface for candidates. This initiative supports the government's commitment to employment, skilling, and creating opportunities for the youth.



- **Indore** is launching **India's first green waste processing plant** under the **PPP model** as part of the **Swachh Bharat Mission-Urban**. The plant will convert green waste into **wooden pellets**, providing an eco-friendly alternative to coal and promoting **sustainability**. It aims to generate revenue for **Indore Municipal Corporation (IMC)** and contribute to a **circular economy** and **innovative waste management**.

It supports **startups in Telecom Software, Cybersecurity, 5G/6G, AI, IoT, and Quantum Technologies**, with **STPI as the implementation partner**. Running in **hybrid mode**, the program will have **two cohorts per year**, each with **18 startups**, offering **funding, mentorship, and infrastructure support**.
- The **Purple Fest 2025**, held at **Rashtrapati Bhavan** and organized by **DePWD, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment**, saw **23,500 attendees** promoting **inclusivity, accessibility, and empowerment for Divyangjan**. The event featured **literary discussions, sports, corporate collaborations, and cultural performances**, fostering an **inclusive society**.
- The **Indian Institute of Corporate Affairs (IICA)** launched **Samarthya 2025** on **March 22-23, 2025**, at its **Manesar campus**. The event offers students a platform to develop **corporate rescue strategies** for distressed businesses, focusing on **financial analysis, strategy development, and industry engagement** through **case studies** and **expert mentorship**. Winning solutions receive **industry recognition**.
- The **"Baalpan ki Kavita"** Initiative, launched by the **Department of School Education & Literacy** under the **Ministry of Education**, aims to preserve and promote **Indian rhymes and poems** for young children. Aligning with the **National Education Policy (NEP) 2020**, it focuses on **early childhood education, multilingualism, and cultural relevance**. The initiative encourages contributions of rhymes in various **Indian languages** and English, targeting children aged **3-8 years** across three categories: **Pre-primary, Grade 1, and Grade 2**.
- The **Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare** launched the **Digital Crop Survey (DCS) System** to collect **real-time crop data** through a mobile interface, improving **accuracy** in crop area estimation and agricultural forecasting. Integrated with **Agri Stack**, the system ensures **data privacy** through farmer consent, secure encryption, and compliance with the **Digital Personal Data Protection Act, 2023**. **State control, regular security audits, and restricted data sharing** safeguard the information.
- **Chief of Defence Staff (CDS) Gen Anil Chauhan** inaugurated **Techkriti 2025** at **IIT Kanpur**, Asia's largest **tech and entrepreneurial festival**, under the theme **"Panta Rhei" (Everything Flows)**. He emphasized the modernization of the **Indian Armed Forces** through **Cybersecurity, AI, Quantum Computing, and Cognitive Warfare**, urging young innovators to contribute to **national security**.
- **Union Home and Cooperation Minister Amit Shah** announced the launch of '**Sahkar**', a **cooperative-based taxi service** modeled on **Ola and Uber** but designed to **empower drivers as stakeholders**. Unlike corporate-owned ride-hailing platforms, '**Sahkar**' ensures **fair earnings and profit-sharing** under the **cooperative framework**. Introduced during discussions on the **Multi-State Cooperative Societies (Amendment) Bill, 2023**.

### Miscellaneous National News

- India has conducted its first-ever **population estimation of riverine dolphins**, revealing a total of **6,327 dolphins** across the **Ganga, Brahmaputra, and Indus river systems**. This significant study, conducted as part of '**Project Dolphin**', provides crucial insights into the status and distribution of these **endangered freshwater species**. The findings, published in a government report on Monday, highlight the ecological importance of river dolphins and the need for conservation efforts.
- The **Indian Railway Catering and Tourism Corporation (IRCTC)** and **Indian Railway Finance Corporation (IRFC)** were granted **Navratna PSU status** by the Indian government on **March 4, 2025**, granting them greater **financial and operational autonomy**. With this, all seven listed railway PSUs have achieved **Navratna status**, reflecting the government's commitment to enhancing the efficiency and profitability of **railway-owned enterprises**.
- **Union Minister for New and Renewable Energy, Shri Pralhad Joshi**, emphasized India's commitment to becoming a global leader in **green hydrogen** production. Speaking at the launch of India's first fleet of **hydrogen-powered truck trials** in **New Delhi**, he highlighted the role of the **National Green Hydrogen Mission (NGHM)** in achieving **energy independence** and reducing **carbon emissions**, under **Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership**.
- On **March 4, 2025**, the **Supreme Court of India** ruled that the **right against disability-based discrimination** is a **fundamental right**, in line with the **RPwD Act, 2016**. The judgment allows **visually impaired candidates** to participate in **judicial service recruitment**, ensuring **equal opportunity** and **reasonable accommodation**. The verdict was delivered by Justices **J B Pardiwala** and **R Mahadevan**.



- The **Government of India** has approved the construction of a **12.4 km ropeway** from **Govindghat to Hemkund Sahib Ji** in **Uttarakhand** under the **National Ropeways Development Programme – Parvatmala Pariyojana**. This project aims to provide **all-weather connectivity** to the **Hemkund Sahib** pilgrimage site, boosting **tourism** and **local employment**.
- The **Government of India** has approved the construction of a **12.9 km ropeway** from **Sonprayag to Kedarnath** under the **National Ropeways Development Programme – Parvatmala Pariyojana**. This project aims to provide **all-weather connectivity** to the **Kedarnath Temple**, reducing **travel time** and boosting **tourism** and **employment** in the region.
- Prime Minister **Narendra Modi** chaired the **seventh NBWL meeting** in **Sasan, Junagadh, Gujarat**, with **Union Minister Bhupender Yadav**. Key decisions included the **16th Asiatic Lion Population Estimation**, scheduled for **May 2024**, aimed at assessing the lion population, habitat, and conservation challenges.
- The **Ministry of Mines**, in collaboration with **Coal India Limited (CIL)**, organized the **“Celebrating Women in Mining Sector”** event ahead of **International Women’s Day** to recognize and promote **women’s contributions in mining**. Attended by **key ministers, industry leaders, and organizations** like **IBM, TATA, GSI, ADANI, and Vedanta**, the event honored **46 outstanding women professionals** and featured **panel discussions on gender inclusivity and empowerment**. This initiative highlights the government’s commitment to **breaking barriers and ensuring equal opportunities for women in mining**.
- The **Sahitya Akademi Festival of Letters 2025**, Asia’s largest literature festival, will be held at **Rabindra Bhavan, New Delhi, from 7th to 12th March 2025**. Inaugurated by **Union Minister Gajendra Singh Shekhawat**, the event will feature **Mahesh Dattani** as the chief guest at the **Sahitya Akademi Awards** ceremony and **Upamanyu Chatterjee** delivering the **Samvatsar Lecture**. With **700 writers from 50+ languages across 100 sessions**.
- Launched on **August 26, 2021**, the **e-Shram portal** aims to create a **National Database of Unorganised Workers (NDUW)**, providing workers with a **Universal Account Number (UAN)** and linking them to **social security and welfare schemes**. By **March 3, 2025**, over **30.68 crore** workers had registered, with **53.68% women**. To enhance accessibility, features like **multilingual support, a mobile app, and integration with welfare schemes** were added. The **e-Shram One-Stop-Solution**, launched on **October 21, 2024**, integrates welfare programs for easier access.
- The **literacy rate** among **Muslims** in India has significantly improved, rising from **59.1% in Census 2001** to **68.5% in Census 2011**. Despite this, it was still below the national literacy rate of **73.0%** in 2011. The **PLFS 2023-24** shows further improvement, with the **Muslim literacy rate** at **79.5%**, compared to **80.9%** for all religious communities.
- The **National Archives of India (NAI)** celebrated its **135th Foundation Day** on **March 11, 2025**, with the inauguration of the **“Indian Heritage through Architecture”** exhibition by **Union Minister Shri Gajendra Singh Shekhawat**. The exhibition showcased **India's architectural heritage** through archival documents and rare records. The event also launched the **‘Gyan Bharatam Mission’** to expand access to India’s knowledge repository, while the world’s **largest digitization program** is underway to preserve historical documents.
- The **Oilfield (Regulatory and Development) Amendment Bill, 2024** was passed by the **Lok Sabha** on **March 12, 2025**, after **Rajya Sabha** approval in **December 2024**. The Bill reforms India’s **oil and gas** exploration and production framework to attract investments, boost production, and ensure **energy security**. Key reforms include shifting from a **Production Sharing** to a **Revenue Sharing** regime, simplifying processes, **deregulation of crude oil**, and **pricing freedom for natural gas**.
- The **Fit India Carnival**, a three-day event held from **March 16-18, 2025**, at **Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium, New Delhi**, was inaugurated by **Dr. Mansukh Mandaviya**, Union Minister for Youth Affairs and Sports. The event aimed to promote **fitness, mental well-being, and healthy lifestyle choices**. It featured stars like **Ayushmann Khurrana, Sangram Singh, Mickey Mehta, Shanky Singh, and Rohtash Chaudhary**.
- **Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw** visited the **Hyperloop testing facility** at **IIT Madras**, announcing that the **410-meter Hyperloop tube** would soon become the world’s longest high-speed tube. The **Indian Railways Ministry** is supporting the project, with **Integral Coach Factory (ICF) Chennai** handling the electronic technology. Vaishnaw also attended **Open House 2025** at IIT Madras, discussing India’s advancements in **semiconductors, AI, and data science**, and reaffirming the government’s commitment to technological leadership under **Prime Minister Narendra Modi**.
- **Dr. Jitendra Singh**, Union Minister of Science and Technology, laid the foundation stone for the **North East Centre for Technology Application and Reach (NECTAR)** permanent campus at **Mawdiangdiang, Shillong**, on **March 13, 2025**. Established in **2014** under the **Department of Science and Technology (DST)**, NECTAR focuses on **technology-driven socio-economic development** in the Northeast. The Minister highlighted NECTAR’s work in **saffron cultivation, drone technology, and STEM education**, aiming to make the region India's next saffron hub.



- The Indian government is advancing its nuclear energy efforts with two major projects: the **Jaitapur Nuclear Power Plant** in Maharashtra and the **Gorakhpur Nuclear Power Project** in Haryana. The **Jaitapur plant** will contribute 10% to India's **100 GW nuclear energy target** by 2047, while **Gorakhpur** is the first nuclear facility in **North India**. Addressing concerns over **environmental impact, safety, and nuclear liability**, **Dr. Jitendra Singh** emphasized the commitment to **sustainable energy** and private sector involvement in nuclear energy expansion.
- The **Ministry of Culture**, through **Lalit Kala Akademi (LKA)** and **National Gallery of Modern Arts (NGMA)**, is preserving public art installations under the **Public Art of India (PARI)** project. LKA has implemented a **preservation strategy** to ensure the **sustainability and longevity** of these installations, transforming **Delhi's public spaces** into vibrant artistic landmarks and promoting **regional art forms** globally.
- The **North Eastern Handicrafts and Handlooms Development Corporation Ltd. (NEHDC)** has achieved a significant milestone by obtaining the **Oeko-Tex certification** for **eri silk**. This globally recognized certification ensures that **eri silk** is free from harmful substances and meets international **safety and quality standards**, boosting its **marketability and consumer confidence** in the global textile industry while supporting **eco-friendly** initiatives.
- The **Yuge Yugeen Bharat National Museum** in **New Delhi** will be housed in the **North and South Blocks** as part of the

**Central Vista Redevelopment Project.** The museum aims to showcase India's civilizational and cultural heritage, with technical cooperation from **France Museums Development**. The project offers an immersive experience into India's **past, present, and future**.

- The **Department of Financial Services** directed **Public Sector Banks (PSBs)** to redesign their e-auction platform, leading to the launch of **"e-BKray"** in 2019. On January 3, 2025, the enhanced **"BAANKNET"** portal was introduced to streamline the listing and auctioning of assets, focusing on the disposal of **Non-Performing Assets (NPAs)** and ensuring secure transactions and maximizing sale value.
- On **March 24, 2025**, the **Central Government** notified a **24% salary increase** for **Members of Parliament (MPs)**, effective from **April 1, 2023**. Under the **Salary, Allowances and Pension of Members of Parliament Act**, the monthly salary for Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha MPs has risen from **₹1 lakh** to **₹1.24 lakh**, and the **daily allowance** has been increased from **₹2,000** to **₹2,500**. This is the first revision since **April 2018**.
- The **Supreme Court** has set up a **National Task Force (NTF)** to address **student mental health** concerns in response to rising suicides in higher education, including the tragic deaths of two **IIT Delhi** students in 2023. Chaired by **Justice S. Ravindra Bhat**, the NTF will investigate the causes, analyze existing regulations, and propose solutions to combat **academic stress, caste-based discrimination**, and other institutional issues affecting students' well-being.

## INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS

- On **March 1, 2025**, **President Donald Trump** announced **English** as the **official language** of the **United States**, citing it as a step towards **national unity**. The **White House** released an **executive order**, stating it was "long past time" to make this decision.
- **Yamandú Orsi** was sworn in as **Uruguay's President** on **March 1, 2025**, marking the return of the **leftist Broad Front coalition** after five years of **conservative rule**. A former **history teacher** and **mayor**, Orsi aims to strengthen Uruguay's **social safety net** while tackling **economic stagnation**. His presidency will focus on balancing **leftist support** with **economic growth** and **investor confidence**, while navigating challenges like **labor disputes** and **fiscal constraints**.
- The **Trump administration** imposed significant **tariffs** on imports from **Canada, Mexico, and China** starting **March 4, 2025**, raising import duties to levels not seen in decades. While aimed at boosting **domestic manufacturing** and reducing **trade imbalances**, the move has sparked backlash from **trading partners** and **business groups** due to concerns over **higher consumer costs** and **economic instability**.
- **China has announced a 7.2% increase in its 2025 defence budget**, raising total spending to approximately \$245 billion, as revealed at the National People's Congress (NPC). The budget focuses on modernizing military technology, reinforcing territorial claims, and countering U.S. influence in Asia. Despite being the world's second-largest defence spender, analysts estimate actual expenditure could be 40% higher due to unaccounted costs in other sectors.
- On **March 4, 2025**, **U.S. President Donald Trump**, in his **first congressional address** of his **second term**, announced **reciprocal tariffs** on countries with **high tariffs on U.S. goods**. Effective **April 2**, the policy targets **India, China, the EU, Brazil, Mexico, and Canada**, aiming to ensure a "**level playing field**" for American businesses. Trump cited "**very unfair**" **trade practices** as the reason, potentially impacting **U.S.-India trade relations**.
- The **world's largest iceberg, A23a**, has **run aground near South Georgia**, a **British overseas territory**. Scientists are monitoring its impact, as it may **disrupt wildlife feeding routes** but also **boost ocean productivity** by releasing nutrients. **A23a broke off from Antarctica in 1986** and has drifted for decades before lodging on the **continental shelf**. Its future movement remains uncertain due to **oceanic conditions**.
- **Israel has appointed Eyal Zamir as its new Chief of Staff** amid ongoing military operations and rising regional tensions. A **former tank commander and defence ministry director**, Zamir succeeds **Lieutenant General Herzi Halevi**, who resigned after the **October 7, 2023 Hamas attack**. His leadership will focus on **Gaza operations, Iran tensions, and West Bank security**. **Prime Minister Netanyahu** has expressed confidence in Zamir's ability to achieve "**absolute victory**" against Hamas.
- **Mark Carney** has been appointed as the new leader of **Canada's Liberal Party** and the country's next **Prime Minister**, replacing **Justin Trudeau** amid growing public dissatisfaction. The former **central banker** will now lead the party into the upcoming **general elections** and manage **Ottawa's response** to increasing challenges from **US President Donald Trump**.
- China has deployed a **Large Phased Array Radar (LPAR)** system in **Yunnan province**, near the **China-Myanmar border**, enhancing surveillance over India. The radar boasts a **range of 5,000+ kilometers**, with **advanced tracking capabilities** to monitor ballistic missiles and aerial activities. Positioned strategically, it can track missile tests from India's **Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam Island**, raising security concerns.
- In response to the global financial crisis and uncertainty, **UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres** launched the '**UN80 Initiative**'. This initiative aims to improve **efficiency** and **cost-effectiveness** within the **United Nations** by addressing shrinking resources, streamlining operations, and enhancing the organization's ability to deliver on its mandates effectively.
- In a historic breakthrough, **Armenia and Azerbaijan** agreed on the text of a **peace treaty** on **March 13, 2025**, ending nearly four decades of conflict over the **Nagorno-Karabakh** region. While this marks a significant step toward **stability** in the **South Caucasus**, **Azerbaijan** demands changes in **Armenia's constitution** before signing the treaty, creating uncertainty about the timeline for its official signing.
- **Donald Trump's** social media platform, **Truth Social**, is set to begin trading on the **NASDAQ** pending a shareholder vote on its merger with **Digital World Acquisition Corp. (DWAC)**, a **SPAC**. This move could reshape the financial structure of **Trump Media & Technology Group (TMTG)**, which owns **Truth Social**.
- **Stuart Young** is set to be sworn in as the new **Prime Minister of Trinidad and Tobago** at a formal ceremony at the **President's House in St. Ann's**. He will succeed **Dr. Keith Rowley**, who has officially stepped down from his position.
- The **Asian Development Bank (ADB)** has launched the **Frontier Seed (Pacific)** program to boost local businesses, strengthen capital markets, and promote **sustainable economic growth** in the Pacific region. ADB has committed **\$200,000** in technical assistance to **SeaPAC Pte Ltd** (prawn production) and **Kahuto Pacific** (aerial mapping). Backed by international partners like the **ORCA Trust Fund, Nordic Development Fund, and FCDO**, the program aims to attract investors, create jobs, and enhance economic resilience with an initial commitment of **\$4 million**.



- In 2025, **US President Donald Trump** is considering a **travel ban** on citizens from 43 countries, categorized into **Red, Orange, and Yellow** lists. **Red List** countries (11 nations, including Afghanistan, Iran, and Venezuela) face **complete visa suspension**, while **Orange List** countries (10 nations, including Russia, Pakistan, and Haiti) will have **severely restricted visas**. **Yellow List** countries (22 nations, including Angola, Cambodia, and Zimbabwe) have **60 days** to address US concerns. This move expands on the travel restrictions from Trump's first term, which were later revoked by **Joe Biden** in 2021.
- Kirsty Coventry**, a legendary swimmer from **Zimbabwe**, made history by becoming the **first female and first African president** of the **International Olympic Committee (IOC)**. Her election marks a significant milestone for the IOC, ushering in a new era of **progress, diversity, and inclusivity** in global sports leadership.
- In **2024**, **global funding for women-led tech startups** fell to **\$29.6 billion**, an **11% decline from 2023** and **21% from 2022**, due to **macroeconomic challenges**. Despite the downturn, **India ranked second globally** in **all-time funding for women-led tech startups**, after the **United States**, as per **Tracxn**. Women-led startups accounted for **11.7% of total global funding**, with **45 funding rounds exceeding \$100 million**. Key sectors like **Enterprise Applications, Life Sciences, and FinTech** continued to attract significant investment.
- Indonesia** has announced its decision to join the **New Development Bank (NDB)**, a multilateral financial institution established by the **BRICS** nations. **President Prabowo Subianto** made the announcement during a meeting with **NDB President Dilma Rousseff**. This move is expected to enhance Indonesia's **economic transformation** by enabling financial collaborations and investment opportunities in key sectors.
- Netumbo Nandi-Ndaitwah** made history as **Namibia's first female president** on **March 21, 2025**, coinciding with the country's **35th Independence Day**. A veteran of **SWAPO**, she won the **November 2024 elections** with 58% of the vote. Her administration will focus on addressing **unemployment**, especially among youth, aiming to create **500,000 jobs** through investments in **agriculture, fishing, and the creative sectors**.
- President **Donald Trump** announced a **25% tariff** on imported **cars and auto components**, effective next week, impacting global markets including the **EU, Canada, India, and China**. While **Indian automakers** may not face immediate challenges, **auto component manufacturers and tyre companies** exporting to the US could be significantly affected. This move aligns with Trump's broader **trade strategy** to protect **American industries** and encourage **domestic manufacturing**.
- On **March 28, 2025**, a **7.7-magnitude earthquake** struck near **Mandalay, Myanmar**, causing widespread damage in **Bangkok, Thailand**. The Thai government, led by **Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra**, declared a **state of emergency** as a **30-storey skyscraper** collapsed, trapping 43 workers. **Structural damage** was reported across the city, and **panic** led to evacuations, while **water overflow** was observed in pools. Rescue operations are ongoing.

**RBI's 'Regulations at a Glance': Key Insights for Cooperative Banks**

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has released the "Regulations at a Glance" handbook, compiled by the Department of Regulation (DoR), to offer a broad overview of key regulatory guidelines applicable to various banking entities, including cooperative banks. The handbook summarizes major regulations in a tabular format for easy reference but does not replace official circulars, Master Circulars, or Master Directions. This article highlights essential regulatory provisions applicable to cooperative banks as outlined in the handbook.

**Key Regulations for Cooperative Banks**

**1. Licensing of New Institutions**

**Urban Cooperative Banks (UCBs)**

- Minimum paid-up capital/net worth: ₹12.5 lakh – ₹4 crore (depending on location and population size).
- Note: RBI has stopped accepting fresh applications for new UCBs since 2004.

**Rural Cooperative Banks (StCBs & CCBs)**

- Declared as State Cooperative Banks (StCBs) or Central Cooperative Banks (CCBs) by the state government.
- RBI grants licenses based on NABARD's recommendations and internal assessment.



**Promoters' Criteria**

- Evaluated on educational qualifications, professional competence, financial strength, capital mobilization ability, and membership eligibility.

**2. Branch Licensing****Urban Cooperative Banks (UCBs)**

- Automatic Route: UCBs classified as Financially Sound and Well Managed (FSWM) can open branches up to 10% of existing branches (min. 1, max. 5).
- Approval Route: FSWM UCBs must submit an Annual Business Plan (ABP) to RBI's regional office by December 15.

**State Cooperative Banks (StCBs)**

- Require NABARD & RBI approval with conditions like:
- CRAR  $\geq$  9%, NNPA  $\leq$  5%, compliance record, and no penalties in last two years.

**District Central Cooperative Banks (DCCBs)****Additional requirements,**

- Operational for at least 3 years and net profit in last 2 years.
- Not under RBI restrictions.

**3. Governance Framework****Regulated by**

- State/Central Cooperative Society laws.
- Banking Regulation (BR) Act, 1949 (since 2020).

**Key Provisions**

- UCBs must form an Audit Committee of the Board.
- Fit and proper criteria for directors, MD/CEO, and WTD.
- Maximum continuous tenure limits for directors.
- Larger UCBs must appoint an independent Chief Risk Officer (CRO).
- NABARD issues governance guidelines for rural cooperative banks.

**4. Credit Risk Management****Urban Cooperative Banks (UCBs)**

- Loan against shares, bonds, and debentures: Max ₹10 lakh, LTV 50%.

**Rural Cooperative Banks**

- Loan against shares, bonds, and debentures: Max ₹5 lakh, LTV 50%.

**Securitization of Standard Assets**

- Allowed for SCBs, AIFIs, and NBFCs.
- Not allowed for RRBs and Cooperative Banks.

**5. Interest Rate Framework & Deposit Pricing****General Principles**

- Uniform interest rates across all branches/customers.
- No discrimination in deposit rates for similar amounts and dates.

- No negotiation of interest rates with individual depositors.
- NRE/NRO deposit rates cannot exceed domestic deposit rates.

**6. Mergers & Amalgamations****Key Provisions**

- Governed by the Banking Regulation (BR) Act, 1949.
- RBI has discretionary power under Section 44A to approve voluntary amalgamations.
- **Private Bank Mergers:** Must be approved by shareholders (2/3rd majority) before submission to RBI.
- **UCB Mergers:** Considered only if depositors' funds are fully protected.

**7. Resolution of Banking Companies & Cooperative Banks****Compulsory Amalgamation/Reconstruction**

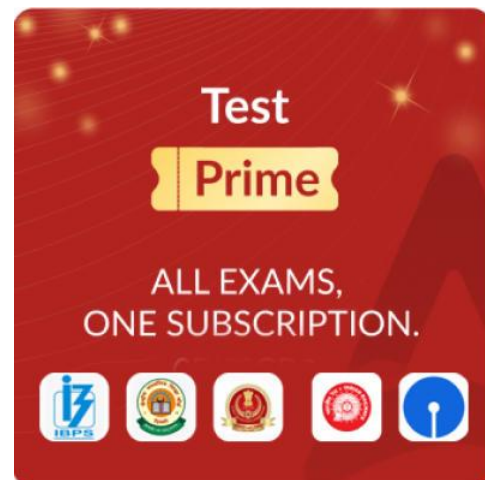
- RBI can apply to the government for restructuring under Section 45 of the BR Act.
- Section 45(4) (2020 Amendment): RBI can initiate amalgamations during a moratorium or at any other time.

**Powers of RBI**

- **Section 10B:** Remove Chairman/MD of a banking company.
- **Section 36ACA:** Supersede the board of banking companies.
- **Section 35A:** Issue directives for proper banking management.
- **Section 22(4):** RBI can cancel banking licenses (appeals go to the Central Government within 30 days).

**Post-License Cancellation**

- **Banking companies:** High Court appoints liquidator.
- **Uni-state cooperative banks:** Registrar of Cooperative Societies appoints liquidator.
- **Multi-state cooperative banks:** Central Registrar appoints liquidator.

ECONOMY & BUSINESS

GDP & GROWTH RATE as per October 2024

- Crisil has forecasted India's GDP growth to stay at 6.5% in FY26, with the RBI's MPC likely to reduce the repo rate by 50-75 basis points to boost growth. While lower than the previous year's 9.2%, it aligns closely with the pre-pandemic average of 6.6%, maintaining India's position as the fastest-growing major economy.

- Morgan Stanley projects India's GDP will reach \$5.7 trillion by fiscal 2028, making it the third-largest economy, surpassing Germany and Japan. India, currently the fifth-largest economy, is expected to overtake Japan by 2026. India's share in global GDP will rise from 3.5% in 2023 to 4.5% by 2029, driven by strong policies, improved infrastructure, and a growing consumer market. In a bullish scenario, GDP could reach \$10.3 trillion by 2035.



- India has achieved a historic economic milestone by doubling its **GDP** from **\$2.1 trillion** in 2015 to **\$4.3 trillion** in 2025, marking a **105% increase** and the fastest growth among major global economies. According to the **IMF**, India's inflation-adjusted GDP growth over the decade is **77%**, positioning it as one of the world's most rapidly expanding economies. India is set to surpass **Japan** in 2025 and may overtake **Germany** by 2027.
- S&P Global** has revised India's **GDP growth forecast** for **FY26** down to **6.5%** from the earlier **6.7%**. The forecast assumes a **normal monsoon** and stable **commodity prices**, including **crude oil**. Despite global trade uncertainties, **India's services-led exports** to the **US** remain strong. Additionally, **easing food inflation**, **tax benefits** from the **FY26 Budget**, and **lower borrowing costs** are expected to boost domestic consumption.
- India's **Current Account Deficit (CAD)** widened to **\$11.5 billion (1.1% of GDP)** in **Q3 FY25**, driven by a higher **merchandise trade deficit** of **\$79.2 billion**, while **CAD moderated** from **Q2 FY25**. The **Balance of Payments (BoP)** saw a **depletion of \$37.7 billion**, contrasting with a surplus a year ago. **Forex reserves surged by \$311 billion** since **Dec 2018**, marking the largest increase under any **RBI Governor**.
- India's **core sector growth** slowed to **2.9% in February 2025**, the weakest in five months, compared to **7.1% in February 2024**. The decline was due to a **high base effect and weaker output** in five of the eight industries. **Cement (10.5%)** and **fertilizers (10.2%)** were the only sectors with **annual growth**, while **coal (1.7%)**, **crude oil (-5.2%)**, and **natural gas (-6%)** performed poorly. The slowdown may impact **Industrial Production Index (IIP) growth**, which stood at **5% in January 2025**.
- India's **agriculture trade surplus** has been shrinking despite growth in exports like **basmati rice, spices, coffee, and tobacco**. The surge in imports of **pulses and edible oils** has contributed to this decline. The surplus peaked at **\$27.7 billion** in 2013-14, and dropped to **\$16 billion** in 2023-24. For **April-December 2024**, the surplus fell to **\$8.2 billion**, down from **\$10.6 billion** in the previous year.
- India's **retail inflation** dropped to a **seven-month low** of **3.61%** in February 2025, driven by a decline in **food inflation** to below 4% for the first time in nearly two years. This broad-based reduction, particularly in perishable goods and protein-based food items, has raised expectations for a potential **rate cut** by the **Reserve Bank of India (RBI)** in the upcoming April meeting.
- India's **Consumer Price Index (CPI)** for **February 2025** shows a **year-on-year inflation** of **3.61%**, marking the **lowest inflation rate** since **July 2024**. This represents a **65 basis points** decline from **January 2025**. A significant drop in **food inflation**, especially in **rural areas**, contributed to this moderation.
- India's **Index of Industrial Production (IIP)** for **January 2025** showed a **5.0% growth**, up from **3.2%** in **December 2024**. The **manufacturing sector** led the growth at **5.5%**, followed by **mining (4.4%)** and **electricity (2.4%)**. The IIP index for January 2025 stands at **161.3**, up from **153.6** in January 2024.
- Moody's Ratings** projects **India's economic growth** to exceed **6.5%** in **FY 2025-26**, up from **6.3%** in **FY 2024-25**. The growth will be fueled by increased **government capital expenditure, tax cuts, and monetary easing**. However, Moody's warns of a moderate decline in **asset quality** in the **banking sector**, particularly due to stress in **unsecured retail loans, microfinance, and small business loans**.
- Fitch Ratings** has affirmed the **Long-Term Issuer Default Rating (IDR)** of **Union Bank of India** and **Punjab National Bank (PNB)** at **'BBB-'** with a stable outlook. The **Viability Rating (VR)** has been upgraded to **'bb-'** from **'b+'**, reflecting improved **financial performance and asset quality**. The ratings reflect strong **government support** and a favorable **operating environment**.
- India's **net FDI** dropped significantly to **\$1.4 billion** during April 2024–January 2025, down from **\$11.5 billion** a year earlier. This decline was due to increased **repatriation by investors** and higher **outward FDI** by Indian firms. However, **gross FDI** grew by **12.4% YoY**, reaching **\$67.7 billion**, as per the **RBI's March 2025 bulletin**.
- India's **foreign exchange reserves** surged by **\$15.267 billion** to reach **\$653.966 billion** during the week ending **March 7, 2025**, marking the sharpest rise in over two years. This increase was driven by a **\$10 billion forex swap** by the **Reserve Bank of India (RBI)** on **February 28, 2025**. The previous week's reserves were **\$638.698 billion**, and the all-time high remains **\$704.885 billion** (September 2024).

### ECONOMY NEWS

- GST collections in February 2025** rose by **9.1% YoY**, totaling **₹1.84 lakh crore**, reflecting strong domestic economic activity and improved compliance. The breakdown includes **Central GST (CGST) ₹35,204 crore**, **State GST (SGST) ₹43,704 crore**, **Integrated GST (IGST) ₹90,870 crore** (with ₹41,702 crore from imports), and **Compensation Cess ₹13,868 crore**.
- India's **circular economy** is expected to generate over **\$2 trillion** in market value and create nearly **10 million jobs** by **2050**, as per **Union Minister Bhupender Yadav**. At the **12th Regional 3R and Circular Economy Forum**, he highlighted the shift towards a sustainable, **reuse and recycle-based system**. India is also interested in hosting the **World Circular Economy Forum 2026**, launching key **initiatives, MoUs**, and reports to promote **sustainable waste management** and urban **circular economy practices**.



- India's **wholesale inflation** rose to **2.38%** in **February 2024**, slightly up from **2.31%** in January. The increase was driven by higher prices in **manufactured food products, textiles, and non-food articles**, though a decline in the **Food Index** provided some relief.

- Paytm** has partnered with **Perplexity**, an **AI-driven answer engine**, to integrate **AI-powered search** into the Paytm app, enabling users to ask questions, explore topics in **local languages**, and make informed **financial decisions**. Perplexity offers **real-time responses** with **in-line citations**, providing **accurate** and **reliable** answers, especially for **finance and market trends**.
- PhonePe** has launched the **'Insuring HEROES'** campaign ahead of **International Women's Day 2025**, aiming to **enhance financial security for women** by offering **exclusive discounts on term life and health insurance**. Available on the **PhonePe app** from **March 6 to March 9, 2025**, the campaign provides **up to 30% off on term life insurance** and **15% off on health insurance**, making **affordable insurance more accessible for women**.
- In **February 2025**, India's **digital payments ecosystem** showed mixed trends, with **UPI transactions declining MoM**, while **FASTag and AePS** saw steady growth. Despite this, the industry continued expanding **YoY**, driven by increased adoption of **cashless transactions** across the country.
- Razorpay**, a leading **fintech company**, has launched its **payment solutions** in **Singapore**, marking a major expansion after its success in **India and Malaysia**. The move aligns with Singapore's **digital-first economy** and growing **real-time payments** ecosystem. Razorpay aims to simplify **cross-border transactions**, reduce **payment costs**, and introduce **AI-driven financial tools** to empower businesses in Singapore.
- SBI Life Insurance** has launched two new **child insurance products**—**'SBI Life – Smart Future Star'** and **'SBI Life – Smart Platina Young Achiever'**—to secure children's **financial future**. These products aim to provide **financial safeguards** amidst rising **education costs**, evolving **career aspirations**, and increasing **lifestyle expenses**, ensuring children can pursue their dreams without financial constraints.
- GRM Overseas Limited** has launched a new marketing campaign for its **10X Classic Chakki Fresh Atta**, with **Bollywood actor Salman Khan** as the brand ambassador. Titled **"Better Half Ki Better Choice"**, the campaign highlights the product's **quality, hygiene, and nutrition**, positioning it as the preferred choice for households. With the tagline **"10 Ka Dum"**, the campaign promotes **branded packaged wheat flour** over traditional unpackaged options.
- Star Health Insurance** launched the **SheTARA campaign** in **Tamil Nadu** to celebrate **International Women's Day**. The initiative promotes **preventive healthcare** among women and encourages more women to join as **insurance agents**. With **42% of India's women workforce** (6.3 lakh) based in Tamil Nadu, the state is an ideal location for this campaign.
- Credit disbursement to **priority sectors** like **agriculture, MSME, and social infrastructure** has grown by **85%**, rising from **₹23.01 lakh crore** in 2019 to **₹42.73 lakh crore** in 2024. The **RBI and government** have implemented measures to ensure **credit discipline, responsible lending, and technological adoption**. **Public Sector Banks (PSBs)** are collaborating with **FinTechs** to enhance **banking services** and facilitate **seamless lending**.
- Digital payment transactions in India surged from **8,839 crore** in FY 2021-22 to **18,737 crore** in FY 2023-24, reflecting a **46% CAGR**. This growth was led by **UPI**, which grew at **69% CAGR**, contributing to over **70%** of digital payments. The **Incentive Scheme for RuPay Debit Cards** and **BHIM-UPI** transactions has been pivotal in boosting **digital transactions** nationwide.
- India's **digital payment ecosystem** saw over **18,000 crore** transactions in FY 2024-25 (till January 2025), driven by **UPI adoption, fintech collaborations, and government initiatives**. To ensure security, **RBI and NPCI** implemented **AI-driven fraud detection** systems and awareness campaigns, while the government strengthened **cybercrime reporting** mechanisms to enhance **user safety** in digital transactions.
- The **MSME sector** in India has seen significant growth in **credit availability** and a reduction in **Non-Performing Assets (NPAs)**, with the **gross NPA ratio** decreasing from **11% in 2020** to **4% in 2024**. Measures by the **government and RBI** have strengthened **loan recovery mechanisms** and ensured financial stability, improving the health of the MSME credit sector.
- In 2024, **India** became the top source of **Foreign Direct Investment (FDI)** into **Dubai**, surpassing the **United States, France, and the United Kingdom**. Dubai maintained its status as the world's leading destination for **Greenfield FDI projects** for the fourth consecutive year, driven by its **business-friendly environment, tax policies, and infrastructure**, positioning it as a global investment hub.
- IIFL Finance has rebranded seven of its branches as **'Shakti'** branches to mark **Women's Day**, staffed entirely by women in the **Delhi NCR and Mumbai MMR**. This initiative aims to empower women in the **financial services sector**, promote **diversity, equity, and inclusion**, and support **women entrepreneurs** while advancing **financial literacy** in underserved communities.





- The **Finance Ministry** has approved the issuance of **Zero Coupon Bonds (ZCBs)** by **Power Finance Corporation (PFC)** to raise up to ₹10,000 crore. ZCBs are issued at a discount and redeemed at full face value upon maturity, with the return for investors being the difference between the issue price and the face value.
- In **February 2025**, **UPI** saw a 5.2% decline in transaction volume, totaling **16.11 billion** transactions. Despite this drop, **PhonePe**, **Google Pay**, and **Paytm** maintained their market dominance, with **Flipkart's Super.money** debuting in the top five UPI apps. This decline signals a possible shift in **user behavior** or market **saturation**.
- In a historic move, the **Insurance Regulatory and Development Authority of India (IRDAI)** granted **Valueatics Reinsurance**, backed by **Prem Watsa** and **Kamesh Goyal**, the **first private reinsurance license** in India. This marks a significant step in fostering competition in the reinsurance sector, ending **GIC Re's monopoly** that has lasted since 1972. The approval was granted during **Debasish Panda's** final board meeting as IRDAI Chairperson on **March 12, 2025**.
- The **Insurance Regulatory and Development Authority of India (IRDAI)** has re-designated **Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC)**, **The New India Assurance Company**, and **General Insurance Corporation of India (GIC Re)** as **Domestic Systemically Important Insurers (D-SIIs)** for **2024-25**. These insurers are deemed critical to the stability of the Indian financial system due to their size, market importance, and interconnectedness with both the domestic and global economy.
- Adar Poonawalla, CEO of **Serum Institute of India**, sold his stake in **Magma General Insurance** to **Patanjali Ayurved** and **DS Group** for **₹4,500 crore**, giving them a **98% stake**. This strategic acquisition strengthens **Magma Insurance's** position, leveraging Patanjali's rural reach and DS Group's financial expertise. The company offers over **70 insurance products**, with a **gross written premium (GWP)** of **₹3,295 crore** in 2024, projected to rise to **₹3,650-3,700 crore** in 2025.
- The **Union Cabinet** approved a ₹1,500 crore incentive scheme for banks to promote **UPI transactions** below ₹2,000 in FY 2024-25. Banks will receive a 0.15% incentive on transactions by **small merchants**, with part of the payout based on maintaining reliable **UPI infrastructure**. The initiative aims to boost **digital payments** adoption, especially among **small businesses**, without imposing merchant fees.
- The **Union Cabinet**, led by **Prime Minister Narendra Modi**, approved the **Revised Rashtriya Gokul Mission (RGM)** with an allocation of ₹3,400 crore (plus ₹1,000 crore) for the 15th Finance Commission cycle (2021-26). The mission focuses on boosting **milk production**, **genetic improvement**, and **farmer incomes**, while preserving **indigenous bovine breeds** through scientific interventions.
- **BPCL** has inaugurated a **3.2 MW AC floating solar power plant** at the **Kochi Refinery**, marking a major step toward **sustainable energy**. **Chief Secretary Sarada Muraleedharan** inaugurated the project on **March 22, 2025**. Built on an **8-acre rainwater harvesting pond**, the plant is part of BPCL's efforts to integrate **renewable energy**, with an investment of **₹28.93 crore**.
- The **Indian government** has formed the **Inter-Ministerial-Industry Committee on Fintech (IMICF)** to address **regulatory concerns** and create a long-term strategy for the **financial technology (fintech)** sector. Chaired by the **Secretary of the Department of Financial Services (DFS)**, the committee will evaluate fintech's impact on the **banking and financial services industry (BFSI)**, identify growth obstacles, and study **global best practices** in **governance and regulation**.
- Adar Poonawalla, CEO of **Serum Institute of India**, sold his stake in **Magma General Insurance** to **Patanjali Ayurved** and **DS Group** for **₹4,500 crore**, giving them a **98% stake**. This strategic acquisition strengthens **Magma Insurance's** position, leveraging Patanjali's rural reach and DS Group's financial expertise. - **SBI Mutual Fund** launched two new schemes—the **SBI BSE PSU Bank Index Fund** and the **SBI BSE PSU Bank ETF**—to provide exposure to India's public sector banking sector. Both will track the **BSE PSU Bank Index** with **95% of assets** allocated to its securities. The **NFO** opens on **March 17, 2025**, and closes on **March 20, 2025**, with a minimum investment of ₹5,000. The funds are managed by **Viral Chhadva**.
- In a significant milestone for India's **floriculture sector**, the **APEDA** facilitated the first-ever export of **Anthurium flowers** from **Mizoram** to **Singapore**, consisting of **1,024 cut flowers** (70 kg) in 50 boxes. This initiative, in collaboration with the **Department of Horticulture, Government of Mizoram**, highlights **Mizoram's floriculture potential** and boosts **India's agricultural exports**, benefiting **local farmers**, including **women**.
- **Public Sector Banks (PSBs)** in India reported significant financial improvement in **FY24**, with net profits reaching their highest-ever levels and a **33% increase in dividend payouts** to **Rs 27,830 crore**, up from **Rs 20,964 crore** in FY23. This growth highlights the banks' strengthened financial position and their ability to return value to **shareholders**, including the **Indian government**.



- The **Finance Ministry** informed the **Lok Sabha** that **public sector banks (PSBs)** have transferred over ₹45,000 crore of **unclaimed deposits** to the **Depositor Education and Awareness (DEA) Fund** between 2019-20 and 2024-25 (up to December 31, 2024). The **Reserve Bank of India (RBI)** manages this fund under the **Depositor Education and Awareness Fund Scheme, 2014**.
- **Reliance Industries Ltd (RIL)**, led by **Mukesh Ambani**, has acquired a **100% stake** in **Nauyaan Tradings Private Limited (NTPL)** through its subsidiary **Reliance Strategic Business Ventures Limited (RSBVL)** for ₹1 lakh. Additionally, NTPL has signed a **share purchase agreement** with **Welspun Corp Limited (WCL)** to acquire **74% of Nauyaan Shipyard Private Limited (NSPL)** for ₹382.73 crore. This acquisition, set to complete by **March 21, 2025**, is part of Reliance’s strategy to expand in the **shipyard, naval, defense, and energy sectors**.

India Ranks 4th in Global Wealth Rankings: Knight Frank's Wealth Report 2025

In March 2025, the London-based global property consultancy firm, **Knight Frank**, released the 19th edition of **'The Wealth Report 2025'**, providing a comprehensive analysis of the global distribution of wealth. The report highlights the growing number of **High Net-Worth Individuals (HNWIs)** worldwide, with India securing the **4th position globally**, boasting an estimated **85,698 HNWIs in 2024**, marking a **6% increase** from the previous year. With **3.7% of the world's wealthy population**, India continues to strengthen its presence among the top wealth-generating nations. The **United States of America (USA)** remains the leader with **905,413 HNWIs**, followed by **China (471,634 HNWIs)** and **Japan (122,119 HNWIs)**.

Key Global Findings from The Wealth Report 2025

The Growth of High Net-Worth Individuals Worldwide

The report defines **HNWIs** as individuals possessing at least **USD 1 million** in investable assets. According to the findings, the number of **HNWIs increased by 4.4% globally**, reaching **2,341,378 in 2024**, up from **2,243,300 in 2023**.

The top three regions that experienced the highest percentage growth in their HNWI populations are:

- **United States – 5.2% growth**
- **Asia – 5% growth**

Global Trends in Women’s Workforce Representation

Political Landscape: A Historic Year for Elections

The year **2024** was remarkable for women’s participation in politics. According to the **OECD**, the average **women’s parliamentary representation** rose to **34%**, a testament to global efforts toward gender inclusivity.

- **Japan** saw a substantial increase in representation, jumping from **10% to 16%**.
- **Britain** experienced notable growth, with representation rising from **35% to 41%**.
- **The United States**, however, witnessed a slight decline, with female parliamentary representation falling to **28.7%**.

This data highlights the evolving role of women in governance, though many nations still lag behind in achieving gender parity in politics.

Economic Indicators: Progress and Challenges

On the economic front, the **percentage of women on corporate boards** reached **33%**, reflecting a growing acceptance of gender diversity in leadership roles. **Finland Tops the World Happiness Rankings for the Eighth Consecutive Year**

**Finland** has once again secured its position as the world's happiest country for the eighth consecutive year, according to the latest global happiness rankings. The study, conducted by the **Wellbeing Research Centre at the University of Oxford in collaboration with Gallup and the UN Sustainable Development Solutions Network**, revealed that the United States has dropped to its lowest-ever ranking at 24th place. The rankings are based on people's self-assessment of their quality of life, highlighting factors such as social trust, economic stability, and life expectancy.

**Global Happiness Rankings: Finland Remains on the Top**

The 2024 World Happiness Report has reaffirmed Finland's position as the happiest country in the world. Other Nordic nations, including Denmark, Iceland, Sweden, and the Netherlands, rounded out the top five.



The rankings are derived from individuals' responses to survey questions about their overall life satisfaction. Despite Finland's geographical proximity to Russia and increasing geopolitical tensions, its citizens continue to report high levels of happiness.

### Factors Influencing Happiness Rankings

The happiness rankings are based on a three-year average of a population's self-assessment of life quality. The factors considered in the ranking include:

- **Gross Domestic Product (GDP) per capita** – Economic stability contributes significantly to life satisfaction.
- **Healthy life expectancy** – Access to quality healthcare and a longer lifespan improve well-being.
- **Social support** – Having a reliable network of family and friends enhances happiness.
- **Freedom to make life choices** – A sense of autonomy and personal control is linked to higher life satisfaction.
- **Generosity** – Acts of kindness and donations contribute positively to societal happiness.
- **Perceptions of corruption** – Lower levels of corruption improve trust in government institutions and social systems.

### The Role of Social Trust in Happiness

One of the key findings of the 2024 report is the strong correlation between happiness and **belief in the kindness of others**. The report highlights that people who believe in social trust—such as the likelihood of someone returning a lost wallet—tend to experience greater happiness.

Nordic countries, which consistently rank at the top in happiness indices, also excel in social trust metrics. This suggests that interpersonal trust and societal stability play an essential role in overall well-being.

### United States Sees a Decline in Happiness

The United States, which ranked 13th in 2016, has now dropped to **24th place**, marking its lowest position ever in the global rankings. Experts attribute this decline to increasing **income inequality, political divisions, and social unrest**.

Similarly, the United Kingdom also fell to its lowest ranking since 2017. Researchers have observed that while happiness disparities between countries have remained stable, **happiness inequality within countries has increased by about 25% over the past two decades**.

### Geopolitical Challenges and Their Impact on Happiness

Despite facing increased geopolitical tensions due to its **proximity to Russia**, Finland has continued to rank as the happiest nation. Over recent years, Finland and other European countries have experienced a rise in cyberattacks, GPS jamming, and suspected sabotage of critical infrastructure in the Baltic Sea. However, these external challenges have not significantly impacted the Finnish people's reported happiness levels.

India's **happiness ranking** has improved steadily, reaching **118th** in the **World Happiness Report 2025**, up from **126th** in **2023** and **139th** in **2020**. Key factors include **economic growth, better**

**corruption perception (rank improved from 71 in 2022 to 56 in 2024), and rising personal freedom (ranked 23rd in 2024, highest in five years)**. India's **GDP per capita rank** also improved to **93rd** in 2024. However, it still lags behind **Pakistan (109th)** and **Nepal (92nd)** due to **lower social support and economic inequality**.

### Roshni Nadar Becomes First Indian Woman in World's Top 10 Richest Women

Roshni Nadar, Chairperson of **HCL Technologies**, has achieved a historic milestone by becoming the **first Indian woman** to enter the **world's top 10 richest women** list. **TESTING**

- The Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) successfully tested an indigenous Integrated Life Support System (ILSS) for the Light Combat Aircraft (LCA) Tejas. This Oxygen Generating System-based (OBOGS) ILSS eliminates the need for conventional liquid oxygen cylinders, generating breathable oxygen for aircrew during flight. Conducted by the Defence Bio-Engineering & Electro Medical Laboratory (DEBEL) in Bengaluru, the trial proved the system's effectiveness under extreme conditions, paving the way for its use in other aircraft like the MiG 29K.
- India's Aeronautical Development Agency (ADA) successfully tested the Astra BVRAAM (Beyond Visual Range Air-to-Air Missile) from the LCA Tejas AF MK1 prototype off the Chandipur coast, Odisha. Developed by DRDO, the missile hit a flying target accurately, demonstrating a range of over 100 kilometers and enhancing India's air defense capabilities with advanced, indigenous missile technology.
- The DRDO and Indian Navy successfully tested the Vertically-Launched Short-Range Surface-to-Air Missile (VLSRSAM) on March 26, 2025, at the Integrated Test Range (ITR) in Chandipur, Odisha. The missile successfully engaged and destroyed a high-speed aerial target at low altitude, demonstrating its Near-Boundary-Low Altitude capability, agility, reliability, and accuracy in combat configuration.
- The tenth ACTCM Barge, LSAM 24 (Yard 134), was launched on March 26, 2025, at M/s Suryadipta Projects Pvt Ltd, Thane. This vessel is part of a contract for eleven such

barges awarded on March 5, 2021, to the MSME shipyard. The barges are indigenously designed and built, strengthening the Indian Navy's logistics and operational capabilities.

**DEAL & MoU's**

- India has signed a \$248 million agreement with Russia's Rosoboronexport to procure 1,000 horsepower engines for its T-72 battle tanks, aiming to boost battlefield mobility and offensive capability of the Indian Army. The deal also includes technology transfer to Armoured Vehicles Nigam Ltd for the licensed production of these engines, strengthening India's defense manufacturing sector.
- Bharat Electronics Limited (BEL) signed a ₹2,906 crore contract with the Ministry of Defence (MoD) for the procurement of the Low-Level Transportable Radar (LLTR) Ashwini. Developed by DRDO's LRDE, this solid-state technology radar can track drones, helicopters, and fighter jets. The deal supports Aatmanirbhar Bharat, boosting indigenous defence production.
- The Indian Navy launched its second Project 1135.6 follow-on frigate, 'Tavasya', at Goa Shipyard Limited (GSL). This multi-role combat warship is designed for air, surface, and sub-surface warfare, measuring 124.8m in length and displacing over 3,800 tonnes. Equipped with stealth technology, advanced weapons like the BrahMos missile, and indigenous sensors, it reflects India's progress in self-reliance under the Atmanirbhar Bharat initiative.



**ARMY, NAVY & AIR FORCE NEWS**

- **Raksha Mantri Shri Rajnath Singh** made history by becoming the first **Defence Minister of India** to visit the **Institute of Aerospace Medicine (IAM)** in **Bengaluru, Karnataka**, on **March 09, 2025**. His visit highlighted the significance of **aerospace medicine** in India's **defence and aviation sectors**. Singh was briefed on IAM's role in **pilot training, aeromedical research, and medical evaluation** of Air Force personnel. He also inaugurated a key **research project** and emphasized the growing importance of **space medicine** as India advances in both air and space domains.
- **HDFC Bank**, in partnership with the **Indian Army** and **CSC Academy**, has renewed its **Memorandum of Understanding (MoU)** to expand **Project NAMAN**, which supports **Army veterans**, their families, and next of kin. The agreement will establish **Common Service Centres (CSCs)** at **26 Directorate of Indian Army Veterans (DIAV)** locations, offering **pension services, Government-to-Citizen (G2C) services, and Business-to-Consumer (B2C) services** at defense establishments. This initiative is part of HDFC Bank's **Parivartan programme**, aimed at promoting **economic inclusiveness** for veterans and their families.
- The **First Training Squadron (1TS)** of the **Indian Navy**, including **INS Sujata, INS Shardul, and ICGS Veera**, successfully completed its visit to **Phuket Deep Sea Port, Thailand**. The visit involved **coordinated tactical maneuvers, professional exchanges, and joint exercises** with the **Royal Thai Navy (RTN)**, strengthening the maritime

partnership between **India** and **Thailand**.

- India is set to enhance **maritime security** cooperation with **Mauritius** through a **white shipping agreement**. The deal, expected to be signed during **Prime Minister Narendra Modi's** visit, will enable the exchange of **commercial shipping information** between the **Indian and Mauritian navies** and coast guards, strengthening ties in the **Western Indian Ocean** amid rising **Chinese presence** and shifting **geopolitical dynamics**.
- The keel-laying ceremony for the second **Fleet Support Ship (FSS)** was held on **March 12, 2025**, at **L&T Shipyard, Kattupalli**. The event, attended by **Vice Admiral Rajaram Swaminathan** and senior officials, marks a significant milestone in India's maritime capabilities. The project is part of a **contract signed in August 2023** between the **Indian Navy** and **Hindustan Shipyard Limited (HSL)** for five FSS vessels, with deliveries starting by mid-2027. The initiative showcases the success of the **public-private partnership (PPP)** model, with **L&T** constructing two ships to boost India's **shipbuilding capacity**.
- India and **Australia** have agreed to strengthen **defence cooperation and interoperability** across **maritime, land, and air domains**. This was discussed during the **9th India-Australia Defence Policy Talks** in **New Delhi** on **March 17, 2025**. Key areas include enhancing **maritime domain awareness, information sharing, and science & technology collaboration**, with a focus on the upcoming **2+2 Ministerial Dialogue** in Australia.

**SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGY****SATELLITES LAUNCHES**

- NASA's **IM-2 mission**, launched on **February 26, 2025**, targets the **lunar south pole's Mons Mouton** to explore **water ice and rare minerals** for future lunar bases. The mission also aims to deploy **Nokia's 4G/LTE network**, enabling **high-speed communication** on the Moon. These objectives could support sustained **lunar habitation** and future **Mars missions**.
- India's **Aditya-L1 mission**, the first dedicated **solar observatory**, has captured the first-ever image of a **solar flare 'kernel'** in the **photosphere and chromosphere**. This groundbreaking discovery will enhance understanding of the **Sun's energy bursts and solar dynamics**.
- On **March 3, 2025**, **Firefly Aerospace's Blue Ghost spacecraft** successfully landed on the **Moon**, marking a major milestone in **private space exploration**. As part of **NASA's Commercial Lunar Payload Services (CLPS)** program, it is the **third private moon mission** and the first with an almost flawless landing. The year 2025 is expected to see more **lunar missions** focused on **scientific research, exploration, and technology demonstration**.

- **SpaceX's Starlink** is set to launch its **satellite-based broadband services** in India, partnering with telecom giants **Reliance Jio** and **Bharti Airtel** to offer **high-speed internet**, especially in **rural and remote areas**. However, **regulatory approvals** from the Indian government are still pending. The impact of Starlink on India's **broadband market** in terms of **speed, pricing, and availability** remains to be seen.
- NASA is set to launch two groundbreaking missions, **SPHEREx** and **PUNCH**, aboard a **SpaceX Falcon rocket**. **SPHEREx** will map cosmic light from the earliest galaxies using **infrared detectors**, providing insights into the **Big Bang and cosmic history**. **PUNCH** will study the **Sun's corona and solar wind** using **polarimetric imaging**, enhancing our understanding of **solar storms and space weather**.
- **Bellatrix Aerospace**, a **Bengaluru-based** space mobility company, has signed an **MoU** with **Astroscale Japan** to collaborate on **active debris removal, satellite servicing, and sustainable in-orbit mobility**. This partnership aims to improve **space sustainability** and ensure a cleaner **orbital environment**. Bellatrix is known for its innovative **propulsion technologies**, while Astroscale is a leader in **space debris mitigation**.



NATIONAL

- Union IT Minister **Ashwini Vaishnaw** launched the **IndiaAI Compute Portal** and **AIKosha Dataset Platform** under the **IndiaAI Mission** to accelerate AI innovation in India. The Compute Portal provides access to **18,000+ GPUs, cloud storage, and AI-related services**, supporting **students, startups, researchers, and government departments**. It aims to offer **affordable, high-performance AI computing** and facilitate the development of **India's own foundational AI model**.
- Bharti Airtel and Reliance Jio have signed agreements with **SpaceX** to bring **Starlink** satellite internet to **India**, aiming to bridge the digital divide, especially in **remote and underserved areas**. Starlink, a satellite-based internet service, uses a network of **low Earth orbit (LEO) satellites** to provide high-speed internet without traditional infrastructure. With **7,000 satellites in operation** and **4.6 million users** globally, the service aims to serve India's **670 million people** lacking internet access. The deal is pending **security clearance** from the Indian **Home Ministry**.
- India has become a global space leader, generating **USD 143 million** in foreign exchange by launching **393 foreign satellites** from **34 countries** between **2015 and 2024**. The **ISRO** used **PSLV, LVM3, and SSLV** vehicles for these launches. This success strengthens India's position in the **global space economy** and sets the stage for future missions like **Gaganyaan** and the **Bharatiya Antariksha Station** by **2035**.
- India's **Chandrayaan-5 mission** was approved on **March 13, 2025**, and announced by **ISRO Chairman V Narayanan**. In collaboration with **Japan (JAXA)**, the mission aims for an advanced study of the **Moon's surface**. Unlike **Chandrayaan-3**, it will deploy a **250 kg rover**, ten times heavier than the '**Pragyan**' rover. The mission will focus on **mineralogical and geological analysis** of the Moon.
- **ISRO** launched the **Shri S Ramakrishnan Centre of Excellence in Fluid and Thermal Science Research** at **IIT Madras**, inaugurated by **ISRO Chairman V Narayanan**. The facility will focus on **thermal challenges** in space applications, including **heat dissipation in satellites and launch vehicles**, and develop **cooling solutions**. This initiative aims to enhance **India's self-reliance** in space technologies and strengthen research for **future deep-space missions**.
- **ISRO**, in collaboration with **Semiconductor Laboratory (SCL)**, developed two **32-bit microprocessors** for space applications: **Vikram 3201** and **Kalpana 3201**. **Vikram 3201** is India's first indigenous microprocessor qualified for space missions, supporting **floating-point arithmetic** and compatible with previous models. **Kalpana 3201**, a **SPARC V8 RISC** processor, is efficient for high-speed processing and

compatible with open-source software. Both processors support India's **self-reliance** in **high-performance computing** for **space missions**.

- **Tata Communications** launched **Vayu**, an **AI-powered cloud solution** offering **cost-effective, flexible, and intelligent enterprise cloud services**. Vayu integrates **IaaS, PaaS, AI capabilities, security, cloud connectivity, and professional services**. It provides **15-25% cost savings**, eliminates **data egress charges**, and reduces **multi-cloud complexities**, positioning itself as a next-gen cloud fabric to optimize performance and **cost efficiency**.
- A **human coronavirus HKU1** case was reported in **Kolkata**, raising concerns. Medical experts clarified that **HKU1**, identified in **2005**, causes **mild respiratory illnesses** and does not pose a pandemic threat like **Covid-19**. The patient is stable, and the virus spreads through **respiratory droplets** and **surface contact**. Vulnerable individuals, including the **elderly, children, pregnant women**, and those with weakened immune systems, should take precautions.

INTERNATIONAL

- Researchers from **China** and **Japan** have provided evidence that **niobium diselenide (NbSe<sub>2</sub>)** could exhibit a **Bose metal state**, where **Cooper pairs** form but fail to condense into a **superconducting state**. This discovery challenges traditional theories about metals and is a significant advancement in **condensed matter physics**, as reported in **Physical Review Letters** on **February 13, 2025**.
- On **March 3, 2025**, **Firefly Aerospace's Blue Ghost spacecraft** successfully landed on the **Moon**, marking a major milestone in **private space exploration**. As part of **NASA's Commercial Lunar Payload Services (CLPS)** program, it is the **third private moon mission** and the first with an almost flawless landing. The year 2025 is expected to see more **lunar missions** focused on **scientific research, exploration, and technology demonstration**.
- Mycelium bricks, made from the fibrous network of fungi, are an innovative **eco-friendly** material being explored in the construction industry to reduce **carbon footprint**. These **biodegradable** and **fire-resistant** bricks offer good **insulation** and can help reduce **CO<sub>2</sub> emissions** from traditional fired clay bricks. However, they face challenges such as **structural limitations, moisture vulnerability**, and **higher production costs**, particularly in India's **tropical climate**.
- **Google** has launched **Gemma 3**, a lightweight **AI model** designed for efficient performance on devices like **smartphones, laptops**, and other platforms. Built on the technology of **Gemini 2.0**, Gemma 3 offers **low-latency processing** on a single **GPU or TPU** host, enhancing user experience with its efficient capabilities.



## SPORTS

CRICKET

- **Virat Kohli** played his historic **300th ODI** on **March 2, 2025**, against **New Zealand** in **Dubai**, becoming the **7th Indian** and **22nd player** globally to reach this milestone. Kohli joins cricket legends like **Sachin Tendulkar** (463 ODIs) and **MS Dhoni** (347 ODIs) in this exclusive club.
- **Vidarbha** won their **third Ranji Trophy** title in seven seasons, defeating **Kerala** in the **2024-25 final** in **Nagpur**. Led by **Akshay Wadkar**, Vidarbha secured the victory on **March 2** after the final ended in a draw, thanks to their **first-innings lead** at the **Vidarbha Cricket Association Stadium**.
- **Steve Smith**, the Australian cricketering great, announced his retirement from **One-Day Internationals (ODIs)**, ending a remarkable career in the 50-over format. With **170 matches**, **5800 runs**, and **two World Cup victories**, Smith leaves a lasting legacy in **Australian cricket**. Known for his unorthodox yet effective batting, he will continue playing **Test** and **T20 cricket** in future international assignments.
- **Mushfiqur Rahim** has announced his **retirement from ODIs** after **Bangladesh's Champions Trophy campaign**, ending his **19-year ODI career**. The **37-year-old wicketkeeper-batsman** shared his decision on **Instagram**, citing recent challenges but reaffirming his **dedication and honesty** toward Bangladesh cricket.
- In **December 2024**, **Jay Shah** stepped down as **ACC president** after three terms and was elected **ICC chairman**, assuming office on **December 1, 2024**. Following his departure, **Shammi Silva** became the new **ACC president**, while **Rajeev Shukla** and **Ashish Shelar** took on key roles in the **ACC Board**. This transition comes ahead of major cricket events like the **2025 Asia Cup** in the **UAE** and the **ICC Champions Trophy**.
- **Harry Brook**, the **England batter**, has withdrawn from the **Indian Premier League (IPL) 2025** for the second consecutive year, despite being signed by **Delhi Capitals (DC)** for **₹6.25 crores** in the previous year's auction. His decision could lead to a **two-year ban** from future IPL editions, in accordance with new rules introduced by the **Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI)**.
- A **one-off day-night Test match** between **Australia** and **England** will be held at the **Melbourne Cricket Ground (MCG)** from **March 11 to March 15, 2027**, to celebrate the **150th anniversary** of the first-ever Test match. This landmark **pink-ball Test** marks a significant moment in the evolution of **Test cricket**, blending tradition with modernity and drawing global attention to the game's longest format.
- India's **Shubman Gill** won the **ICC Men's Player of the Month** for February 2025, while **Australia's Alana King** claimed the **ICC Women's Player of the Month** title, both recognized for their **outstanding performances**.

- **Delhi Capitals (DC)** has appointed **Axar Patel** as the team's **captain** for the **2025 IPL season**. The **31-year-old all-rounder**, with the franchise since 2019, takes over after serving as **vice-captain** for two seasons. Known for his consistency with both bat and ball, Axar Patel is set to lead DC towards success with a well-balanced squad.
- **Ajinkya Rahane** made history by becoming the first **Indian player** to captain **three different IPL teams**. In **IPL 2025**, he led **Kolkata Knight Riders (KKR)** in their opening match against **Royal Challengers Bengaluru** at **Eden Gardens**, marking his 26th game as an IPL captain. Rahane previously captained **Rising Pune Supergiant** in 2017 and **Rajasthan Royals** in 2018-2019.

BADMINTON & TENNIS

- **Achanta Sharath Kamal**, India's legendary **table tennis** player, announced his retirement, with his farewell tournament being the **WTT Star Contender** in **Chennai** from **March 25-30, 2025**. A **10-time National Champion** and **five-time Olympian**, Sharath has earned recognition at the **Commonwealth Games**, **Asian Games**, and **Olympics**.

ATHLETIC & FOOTBALL

- Indian football legend **Sunil Chhetri** has made a remarkable comeback to the national team at the age of **40**, reversing his retirement decision from **June 2024**. The former captain and **India's all-time leading goal scorer**, who had retired after a World Cup qualifier against **Kuwait**, was recalled by **head coach Manolo Marquez** for India's pursuit of **2027 AFC Asian Cup** qualification.
- **Japan** secured its spot in the **2026 FIFA World Cup** as the first team to qualify after the host nations. A **2-0 win** over **Bahrain** at **Saitama Stadium** on **March 20, 2025** confirmed their place. **Daichi Kamada** and **Takefusa Kubo** scored in the second half, marking Japan's **eighth consecutive World Cup appearance**.

OTHER SPORTS NEWS

- **Gulmarg**, the famous ski resort in **Jammu and Kashmir**, will host the **Khelo India Winter Games (KIWG) 2025** from **March 9 to 12**. Originally scheduled for **February 22-25**, the event was postponed due to a lack of snow but has been rescheduled following **moderate to heavy snowfall** in the region.
- **Brandon Holt** of the **United States** won the **2025 Bengaluru Open ATP 125 Challenger**, defeating **Shintaro Mochizuki** of **Japan** in the final on **March 2, 2025** at the **KSLTA Tennis Stadium**. - The **Khelo India Winter Games 2025 (KIWG 2025)** was held in two phases from **January 23 to March 12, 2025**, with over **400 athletes** from **19 teams** participating. The event took place in **Leh, Ladakh** and **Jammu & Kashmir**, and the **Indian Army** emerged as the overall champion, winning the most **gold medals**.
- India had a remarkable showing at the **Special Olympics World Winter Games 2025** in **Turin, Italy**, securing **33 medals**: **8 gold**, **18 silver**, and **7 bronze**. **Snowshoeing** was a strong area, with 10 medals, including **silver** for Vasu Tiwari, Shalini Chauhan, and Tanya, and a **bronze** for Jahangir. In **Alpine Skiing**, India won 10 medals, including **silver** for Radha Devi, Nirmala Devi, and Abhishek Kumar in various categories.
- **India Masters** won the inaugural **International Masters League (IML) 2025**, defeating **West Indies Masters** by **six wickets** in a thrilling final at the **SVNS International Stadium**. Led by **Sachin Tendulkar**, India Masters triumphed in front of nearly **50,000 fans**. The match, featuring **Brian Lara** and a star-studded lineup, celebrated cricket’s golden era. India Masters also earned a **₹1 crore** prize for their victory.
- The **Kabaddi World Cup 2025** begins in **England**, marking the first time the tournament is hosted outside Asia. **India's men’s team** will face **Italy** in **Wolverhampton**. The event spans **seven days**, with **60+ matches** across venues like **Birmingham, Coventry, Walsall, and Wolverhampton**.
- The **Khelo India Para Games 2025** will be held from **March 20 to 27, 2025** in **New Delhi**. **Dr. Mansukh Mandaviya**, Minister of Youth Affairs and Sports, launched the official anthem at **Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium**. The **mascot ‘Ujjwala’**, inspired by the house sparrow, symbolizes **resilience** and **determination**. The **Games logo**, featuring Delhi landmarks, was unveiled by **Devendra Jhajharia** and **Sminu Jindal**.
- **Hockey Jharkhand** won their first-ever **15th Hockey India Senior Women National Championship 2025** title, defeating **defending champions Hockey Haryana** in a thrilling final at **Tau Devi Lal Complex, Panchkula**. The match ended in a **1-1 draw**, and **Hockey Jharkhand** triumphed in the **penalty shootout**, making history in Indian women’s hockey.
- In the **Chinese Grand Prix**, **Oscar Piastri** triumphed over his **McLaren teammate Lando Norris**, delivering a standout performance for the team in **Formula 1 2024**. Meanwhile, **Ferrari** faced a post-race setback as **Charles Leclerc** and **Lewis Hamilton** were **disqualified** for **technical infringements**.
- Indian wrestler **Sunil Kumar** won a **bronze medal** in the **87kg Greco-Roman** category at the **Asian Wrestling Championships 2025** in **Amman, Jordan**. Sunil, a former **silver medallist** (2019), began his campaign with a dominant **10-1 victory** over **Tajikistan’s Sukhrob Abdulkhaev** in the quarterfinals.
- The **Khelo India Para Games (KIPG) 2025** concluded in **New Delhi** with nearly **1,300 para-athletes** showcasing remarkable talent. **Haryana** topped the medal tally with **34 golds**, followed by **Tamil Nadu** (28) and **Uttar Pradesh** (23). The event set **18 national records**, highlighting the growing competitiveness and excellence of para-athletes in India.

These include **Kanger Valley National Park**, **Mudumal Megalithic Menhirs**, **Ashokan Edict Sites**, **Chausath Yogini Temples**, **Gupta Temples of North India**, and **Palace-Fortresses of the Bundelas**. Being on the Tentative List is a crucial step towards **UNESCO World Heritage** status, showcasing India's commitment to preserving its **cultural and natural heritage**.
- The **'Watan Ko Jano'** programme, funded by the **Ministry of Home Affairs**, aims to promote **national integration** by exposing children under 18 from government-run homes to the **culture, history, and technological advancements** of other parts of India. The initiative has successfully fostered unity among **India's youth** and contributed to a more **inclusive and harmonious society**.



- **East Coast Railway (ECoR)** has become the **first railway zone** in India to achieve **250 million tons (MT) of originating freight** in **FY 2024-25**, reaching the milestone on **March 21, 2024, 11 days ahead of schedule**. This marks the **second consecutive year** of surpassing 250 MT, reinforcing ECoR's position as **India's highest freight-loading railway zone** and a key contributor to **logistics and economic growth**.
- The **Archaeological Survey of India (ASI)** has made significant discoveries at two locations: over **110 megalithic burial sites** near **Malampuzha Dam** in **Palakkad, Kerala**, shedding light on early **Iron Age** society, and a collection of **Buddhist antiquities** in **Ratnagiri, Odisha**, offering insights into the spread of **Vajrayana Buddhism** and its links with **Southeast Asia**.
