DoSJE- UNDP Agreement for improved access to finance and technologies to waste-pickers

The agreement was signed on Labor Day, 2025 (1st May) **between United Nations Development Programme and Department of Social Justice and Empowerment to enable waste-pickers** with improved access to finance and relevant technologies along with safe and sustainable work environment.

Additional Points

- **UNDP** also provides financial support for the establishment of Project Management Units (PMUs) across various states under NAMASTE scheme.
- Waste-pickers have been added as a component under the NAMASTE Scheme from the FY24.
- NAMASTE is being implemented by MoSJE for broadening the formal inclusion of waste pickers across India, with an aim to enumerate 2,50,000 waste pickers nationwide.

Waste-Picker component under NAMASTE scheme

- Enumerate and recognize them through a nationwide digital profiling and registration.
- Provide occupational photo ID cards to ensure formal identity and access to government benefits.
- Health insurance coverage under Ayushman Bharat-PMJAY
- Skill upgradation training
- Provision of **PPE kits** and
- Capital subsidies for waste collection vehicles.
- Facilitate the **formation and strengthening of waste-picker collectives**, enabling them to manage Decentralized Waste Collection Centers (DWCCs) and improve their livelihoods.
