QS World Rankings 2026: Top 10 & Best Indian Universities

The **QS World University Rankings 2026**, one of the most respected global indicators of academic excellence, has been officially released. With over **1,500 universities** featured across more than **100 countries**, the rankings reflect the growing competitiveness and evolution of the global higher education landscape.

For the 14th consecutive year, the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) has secured the #1 position globally, affirming its reputation for academic rigor, research excellence, and innovation leadership. MIT continues to lead across indicators such as academic reputation, faculty/student ratio, and employer reputation.

In a press release, **QS** (Quacquarelli Symonds) confirmed that nearly **500** institutions have improved their positions compared

to the previous year. This improvement is based on metrics like citations per faculty, international student ratio, and sustainability.

Among the fastest-rising institutions, **Sunway University** from **Malaysia** stood out, **jumping over 120 places** from its previous ranking. This significant rise underscores Asia's growing prominence in global education, driven by investment in **research infrastructure**, **international collaborations**, and a **diverse academic ecosystem**.

The 2026 edition includes institutions from more than 100 regions, offering insights into the best universities across North America, Europe, Asia, Australia, Latin America, and Africa. It continues to serve as a valuable tool for students, researchers, and policy-makers alike.

PM Modi Conferred with Cyprus' Highest Civilian Honour — Order of Makarios III

In a significant diplomatic gesture, Prime Minister Narendra Modi was conferred with the Grand Cross of the Order of Makarios III, Cyprus' highest civilian honour, on June 16, 2025, by President Nikos Christodoulides. The award is named after Archbishop Makarios III, the first President of Cyprus, and is reserved for global leaders and dignitaries who have made outstanding contributions to international relations and peace.

Why in News?

PM Narendra Modi received Cyprus' top civilian award during his first-ever official visit to the Mediterranean nation. The award, Grand Cross of the Order of Makarios III, recognizes his efforts in strengthening India-Cyprus relations and promoting global cooperation. Modi's visit marks a historic milestone, as he is the first Indian Prime Minister to visit Cyprus.

India Marks 50 Years of Crocodile Conservation Project on **World Crocodile Day**

On World Crocodile Day (June 17, 2025), India celebrates the 50th anniversary of its pioneering Crocodile Conservation Project (CCP), which began in 1975 at Bhitarkanika National Park, Odisha. This milestone highlights India's successful journey in conserving all three native crocodilian species, including the critically endangered Gharial. With Odisha at the forefront, this initiative has now become a national and global model for reptilian conservation.

Why in News?

India commemorates 50 years of the Crocodile Conservation Project on World Crocodile Day (17th June 2025). Odisha stands out as the only Indian state with all three native crocodilian species thriving in the wild. India hosts 80% of the world's wild gharial population, underlining its global significance in crocodilian conservation.

- Project Launched: 1975, at Bhitarkanika National Park, Odisha.
- Supported By: UNDP and FAO.
- Method Adopted: "Rear and release"—capturing eggs or hatchlings, rearing in captivity, then releasing into protected

National Affairs

- Visakhapatnam will host the 11th International Day of Yoga (IDY 2025) on June 21, celebrating 10 years of this global wellness event. Senior officials from the Ministry of Ayush and the Andhra Pradesh Government recently reviewed preparations at key venues. The state's ambitious "Yogandhra" initiative targets yoga outreach to 2 crore people and aims to train 20 lakh certified practitioners. With more than 1 lakh locations participating across the state and 5 lakh attendees expected in Visakhapatnam alone, IDY 2025 promises to exemplify India's commitment to "Yoga for One Earth, One Health." - At the Institutional Arbitration Conference held in New Delhi on June 14, 2025, Law Minister Arjun Ram Meghwal emphasized India's ambition to become a global arbitration hub. Highlighting the need for alternative dispute resolution (ADR) methods such as arbitration, mediation, and conciliation, the Minister stressed reduced court burden and investor convenience. ONGC Chairman Arun Kumar Singh and other stakeholders underlined the importance of time-bound, corporate-style arbitration. (Click here to read article)





- PM Narendra Modi's visit to Cyprus in June 2025 marks a strategic recalibration in India's foreign policy. As Turkey strengthens its alliance with Pakistan, India's outreach to Cyprus a nation that has consistently backed India on the global stage is both symbolic and strategic. Cyprus' role in the India-Middle East-Europe Economic Corridor (IMEC), its geographical proximity to West Asia, and its upcoming presidency of the EU Council in 2026 amplify its significance. The visit underscores India's commitment to counter-terror diplomacy, multilateral engagement, and trade connectivity in a rapidly evolving global order. (Click here to read article)
- The DhartiAaba Janbhagidari Abhiyan, launched by the Ministry of Tribal Affairs, is India's largest tribal empowerment campaign, covering over 549 tribal districts, 2,900+ blocks, and 1 lakh villages. The campaign ensures benefit saturation by delivering key services such as Aadhaar enrolment, Ayushman Bharat cards, PM-Kisan registration, Jan Dhan accounts, pensions, and skill development at the doorstep of tribal households. Implemented as part of Janjatiya Gaurav Varsh, and supported by programs like PM-JANMAN and DAJGUA, the initiative marks a major step in inclusive governance and last-mile delivery. - Maruti Suzuki India has inaugurated India's largest automobile in-plant railway siding at its Manesar plant, marking a major step towards green logistics. Aligned with the PM Gati Shakti Master Plan, the ₹452 crore facility is part of the 126 km Haryana Orbital Rail Corridor. It will dispatch 4.5 lakh vehicles annually, cut 1.75 lakh tonnes of CO₂ emissions, and save 60 million litres of fuel per year. With this, MSIL aims to increase rail-based dispatches to 35% by FY2030–31, supporting India's vision of a net-zero emission economy by 2070. (Click here to read article)
- The Government of India has introduced a ₹3,000 FASTag Annual Pass, starting August 15, 2025, for private vehicles like cars, jeeps, and vans. Valid for one year or 200 trips, this initiative aims to reduce toll-related disputes, especially where plazas are closely spaced, and encourage a digital-first tolling system. The pass can be activated through the Rajmarg Yatra App or official NHAI/MoRTH platforms, offering an affordable, hassle-free travel experience across National Highways. (Click here to read article)
- India has initiated Operation Sindhu to evacuate its nationals from Iran amid the growing threat of conflict with Israel. Over 100 Indian students have already been safely evacuated via Armenia, reflecting the government's swift and well-coordinated response. The operation emphasizes India's commitment to the safety of its citizens abroad, effective diplomacy, and robust crisis management strategies. (Click here to read article)

- Anantha Chandrakasan, a Chennai-born academic and MIT's School of Engineering Dean, has been appointed as the first Indian-born Provost of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT). Taking office on July 1, 2025, he will oversee MIT's academic and financial strategy. A renowned engineer and researcher, Chandrakasan leads MIT's Energy-Efficient Circuits and Systems Group, and has been instrumental in promoting innovation, entrepreneurship, and inclusion through programs like SuperUROP and Rising Stars. - On June 18, 2025, the Election Commission of India (ECI) unveiled a new SOP to deliver Elector Photo Identity Cards (EPICs) within 15 days of any electoral roll update. Powered by the ECINet platform and integrated with the Department of Posts, the system provides real-time tracking and SMS notifications to voters. This tech-driven step aims to improve voter convenience, ensure timely delivery, and bolster digital transparency in India's electoral services. (Click here to read article)
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi's first visit to Croatia signals a strategic shift in India's foreign policy, emphasizing deeper connectivity with Central and Eastern Europe. With its Adriatic Sea access, membership in EU and NATO, and involvement in initiatives like 3SI and IMEC, Croatia offers India key trade and geopolitical advantages. The visit also revived historic cultural ties, notably through the Sanskrit grammar work of Croatian scholar Filip Vezdin. This outreach reinforces India's presence in the region and counters rival global influences like the BRI, while enhancing prospects for UNSC support. (Click here to read article)
- The Election Commission of India (ECI) has rolled out transformative reforms during the June 2025 bye-polls, introducing innovations like mobile deposit facilities, realtime VTR updates, and 100% webcasting. These initiatives, implemented across five Assembly Constituencies, enhance voter convenience, transparency, and polling efficiency. With the Special Summary Revision of electoral rolls also carried out for the first time in two decades, these reforms set a precedent for future state elections, especially the upcoming Bihar Assembly Elections. - India is set to export its first-ever locally manufactured locomotive to Guinea, with PM Narendra Modi inaugurating the flag-off ceremony from Marhowrah, Bihar, on June 20, 2025. The deal includes 150 high-tech locomotives worth ₹3,000 crore, made for Guinea's SimFer Simandou mining project. Manufactured under the Make in India initiative, these locomotives feature world-class safety, comfort, and performance. The project, awarded through global competitive bidding, highlights India's rising capabilities in railway manufacturing, its diplomatic outreach to Africa, and the realization of the Atmanirbhar Bharat vision. - To mark World Sickle Cell Day on June 19, 2025, AIIMS Mangalagiri organized an awareness rally in collaboration with the **Departments of Health and Tribal Welfare**. The event featured participation from students, tribal members, and medical professionals, aiming to boost awareness about sickle cell disease, a hereditary blood disorder that disproportionately affects tribal populations in India. - The Union Public Service Commission (UPSC) has launched "Pratibha Setu", a revamped platform that allows employers to access details of non-recommended candidates who cleared all stages of UPSC exams but were not on the final merit list. This move provides career alternatives to top-tier aspirants and strengthens the interface between government-selected talent and private sector demand. With secure login access for verified recruiters and opt-in participation from candidates, Pratibha Setu represents a forward-looking employment reform initiative. (Click here to read article)
- The Government of India is set to notify the **Legal Metrology** (Indian Standard Time) Rules, 2025, mandating the use of Indian Standard Time (IST) across all legal, commercial, and digital activities. This initiative, backed by the **Department** of Consumer Affairs, CSIR-NPL, and ISRO, aims to enhance digital security, traceability, and operational efficiency by eliminating reliance on foreign time sources. It includes setting up five Regional Reference Standard Laboratories (RRSLs) with atomic clocks and secure synchronization protocols. The move is a major leap towards **One Nation**, One Time, securing national digital infrastructure under a trusted, standardized ecosystem. (Click here to read article)
- In a major step towards uniting the world through the ancient practice of yoga, the Morarji Desai National Institute of Yoga (MDNIY) launched 'Yoga Bandhan', a flagship international program under the Ministry of Ayush. As a Signature Event leading up to the International Day of Yoga (IDY) 2025, the initiative brought together yoga ambassadors from 15 countries to strengthen global partnerships in yoga education, diplomacy, and wellness, reflecting India's continued leadership in promoting cultural unity and holistic health worldwide. - During his visit to Bhubaneswar on June 20, 2025, Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated ₹18,600 crore worth of development projects, flagged off new rail and bus services, and launched the Odisha Vision Document, aiming for a \$1.5 trillion economy by 2047. Emphasizing cultural revival, women empowerment, and infrastructure growth, the PM also rolled out the Baraputra Aitihya Gram Yojana and felicitated Lakhpati Didis under the SHG initiative. The event signaled the government's commitment to holistic, inclusive progress in Odisha. (Click here to read article)

- The Ministry of Women and Child Development, under Annpurna Devi, launched the Gender Budgeting Knowledge Hub on June 20, 2025, during a national consultation in New Delhi. The platform will act as a digital repository for gender budgeting resources, aiding ministries, states, and policymakers in integrating gender equality in planning and budgeting. The Centre's allocation for FY 2025–26 stands at ₹4.49 lakh crore, a 4.5x increase from 2014-15. The consultation reviewed 20 years of gender budgeting in India and proposed training manuals and sector-specific strategies to further strengthen inclusive fiscal governance. - Yoga Sangam 2025, an initiative by the Ministry of Ayush, marks a transformative celebration of the 11th International Day of Yoga (IDY) with the theme "Unity Through Breath". This nationwide event will mobilize participation at over one lakh locations, including schools, offices, villages, and metros, symbolizing a collective movement for health and harmony. Emphasizing synchronized breathing and community connection, it redefines yoga as both a wellness practice and a national unifier. (Click here to read article)
- The Centre has notified the schedule for the 2027 decennial census, which will include caste enumeration. This will be India's first caste-based census in 16 years, since the last socio-economic caste data was gathered in 2011. The announcement follows a high-level review chaired by Union Home Minister Amit Shah.

States in the News

- In a historic move, Bihar becomes the first Indian state to implement mobile-based e-voting, set to launch during the 28th June municipal elections. Developed by C-DAC and the Bihar State Election Commission, the Android-based system aims to boost inclusive voting by enabling migrant workers, senior citizens, pregnant women, and Divyang voters to vote remotely. With features like blockchain technology, live face scan, biometric verification, and audit trails, the system ensures digital security, transparency, and tamper-proof voting, revolutionizing India's democratic process. - Google inaugurated its first Asia-Pacific Safety Engineering Centre (GSEC) in Hyderabad on June 18, 2025, solidifying India's role in global cybersecurity and responsible Al development. Inaugurated by CM A Revanth Reddy, the centre will combat online fraud, ensure infrastructure safety, and develop Al-driven security solutions like realtime scam alerts and SynthID watermarking. With its Hyderabad operations since 2007, Google reaffirmed its commitment to user safety, job creation, and skilling. The launch aligns with India's AI transformation strategy and Telangana's vision of becoming a \$1 trillion economy by 2035. (Click here to read article)





- The Maharashtra government's new directive under the State Curriculum Framework 2024 declares Hindi as the default third language from Classes 1 to 5 in Marathi and English medium schools, with the option to study another Indian language if 20 students per class request it. While aligned with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, the move has been criticized by the opposition and language activists as a veiled attempt to reimpose Hindi despite earlier assurances that it wouldn't be mandatory. - In a landmark decision, the Calcutta High Court has ordered the Centre to resume MGNREGA operations in West Bengal starting August 1, 2025, after a three-year suspension due to alleged irregularities. The court stressed the need to separate past misconduct from the future right to livelihood, restoring work opportunities to over 25 million rural workers. The scheme's revival is seen as a victory for civil rights, with advocates hailing it as a turning point for rural employment, economic justice, and public accountability in India's flagship social welfare programme. - The Government of India has approved a ₹2,006.40 crore relief package for Himachal Pradesh under the National Disaster Response Fund (NDRF) to support recovery and reconstruction following the 2023 monsoon disasters. Over 550 people died during the floods and landslides. The decision, made by a high-level committee led by Union Home Minister Amit Shah, includes ₹1,504.80 crore as the Centre's share. The state had earlier sought ₹9,042 crore under PDNA. This move reflects a national commitment to disaster resilience and follows similar packages to Uttarakhand and Sikkim. - The Prayoga Institute of Education Research, in collaboration with the SBI Foundation and SBI Funds Management, launched the Kriya programme in 12 government schools of Raichur district on June 17, 2025. Aligned with NEP 2020, the initiative aims to provide experiential science learning for students from Classes 6 to 10, encouraging critical thinking and inquiry-based education. Having already impacted over 11,000 students in Karnataka, the programme marks a key milestone in Prayoga's mission to transform rural STEM education through scalable, research-backed methods. - The Delhi Government is set to begin cloud-seeding trials by late June 2025, marking a significant move in weather modification technology to potentially combat pollution and water scarcity. - The UK government has appointed Blaise Metreweli as the first female chief of MI6, marking a historic moment in the agency's 116-year legacy. - According to the SIPRI Yearbook 2025, India has modestly expanded its nuclear arsenal and is actively developing new nuclear delivery systems, including canisterised missiles that could carry warheads even during peacetime. This comes amid global nuclear modernisation, where nations like China (now with over 600 warheads) and Pakistan are also upgrading capabilities. The report warns of a new nuclear arms race, as 12,241 nuclear warheads are now estimated worldwide, with Russia and the US holding 90% of them. (Click here to read article)
- The Times Higher Education (THE) Impact Rankings 2025 showcased India's growing presence in sustainabilityoriented education, with Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham (Rank 41) and Lovely Professional University (Rank 48) leading among 135 Indian participants. They were joined in the global top 100 by JSS Academy and Shoolini University, marking a strong performance in UN SDGs like clean energy, climate action, and quality education. With Asian universities dominating the top ranks and Western Sydney University retaining global leadership, the rankings highlight India's rising academic influence on sustainability metrics. - India ranked 71st in the Energy Transition Index 2025 released by the World Economic Forum, a drop from last year's 63rd position. While the country advanced in energy efficiency, clean energy investments, and regulatory frameworks, gaps remain in energy equity, grid reliability, and import dependence. The report emphasized uneven global progress, with only 28% of countries improving in all three core energy dimensions. India remains a key player in global energy transformation, alongside the US, China, and EU. (Click here to read article)

- The MCC has outlawed the "bunny hop" boundary catch in its Law 19.5.2 update, effective in ICC play from June 17, 2025, and in the MCC Laws from October 2026. Under the new rule, a fielder may make only one airborne touch after springing from beyond the boundary and must land inside the field to complete the catch; otherwise, it is scored a boundary. This amendment aims to uphold the spirit of fair play, eliminate unusual-looking multi-touch feats, and ensure consistency across cricket's premier championships. (Click here to read article)
- Taylor Fritz emerged victorious at the 2025 Stuttgart Open, defeating Alexander Zverev in straight sets to earn his first title of the year and ninth overall. The match showcased Fritz's flawless service game, as he didn't drop serve during the entire tournament. The win strengthens his form going into Wimbledon 2025, where he will enter with renewed confidence. Meanwhile, Zverev's struggles on grass continued, marking his third loss in a grass-court final. - Union Minister Kamlesh Paswan inaugurated Garuda Aerospace's Agri-Drone Indigenization Facility in Chennai, launching 300 Centres of Excellence (CoEs) and the DGCAapproved Train the Trainer (TTT) programme. The 35,000 sq. ft. facility is equipped to manufacture 1 lakh drones by 2026, aligning with Prime Minister Modi's vision of making India a Global Drone Hub. Live demonstrations by Drone Didis, collaboration with the Bharat Drone Association, and a focus on self-reliance, skilling, and innovation marked a transformative moment for the country's drone industry. - India has marked a significant milestone in cancer research by developing a one-step synthesis method for PEGylated nano-cups, offering a non-toxic, efficient alternative for photothermal therapy (PTT). Spearheaded by INST Mohali with contributions from IIT Bombay and ACTREC, this breakthrough utilizes ZIF-8 MOF and ascorbic acid to create semi-shells that can precisely target and destroy cancerous tumors, especially in advanced breast cancer. The innovation not only enhances therapeutic efficacy but also opens pathways for biosensing and chemo-photothermal treatments, making it a game-changer in minimally invasive oncology. - India's participation in international commercial spaceflight has reached new heights as the Axiom Mission 4 launch, featuring Indian astronaut Shubhanshu Shukla, has been rescheduled to June 22 due to safety checks in the Zvezda module of the ISS. The mission, led by NASA astronaut Peggy Whitson and operated by Axiom Space, includes astronauts from India, Poland, and Hungary, and will fly aboard the SpaceX Falcon 9 using the Dragon capsule. - A new COVID-19 variant, NB.1.8.1 (Nimbus), first identified in January 2025, is drawing global concern due to its rapid spread and a distinct symptom described as "razor blade throat". Classified by the WHO as a variant under monitoring, Nimbus, a descendant of Omicron, has been detected in 22 countries including the US, UK, China, and parts of Asia, accounting for 10.7% of sequenced cases in late April. - Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman has laid the foundation stone for a Mini Planetarium and Astro Globe at the Hanle Dark Sky Reserve in Ladakh, with a project outlay of ₹276.65 lakh under the Special Development Package. - Honda has made its debut in the space race with the successful launch and landing of a reusable experimental rocket on June 17, 2025, from its Hokkaido facility. - The US FDA has approved Lenacapavir (Yeztugo), a twiceyearly injectable drug for HIV prevention, showing 99.9% efficacy in Phase 3 trials. Though not widely used in India due to high costs and absence in national HIV programmes, experts say the drug could transform global public health outcomes if supported by WHO and donor agencies. In a move set to accelerate India's entry into the commercial space launch market, HAL has secured a ₹511 crore deal to manufacture and operate SSLVs under ISRO's technology transfer programme. The process will include two years of support and training, after which HAL will independently handle SSLV production. 
Obituaries News

- Former ISRO scientist and renowned Tamil author Nellai Su. Muthu passed away on June 16, 2025, in Thiruvananthapuram at the age of 74. Born in Tirunelveli, he served at the Satish Dhawan Space Centre, collaborated with Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam, and wrote over 170 books. His works like Vinveli 2057 and Einsteinum Andaveliyum received multiple state awards, and his contributions spanned science communication, children's literature, and Tamil poetry. - Maruti Chitampalli, the 93-year-old Padma Shri awardee and legendary environmentalist, passed away in Solapur due to age-related ailments.
