This initiative comes amid growing efforts to improve digital accessibility, passenger convenience, and operational efficiency within the Indian Railways system.

Cabinet Approves ELI Scheme to Generate 3.5 Crore Jobs **Across India**

In a major employment-focused reform, the Union Cabinet chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi has approved the Employment Linked Incentive (ELI) Scheme, aiming to generate over 3.5 crore jobs across sectors with special emphasis on manufacturing. With a substantial outlay of nearly ₹1 lakh crore, the scheme seeks to boost first-time employment, support employers in creating new jobs, and extend social security benefits to India's young workforce.

Why in News?

The ELI Scheme, announced in the Union Budget 2024–25 and approved by the Cabinet on July 1, 2025, is part of a larger employment and skilling package worth ₹2 lakh crore. It is designed to address unemployment challenges, promote formal job creation, and enhance youth employability, especially in the post-pandemic era. The scheme targets job creation from August 1, 2025, to July 31, 2027.

Aim & Objectives

- Create over 3.5 crore formal jobs in 2 years.
- Promote employment in manufacturing and other sectors.
- Support first-time employees and incentivize employers.
- Strengthen social security coverage through EPFO registration.
- Enhance financial literacy and promote savings culture among youth.

Structure of the ELI Scheme

Part A – Incentives to First-Time Employees

- Beneficiaries: 1.92 crore new employees registered with EPFO.
- **Benefit:** One-month wage up to ₹15,000 in two installments:
- First installment after 6 months of service.
- Second installment after 12 months + completion of financial literacy training.
- **Eligibility:** Salary up to ₹1 lakh/month.
- A portion of the incentive to be locked in savings instruments for future withdrawal.

Part B – Support to Employers

- Covers all sectors; special benefits for manufacturing.
- Incentives to employers for hiring additional employees (with sustained 6-month employment).
- Applicable only for employers registered with EPFO.

Minimum new hires required

- 2 employees (firms with <50 employees)
- 5 employees (firms with ≥50 employees) Incentive Structure for Employers,
- Employee's EPF Wage Slab Employer Incentive/Month
- Up to ₹10,000 Up to ₹1,000





- ₹10,001 ₹20,000 ₹2,000
- ₹20,001 ₹1,00,000 ₹3,000
- For manufacturing, incentives will be extended to the 3rd and 4th years.

Payment Mechanism

- Part A: Payments via DBT through Aadhaar Bridge Payment
- Part B: Payments to employers' PAN-linked accounts.



Union Cabinet Approves ₹1 Lakh Crore RDI Scheme to Boost **Private Sector Innovation**

In a major initiative to strengthen India's innovation ecosystem, the Union Cabinet approved the Research Development and Innovation (RDI) Scheme on July 1, 2025, with an outlay of ₹1 lakh crore. The scheme is designed to spur private sector investment in high-impact research and development, particularly in sunrise and strategic sectors, by offering long-term financing at low or nil interest rates. The program will be strategically guided by the Anusandhan National Research Foundation (ANRF), chaired by the Prime Minister.

Why in News?

The approval of the RDI Scheme marks a significant policy move to promote deep-tech innovation, economic self-reliance, and strategic research investment by the private sector. With traditional R&D funding channels often limited for industry players, this scheme provides a transformative financing mechanism to overcome those constraints.



Key Objectives of the RDI Scheme

- Promote private sector-led R&D and innovation in sunrise domains like AI, semiconductors, clean energy, etc.
- Encourage investment in technology acquisition and commercialization.
- Finance high Technology Readiness Level (TRL) projects.
- Support strategic sectors critical for national security and economic competitiveness.
- Establish a Deep-Tech Fund of Funds to stimulate long-term innovation.

Two-Tier Structure

Tier 1 – Special Purpose Fund (SPF)

Created within the ANRF, this fund will act as the central custodian of funds and allocate capital to second-level fund managers.

Tier 2 – 2nd-Level Fund Managers

- These managers will channel concessional long-term loans to private entities engaged in transformative R&D projects.
- Loans will carry low or nil interest, helping mitigate risk and encourage innovation.

Institutional Oversight

- The ANRF Governing Board, headed by the Prime Minister, will provide strategic direction and supervision.
- The scheme reflects a collaborative model between government and industry for advancing national innovation goals.

Significance of the Scheme

- Unlocks growth and risk capital for private enterprises, especially startups and MSMEs in tech.
- Helps position India as a global innovation hub.
- Strengthens technology self-reliance and supports the Make in India and Atmanirbhar Bharat missions.
- Aligns with India's goals under the National Deep-Tech Strategy and Vision 2047.

Global Unicorn Index 2025: Top 10 Countries with the Most **Billion-Dollar Startups**

The Hurun Global Unicorn Index 2025, published by the Hurun Research Institute, marks a significant milestone in the global startup ecosystem. This year, the total number of privately held startups valued at over \$1 billion, known as unicorns, has reached a record 1,523. These companies, collectively worth \$5.6 trillion, represent the forefront of global innovation and entrepreneurship.

Global Growth of Unicorns

Since 2019, the number of countries with unicorns has increased by 120%, now totaling 52 nations. Similarly, unicorns are now spread across 307 cities, showing a 160% year-on-year increase in geographic diversity. This demonstrates the expanding reach of the startup ecosystem beyond traditional tech hubs.

Country Highlights

United States

The United States leads the world with **758 unicorns**, almost half of the global total. It added **55 new unicorns** in the past year. Six of the world's ten most valuable unicorns are based in the US. San Francisco retains its status as the "Unicorn Capital of the World" with 199 unicorns, followed by New York (142).

China

China remains second, with **343 unicorns** concentrated in tech hubs like **Beijing**, **Shanghai**, and **Shenzhen**. Notable Chinese unicorns include **ByteDance**, **Ant Group**, and **Shein**.

India

India ranks third globally with **64 unicorns**, led by cities like **Bengaluru**, **Mumbai**, and **Gurugram**. The sectors driving this growth include **fintech**, **gaming**, and **edtech**. Leading unicorns from India are:

- **Zerodha** \$8.2 billion
- Dream11 \$8 billion
- Razorpay \$7.5 billion

United Kingdom

The UK ranks fourth with **61 unicorns**, nearly all concentrated in **London**, which ranks fifth globally among cities by unicorn count. The UK startup scene remains strong in fintech, AI, and digital health.

Germany and France

Germany and France are the top unicorn hubs in continental Europe. Germany's **Berlin** leads with 36 unicorns nationally, while France's **Paris** accounts for the country's total of 30 unicorns. These two nations are establishing Europe as a competitive region in global innovation.

Canada

Canada has risen to seventh place with **28 unicorns**, driven by growth in **clean tech**, **AI**, and **enterprise software**. **Toronto** is the nation's top unicorn city.

Israel

Although Israel dropped one spot this year, it still has a strong presence with **20 unicorns**, primarily located in **Tel Aviv**. Israeli startups excel in **cybersecurity**, **healthtech**, and **agritech**.

South Korea and Singapore

Both countries share the ninth position with **18 unicorns** each. South Korea's unicorns are mostly centered in **Seoul**, while **Singapore** continues to rise as Southeast Asia's dominant startup hub.

UN Sustainable Development Goals Index 2025: Top 10 Best and Worst Performing Countries

The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), adopted by all United Nations member states in 2015, set out an ambitious vision for a fairer, greener, and more inclusive world by 2030. However, the 2025 Sustainable Development Report (SDR), published by the UN Sustainable Development Solutions Network (SDSN), paints a sobering picture: None of the 17 SDGs are on track to be fully achieved by 2030, and only 17% of the targets are progressing as planned.

While the world has made notable progress in areas like access to basic services, infrastructure, and healthcare, it has regressed in key sectors such as press freedom, corruption perception, nutrition, and environmental sustainability.





Global Ranking: A Tale of Two Worlds Top 10 Countries in SDG Index 2025

Europe, particularly the Nordic countries, continues to lead global efforts toward sustainable development. Finland has retained the top position, followed closely by Sweden and Denmark.

India's Historic Rise in SDG Ranking India Breaks into Top 100

In a remarkable improvement, India has ranked 99th in the 2025 SDG Index, with a score of 67.0. This marks India's first time entering the top 100, a significant milestone considering its past positions:

- 109th in 2024
- 112th in 2023
- **121st** in 2022
- 120th in 2021

This steady climb reflects India's growing focus on sustainable development, particularly in clean energy, digital public infrastructure, and financial inclusion.

India in Regional Comparison

Despite entering the top 100 globally, India still lags behind several South Asian peers, indicating both progress and challenges.

While India has overtaken Bangladesh and Pakistan, it remains behind Bhutan, Nepal, and Sri Lanka, suggesting room for regional cooperation and shared learning.

Highlights from Asia and the Global South

Notable Progress in Southeast and South Asia

Some of the most significant improvements since 2015 were made by countries in Asia, particularly in healthcare, education, and infrastructure.

- Nepal improved by 11.1 points
- Cambodia gained 10 points
- Philippines rose by 8.6 points

These nations demonstrate that with targeted policies and international support, lower-income countries can accelerate SDG progress.

China and the United States: A Mixed Picture

- China ranks 49th with a score of 74.4
- United States ranks 44th with a score of 75.2

Despite being two of the world's largest economies, both countries fall short of the top 40, with challenges in inequality, environmental sustainability, and health outcomes affecting their scores.

Challenges Facing the World in 2025

Despite some pockets of improvement, global SDG progress remains off track. According to the 2025 SDR:

- **Only 17%** of targets are progressing on schedule.
- Obesity, corruption, and media suppression are on the rise.
- Environmental degradation, including sustainable nitrogen management, is deteriorating.
- Inequality and gender gaps persist across both developed and developing nations.

The report also highlights the need for increased global cooperation, financial investments, and data-driven policies to meet the 2030 Agenda.





PM Modi Honoured in Ghana with 'Order of the Star'

In a historic diplomatic gesture, Prime Minister Narendra Modi has been conferred with Ghana's highest civilian award, the "Officer of the Order of the Star of Ghana", during his landmark visit to the country. The honour, bestowed by President John Dramani Mahama, recognizes PM Modi's global statesmanship, commitment to South-South cooperation, and his role in elevating India-Ghana bilateral ties. The Indian Prime Minister dedicated the award to India's youth, its diverse cultural legacy, and the shared democratic values between the two nations.

Why in News?

PM Modi received Ghana's top civilian honour on July 3, 2025, during his first state visit to Ghana. The honour celebrates his leadership and strengthens diplomatic engagement between India and Ghana, especially in sectors like trade, healthcare, education, and digital connectivity.

About the Honour

- Name of the Award: Officer of the Order of the Star of Ghana
- Conferred by: President John Dramani Mahama
- Reason: In recognition of PM Modi's distinguished global leadership, diplomatic outreach, and efforts to build South-South cooperation.

PM Modi Receives Trinidad and Tobago's Highest Civilian Award

On July 4, 2025, Prime Minister Narendra Modi was honoured with the Order of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago, the country's highest civilian award. The ceremony took place during his two-day visit to the Caribbean nation. This award was given for his global leadership and strong connection with the Indian diaspora. It is an important moment in strengthening India's ties with Trinidad and Tobago.

A Historic First Visit

This is PM Modi's first official visit to Trinidad and Tobago as Prime Minister. It is also the first Indian Prime Ministerial-level visit to the country since 1999. The visit is part of Mr. Modi's fivenation tour, and it highlights the long-standing bond between India and the island nation.

Reason for the Honour

The Order of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago was given to Mr. Modi to recognize his global leadership, his work in supporting the Indian community abroad, and his help during the COVID-19 pandemic. Prime Minister Kamla Persad-Bissessar of Trinidad and Tobago announced the award and said Mr. Modi's visit marks a moment of pride and connection between the two nations.

PM Modi's Response and Gifts

PM Modi said he was honoured to receive the award and accepted it on behalf of 140 crore Indians. As part of the visit, he also gave holy water from the Mahakumbh and a replica of the Ram Mandir to the Prime Minister of Trinidad and Tobago, symbolizing cultural and spiritual unity.







Visit to Ghana Beforehand

Before arriving in Trinidad and Tobago, Mr. Modi visited Ghana, where he received another top honour – the Officer of the Order of the Star of Ghana. The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said this honour was given for his strong leadership and contribution to global cooperation.

India and Trinidad & Tobago Sign Six New Agreements to **Boost Ties**

On July 4, 2025, India and Trinidad & Tobago signed six key agreements in Port of Spain to improve their partnership in many areas. These include work in infrastructure, medicine, culture, and sports. The deals were signed during Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to the country. This visit is seen as a big step toward building stronger ties between the two nations.

First Prime Ministerial Visit in Over 25 Years

This is the first visit by an Indian Prime Minister to Trinidad & Tobago since 1999. PM Narendra Modi met with Trinidad & Tobago's Prime Minister Kamla Persad-Bissessar and held important talks to improve cooperation. The two leaders discussed future work in agriculture, education, digital payments, and healthcare. They also shared views on major global issues like climate change, cyber security, and disaster response.

Both leaders showed great warmth and respect during the visit. PM Bissessar said that Mr. Modi's visit was a "landmark moment" that will give new energy to the friendship between the two countries.

Six Agreements Signed

The two nations signed six Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs). These deals cover cooperation in,

- 1. Pharmaceutical standards
- 2. Quick development projects
- 3. Cultural exchange
- 4. Sports promotion
- Diplomatic training
- 6. Sharing of official documents and research

The aim of these agreements is to create more jobs, better services, and stronger people-to-people connections between India and Trinidad & Tobago.

PM Modi also announced that people of Indian origin living in Trinidad & Tobago can now apply for OCI (Overseas Citizenship of India) cards, even if they are from the sixth generation. This will help families stay connected with their roots in India.

Meetings with National Leaders

PM Modi also met President Christine Carla Kangaloo, who recently received the Pravasi Bharatiya Samman Award for her service to the Indian community. Their meeting was friendly and respectful. PM Modi praised her for her public service and leadership. Both leaders also agreed to work together on issues that affect the Global South, such as climate problems and fair international cooperation.

PM Modi also thanked Trinidad & Tobago for its support to India after the Pahalgam terror attack and said both countries stand united against terrorism.

National Affairs

- From August 2025, all post offices in India will begin accepting digital payments using dynamic QR codes linked to the UPI system, as part of the Department of Posts' IT 2.0 upgrade. The move follows a successful pilot in Karnataka and aims to promote financial inclusion, especially in rural and semi-urban areas. Replacing static QR codes, the new real-time dynamic system ensures secure, seamless, and cashless transactions at postal counters, aligning with the goals of Digital India and a cashless economy. - Union Home Minister Amit Shah inaugurated the National Turmeric Board Headquarters in Nizamabad, Telangana, on June 30, 2025. This move fulfills a long-pending demand of turmeric farmers and aligns with the Centre's ambitious goal of reaching \$1 billion in turmeric exports by 2030. The board will focus on research, branding, marketing, and ensuring fair prices for farmers. - On Statistics Day 2025, the National Sample Survey Office (NSO) under MoSPI launched the GolStats mobile app, a digital tool offering real-time, on-the-go access to official government statistics like GDP, inflation, and employment. With features such as interactive dashboards, infographics, CSV downloads, and a user-friendly design, the app promotes data transparency, citizen empowerment, and supports Digital India and Viksit Bharat missions.  - In a sweeping reform move, the Election Commission of India (ECI) is de-listing 345 Registered Unrecognised Political Parties (RUPPs) that have not contested elections since 2019 and are untraceable. While registered under Section 29A of the RP Act, 1951, many RUPPs exploit benefits like tax exemptions, common symbols, and star campaigners despite being inactive. The ECI lacks explicit de-registration powers, but parties are being removed for non-compliance and non-existence. Legal and electoral reform bodies like the Law Commission and the ECI's 2016 **Memorandum** have recommended amending the RP Act to empower de-registration. This clean-up drive supports electoral transparency and curbs misuse of public provisions. (Click here to read article)

The project collects extensive data, including genomic, proteomic, metabolic, environmental, and socio-economic indicators, to understand how Indians age and why some age healthier than others. The ultimate goal is to establish the Bharat Baseline, enabling personalized healthcare and early disease detection tailored to India's diverse population. (Click here to read article)
- On July 2, 2025, the Ministry of Road Transport and Highways (MoRTH) revised its toll rule to cut charges by up to 50% on National Highway sections with tunnels, bridges, flyovers, and elevated roads. - The Union Cabinet's approval of the ₹1,853 crore project to upgrade the Paramakudi-Ramanathapuram road in Tamil Nadu marks a significant step toward infrastructure modernization. Developed under the Hybrid Annuity Mode (HAM), the project will convert 46.7 km of NH-87 into a four-lane corridor, improving connectivity between key towns and religious destinations like Rameshwaram. This initiative is expected to decongest traffic, boost tourism, enhance road safety, and generate over 18 lakh employment person-days, making it a cornerstone for regional development and economic integration in the state. While this benefits domestic businesses, it raises concerns over OECD consensus, potential retaliatory taxes, and uneven competition in the global economy. - Adani Green Energy Ltd has made history by becoming the first Indian company to cross 15 GW of installed renewable energy capacity, marking a key achievement in India's clean energy journey. - India's external debt rose to \$736.3 billion in FY25, registering a 10% growth over the previous year, with the external debt-to-GDP ratio climbing to 19.1%. - India has commissioned INS Tamal, a state-of-the-art stealth guided missile frigate, in Russia, representing the last foreign-built major warship for the Indian Navy. Built under Project 1135.6, Tamal underscores the shift toward defence indigenisation, integrating systems like BrahMos missiles and HUMSA-NG sonar. The vessel enhances India's blue-water capabilities and reinforces the Indo-Russian defence partnership, having become the 51st ship built under the collaboration. The Western Fleet now gains a powerful asset, while future warships will be constructed domestically, propelling India closer to its Aatmanirbhar Bharat vision. (Click here to read article)
