PM Modi Attends 17th BRICS Summit in Brazil

Prime Minister Narendra Modi took part in the 17th BRICS Summit held in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil on 6–7 July 2025. Leaders from BRICS countries met to talk about global reforms, peace and security, multilateral cooperation, and the growing role of Artificial Intelligence (AI). The summit was important as it focused on giving a stronger voice to the Global South and shaping a more balanced world order.

Focus on Global Governance and Security

During the session on "Reform of Global Governance and Peace and Security", PM Modi stressed the need to update global institutions like the UN Security Council, IMF, World Bank, and WTO. He said these organizations were formed in the 20th century and cannot handle today's challenges unless they are reformed. He also thanked other leaders for including strong support for UN reforms in the Summit Declaration.

On the topic of peace and security, Modi raised concern about rising terrorism. He referred to the Pahalgam terror attack in April 2025, calling it not just an attack on India but on all humanity. He urged the world to act strongly against terrorism and punish those who support or protect terrorists. He appreciated the BRICS countries for condemning the attack and stressed that there should be zero tolerance and no double standards when it comes to terrorism.

Call for Dialogue Amid Global Conflicts

Modi also spoke about the ongoing conflicts in West Asia and Europe, describing them as serious matters. He said India has always believed in resolving disputes through dialogue and diplomacy and is ready to help in any peace efforts. This shows India's consistent role as a peace supporter on the world stage.

Strengthening Multilateralism and Promoting AI

In the second session on "Multilateral, Economic-Financial Affairs and AI", the Prime Minister said BRICS must remain united to deal with global changes and uncertainties. He gave four ideas to make BRICS stronger,

- 1. The BRICS New Development Bank should fund projects based on countries' real needs and focus on long-term success.
- 2. BRICS should set up a Science and Research Repository to support Global South countries.
- 3. The group should secure critical mineral supply chains to reduce risks.
- 4. BRICS must work for Responsible AI, balancing innovation and AI governance.

Rio Declaration Adopted

At the end of the summit, all member countries adopted the 'Rio de Janeiro Declaration', which included shared goals on global reforms, peace, technology, and financial development. PM Modi also thanked Brazil's President for the warm welcome and successful organization of the summit.

BRICS Strongly Condemns Pahalgam Attack at Rio Summit – Rio de Janeiro Declaration

At the 17th BRICS Summit held in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, on July 6–7, 2025, member countries came together to adopt the Rio Declaration. The group strongly condemned the Pahalgam terror attack, supported India's call for zero tolerance against terrorism, and discussed urgent global reforms. This summit highlighted BRICS' growing unity on issues of security, global fairness, and inclusivity.

BRICS Condemns Terror Attack in Pahalgam

In a strong message, the BRICS nations condemned the terrorist attack in Jammu and Kashmir's Pahalgam on April 22, 2025, describing it as a crime against humanity. They supported India's position on having zero tolerance towards terrorism. The Rio Declaration clearly stated that cross-border terrorism, terror financing, and safe havens for terrorists must be opposed globally and without any double standards. BRICS also stressed that each country has the main responsibility to stop terrorism within its borders, following international law.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi, while speaking at the summit, thanked the leaders for their strong support and called for strict global actions against terrorism. He reminded the world that the Global South, including India, has often suffered due to double standards in the fight against terrorism.

PM Modi Pushes for Global Reforms

During his address, PM Modi raised the issue of unfair global systems, saying that many countries, especially from the Global South, are left out of major decision-making. He said that bodies like the UN Security Council, WTO, and global financial institutions need urgent reforms to reflect today's world. Modi compared old systems to typewriters in the age of AI, stressing that without changes in voting rights, leadership roles, and governance, these institutions will remain outdated.

Modi pointed out that two-thirds of humanity, especially in Africa, Asia, and Latin America, do not have proper representation in global institutions. He said this was not just about fairness but also about making these bodies more effective and credible.

From 6 to 7 July 2025, leaders of BRICS nations gathered in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, for the 17th BRICS Summit. They came together to discuss how to build a more fair, equal, and sustainable world. The summit was important because it showed a united stand on global reforms, welcomed new members, and launched new efforts in health, climate, and technology.

United for a Fairer World

At the summit, the leaders adopted the Rio de Janeiro Declaration, which calls for changes in how global organisations like the United Nations and World Trade Organization work. They said these systems should be fairer, more democratic, and reflect today's world.





The leaders also agreed to work more closely in areas such as,

- Politics and security
- Economy and trade •
- Culture and people-to-people ties •

Prime Minister Narendra Modi supported these ideas and said that the Global South-countries in Asia, Africa, and Latin America—must have a bigger say in world decisions. He also stressed the need to update old institutions to match modern challenges.

New Members and Big Initiatives

This year's summit was special because Indonesia officially became a full BRICS member. Eleven other countries, including Belarus, Nigeria, Cuba, and Vietnam, joined as BRICS partners. This expansion shows BRICS' growing influence and support worldwide.

The leaders also announced three new plans,

- 1. BRICS Climate Finance Framework to help countries fund eco-friendly growth.
- 2. Global AI Governance Statement to guide safe and fair use of artificial intelligence.
- 3. Partnership to Eliminate Socially Determined Diseases to fight health problems caused by poverty and inequality.

These steps show BRICS' goal to be more than just a political group—it's now working on real-world problems that affect people's lives.

Stronger Global Voice for Developing Nations

The BRICS leaders spoke firmly about the need to reform global bodies like the UN Security Council, World Bank, and IMF. They said these should better reflect the needs of developing countries. They also called for,

- Fairer voting rights
- Equal leadership roles for women and different regions
- Ending unfair sanctions by powerful countries ٠

PM Modi shared India's support for inclusive multilateralism, where every country, big or small, has a say.



Peace, Safety, and Digital Trust

BRICS also talked about peace and security. Leaders said global conflicts must be solved through talks, not violence. They condemned terrorism, destruction of civilian infrastructure, and harmful trade actions.

In the digital world, BRICS agreed to build rules for cyber safety, prevent online crime, and keep the internet open, safe, and stable.

India Ranked Among World's Most Equal Countries by World Bank

India has been named the fourth most equal country in the world by the World Bank, based on the Gini Index for 2025. With a score of 25.5, India has achieved a strong level of income equality, ahead of many developed nations. This is a big step for a large and diverse country, and shows how government policies and poverty reduction efforts are creating real change.

Understanding the Gini Index and India's Rank

The Gini Index measures how fairly income is shared in a country. A score of 0 means perfect equality, while 100 means complete inequality. India's score of 25.5 makes it one of the most equal countries in the world, just behind Slovak Republic (24.1), Slovenia (24.3), and Belarus (24.4).

India's ranking is better than China (35.7), the United States (41.8), and all G7 and G20 nations. Back in 2011, India's Gini score was 28.8, so this improvement over a decade shows steady progress. The World Bank released this data in its July 2025 report, covering 167 countries.

Big Drop in Poverty Rates

India's improved equality is closely linked to falling poverty levels. According to the World Bank's Spring 2025 Poverty and Equity Brief, the number of people in extreme poverty dropped from 16.2% in 2011–12 to just 2.3% in 2022–23. That means about 171 million Indians have come out of poverty in the last 12 years.

If we use the new global poverty line of \$3 per day, the poverty rate for 2022–23 is still low at 5.3%. These figures highlight the success of India's long-term efforts to improve lives across cities and villages.

Key Government Schemes That Helped

Several government programmes have helped reduce poverty and increase income equality. These include,

- PM Jan Dhan Yojana: Over 55.69 crore people now have bank accounts, which allows direct transfer of benefits.
- Aadhaar & DBT (Direct Benefit Transfer): Over 142 crore Aadhaar cards issued, helping ensure benefits reach the right people. DBT has saved the government ₹3.48 lakh crore so far.
- Ayushman Bharat: This health scheme has issued over 41.34 crore cards, offering free treatment up to ₹5 lakh per family per year. A special scheme also supports citizens aged 70+, no matter their income.

- Stand-Up India: This scheme gives loans to SC/ST and women entrepreneurs, with ₹62,807 crore already funded.
- **PM Vishwakarma Yojana**: A total of 29.95 lakh artisans have registered for tools, training, and credit support.
- **PMGKAY (Free Food Grains Scheme):** Reached 80.67 crore people, ensuring food security even during tough times like COVID-19.

PM Modi Honored With 'Key to the City of Buenos Aires'

On July 6, 2025, Prime Minister Narendra Modi was honoured with the 'Key to the City of Buenos Aires' during his official twoday visit to Argentina. This symbolic award was given in recognition of his efforts to strengthen the relationship between India and Argentina. The visit was historic, as it was the first by an Indian Prime Minister in 57 years.

Symbolic Honour for PM Modi

PM Modi was presented with the 'Key to the City' by Jorge Macri, the Chief of the City Government of Buenos Aires. This is a ceremonial gesture of trust and friendship. The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said the honour reflects PM Modi's role in building closer ties between India and Argentina. PM Modi expressed gratitude for the warm welcome and shared photos and messages on his official X (formerly Twitter) account.

Tributes to Icons and Cultural Connections

During his visit, PM Modi paid tribute to Mahatma Gandhi and Rabindranath Tagore by visiting their statues in Buenos Aires. He said Gandhi's message of peace and non-violence continues to inspire the world. Modi also honoured General Jose de San Martin, Argentina's national hero, at Plaza San Martin. He praised his leadership in the fight for freedom in South America. The visit focused on cultural respect and shared values.

Strengthening India-Argentina Ties

PM Modi met President Javier Milei and held high-level talks. Both leaders celebrated 75 years of diplomatic relations and agreed to expand ties in defence, energy, agriculture, mining, and trade. Argentina will supply lithium and shale gas to help India's energy needs. Modi also requested easier entry for Indian medicines into Argentina. They discussed collaboration in sports and education, and Modi invited President Milei to visit India.

Warm Welcome from Indian Diaspora

PM Modi received a grand welcome from the Indian community in Buenos Aires. People gathered outside his hotel, waving Indian flags, singing songs, and dancing. PM Modi interacted warmly with them and said that distance can never break cultural bonds. He appreciated their love and said their presence added special joy to the visit.

NITI Aayog Releases 2nd SDG Index for North East Districts

NITI Aayog, in partnership with the Ministry of Development of North Eastern Region (MoDoNER) and UNDP, released the second edition of the North Eastern Region District SDG Index (2023-24) on July 7, 2025, in New Delhi. The index shows how 121 districts from eight North East states are performing on Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). This is important because it helps track progress and plan better development in these states.

About the SDG Index and Its Purpose

The NER District SDG Index is a tool to measure how well different districts in North East India are doing in achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). These goals focus on areas like health, education, clean water, hunger, jobs, and equality. The first edition of the index was launched in August 2021. The latest 2023-24 edition helps identify which districts are doing well and where improvements are needed. It supports planning, better use of resources, and targeted development.

Key Highlights of the 2023-24 Report

85% of districts improved their overall SDG scores compared to the last report.

All districts in Mizoram, Sikkim, and Tripura achieved Front Runner status, meaning they scored between 65 and 99 points. Hnahthial (Mizoram) is the best performing district with a score of 81.43, while Longding (Arunachal Pradesh) scored the lowest at 58.71.

Nagaland had three districts among the top 10 performers. Sikkim showed the most consistent performance across its districts, with scores close to each other.

Districts were grouped into 4 categories

- Achiever (Score = 100)
- Front Runner (Score 65–99)
- Performer (Score 50–65)
- Aspirant (Score < 50)

No district fell into Achiever or Aspirant categories this year.

Statements by Key Leaders

The index was released in New Delhi by senior officials including, Shri Suman Bery, Vice Chairman, NITI Aayog Shri B.V.R. Subrahmanyam, CEO, NITI Aayog Shri Chanchal Kumar, Secretary, MoDoNER Dr. Angela Lusigi, Resident Representative, UNDP India Suman Bery said achieving the SDGs by 2030 is key for building a Viksit Bharat @2047 (a developed India by 2047). Subrahmanyam highlighted the importance of the North East,

calling it the "Ashta Lakshmi" or eight jewels of India.

Chanchal Kumar stressed the index helps find gaps and improve planning.

Dr. Lusigi noted that data must lead to real change for people's lives.



State-wise Performances and Observations

Sikkim and Tripura showed steady and high-level performances with small score differences between districts.

Mizoram and Nagaland had both very high and relatively lower scoring districts, showing more variation.

All districts in Assam improved in areas like Zero Hunger, Clean Water, Education, and Jobs.

Top and bottom performers in some states,

- Arunachal Pradesh: Lower Dibang Valley (73.36) and Longding (58.71)
- Assam: Dibrugarh (74.29) and South Salmara-Mankachar • (59.71)
- Manipur: Imphal West (73.21) and Pherzawl (59.71)
- Meghalaya: East Khasi Hills (73.00) and East Jaintia Hills • (63.00)

This index supports efforts like the Aspirational Districts Programme and encourages evidence-based planning to ensure no district is left behind.

PM Modi Gets Namibia's Top Civilian Honour

Prime Minister Narendra Modi was given Namibia's highest civilian award during his one-day state visit to the African nation on Wednesday. The award, called 'The Order of the Most Ancient Welwitschia Mirabilis', was presented by Namibia's President Netumbo Nandi-Ndaitwah. This honour shows the strong and growing relationship between India and Namibia.

Modi Receives Top Honour in Namibia

During his visit to Namibia on Wednesday, PM Modi was honoured with the country's top civilian award – The Order of the Most Ancient Welwitschia Mirabilis. The ceremony took place in the capital and was led by Namibia's President Netumbo Nandi-Ndaitwah. The award is named after a rare desert plant found only in Namibia, which stands for strength, long life, and resilience.

Modi is the first Indian leader to receive this special award. In his acceptance speech, he said, "I accept this honour with deep gratitude and dedicate it to the 1.4 billion people of India and the strong friendship between India and Namibia."

Meaning and History of the Award

The Welwitschia Mirabilis Award was started in 1995. It is given to people who show great leadership and work to build strong ties between nations. The plant it is named after survives in the desert for many years, which is why it is used as a symbol of endurance and unity.

This is PM Modi's 27th international award and the fourth during his current five-nation trip. Interestingly, it is also his second award within 24 hours, showing the global appreciation he is receiving on this tour.

A New Chapter in India-Namibia Relations

This honour marks a new milestone in the bond between India and Namibia. India and Namibia have worked together in areas like education, healthcare, defence, and technology. The award is a symbol of Namibia's respect for India's support and its interest in building even stronger ties in the future.

With this honour, both countries are expected to deepen their cooperation further in the coming months, especially in trade, green energy, and digital innovation.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi Honoured with Brazil's Highest **Civilian Award**

This honour represents not just an individual achievement for the Prime Minister, but also reflects the international recognition of India's leadership and its growing influence on the global stage.

About the Award: Brazil's Top Civilian Honour

The Grand Collar of the National Order of the Southern Cross is the most prestigious civilian honour in Brazil. It is awarded to heads of state and government leaders who have made outstanding contributions to strengthening Brazil's relations with other countries.

By conferring this honour upon Prime Minister Modi, Brazil has acknowledged his efforts in enhancing India-Brazil strategic **partnership**, as well as his role in advancing cooperation through international platforms like BRICS, G20, and the United Nations.

This honour is a powerful reflection of the deepening ties between the two democracies. India and Brazil share common values, such as respect for sovereignty, sustainable development, and a multipolar world order. Over the years, the two countries have collaborated in areas such as:

- **Global governance**

Pride for India on the International Stage

This is the 26th international award or honour given to Prime Minister Narendra Modi by a foreign nation since he assumed office in May 2014. These recognitions highlight India's diplomatic strength, growing economic power, and the global trust in its leadership.



By honouring Prime Minister Modi, Brazil has also shown respect for **India's growing role in shaping global policies**, especially in the Global South.

Widespread Appreciation from Indian Leaders

The announcement of this award has been widely celebrated in India. Leaders from across the country have expressed their appreciation for the honour, calling it a proud moment for all Indians. Many have acknowledged that this award is not only a recognition of Modi's diplomacy but also a sign of India's **growing stature in international affairs**.

India's Maratha Forts Added to UNESCO World Heritage List

Maratha Military Landscapes of India were added to the UNESCO World Heritage List during the 47th session of the World Heritage Committee in Paris. This important recognition covers 12 historic forts built by the Maratha rulers between the 17th and 19th centuries. The listing highlights their unique military design and the rich history of India's fort architecture.

What Is the Maratha Military Landscapes?

The Maratha Military Landscapes are a group of 12 forts that show the smart planning and strength of the Maratha Empire. These forts were built across different terrains — hills, coasts, and plains — to protect the kingdom and control trade routes. They include Salher Fort, Shivneri Fort, Lohgad, Khanderi Fort, Raigad, Rajgad, Pratapgad, Suvarnadurg, Panhala Fort, Vijay Durg, Sindhudurg (all in Maharashtra) and Gingee Fort in Tamil Nadu.

These forts were known for their clever use of nature, water storage systems, and strong walls. Built mostly between the 1600s and 1800s, they show how Marathas used military skills to build powerful defense structures.

UNESCO's Decision and the Committee Meeting

The UNESCO World Heritage Committee took this decision during its 47th session in Paris. On X (formerly Twitter), UNESCO posted:

"New inscription on the @UNESCO #WorldHeritage List: Maratha Military Landscapes of India, #India."

This nomination was part of the 2024–25 UNESCO World Heritage cycle, and Indian officials had worked hard to present the historical and cultural importance of these forts to the world. The recognition gives international importance to India's fort heritage and adds value to future conservation efforts.

India's Pride and Historical Significance

The Maratha forts were not just buildings — they were symbols of resistance, planning, and unity. Leaders like Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj used them to build and protect the Maratha Empire. Some of these forts, like Raigad and Pratapgad, are especially famous in Indian history. For example, Pratapgad Fort, located about 22 km from Mahabaleshwar, played a key role in many battles and still stands strong today.

Indian historians, heritage experts, and government officials have welcomed this decision, saying it will help promote tourism, boost local pride, and ensure better care of these monuments.

National Affairs

- The Haryana government will build Asia's largest jungle safari in the Aravalli Hills, as announced on July 6, 2025. The safari will be spread over 10,000 acres and will focus on wildlife protection, green tourism, and job creation. - Himachal Pradesh has launched India's first Aadhaar-based Face Authentication (FaceAuth) system for ration distribution under the Public Distribution System (PDS) in July 2025. The system uses a smartphone camera to verify a person's face instead of OTP or fingerprints. This new method, led by the Department of Digital Technologies and Governance (DDTG) and supported by Gokul Butail, aims to fix past issues and ensure smoother and faster service. Himachal's initiative marks a big move toward digital and inclusive governance. (Click here to read article)
- Kerala's first skin bank is opening on July 15, 2025, at the Thiruvananthapuram Government Medical College Hospital. The facility, approved by K-SOTTO and costing Rs 6.75 crore, will collect donated skin to treat burn victims. - On July 8, 2025, the Nitish Kumar-led Bihar government approved a significant policy shift, granting 35% reservation in government jobs exclusively for women domiciled in Bihar. Earlier available to all women, the new domicilebased policy-proposed by the General Administration Department (GAD)—restricts this horizontal reservation to native women only, across all state government cadres. Women from other states will now be considered under the general category, aiming to empower local women and boost their participation in governance and administration. - Uttarakhand Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami announced the launch of 'Operation Kalanemi', a police campaign to catch fake saints and religious impersonators in the state. The operation is named after Kalanemi, a demon from Hindu mythology who disguised himself as a saint to mislead others. Dhami said these individuals cheat people, especially women, and harm the image of Sanatana Dharma. (Click here to read article)
- Mumbai's Carnac Bridge, originally built in 1868, has been rebuilt and renamed as Sindoor Bridge to honour Operation Sindoor, a military strike on terror camps in Pakistan. The new name also reflects an effort to erase the colonial legacy of Governor Carnac, who was linked to atrocities against Indians. The new 328-metre-long bridge, inaugurated on July 10, 2025, by Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis, will improve traffic in South Mumbai. (Click here to read article)
- The Central Government has announced that a new Akashvani Kendra will be set up in Ujjain, Madhya Pradesh, under the BIND scheme. - On July 6, 2025, Jennifer Geerlings-Simons was elected as Suriname's first female President. She will take office on July 16 and faces the huge task of fixing the country's troubled economy. The previous government had taken help from the IMF and reduced subsidies, which caused protests. Simons plans to improve tax collection and manage the country's debt. Suriname is also waiting for its offshore oil production to begin in 2028, which could bring economic relief. The country hopes her leadership will bring stability and progress. - The Mauna Loa Observatory in Hawaii, which has been measuring atmospheric CO₂ for over 65 years, may soon shut down due to a lack of U.S. government funding. Known for producing the iconic Keeling Curve, this observatory has provided crucial evidence of human-caused climate change by showing a steady rise in carbon dioxide levels—mainly from burning fossil fuels. Its long-term data is vital for tracking global warming and guiding climate action worldwide. (Click here to read article)
- Elon Musk has announced the formation of a new US political group called the America Party, aiming to change the country's traditional two-party system. The resolution also asked for more economic support for Afghanistan and suggested that UN Secretary-General António Guterres appoint a coordinator to lead global actions. The resolution is not legally binding, but it shows strong world opinion and concern about human rights and terrorism in Afghanistan. (Click here to read article)
- Colombia and Uzbekistan have joined the New Development Bank (NDB), taking the total number of members to 11. This announcement comes ahead of the 17th BRICS Summit. The NDB, led by Dilma Rousseff and based in Shanghai, funds projects in infrastructure, clean energy, and digital development. The bank aims to support the Global South and help countries keep pace with modern technology. (Click here to read article)
- On July 7, 2025, Trinidad and Tobago became the eighth country and the first in the Caribbean to adopt UPI (Unified Payments Interface) for Indian travelers. The move was announced during Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit, and it allows Indian visitors to pay in rupees by scanning QR codes at partner stores using UPI-enabled apps. Other countries with UPI access include UAE, Singapore, France, Bhutan, Nepal, Sri Lanka, and Mauritius. To use UPI abroad, travelers need a linked UPI app, international roaming, and UPI Global access. The conversion fees are minimal, making UPI a low-cost and simple way to pay while traveling. - EU finance ministers approved Bulgaria's adoption of the euro, making it the 21st member of the eurozone starting January 1, 2026. Bulgaria will shift from the lev to the euro at a fixed rate of 1.95583 lev per euro. - Indian Bank and Punjab National Bank (PNB) have waived minimum balance penalties for savings account holders starting from July 7 and July 1, 2025, respectively. Indian Bank also reduced its one-year lending rate to 9%, offering relief to loan borrowers. These steps are aimed at boosting financial inclusion and making banking easier, cheaper, and more accessible for all—especially students, senior citizens, farmers, and low-income families. - The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) said on July 1, 2025, that ₹2000 notes worth ₹6,099 crore are still in circulation, even though it announced their withdrawal on May 19, 2023. Out of the original ₹3.56 lakh crore, 98.29% has been returned. People can still deposit or send these notes through RBI offices or post offices. The ₹2000 note is still legal but is being gradually removed from use. (Click here to read article)

- On July 4, 2025, the liquidity surplus in India's banking system rose to ₹4.04 trillion, its highest since May 2022, thanks to increased government spending and a ₹2.69 trillion surplus transfer by the RBI. A 7-day VRRR auction saw bids of ₹1.7 trillion, with ₹1 trillion accepted at 5.47%. The RBI's 0.50% CRR cut earlier had also added ₹1.16 trillion to the system. - The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) will hold an auction on July 11, 2025, to sell two government bonds worth ₹25,000 crore through its e-Kuber platform in Mumbai. One bond is new, and the other is a re-issue of an older one. These dated securities will pay interest every six months and are used to help the government raise money. - Adani Power Ltd has acquired the 600 MW Vidarbha Industries Power Ltd in Butibori, Nagpur for ₹4,000 crore, increasing its total capacity to 18,150 MW. - Nvidia became the first publicly traded company to reach a \$4 trillion market value, thanks to a 1,350% rise in its stock since October 2022. The rule was first introduced in 2020 under Section 10(23FE) of the Income Tax Act, and the latest extension was officially notified by the Department of Revenue. - Lando Norris won the British Grand Prix at Silverstone on July 6, 2025, in a wet and exciting race. He took the lead after Oscar Piastri received a 10-second penalty, which helped Norris reduce the points gap in the Formula 1 championship. It was McLaren's first win at Silverstone since 2008. Nico Hülkenberg finished third, and Max Verstappen came fifth after a spin. Many rookie drivers crashed out due to the rain. Norris called the win a dream come true in front of his home fans. - India achieved a historic Test victory at Edgbaston on July 6, 2025, beating England by a record 336-run margin, the biggest overseas win for India in terms of runs. Akash Deep stood out with 10 wickets, the best Test figures by an Indian in England. This was also India's first Test win at Edgbaston after seven losses. The match saw several records broken, including the highest total runs in a Test between the two nations. India has now leveled the series 1-1, marking a proud moment in Indian cricket history. - India will place a strategic bid to host the 2029 or 2031 World Athletics Championships, according to AFI official Adille Sumariwalla on July 6, 2025 in Bengaluru. The bidding process starts this year, and final decisions will be made in September 2026. Since Tokyo (2025) and Beijing (2027) are already hosting, India may have a better chance at 2031. India has also shown interest in hosting the 2028 Junior World Championships and future Athletics Relay events. These efforts are part of India's goal to bring the Olympics to the country in 2036. - Mexico defeated the United States 2-1 in the CONCACAF Gold Cup 2025 final held at NRG Stadium, Houston. Chris Richards scored early for the US, but Raul Jimenez and Edson Alvarez scored for Mexico to seal the win. This victory gives Mexico a record 10th Gold Cup title. - India made history at the World Boxing Cup 2025 in Astana by winning 11 medals, including 3 gold, 5 silver, and 3 bronze. Sakshi, Jaismine, and Nupur were the gold medal winners who led the team to success. Their wins against strong opponents from the USA, Brazil, and Kazakhstan brought pride to the country. - Magnus Carlsen won the SuperUnited Rapid and Blitz 2025 chess tournament in Zagreb, Croatia on July 7, finishing with 22.5/36. He secured the title one round early. Wesley So of the USA came second with 20/36, and India's D Gukesh took

third with **19.5/36**. This Grand Chess Tour event tested players in **Rapid and Blitz formats**. Gukesh, despite challenges in Blitz, showed strong progress. The **next event** will be held in **Saint Louis, Missouri** in **August 2025**. (<u>Click here to read article</u>)

- Neeraj Chopra won the inaugural Neeraj Chopra Classic 2025 in Bengaluru with a best javelin throw of 86.18 metres. The event was held at the Sree Kanteerava Stadium as part of the World Athletics Gold-level series. Kenya's Julius Yego finished second with 84.51 metres, while Sri Lanka's Rumesh Pathirage came third with 84.34 metres. Neeraj impressed the crowd with a strong third throw, keeping his top form ahead of upcoming global competitions. This new event also marks India's growing presence in international athletics. - The IPL's total value rose to \$18.5 billion in 2025, showing its growing status as a top sports league. RCB became the most valued franchise at \$269 million after winning the 2025 title. Mumbai Indians and CSK followed behind. Sponsorships and viewership also broke records—JioHotstar and Star Sports saw historic numbers. Tata Group extended its sponsorship deal, and PBKS showed the highest growth in brand value. The league's success shows that the IPL is now a global sports business, combining cricket, entertainment, and media in a way few other events do. (Click here to read article)
- On July 10, 2025, Sachin Tendulkar's portrait was officially unveiled at the MCC Museum at Lord's Cricket Ground in London, a place known as the Home of Cricket. The painting was created by Stuart Pearson Wright, and Tendulkar also rang the bell to begin the day's India vs. England Test match. He shared memories of his early days in England and said the portrait was a special moment in his journey. He also praised Shubman Gill, India's new captain, for his calm leadership and good form. - The Indian men's football team has dropped six places to 133rd in the FIFA rankings, marking its worst ranking since December 2016. The decline follows recent defeats to Thailand and Hong Kong in June 2025, which also led to coach Manolo Marquez's exit. India's performance under him saw just one win in eight matches. With the team struggling and qualification for the 2027 Asian Cup at risk, India's next chance to bounce back will come in October against Singapore. (Click here to read article)



- On July 11, 2025, both Italy and the Netherlands confirmed their spots in the ICC Men's T20 World Cup 2026 after the final matches of the Europe Qualifiers. This will be Italy's first appearance at the global event. Despite losing to the Netherlands, Italy ensured qualification by holding their opponents till the 17th over, maintaining a better net run rate. The Netherlands chased down 134/7 with strong performances from Roelof van der Merwe and Michael Levitt. A total of 15 teams have qualified so far, with more to be confirmed through upcoming qualifiers. The World Cup will take place in India and Sri Lanka in 2026. (Click here to read article)
- Harikrishnan A. Ra., a 23-year-old from Chennai, became India's 87th Grandmaster after earning his third GM norm at the La Plagne International Chess Festival in France on July 11, 2025. Coached by Shyam Sundar, Harikrishnan had previously earned GM norms in Switzerland (2023) and Spain (June 2025). His final performance, including a draw with P. Iniyan and a win over Jules Moussard, secured the title. Harikrishnan, who recently finished his M.Com from SRM, plans to compete in Spain and Portugal before pursuing an MBA in the USA. His next goal is to reach an Elo rating of 2600. (Click here to read article)

Schemes and Committees News

- The Rajasthan government has launched the Pandit Deendayal Upadhyay Poverty-Free Village Scheme on July 4, 2025, to support BPL families in 5,000 villages. The plan offers up to Rs 1 lakh for job and business help, and Rs 15,000 for women in SHGs. Families who moved out of poverty will receive Rs 21,000 as a reward and Atmanirbhar Parivar Cards. So far, 30,631 families have been identified, and 61,000 applications have been received. The government is also creating village-wise plans to connect families with skill and job programs. This step is a major effort to reduce rural poverty and build self-reliant villages in Rajasthan. (Click here to read article)
- The Punjab government launched the Mukhya Mantri Sehat Yojana on July 8, 2025, offering free and cashless medical treatment up to ₹10 lakh per year for every family in the state. Unveiled by Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann and AAP leader Arvind Kejriwal in Chandigarh, the scheme will cover around 65 lakh families (nearly 3 crore people), including farmers, workers, pensioners, businessmen, and government employees. Digital health cards will enable treatment for 2000+ diseases at government and private hospitals. Beneficiaries of Ayushman Bharat will receive a ₹5 lakh top-up, ensuring ₹10 lakh total coverage.  Dr. Lavanya R. Mundayur, head of AIC, shared her views on the 10-year journey of the Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana in New Delhi. She said the scheme has shown progress, especially in bringing non-loanee farmers under coverage, but the overall reach has flattened. She recommended greater central funding, a national-level model, and independent third-party evaluation. - The Government of Andhra Pradesh launched the Digi-Lakshmi scheme on June 30, 2025, to help urban poor women become entrepreneurs. Under this plan, 9,034 Common Service Centres (CSCs) will be set up in Urban Local Bodies, each run by Self-Help Group (SHG) women. These centres, called ATOM Kiosks, will provide around 250 public services. The Mission Director of MEPMA will lead the project, and women will get training and loans of ₹2 to ₹2.5 lakh to start their centres. The scheme is part of the 'One Family, One Entrepreneur' mission and aims to support women empowerment and digital job creation across Andhra Pradesh. (Click here to read article)
- The Assam Cabinet approved the 'Gajah Mitra' scheme on July 11, 2025, to stop the rising number of human-elephant conflicts. The plan will be carried out in 80 problem areas where both people and elephants have died in past years. It includes growing elephant-friendly plants, setting up rapid response teams, and raising village awareness. According to a Wildlife Institute of India report, over 1,400 people and 1,209 elephants died between 2000 and 2023, mainly due to human activities like illegal fencing. Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma said the situation is serious and needs urgent action. The scheme aims to ensure safety and harmony for both humans and elephants in Assam. - India launched its first electric truck scheme under the PM E-DRIVE initiative, with a maximum incentive of ₹9.6 lakh per vehicle. The scheme, announced by Minister H.D. Kumaraswamy, targets N2 and N3 category electric trucks, and promotes cleaner freight transport. With 5,600 e-trucks expected to be deployed and support from companies like SAIL, Tata Motors, and Ashok Leyland, the scheme supports the Atmanirbhar Bharat vision and India's net-zero goal by 2070. Old diesel trucks must be scrapped, and strict warranty rules will ensure quality and reliability. (Click here to read article)
- Union Cabinet approved a ₹1 lakh crore employmentlinked incentive scheme to generate 3.5 crore jobs, with 1.92 crore for first-time workers, between August 2025 and July 2027. The scheme offers ₹3,000 per employee per month to employers and wage support of up to ₹15,000 to new employees. Announced by Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw, it is part of the PM's ₹2 lakh crore youth employment plan. (Click here to read article)





Science and Technology News

- On July 6, 2025, Union Minister Dr. Jitendra Singh opened the National Biobank at CSIR-IGIB, New Delhi. This project will collect data from 10,000 Indians to support personalized medicine and better disease treatment. It is part of the Phenome India project. The minister also highlighted India's work in genomics, CRISPR technology, and healthcare innovation. Experts like Dr. N. Kalaiselvi and Dr. Souvik Maiti praised the move as a major step toward healthcare self-reliance and global leadership in science. (Click here to read article)
- India became the fourth-largest biofuel consumer in the world in 2024, moving ahead of China for the second year in a row, according to the Statistical Review of World Energy 2025. India consumed 77 kbbloe/d, a 40% rise from last year, while China consumed 60 kbbloe/d. However, in biofuel production, India made 70 kbbloe/d, still behind China's 106 kbbloe/d. The report also showed that global demand for biofuels rose, especially in the Asia Pacific and North America regions. While biofuels help cut pollution, overall global emissions from energy rose by 1% in 2024, marking another record high. (Click here to read article)
- HCLSoftware, the software arm of HCLTech, has launched Domino 14.5, an advanced platform focused on data sovereignty and enhanced privacy for governments and regulated organisations. Its key feature, Domino IQ, is a sovereign AI solution designed to safeguard sensitive national and enterprise data from foreign surveillance. Richard Jefts, Executive VP, emphasized the importance of local digital control, especially as nations tighten data protection frameworks. (Click here to read article)
- The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) successfully conducted two hot tests of the Gaganyaan Service Module Propulsion System (SMPS) on July 3, 2025, at its Propulsion Complex in Mahendragiri, Tamil Nadu, marking a crucial step for India's first crewed space mission under the Gaganyaan Programme. The SMPS, featuring 5 Liquid Apogee Motors (LAMs) and 16 Reaction Control System (RCS) thrusters, is key for orbital maneuvers, trajectory corrections, and crew safety. - Switzerland's health authority, Swissmedic, has given its first approval to a malaria medicine for infants, made by Novartis. The approval came on July 9, 2025, and applies to babies weighing 2 to 5 kilograms. The decision is important because malaria kills thousands of children, especially in Africa, where 95% of global malaria deaths occurred in 2023. Experts say the new medicine is safe and effective, and it will be offered on a not-for-profit basis in malaria-hit countries. This move could help protect the youngest lives in the fight against one of the world's deadliest diseases. (Click here to read article)

- The Ministry of Information and Broadcasting (MIB) has launched the Kalaa Setu – Real-Time Language Tech for Bharat Challenge via its WaveX Startup Accelerator Platform. The challenge calls on AI startups across India to build tools that turn text into audio, video, or graphics in various Indian languages. Applications can be submitted on the WaveX portal by July 30, while the Bhasha Setu translation challenge closes on July 22. This effort is part of the WAVES initiative, aiming to boost innovation in media and language tech. (Click here to read article)
- The Government of Andhra Pradesh has introduced the Smart Mosquito Surveillance System (SMoSS) to fight mosquito-borne diseases like dengue and malaria. This Alpowered project will start in 66 places across six major cities including Vijayawada and Visakhapatnam. It will use smart sensors, drones, apps, and hospital data to track and control mosquito breeding. The system will help officials take quick action by sending alerts and mapping problem areas. This is a big step toward tech-based public health and can serve as a model for other states in India. (Click here to read article)
- A new species, Garcinia kusumae, has been discovered in Baksa district, Assam, by botanist Jatindra Sarma, who named it in honour of his late mother, Kusum Devi. The discovery was made in April 2025 and published in the global journal Feddes Repertorium. This evergreen tree has unique flowers and fruits and is used in traditional food and medicine. With this, Assam adds to its record of 12 Garcinia species. The new finding boosts India's botanical diversity and shows how much more is still to be discovered in the country's rich forests.
