



Union Government Notifies Transfer & Repatriation of 18 High Court Judges

To maintain the balance, efficiency, and impartiality of the judiciary in India, the Union Government on July 14, 2025, issued official orders transferring and repatriating 18 High Court judges across various states. This development follows recommendations made by the Supreme Court Collegium on May 26, 2025. These strategic appointments aim to enhance judicial functioning, promote uniformity in case disposal, and address regional imbalances in judicial staffing.

Background

The transfer and repatriation of High Court judges in India are governed by Article 222 of the Constitution, which empowers the President to transfer a judge from one High Court to another after consultation with the Chief Justice of India (CJI). The Supreme Court Collegium, headed by the CJI, plays a crucial role in suggesting such movements. The current transfer notifications are part of this long-standing administrative mechanism and reflect an effort to uphold the independence and integrity of the judiciary by rotating judges across states.

Significance of the Transfers

These judicial reshuffles are not merely administrative—they serve multiple significant purposes,

- Impartiality: By relocating judges to states other than their parent High Courts, potential local pressures and regional biases are minimized.
- Efficiency: High Courts with a heavier caseload can benefit from additional or experienced judges from other jurisdictions.
- Expertise Sharing: Transferred judges bring their diverse legal experience and judicial perspectives to the host High Court, enriching its jurisprudence.
- National Integration: These transfers foster a pan-Indian judicial culture, ensuring that judges are familiar with diverse legal interpretations across the country.

National Affairs

President Droupadi Murmu has nominated four new members—Ujjwal Nikam, C. Sadanandan Master, Harsh Vardhan Shringla, and Dr. Meenakshi Jain—to the Rajya Sabha on July 12, 2025, based on the Council of Ministers' advice. The announcement was made under Article 80 of the Constitution. Prime Minister Narendra Modi congratulated them and praised their contributions in fields such as law, education, foreign policy, and history. These nominations aim to ensure that the Rajya Sabha includes experts from diverse fields who can offer unique and informed viewpoints during discussions. (Click here to read article)

- Yakten village in Sikkim became India's first digital nomad village under the 'Nomad Sikkim' project. With strong internet, power backup, and homestays run by locals, it gives remote workers a peaceful and connected place to live and work. This move supports rural income, promotes sustainable tourism, and shows how India's villages can grow with the digital economy. (Click here to read article)
- Gujarat has emerged as the top state in India for processed potato production, with Banaskantha leading the way, followed by Sabarkantha and Aravalli. The state produced 48.59 lakh tonnes of potatoes in 2024–25, with more than 25% used for processing. With strong government support, high-quality varieties, and cold storage systems, Gujarat is now meeting domestic needs and entering global markets. The success shows how modern farming and smart policies can help rural economies grow. (Click here to read article)
- Health Ministry of India started a new Snack Nutrition Awareness Campaign at AIIMS Nagpur. The campaign includes posters beside food stalls showing how much sugar, fat, and trans fat is in common snacks like samosas and biscuits. It warns about health risks and promotes moderation. The Health Secretary asked all government offices to join by sharing health messages and offering healthier food. A The Lancet study says India may have 450 million obese people by 2050. This campaign is part of a larger plan to fight obesity and lifestyle diseases by helping people make informed food choices. (Click here to read article)
- India is set to be the **first country outside Japan** to launch the latest **E10 Shinkansen bullet trains**, beginning with the **Mumbai-Ahmedabad High-Speed Rail (MAHSR)** in the **early 2030s**. Until then, two **E5 trains**, arriving in **2026**, will be used for **trial runs** and testing under **Indian conditions**. The **E10**, also called **Alfa-X**, is capable of **400 kmph** and offers **advanced safety and comfort**. The **₹1.1-lakh-crore** MAHSR project has made strong construction progress, with **310 km of viaducts**, **15 bridges**, and **5 stations** completed so far. This major step highlights **India-Japan collaboration** in building **world-class railway infrastructure**. (Click here to read <u>article</u>)
- Gujarat launches India's first Tribal Genome Sequencing Project, sequencing 2,000 individuals across 17 districts to detect genetic diseases like sickle cell anaemia. Led by GBRC, the project creates a reference genome database, enabling personalised healthcare. Approved under the 2025–26 budget, it bridges science and tribal welfare, setting a national example in genomic medicine. (Click here to read article)

NSCSTI 2.0, launched on July 18, 2025 by Dr. Jitendra Singh, is a revamped framework developed by the Capacity Building Commission under Mission Karmayogi. It simplifies evaluation metrics, incorporates digital tools and AI, and aligns with models like KCM and AGK. Adaptable across all government levels, the framework supports outcomebased assessments, cross-learning, and institutional excellence, positioning India as a leader in civil services reform. States in the News

- Gujarat has become the first state in India to officially align with the Cruise Bharat Mission, launched on September 30, 2024, by Union Minister Sarbananda Sonowal. The mission aims to boost cruise tourism tenfold by 2029. Gujarat plans to create multiple coastal cruise circuits, linking destinations like Diu, Porbandar, Dwarka, and Padala Island. This move not only supports India's tourism goals but also helps develop Gujarat's maritime economy. (Click here to read article)
- The 75th Pradhan Mantri Divyasha Kendra (PMDK) will be inaugurated on July 15, 2025, at Badaun, Uttar Pradesh, by Union Minister Shri B.L. Verma. This centre will help persons with disabilities and senior citizens by giving them free aids like wheelchairs, tricycles, and hearing aids under the ADIP Scheme and Rashtriya Vayoshri Yojana (RVY). With this new centre, 75 PMDKs are now working across India, having already supported over 1.40 lakh people. This move shows the government's strong focus on inclusive growth and last-mile service delivery. (Click here to read article)
- BITS Pilani will set up India's first 'Al Plus Campus' in Amaravati, Andhra Pradesh, announced on July 14, 2025. The project will cost Rs 1,000 crore, and admissions will begin in 2027. The new campus will teach Al, Data Science, Robotics, and more, with a focus on green energy and global exposure. CM Chandrababu Naidu and BITS Chancellor Kumar Mangalam Birla praised the project, calling it a key step in advanced education. - The Machilipatnam Greenfield Port in Andhra Pradesh is under fast construction, with 48% work completed and plans to start operations by the end of 2026. Built by MEIL, the port will boost exports and jobs in the region. The ₹5,155 crore project has faced delays since 2007 but is now back on track under the Machilipatnam Port Development Corporation Ltd. Both Andhra Pradesh and Telangana are investing in related infrastructure, like dry ports and freight corridors. Locals are hopeful about better land prices and employment. The port is expected to handle 36 million tonnes of cargo every year and support large ships, becoming a key trade hub on the east coast. (Click here to read article)
- The Behdeinkhlam Festival was celebrated with energy and joy in Jowai, Meghalaya, in July 2025. The festival is important to the Pnars, a sub-tribe of the Jaintia community, and is a prayer for health and a good harvest. Rituals include carrying the Symbud Khnong, dancing, food offerings by women, and playing the unique game Dadlawakor. It also spreads messages on drug-free living, climate awareness, and tradition preservation. The festival plays a big role in keeping the Niamtre faith alive and in uniting the community. - Goa launched India's first RoRo ferry service on the Mandovi River, with two high-tech ferries, Gangotri and Dwarka. These vessels, built by Vijai Marine Shipyards, cut travel time between Chorao and Ribandar to just 12–13 minutes and can carry passengers and vehicles. Launched by CM Pramod Sawant, the project comes at no cost to the government and promises to improve water transport and support tourism and local travel. The ferries have modern features like AC cabins, vehicle lanes, and emergency kits, offering a safe and fast journey for all. (Click here to read article)
- Union Minister Nitin Gadkari inaugurated the 2.44 km long Sigandur bridge in Shivamogga, Karnataka, built over the Sharavathi backwaters at a cost of over ₹470 crore. Named after Goddess Chowdeshwari Devi, the bridge connects Sagara and Marakutika, restoring links lost due to the Linganamakki dam. Gadkari also highlighted that National Highway length in Karnataka has increased significantly, with major upcoming road projects worth ₹5 lakh crore. (Click here to read article)
- CM Himanta Biswa Sarma inaugurated India's first Aqua Tech Park in Sonapur, near Guwahati, Assam. Developed by Kolong Kopili NGO with support from NABARD, ICAR-CIFA, and others, the park features new technologies like biofloc, aquaponics, and ornamental fish breeding. The park aims to empower fish farmers, boost production, and create jobs. Assam has already doubled its fish output between 2019 and 2024 and is now the fourth-largest fish producer in India. The government has also launched 10 fishery clusters worth ₹8 crore to support this growth. (Click here to read article)

- Himachal Pradesh government, led by CM Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu, launched the 'My Deed' NGDRS (National Generic Document Registration System) pilot project to digitize land registration and promote paperless, presence-less, and cashless governance. The system allows citizens to apply for land registration online, requiring only a single visit to the tehsil office. Initially rolled out in 10 tehsils across 10 districts, the project is supported by complementary digital revenue reforms, including a new Jamabandi format in Hindi, e-Roznamcha Vakyati (digital diary), and Kaarguzari (online attendance). - Bihar CM Nitish Kumar has announced free electricity for domestic users up to 125 units/month, effective August 1, 2025, benefiting 16.7 million families. Under the Kutir Jyoti scheme, the state will install solar panels for poor households, aiming for 10,000 MW solar capacity in 3 years. The move offers economic relief, boosts clean energy, and aligns with inclusive governance and poll strategy. (Click here to read article)
- Maharashtra has become the first Indian state to grant agricultural status to livestock and poultry farming, allowing over 37 million farmers to access subsidised electricity, agricultural credit, tax relief, and solar equipment subsidies. This decision will benefit the poultry, dairy, fisheries, and small ruminant sectors, potentially adding over ₹7,000 crore annually to the rural economy, while aligning with national goals for scientific livestock development. - In Swachh Survekshan 2024–25, Bengaluru rose to 36th among Million-Plus Cities, improving from last year's 125th, but lagged in toilet cleanliness and landfill remediation. Mysuru, meanwhile, made headlines by joining the Super Swachh League, highlighting its long-term cleanliness, community participation, and sanitation excellence. These outcomes reflect Karnataka's progress and gaps in implementing effective urban waste management, public hygiene, and the overarching goals of Swachh Bharat Mission-Urban. - Maharashtra has unveiled Vidarbha's first integrated steel plant by LMEL in Gadchiroli, featuring a 4.5 MnTPA steel facility, a 5 MnTPA iron ore grinding plant, and the state's inaugural 10 MnTPA slurry pipeline. This initiative promises major advancements in industrial growth, green logistics, job generation, and puts Vidarbha on the map as a rising manufacturing and infrastructure hub in India. - PM Modi inaugurated ₹7,200 crore worth of infrastructure projects in Motihari, Bihar, under the Viksit Bharat Mission. These developments aim to make Bihar a growth hub, ensure urban parity, and provide housing and infrastructure support. International Affairs

- India became the first country to launch the Traditional Knowledge Digital Library (TKDL), earning praise from the World Health Organization (WHO). The platform uses AI to protect and expand India's traditional medicine systems like Ayurveda and Unani. The WHO's report highlighted India's success in merging ancient knowledge with modern technology, mentioning innovations like Ayurgenomics, AI diagnostics, and digital health platforms. These efforts support PM Modi's vision of AI for all and make India a leader in digital health and traditional medicine integration. (Click here to read article)
- France announced a new agreement with New Caledonia that would make the territory a state within the French Republic, giving it more freedom while staying under French control. The plan must be approved by both the French Parliament and New Caledonian voters. The move comes after 2024 protests over voting rights and aims to ease tensions between Indigenous Kanak people and French authorities. The agreement introduces New Caledonian nationality, dual citizenship, and plans for a new referendum. It highlights President Emmanuel Macron's effort to balance unity and respect for local identity. (Click here to read article)
- US Department of Defense (DoD) gave \$200 million contracts to OpenAI, Google, Anthropic, and xAI to boost national security with advanced AI systems. These companies will develop autonomous software tools for military use, guided by the Pentagon's Chief Digital and Artificial Intelligence Office (CDAO). The goal is to stay ahead in global defence by using safe, smart, and missionready AI. - In 2024, South Asia reached a record high in childhood immunisation, as reported by UNICEF and WHO. The region saw 92% DTP3 vaccine coverage, a 27% drop in zero-dose children, and a 39% decline in measles cases. India and Nepal showed significant progress, while Bangladesh and Sri Lanka expanded HPV vaccinations. This success is driven by government leadership, community health workers, and global partnerships. However, with over 2.9 million children still un- or under-vaccinated, continued efforts are needed to ensure universal vaccine access across South Asia. (Click here to read article)
- Yuliia Svyrydenko, a seasoned economist and diplomatic negotiator, has been appointed the Prime Minister of

Ukraine, replacing Denys Shmyhal, who now serves as Defence Minister. Her appointment amid the ongoing Russia-Ukraine war marks a critical moment in Ukraine's political landscape, reflecting President Volodymyr Zelenskyy's strategy to reinforce trusted leadership, economic recovery, and international partnerships. Agreements/MoUs Signed

- India and Saudi Arabia signed long-term fertilizer agreements during JP Nadda's visit to Dammam and Riyadh from July 11–13, 2025. The agreement with Saudi company Maaden will supply 3.1 million metric tons of DAP fertilizer each year for five years starting 2025–26, with the option to extend. The visit also strengthened ties in the health and pharmaceutical sectors, and both countries agreed to increase investments and explore research collaboration. These efforts will improve India's fertilizer security and expand strategic cooperation in key sectors. (Click here to read article)
- NCDEX and IMD signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to launch India's first weather derivatives. These rainfall-based futures contracts will help protect farmers and climate-sensitive sectors from losses caused by unpredictable weather. The partnership will use IMD's accurate weather data, and also offer training, research, and market support. NCDEX CEO Arun Raste and IMD chief Dr. M. Mohapatra praised the move as a key step towards building a climate-resilient economy and giving farmers better financial tools to face future challenges. (Click here to read article)
- The partnership between Vimananu Ltd and CYGR brings advanced drone manufacturing to Navi Mumbai, targeting domestic defence needs and international exports. It will produce various UAV types like ISR, nano, and fixed-wing drones, reinforce technology transfer, support self-reliance in defence, and align with the government's Aatmanirbhar Bharat vision by enhancing India's role in the global UAV ecosystem. - The MoU between NIEPID and Jai Vakeel Foundation (July 2025) aims to provide a structured, scalable curriculum for Children with Intellectual Disabilities (CwID) across India through the DISHA Abhiyan. - India's retail inflation fell to 2.1% in June 2025, the lowest in 77 months, thanks to cheaper vegetables and pulses. Wholesale inflation also turned slightly negative. Science and Technology News

- A new butterfly species, Zographetus mathewi, has been discovered in the Western Ghats of Kerala, adding to the region's already rich biodiversity. The species was confirmed after careful study by researchers from the Travancore Nature History Society, Zoological Survey of India, and others. It is named after George Mathew, a well-known Indian entomologist. This butterfly, also called the Sahyadri Spotted Flitter, is found in forests below 600 metres, and its larvae feed on the vine Aganope thyrsiflora. - A new study led by scientists, including Edward Doddridge from the University of Tasmania, has found that Antarctica's summer sea ice is at record low levels. The research team used satellite data, robotic ocean sensors, and computer models to study the effects. - Chinese scientists at the Beijing Institute of Technology announced the creation of the world's lightest mindcontroller, weighing just 74 milligrams. This device is used to control bees, turning them into cyborgs that can follow commands during military missions, urban combat, drug searches, and disaster rescue. The controller sends signals through three tiny needles inserted into the bee's brain, successfully guiding their flight paths. Professor Zhao Jieliang, who led the team, said insect cyborgs offer better movement, stealth, and endurance than machines. While battery life remains a problem, the team plans to make future upgrades. (Click here to read article)
- Israel successfully launched its Dror-1 communications satellite on July 13, 2025, using a SpaceX Falcon 9 rocket from Cape Canaveral.
