The Swachh Survekshan 2025 report, released under the **Swachh Bharat Mission**, has once again exposed the deep divide in India's urban cleanliness efforts. While some smaller cities have made impressive strides in maintaining hygiene, several of India's major metropolitan areas have failed to keep up. This year, **Madurai** has topped the list as the dirtiest city in India 2025, followed closely by Ludhiana, Chennai, Ranchi, and Bengaluru.

President Droupadi Murmu's Historic State Visit to Botswana

President **Droupadi Murmu** undertook a three-day official visit to Botswana from 11 to 13 November 2025, marking the firstever state visit by an Indian President to the country. This visit was the final part of her tour of Angola and Botswana, and comes ahead of the 60th anniversary of India-Botswana diplomatic relations in 2026, established in 1966.

Major Highlights of the Visit

Arrival and Delegation

President Murmu arrived at the Sir Seretse Khama International Airport in Gaborone on 11 November 2025, where she received a ceremonial welcome. She was accompanied by:

- V. Somanna, Minister of State (MoJS & MoR)
- Parbhubhai Vasava, MP (Bardoli, Gujarat)
- D.K. Aruna, MP (Mahbubnagar, Madhya Pradesh)

Bilateral Meetings

She met President Duma Gideon Boko of Botswana and held one-to-one and delegation-level talks. Both sides explored cooperation in:

- Trade and investment
- Renewable energy
- Agriculture
- Health and pharmaceuticals
- Skill development
- Defence
- Digital technology

Key Visits

On 12 November 2025, President Murmu visited:

- **Diamond Training Company Botswana (DTCB)** a major centre for diamond grading and training
- National Assembly of Botswana, the country's law-making
- Three Dikgosi Monument, where she paid tribute to three key tribal leaders—Khama III, Sebele I, and Bathoen I—who played vital roles in Botswana's freedom movement

MoUs Signed During the Visit

1. Pharmacopoeial Cooperation

India and Botswana signed an MoU to harmonise pharmaceutical quality standards, improve regulatory collaboration, and expand access to Indian medicines in Botswana.

2. Supply of ARV Medicines

India agreed to supply antiretroviral (ARV) drugs used in the treatment of HIV/AIDS, strengthening Botswana's public health system.

3. Recognition of Indian Pharmacopoeia (IP)

Botswana became the 18th country to recognise the Indian Pharmacopoeia as a reference standard for medicines. This recognition reduces the need for repeat quality testing and promotes smoother pharmaceutical trade.

Countries already recognising IP include: Afghanistan, Ghana, Nepal, Mauritius, Suriname, Nicaragua, Bhutan, Mozambique, Solomon Islands, Sri Lanka, Nauru, Malawi, Guyana, Fiji, Cuba, Trinidad & Tobago, and Maldives.

Project Cheetah: Botswana Donates Eight Cheetahs

On 13 November 2025, President Murmu and President Boko visited the Molokodi Nature Reserve. They jointly witnessed the transfer of eight cheetahs, captured from Botswana's Ghanzi region, into a quarantine facility.

These cheetahs will later be sent to **Kuno National Park**, **Madhya Pradesh**, where India has already introduced batches from Namibia and South Africa.

Project Cheetah aims to restore the species in India, where cheetahs became extinct in 1952.

Trade Relations

- India is one of Botswana's major trading partners, with annual bilateral trade around USD 500 million, dominated by the diamond sector.
- India imports rough diamonds from Botswana, processes them in hubs like Surat (Gujarat), and re-exports finished stones globally.

India Skills Report 2026 Released: India's Employability Rises to 56.35%

In November 2025, the Educational Testing Service (ETS), along with its partners—the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII), AICTE, AIU, and Taggd—released the 13th edition of the India **Skills Report (2026)**. The report highlights a steady rise in India's overall employability, which increased to 56.35% in 2026 from 54.81% in 2025. This improvement reflects India's shift toward a skill-first economy, driven by AI adoption, digital skilling, and growing global workforce mobility.

Key Findings of th e Report

1. Women Outperform Men in Employability

For the first time in five years, women's employability (54%) surpassed that of men (51.5%).

The report attributes this growth to the rise of hybrid work models, increased digital skilling, and greater opportunities in Tier-2 and Tier-3 cities.

Women's participation has notably increased in BFSI, education, and healthcare sectors.

2. Expanding Gig Workforce

India's gig and freelance workforce is expected to reach 23.5 million by 2030.

Project-based hiring has increased by 38% compared to the previous year.

Despite this rise, permanent jobs still make up 72% of total employment, but gig and third-party roles have grown to 16%.

3. India as a Global Talent Hub

The report positions India as a leading global supplier of skilled professionals.

With global labour shortages projected to reach 85 million by **2030**, India is expected to offer a surplus talent pool of **45 million skilled workers**, strengthening its global relevance.

4. AI and Tech Skills in High Demand

- India now holds 16% of the world's AI talent, expected to reach **1.25 million** professionals by 2027.
- Over 90% of employees across sectors use Generative AI tools.
- 70% of IT firms and 50% of BFSI companies have adopted AIbased recruitment systems.
- Computer Science graduates show the employability at 80%, followed by IT engineers at 78%, showing strong demand for skills in AI, automation, and data analytics.

5. Top Hiring Trends

- Hiring intent for FY 2026-27 stands at 40%, compared to 29% last year.
- The most in-demand sectors are:
 - **Technology**
 - 0 **BFSI**
 - Manufacturing 0
 - Renewable Energy 0
 - Healthcare 0

6. Emerging Skill Hubs

Tier-2 and Tier-3 cities, including Lucknow, Kochi, and **Chandigarh**, have emerged as strong employability hubs, helping reduce the urban-rural skill gap.

7. Top Employable States

8. Most Employable Age Group

The 22-25 age group continues to lead with an employability rate of **75.7%**, dominating entry-level recruitment.

About the India Skills Report

This year's theme is "The Future of Work: Gig Workforce, Freelancing, Al-Supplemented Workforce, Remote Work and Entrepreneurship."

The report surveyed over 1 lakh candidates through the Global Employability Test (GET) and gathered insights from seven key industries, giving a comprehensive view of India's evolving workforce landscape.

QS World University Sustainability Rankings 2026

The QS World University Sustainability Rankings 2026, an annual list by global education analytics firm QS, has ranked Lund University (Sweden) as the world's most sustainable university. This is the first time Lund University has topped the list since its inception in 2023, displacing the University of Toronto, which had held the top position in both 2024 and 2025. This year's rankings assess nearly 2,000 universities across 106 countries, up from around 1,750 in the previous edition, marking a significant expansion of global participation in evaluating environmental, social, and governance (ESG) performance in higher education.

This list reflects strong performances by universities in the UK and Canada, with Sweden's Lund University claiming a perfect score of 100.

India's Growing Footprint in Global Sustainability Rankings India has shown notable progress in the 2026 edition,

- 103 Indian universities featured in the rankings
- 26 institutions debuted in the rankings, the second highest number of new entries after Mainland China
- India ranks fourth in terms of total representation, behind the US (240), China (163), and the UK (109)
- This signals growing attention toward sustainability in Indian higher education institutions, with more universities aligning with ESG goals and sustainable development practices.

About the QS World University Sustainability Rankings

The QS Sustainability Rankings were introduced in 2023 and are designed to measure how well universities are addressing the world's most pressing environmental and social challenges. The rankings are based on,

- Environmental impact (carbon footprint, green practices, climate action)
- Social impact (equality, access, community engagement)
- Governance and ethics (institutional transparency, sustainability targets)
- Universities are scored and ranked according to their ESG performance, providing a snapshot of how institutions contribute to a more sustainable global future.

PM Narendra Modi's Visit to South Africa for the 20th G20 Summit

Prime Minister Narendra Modi's 2025 visit Johannesburg marked a significant moment in India-Africa relations and the evolution of the G20. Hosted by South African President Cyril Ramaphosa, the summit focused on strengthening global solidarity, reforming financial institutions, and advancing sustainable development. The visit also featured important announcements, new partnerships, and several bilateral meetings with world leaders.

PM Narendra Modi Arrived in South Africa

PM Modi arrived at Waterkloof Air Force Base on November 21, **2025**, where he received a ceremonial welcome.

This was his fourth official visit to South Africa, following his 2016 bilateral visit and participation in BRICS Summits in 2018 and 2023.

Highlights of the 2025 G20 Summit

Theme and Participation

The 2025 G20 Summit, held on November 22-23, was based on the theme "Solidarity, Equality, Sustainability."

Leaders from 19 member countries, the European Union, and major global bodies such as the UN, IMF, World Bank, WTO, WHO, OECD, and ILO attended the summit.

The United States did not participate.

PM Narendra Modi's Addresses at the Summit

Opening Session: "Inclusive and Sustainable Economic Growth - Leaving No One Behind"

PM Modi **highlighted**:

- The need to reform development financing
- The importance of inclusive and sustainable growth
- Enhancing the voice of the Global South
- Second Session: "A Resilient World"

He called for:

- Stronger global climate action
- Safeguarding global food security











Third Session: "A Fair and Just Future for All" He proposed:

- A Global Framework for Talent Mobility
- Cooperation on critical minerals
- Decent work standards
- Responsible and inclusive expansion of AI

He also announced that India would host the AI Impact Summit in February 2026 under the theme "Sarvajanam Hitaya, Sarvajanam Sukhaya."

Six Key Ideas Proposed by PM Modi

PM Modi put forward six major initiatives:

1. G20 Global Traditional Knowledge Repository

A global database to preserve and utilize traditional knowledge.

2. G20 Africa Skills Multiplier

Training one million certified trainers to build long-term skilling capacity across Africa.

3. G20 Global Health Response Team

A rapid-response team of experts for global health emergencies.

4. G20 Open Satellite Data Partnership

Sharing satellite data with developing countries for agriculture, disaster management, and fisheries.

5. G20 Critical Minerals Circularity Initiative

Promoting recycling, urban mining, and reuse to strengthen mineral supply chains.

6. G20 Initiative on Countering the Drug-Terror Nexus

A coordinated global effort to disrupt drug trafficking and terror financing.

G20 Adopted a 122-Point Joint Leaders' Declaration

G20 countries adopted a comprehensive 122-Point Leaders' **Declaration** emphasizing:

- Climate Action and Sustainability
- Debt Relief and Development Financing
- Critical Minerals
- Trade and Multilateralism
- **Peace and Security**
- **Support for Vulnerable Countries**
- Reforms of Global Governance

Major Outcomes of the 2025 G20 Summit

IMF Reform

The Summit approved a 25th IMF Executive Board seat for Sub-**Saharan Africa**, enhancing the region's representation.

Mission 300

Leaders launched Mission 300, aimed at providing electricity access to 300 million Africans by 2030.

Renewable Energy Goals

Members agreed to:

- Triple global renewable energy capacity by 2030
- Double global energy efficiency by 2030
- Critical Minerals

A Critical Minerals Framework was adopted for sustainable mining and resilient supply chains.

Food Security

The **Ubuntu Approaches** on food security were **introduced**, supporting small farmers, local agriculture, and price stability.

♦ Al for Africa

The G20 launched the AI for Africa Initiative, strengthening digital talent, data access, and computing infrastructure.

ACITI Partnership Launched

India, Canada, and Australia announced the ACITI Partnership (Australia-Canada-India Technology & Innovation Partnership). This trilateral initiative focused on:

- Critical and emerging technologies
- Green energy innovation
- Resilient supply chains, including critical minerals
- Al for public good

Bilateral Meetings Held by PM Modi

On the sidelines of the summit, PM Modi met several world leaders:

South Africa

He met President Cyril Ramaphosa and reviewed cooperation in trade, mining, skills, and investment.

Canada

He met Prime Minister Mark Carney and discussed expanding ties in defence, trade, space, and technology.

Both sides agreed to resume CEPA negotiations, aiming to double trade to USD 50 billion by 2030.

Japan

In his first meeting with PM Sanae Takaichi, both leaders reviewed progress under the India-Japan Special Strategic and Global Partnership (SSGP).

Italy

PM Modi met Italy's PM Giorgia Meloni, and both countries adopted the India-Italy Joint Initiative to Counter Terror **Financing**, strengthening cooperation in FATF and GCTF.

IBSA Leaders' Meeting

PM Modi attended the IBSA Leaders' Meeting with leaders from Brazil and South Africa.

He proposed:

- An IBSA Digital Innovation Alliance featuring UPI, CoWIN, cybersecurity exchanges, and women-led tech models.
- An IBSA Fund for Climate-Resilient Agriculture to boost South-South cooperation.

India's Performance at ISSF World Championship Rifle/Pistol

India secured 13 medals: 3 gold, 6 silver, and 4 bronze, finishing third overall.

Gold Medals

Four New Labour Codes made effective to Simplify and Streamline Labour Laws

In November 2025, the Government of India (GoI) officially enforced four major labour codes—the Code on Wages (2019), the Industrial Relations (IR) Code (2020), the Code on Social Security (2020), and the Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions (OSHWC) Code (2020).

These codes came into effect on 21 November 2025, replacing and consolidating 29 existing labour laws into a unified and simplified framework.

The Code on Wages was earlier notified on 8 August 2019, while the remaining three codes were notified on 29 September 2020.

2. Minimum Wage for All

A statutory **right to minimum wages** for all employees in both organised and unorganised sectors.

3. National Floor Wage

No state may fix wages below the floor wage, ensuring nationwide uniformity.

4. Wage Fixation Criteria

Skill level, location, and nature of work must guide minimum wage decisions.

5. Gender Equality

No discrimination based on gender—including transgender

6. Wage Payment Rules Expanded

Timely wage payment and controls on deductions now apply to all employees (not limited to those earning below ₹24,000/month earlier).

7. Overtime

Overtime wages must be at least 2× the normal wage.

Industrial Relations (IR) Code, 2020 – Key Provisions

1. Fixed-Term Employment

Fixed-term workers get equal pay and benefits as permanent workers, including gratuity after one year.

2. Re-skilling Fund

A fund created for retrenched employees, with contributions equal to 15 days' wages per worker.

3. Trade Union Recognition

A union with 51% membership becomes the Negotiating Union; otherwise, a Negotiating Council forms.

4. Expanded Worker Definition

Includes journalists, sales promotion staff, and supervisors earning up to ₹18,000/month.

5. Higher Threshold for Lay-off/Retrenchment/Closure

Approval threshold raised from 100 to 300 workers.

6. Women's Representation

Mandatory proportional representation of women in grievance committees.

7. Work-from-Home Provision

Permitted through mutual consent in service sectors.

8. Direct Tribunal Access

Allowed if conciliation fails within 90 days.

9. Notice for Strikes/Lockouts

Mandatory **14-day notice**, bringing uniformity.

Code on Social Security, 2020 - Key Provisions

1. Expanded Social Security Coverage

Covers unorganised, gig, and platform workers.

2. ESIS Nationwide Coverage

ESIS became applicable across all of India, not just notified areas.

3. EPF Inquiry Timelines

Inquiries must begin within 5 years and end within 2 years (extendable by 1 year).

Appeals require only 25% deposit of the disputed amount.

4. Gig & Platform Workers Included

New definitions added—gig worker, platform worker, aggregator.

Aggregators contribute 1-2% of turnover, capped at 5% of payments to workers.

5. Social Security Fund

Dedicated fund for life, disability, health, and old-age benefits for unorganised and gig workers.

6. Uniform Definition of Wages

"Wages" = basic pay + DA + retaining allowance (must be 50% of total remuneration).

7. Gratuity for Fixed-Term Employees

- Fine/imprisonment offences: 75% of maximum fine

OSHWC Code, 2020 – Key Provisions

- Ensure worker safety, health, and dignity
- Create a simplified and business-friendly regulatory system

2. Unified Registration

Electronic registration required for establishments with 10+ employees.

3. Mandatory Appointment Letters

All workers must receive appointment letters outlining job roles, wages, and benefits.

4. Wider Coverage of Workers

Definition of inter-state migrant workers expanded to include direct, contractual, and self-migrant workers.

Benefits Include:

- Annual travel allowance
- Portability of PDS & social security
- Toll-free helpline access

5. Expanded Journalist & Cine Worker Definitions

Covers all employees in electronic media and audio-visual content sectors.

6. Women's Employment

Women permitted to work across sectors, including night shifts, with consent and safety measures.

7. Victim Compensation

At least 50% of fines imposed on offenders to be paid to victims or their families.

Australian Open 2025 Badminton held in Sydney, Australia

The Australian Open (AO) 2025 Badminton, officially titled the Sathio Group Australian Open 2025, is a Badminton World Federation (BWF) Super 500 tournament, held at the State Sports Centre in Sydney, Australia, from 18 to 23 November 2025.

- Indian badminton player Lakshya Sen (world Rank 11) clinched the men's singles title at the Australian Open 2025 by defeating Japan's Yushi Tanaka 21-15, 21-11, marking his first title of the 2025 season and the sixth BWF World Tour crown of his career.
- He became the second Indian to win a BWF World Tour title in 2025 after Ayush Shetty at the US (United States of America) Open Super 300 in June 2025.

Cabinet Approvals

1. Cabinet Approves Rationalization of Royalty Rates for Critical **Minerals**

The Union Cabinet has approved revised royalty rates for four critical minerals — Caesium, Graphite, Rubidium, and Zirconium — to promote their auction and boost domestic production. The new structure includes 2% ASP for Caesium, 4% and 2% ASP for Graphite depending on grade, 2% ASP for Rubidium, and 1% ASP for Zirconium. This change is expected to unlock new mineral blocks, reduce import dependence, enhance supply chain security, and support India's push towards Green Energy. These minerals play major roles in EV batteries, nuclear energy, electronics, GPS systems, fibre optics, and other high-tech sectors, and the move aligns with the country's growing focus on critical and strategic minerals under the MMDR Act.

2. Cabinet Approves Credit Guarantee Scheme for Exporters (CGSE)

The Union Cabinet has approved the Credit Guarantee Scheme for Exporters (CGSE) to provide 100% credit guarantee through NCGTC for additional lending of up to ₹20,000 crore, benefiting both MSME and non-MSME exporters. The scheme aims to boost liquidity, support market diversification, and strengthen India's path toward achieving **USD 1 trillion exports**. By enabling collateral-free credit, the initiative will help exporters maintain operations, improve global competitiveness, and expand into new markets. With exports contributing significantly to GDP,

employment, and foreign exchange reserves, the scheme reinforces India's commitment to promoting an Aatmanirbhar **Bharat** through a more resilient export ecosystem.

3. Cabinet Resolution on Explosion Near Red Fort, Delhi

The Union Cabinet expressed deep grief over the tragic **terrorist** car explosion near the Red Fort on 10 November 2025, which caused multiple deaths and injuries. The Cabinet condemned the heinous and cowardly act, paid tribute to the victims, and appreciated the swift response of security agencies, medical teams, and citizens. The government reiterated its policy of zero tolerance towards terrorism and directed authorities to conduct a thorough and urgent investigation to identify and punish the perpetrators and their supporters. The Cabinet also acknowledged the global solidarity and support extended by various countries in response to the attack.

4. Cabinet Approves Export Promotion Mission (EPM) -

The Union Cabinet has approved the ambitious Export Promotion Mission (EPM) with an outlay of ₹25,060 crore to strengthen India's export ecosystem, especially for MSMEs, first-time exporters, and labour-intensive sectors. The Mission consolidates earlier fragmented schemes into a single, flexible, digital framework operating through two components: NIRYAT PROTSAHAN (focused on affordable trade finance) and NIRYAT **DISHA** (focused on compliance, branding, logistics, and market access). The initiative aims to tackle challenges such as costly finance, limited branding, logistics gaps, and high compliance costs, while also supporting sectors affected by recent global tariff hikes. Implemented by DGFT, EPM is expected to boost employment, improve export readiness, and help India move toward the vision of Viksit Bharat @2047.

5. Cabinet Approves Pune Metro Rail Project Phase-2 (Line 4 &

The Union Cabinet chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi has approved Pune Metro Phase-2's Line 4 (Kharadi-Hadapsar-Swargate-Khadakwasla) and Line 4A (Nal Stop-Warje-Manik Baug), covering 31.636 km with 28 elevated stations at a cost of ₹9,857.85 crore, to be completed in five years. The project will be jointly funded by the Centre, Maharashtra Government, and multilateral agencies, and implemented by Maha-Metro. These corridors integrate with existing metro lines at Kharadi Bypass, Nal Stop, and Swargate, and provide interchanges at Hadapsar Railway Station with future links to Loni Kalbhor and Saswad Road. Running through major routes like Solapur Road, Magarpatta Road, Sinhagad Road, Karve Road, and Mumbai-Bengaluru Highway, the project aims to reduce congestion, improve connectivity across IT hubs, educational clusters, residential belts, and tourism zones. Ridership is projected at 4.09 lakh daily by 2028, rising to 11.7 lakh by 2058. With preconstruction underway, this approval takes Pune's metro network beyond 100 km and strengthens the city's path toward a modern, integrated, and sustainable transport system.











6. Cabinet Approves ₹7,280 Crore Scheme for Sintered Rare Earth Permanent Magnets (REPM)

The Union Cabinet has approved a ₹7,280-crore Scheme to Promote Manufacturing of Sintered Rare Earth Permanent Magnets (REPM), establishing India's first integrated 6,000 MTPA REPM production ecosystem to boost self-reliance and reduce import dependence. REPMs—critical for EVs, renewable energy, consumer electronics, aerospace, and defence—will be manufactured through complete value-chain conversion from rare earth oxides to final magnets. The scheme includes ₹6,450 crore in sales-linked incentives for five years and ₹750 crore capital subsidy for setting up manufacturing capacity, allocated to five global-bid winners with up to 1,200 MTPA each. The scheme duration is seven years, including a two-year gestation period and five years of incentive disbursement. With REPM demand expected to double by 2030, India aims to secure supply chains, boost advanced manufacturing, generate employment, and support the Net Zero by 2070 commitment under the Viksit Bharat @2047 vision.

7. CCEA Approves Two Railway Multitracking Projects Worth ₹2,781 Crore

The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CCEA), chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, approved two major Indian Railways multitracking projects worth ₹2,781 crore: the 141-km Devbhumi Dwarka (Okha)-Kanalus doubling and the 32-km Badlapur-Karjat 3rd & 4th line. Together adding 224 km to the rail network across Maharashtra and Gujarat, the projects aim to ease congestion, boost mobility, improve operational efficiency, and enhance freight capacity by 18 MTPA. The PM Gati Shaktialigned proposals will provide seamless multimodal connectivity, benefiting 585 villages with 32 lakh population. The Kanalus-Okha doubling improves access to Dwarkadhish Temple and accelerates Saurashtra's development, while the Badlapur-Karjat project strengthens the Mumbai suburban corridor and enhances links to southern India. The project will also reduce logistics costs, cut 3 crore litres of oil imports, lower CO2 emissions by 16 crore kg (equivalent to planting 64 lakh trees), and support movement of key commodities such as coal, cement, POL, salt, and containers.

Gujarat

Gujarat launched the Tribal Genome Project, India's first tribalfocused genome sequencing programme by GBRC, covering 2,000 genomes across 17 districts to address genetic disorders like sickle cell anaemia and thalassemia.

Ambaji Marble from Banaskantha received the GI Tag under the High-Quality Natural Stone category.

A 240 TPD biomass pellet plant was inaugurated in Rewari, and foundation was laid for the K2 Bio-Ethanol facility supporting E20 and Net Zero 2070 goals.

Himachal Pradesh celebrated the Raulane Festival in Kinnaur, featuring masked dances and ancient folklore traditions.

Jharkhand

The Supreme Court directed Jharkhand to declare Saranda Forest as a Wildlife Sanctuary.

Karnataka became India's first state to offer 12 days of paid menstrual leave annually for women across all sectors.

RBI Bi-Monthly Monetary Policy 2025

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI), under Governor Sanjay Malhotra, announced its Monetary Policy 2025 on keeping the repo rate unchanged at 5.5% and maintaining the policy stance as 'Neutral'. The decision was unanimously taken by all MPC members.

The RBI also revised its **FY26 GDP growth estimate upwards to 6.8%** (from 6.5% earlier) and **cut CPI inflation forecast to 2.6%** (from 3.1% earlier), signaling optimism on growth with controlled inflationary pressures.

Nobel Prize 2025 in Medicine

The 2025 Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine has been awarded to Mary E. Brunkow, Fred Ramsdell, and Shimon Sakaguchi for their pioneering discoveries on peripheral immune tolerance — a fundamental mechanism that keeps the human immune system from attacking its own tissues. Their work has not only transformed our understanding of how the immune system is regulated but also opened up new avenues for the treatment of autoimmune diseases, cancer, and transplant rejection.

Their collaborative research identified regulatory T cells (Tregs) — specialized immune cells that act as "security guards" to prevent immune cells from mistakenly attacking the body's own tissues. This discovery has revolutionized immunology and disease treatment strategies.

Groundbreaking Discoveries in Immune Tolerance

Understanding Peripheral Immune Tolerance

- Our immune system defends the body against countless microbes daily.
- However, it must also distinguish between foreign invaders and the body's own cells.
- If this balance is disturbed, it can lead to autoimmune diseases, where the immune system mistakenly attacks healthy tissues.
- The laureates' research focused on how this balance is maintained outside the thymus, a mechanism now known as peripheral tolerance.

Nobel Prize in Physics 2025

The Nobel Prize in Physics 2025 has been awarded to John Clarke, Michel H. Devoret, and John M. Martinis for their groundbreaking discovery of macroscopic quantum mechanical tunnelling and energy quantisation in an electric circuit. Their work proved that quantum phenomena can occur even in large-scale systems, bridging the gap between the quantum and classical worlds and paving the way for advanced technologies like quantum computing, cryptography, and sensors.

Quantum Physics Made Visible: The Breakthrough

The Central Question: Size and Quantum Behavior

- One of the fundamental questions in modern physics is: How large can a system be and still exhibit quantum mechanical effects?
- Traditionally, quantum behavior is observable only at the atomic or subatomic scale.
- However, the 2025 Nobel laureates shattered this boundary by demonstrating quantum phenomena in a macroscopic electrical circuit, proving that the laws of quantum mechanics apply even to systems visible to the naked eye.

What is Quantum Physics?

- Quantum physics, also known as quantum mechanics, is a fundamental branch of physics that explains the behavior of matter and energy at the smallest scales — such as atoms, electrons, and photons.
- Unlike classical physics, which describes predictable and continuous behavior, quantum physics reveals a world where particles can exist in multiple states at once, move through barriers, and exchange energy in discrete packets (called quanta).

The Josephson Junction Experiment

- The laureates constructed an electronic circuit using superconductors, materials that allow current to flow without electrical resistance.
- These superconductors were separated by a thin nonconductive barrier, forming a Josephson junction — a device known for its quantum properties.
- By precisely controlling and measuring the properties of this circuit, they could observe quantum tunnelling and energy quantisation on a macroscopic scale.

Key Discoveries and Insights

1. Macroscopic Quantum Tunnelling

- In quantum mechanics, particles can "tunnel" through barriers that they classically shouldn't be able to cross.
- In the laureates' experiment, the entire superconducting system behaved like a single particle, initially trapped in a zero-voltage state.
- Through quantum tunnelling, it escaped this state a shift detectable by the appearance of a voltage — proving that tunnelling is possible even in large, collective systems.

2. Energy Quantisation

- Quantum systems absorb or emit discrete amounts of energy, not continuous values.
- The team demonstrated that their macroscopic system followed this rule exactly, behaving in accordance with quantum predictions.











This finding confirmed that quantum principles govern not just electrons and photons, but even collective states involving billions of particles.

Implications for Quantum Technology

This discovery goes beyond theoretical physics — it has practical implications for emerging technologies,

- Quantum Computing Enables stable and controllable qubits for faster computation.
- **Quantum Cryptography** Paves the way for unbreakable communication systems.
- Quantum Sensors Offers unprecedented precision in measurement and detection.

"It is wonderful to celebrate how century-old quantum mechanics still offers new surprises," said Olle Eriksson, Chair of the Nobel Committee for Physics. "This discovery opens doors to a future defined by quantum technology."

The Nobel Prize in Chemistry 2025 has been awarded to Susumu Kitagawa, Richard Robson, and Omar M. Yaghi for their groundbreaking work in developing metal-organic frameworks (MOFs). These are advanced molecular structures with large cavities that can capture gases, store toxic chemicals, catalyze reactions, and even harvest water from desert air. Their discoveries have opened new possibilities in chemistry and environmental applications.

- Acted as a presidential candidate in the 2024 elections, though blocked by the regime.

Significance

- Demonstrates that peace and democracy are intertwined.
- Inspires citizens globally to resist authoritarianism through nonviolent methods.
- Highlights the role of women leaders in defending freedom under repressive regimes.

Challenges Faced

- Venezuela's transition from a democratic to an authoritarian state.

- Personal threats to life and freedom while continuing activism.

2025 Nobel Prize in Economics

The Sveriges Riksbank Prize in Economic Sciences in Memory of Alfred Nobel 2025 has been awarded to Joel Mokyr, Philippe Aghion, and Peter Howitt for their groundbreaking contributions to understanding innovation-driven economic growth. Their work explains how technological progress and creative destruction have transformed economies from stagnation to sustained prosperity over the past two centuries.

Joel Mokyr's Insights On Historical Growth

- Mokyr used historical evidence to explain why innovation became self-sustaining after the Industrial Revolution.
- He emphasized the need for scientific understanding, cultural openness to new ideas, and societal acceptance of change as foundations for continual progress.
- His research highlighted that before the modern era, stagnation was the norm, as discoveries did not consistently lead to further innovation.

Aghion and Howitt's Theory of Creative Destruction

- In their landmark 1992 paper, Aghion and Howitt developed a mathematical model of creative destruction, showing how new innovations displace old technologies.
- This process fuels productivity and prosperity but also creates economic conflicts, as older firms and workers face displacement.
- They emphasized that societies must manage these transitions constructively to prevent innovation from being blocked by vested interests.

Broader Impact on Economic Thought

The laureates' combined work has redefined how economists understand long-term growth mechanisms.











- Their findings underline the importance of innovation policy, education, and institutional support to maintain economic dynamism.
- Committee Chair John Hassler noted that "economic growth cannot be taken for granted; we must uphold the mechanisms of creative destruction to avoid stagnation."

- His dynamic batting not only won him the Player of the Tournament title but also saw him reach a record-breaking 931 rating points in the ICC Men's T20I Batting Rankings the highest ever by any player in the format at the end of the Super Fours stage.

Competitors & Selection

- He edged out contenders like Kuldeep Yadav (India) and Brian Bennett (Zimbabwe) for the ICC monthly honour, winning both expert panel and fan votes.
- Abhishek's ability to perform under pressure has made him a rising figure in India's T20 setup.

Smriti Mandhana: Leading from the Front

ODI Brilliance vs Australia

- Vice-captain Smriti Mandhana showcased elite form in India's ODI series against Australia, scoring 58, 117, and 125 in three innings.
- She totaled 308 runs in four matches during the month, averaging 77 with a strike rate of 135.68.

Terms of Reference Approved: What's Next for the 8th Central Pay Commission?

On 28 October 2025, the Union Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, approved the Terms of Reference (ToR) for the 8th Central Pay Commission (CPC). This decision marks a major administrative step toward revising the pay structure and service conditions of Central Government employees. The 8th CPC will assess the present emolument system and recommend changes keeping in view India's economic conditions and fiscal sustainability.

Composition and Tenure

The 8th Central Pay Commission will function as a temporary body with the following composition,

- Chairperson
- One Member (Part-Time)
- One Member-Secretary
- It is mandated to submit its recommendations within 18 months from the date of constitution.
- Additionally, the Commission may submit interim reports on specific issues whenever required.

Key Considerations for Recommendations

While formulating its recommendations, the Commission will take into account several vital aspects,

- Economic Conditions and Fiscal Prudence Ensuring recommendations align with the nation's financial health.
- Resource Allocation for Development Balancing employee welfare with funds needed for development and welfare programs.
- Unfunded Pension Liabilities Evaluating the financial burden of non-contributory pension schemes.
- Impact on State Finances Considering recommendations affect State Governments, which often adopt similar pay structures.
- Comparison with Other Sectors Assessing the emolument structure and benefits in Central Public Sector Undertakings (CPSUs) and the private sector.

Background and Significance

- The Central Pay Commissions are periodically established to review and rationalize the salary structure, retirement benefits, and service conditions of Central Government employees.
- Traditionally, a Pay Commission is set up every ten years, with its recommendations implemented subsequently.

- The 7th Central Pay Commission recommendations were implemented in 2016.
- Following this trend, the 8th CPC's recommendations are expected to take effect from 1 January 2026.
- The Government announced the formation of the 8th CPC in January 2025 to ensure a smooth transition to the next pay revision cycle.

The PM also called for mass participation in the 150th anniversary celebrations of Vande Mataram.

The PM opened with greetings on Diwali and Chhath Puja, calling these celebrations a symbol of India's social unity. He commended women's dedication during Chhath Vrat and urged everyone, including those abroad, to experience the festival.

Environment and Local Innovation

Plastic-Waste Meals in Ambikapur

 In Chhattisgarh's Ambikapur, Garbage Cafés exchange meals for plastic waste, 1 kg = lunch/dinner, 0.5 kg = breakfast — a civic initiative tackling pollution and hunger simultaneously.

Lake Revival in Bengaluru

- Engineer Kapil Sharma has rejuvenated 40 wells and 6 lakes, engaging citizens and corporates.
- His work in Bengaluru reflects effective community-driven conservation.

Mangroves in Gujarat

- The Gujarat Forest Department has planted mangroves over 3,500 hectares in Dholera, reviving biodiversity — including dolphins, crabs, and migratory birds.

- NVIDIA, led by CEO Jensen Huang, became the first company ever to cross the \$4 trillion mark, overtaking Microsoft and Apple earlier in the year.
- Microsoft followed by reaching the same milestone in July 2025, while Apple joined the exclusive group after a sharp share-price rally in October 2025.
- Apple's market value surged following the record-breaking launch of the iPhone 17 series in September 2025.
- Over the past three months, Apple's shares have risen by 25%, while Microsoft's have increased by 6%.
- Other major players like Alphabet (Google), Meta, Amazon, and Tesla continue to remain close competitors in the trillion-dollar league.

Cabinet Approvals

- The Union Cabinet chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi approved the continuation of the Biomedical Research Career Programme (BRCP) Phase-III for 2025–26 to 2030–31, extendable till 2037–38, at a cost of ₹1,500 crore jointly funded by the Department of Biotechnology (DBT) with ₹1,000 crore and the Wellcome Trust (UK) with ₹500 crore. Implemented through the DBT–Wellcome Trust India Alliance (SPV), the programme will support early and intermediate research fellowships, collaborative grants, and research management training, aiming to train over 2,000 researchers, enhance women's participation by 10–15%, and expand biomedical research capacity in Tier-2 and Tier-3 institutions, aligning with the Viksit Bharat vision for world-class science and innovation.
- The Cabinet approved the Mission for Aatmanirbharta in Pulses, a six-year initiative (2025–26 to 2030–31) with an outlay of ₹11,440 crore to achieve self-sufficiency in pulse production and reduce imports. The mission will boost research, seed systems, area expansion, procurement, and value-chain infrastructure, targeting 350 lakh tonnes of production and coverage of 310 lakh hectares by 2030–31. It includes distribution of 126 lakh quintals of certified seeds, 88 lakh free seed kits, and setting up 1,000 processing units with ₹25 lakh subsidy each. NAFED and NCCF will ensure 100% procurement of tur, urad, and masoor under PM-AASHA, while promoting climate-resilient agriculture, soil health, and intercropping practices for farmer welfare.
- The Cabinet approved a 3% increase in Dearness Allowance (DA) and Dearness Relief (DR) for Central Government employees and pensioners, effective from July 1, 2025, raising the rate from 55% to 58% of basic pay/pension. The hike will benefit 49.19 lakh employees and 68.72 lakh pensioners, with an annual financial impact of ₹10,083.96 crore. This revision follows the 7th Central Pay Commission's formula and aims to offset inflation and rising living costs.
- The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CCEA) approved increases in the Minimum Support Prices (MSP) for all Rabi crops for the Marketing Season 2026–27, ensuring farmers earn at least 1.5 times their cost of production. The highest MSP hike is for Safflower (+₹600/quintal), followed by Lentil (Masur) +₹300, Rapeseed & Mustard +₹250, Gram +₹225, Barley +₹170, and Wheat +₹160. The profit margins are estimated at 109% for Wheat, 93% for Mustard, 89% for Lentil, 59% for Gram, 58% for Barley, and 50% for Safflower. These measures aim to ensure remunerative prices, crop diversification, and agricultural sustainability.









- The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CCEA) approved the widening and improvement of the Kalibor–Numaligarh section (85.675 km) of NH-715 in Assam to four lanes, including wildlife-friendly elevated corridors through the Kaziranga National Park, at a total cost of ₹6,957 crore. The project includes a 34.45 km elevated corridor, 30.22 km of at-grade widening, and 21 km of greenfield bypasses at Jakhalabandha and Bokakhat. It will connect Guwahati, Nagaon, Golaghat, and Jorhat, linking three airports, three railway stations, and two major highways (NH-127 & NH-129), generating over 34 lakh man-days of employment, and boosting tourism, wildlife safety, and regional trade.
- The Cabinet approved the opening of 57 new Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) across India under the civil sector, at a total cost of ₹5,862.55 crore over nine years (2026–27 to 2034–35) including ₹2,585.52 crore for infrastructure and ₹3,277.03 crore for operations. These KVs will include Balvatikas (pre-primary) in line with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, benefiting around 86,640 students and creating 4,617 permanent jobs. The schools will be set up in 17 States/UTs, including 14 Aspirational districts, 4 LWE districts, and 5 Northeastern/hilly regions, ensuring balanced educational access and promoting national integration.
- The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs approved four major railway multi-tracking projects worth ₹24,634 crore, covering 894 km across Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat, and Chhattisgarh. The projects include the Wardha–Bhusawal (314 km), Gondia–Dongargarh (84 km), Vadodara–Ratlam (259 km), and Itarsi–Bhopal–Bina (237 km) sections. Together, they will benefit 18 districts, improve connectivity for 3,633 villages, and create employment in Aspirational districts. The projects will add 78 MTPA of freight capacity, save 28 crore litres of fuel, and reduce 139 crore kg of CO₂ emissions, equivalent to planting 6 crore trees, while enhancing PM Gati Shakti multi-modal logistics and tourism connectivity.
- The National Crisis Management Committee (NCMC) chaired by Cabinet Secretary Dr. T.V. Somanathan reviewed preparedness for a cyclone forming in the Bay of Bengal expected to make landfall between Machilipatnam and Kakinada (Andhra Pradesh) on October 28, 2025, with wind speeds of 90–100 kmph gusting to 110 kmph. IMD, NDRF, Army, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard, and the State Governments of Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh, Odisha, and Puducherry are on high alert. Over 900 fishing vessels have returned to shore, and evacuation centres are ready. The Cabinet Secretary emphasized zero casualties and rapid restoration of essential services post-landfall.
- The Cabinet approved the continuation of the National Pulses Mission, reaffirming the goal of Aatmanirbharta (self-reliance) in pulses. The mission will boost production

- from 24.2 million tonnes (2024–25) to 35 million tonnes (2030–31) across 416 districts, focusing on rice-fallow areas, seed infrastructure, irrigation, and procurement at MSP. With a budget of ₹11,440 crore, it ensures 100% procurement of tur, urad, and masoor under PM-AASHA, improving food security, farmer income, and nutritional resilience nationwide.
- The Cabinet approved the increase in MSPs for Rabi crops (Marketing Season 2026–27) with the highest hike for safflower (+₹600/quintal), followed by lentil (+₹300), mustard (+₹250), gram (+₹225), barley (+₹170), and wheat (+₹160). The returns range from 50% to 109% over production cost, ensuring fair compensation and encouraging crop diversification in line with the Budget 2018–19 formula.
- The Cabinet approved four-laning of NH-715 between Kalibor and Numaligarh, including wildlife-friendly elevated sections over Kaziranga National Park, at a cost of ₹6,957 crore under EPC mode, covering 85.675 km. The project connects major cities (Guwahati, Nagaon, Golaghat, Jorhat), airports (Tezpur, Liabari, Jorhat), and railway stations (Nagaon, Jakhalabandha, Vishwanath Chariali), generating 15.42 lakh direct and 19.19 lakh indirect jobs, boosting tourism, eco-safety, and trade growth in Assam.

Chasing 147 in a tense final, India recovered from a shaky 20 for 3 to reach the target at 150 for 5, thanks to a matchwinning knock from Tilak Varma. Varma's calm and calculated 69 not out, supported by Shivam Dube's 33 off 22 balls, ensured India lifted the trophy in a game that will be remembered as one of the most gripping India-Pakistan encounters in recent history.

2025 Ramon Magsaysay Award 2025

On August 31, 2025, Educate Girls, officially known as the Foundation to Educate Girls Globally, achieved a historic feat by becoming the first Indian organisation to win the Ramon Magsaysay Award, one of Asia's most prestigious honours. The award recognises the NGO's relentless efforts in transforming the educational landscape for out-of-school girls in India's remotest regions.

This year's other awardees include **Shaahina Ali** from the Maldives for her work in environmental conservation and **Flaviano Antonio L Villanueva** of the Philippines for supporting marginalised communities.

About Educate Girls: Vision and Achievements

Founded in **2007** by **Safeena Husain**, a graduate of the London School of Economics, Educate Girls was born out of a mission to tackle **female illiteracy** in India. Husain left her corporate career in San Francisco and returned to India with a single-minded focus: to bring every girl child into school.

Impact at Scale

Starting in the desert villages of Rajasthan, Educate Girls identified communities most resistant to girls' education. The NGO's grassroots model led to:

- Enrolment and retention of over 2 million girls
- Expansion to 30,000+ villages across India
- School retention rate exceeding 90%

Innovation: Development Impact Bond (DIB)

In **2015**, the NGO pioneered the **world's first Development Impact Bond in education**, linking investor funds to measurable educational outcomes. This model attracted global attention and catalysed scalable interventions in India's rural education sector.

Pragati: Empowering Young Women

Recognising the educational gap among adolescent girls and young women, Educate Girls launched **Pragati**, an open-schooling programme aimed at learners aged 15–29. Starting with 300 participants, the programme now supports **over 31,500 learners**, helping them resume education and access better life opportunities.

Why the Organisation Was Awarded

According to the Ramon Magsaysay Award Foundation (RMAF), Educate Girls was selected for its "commitment to addressing cultural stereotyping through the education of girls and young women, liberating them from the bondage of illiteracy and infusing them with skills, courage, and agency to achieve their full human potential."

This recognition reflects the power of grassroots movements and innovative education financing to enact long-lasting social change.

Understanding the Ramon Magsaysay Award

Origins and Prestige

Established in 1957 by the Rockefeller Brothers Fund and the Philippine government, the Ramon Magsaysay Award is often dubbed the "Asian Nobel Prize." It celebrates exemplary leadership, integrity, and public service.

Over the years, more than **300 individuals and organisations** across Asia have been honoured. Notable past Indian recipients include:

- Arvind Kejriwal (former Delhi CM, 2006)
- Ravish Kumar (journalist, 2019)
- Bezwada Wilson (activist, 2016)
- Sonam Wangchuk (environmentalist, 2018)

The Ceremony and Legacy

The award is formally presented each year on **November 7** at the **Metropolitan Theatre in Manila**, Philippines, and commemorates the birth of **Ramon del Fierro Magsaysay**, former President of the Philippines (born **August 31, 1907**). He was a WWII guerrilla leader, automobile mechanic, and a leader who rose from humble beginnings to become a symbol of people-centric governance.











His presidency was marked by anti-corruption reforms and a deep trust in the common citizen's dignity. His untimely death in a plane crash in **1957** gave rise to the award in his memory, celebrating "greatness of spirit" in public service.

CP Radhakrishnan Elected as India's 15th Vice President

On September 9, 2025, CP Radhakrishnan, the former Tamil Nadu BJP president and Maharashtra Governor, was elected as the 15th Vice President of India, defeating opposition candidate B Sudershan Reddy, a senior advocate and former Supreme Court judge. The election witnessed a high turnout of 98.3%, showcasing the unity and participation of parliamentarians.

Election Results and Turnout

Radhakrishnan secured 452 first preference votes, while Justice Reddy received 300 votes. Fifteen votes were declared invalid. Out of 781 eligible MPs, 767 cast their votes, marking an impressive 98.20% turnout. Thirteen MPs abstained, including members from the Biju Janata Dal, Bharat Rashtra Samithi, Shiromani Akali Dal, and one independent.

His victory margin of 152 votes not only affirmed NDA's legislative strength but also pointed to potential cross-voting within opposition ranks—an indication of internal dissent or strategic shifts among INDIA bloc constituents.

Background of the Vacancy

The Vice Presidential post had remained vacant since July 21, 2025, after Jagdeep Dhankhar resigned due to health concerns. The early election ensured constitutional continuity and reinforced the NDA's emphasis on stabilizing key parliamentary roles.

Who is CP Radhakrishnan?

Chandrapuram Ponnusamy Radhakrishnan was born on October 20, 1957, in Tiruppur, Tamil Nadu. He holds a bachelor's degree in Business Administration and has had a long-standing association with the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) and the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP).

His political career includes,

- Serving as a two-time Lok Sabha MP from Coimbatore (1998 and 1999)
- Becoming Tamil Nadu BJP president
- Holding positions on various parliamentary committees
- Chairing the Coir Board from 2016 to 2020, during which coir exports hit record highs
- Acting as BJP's Kerala in-charge from 2020 to 2022

Radhakrishnan also served as Governor of Jharkhand, and later held additional charge of Telangana and Puducherry. Most recently, he was appointed Governor of Maharashtra in July 2024 before being nominated for the Vice Presidency.

His Broader Contributions

Beyond politics, Radhakrishnan is known for his engagement in sports like table tennis, cricket, and volleyball. He has represented India in multiple international delegations across Asia, Europe, and North America, highlighting his diplomatic acumen.

His career reflects a mix of administrative efficiency and political loyalty, making him a strong fit for the Vice President's constitutional responsibilities, particularly as the Rajya Sabha's presiding officer.

Nepal Gets its First Woman Prime Minister as Sushila Karki as Interim Leader

In a historic political shift, **Sushila Karki, Nepal's first female Chief Justice**, is set to become the country's first woman Prime
Minister after being chosen as the interim leader by Gen-Z
protest groups. The decision follows a youth-led uprising that
forced the resignation of former PM KP Sharma Oli and
dismantled Nepal's entrenched political order.

Karki, 73, was sworn in on 12th September 2025, following an agreement between President Ran Chandra Paudel, the Nepali Army leadership, and Gen-Z representatives.

The Gen-Z Revolt

- The uprising, largely led by young Nepalis frustrated with corruption and governance failures, escalated after the government attempted to impose a ban on social media platforms.
- Protests turned violent, resulting in over 30 deaths and 1,000+ injuries.
- The revolt forced widespread resignations from older political leaders, marking a generational shift in Nepalese politics.
- Key alternative names considered for leadership included Kathmandu Mayor Balendra Shah (Balen) and Kulman Ghising, former chief of Nepal Electricity Authority.
- Ultimately, Sushila Karki emerged as a consensus choice due to her clean image, anti-corruption record, and public credibility.



- She assumes office with broad popular support, though challenges remain in navigating Nepal's deep political divisions, economic slowdown, and fragile democratic institutions.

Regional and International Significance

- Nepal, located between India and China, holds a strategic geopolitical position in South Asia.
- Karki's leadership signals a generational and gender milestone, potentially inspiring greater women's political participation in South Asia.
- The shift may also affect India-Nepal relations, as Karki studied in India and maintains academic ties, which could strengthen bilateral cultural diplomacy.

Cabinet Approvals

- The Union Cabinet chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi approved a Rs.1,500 crore Incentive Scheme to promote critical mineral recycling under the National Critical Mineral Mission (NCMM). The scheme, with a tenure of six years (FY 2025-26 to FY 2030-31), will support recycling of e-waste, Lithium-ion battery scrap, and catalytic converters from end-of-life vehicles. It offers 20% Capex subsidy on plant & machinery and an Opex subsidy linked to incremental sales. Benefits are capped at Rs.50 crore for large entities and Rs.25 crore for small units, encouraging both established players and start-ups. The scheme aims to create 270 kilo ton annual recycling capacity, yielding 40 kilo ton of critical minerals, attracting Rs.8,000 crore investment and generating 70,000 jobs.
- The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CCEA) approved the doubling of the Bhagalpur–Dumka–Rampurhat railway line section (177 km) in Bihar, Jharkhand, and West Bengal at a cost of Rs.3,169 crore. The project will enhance railway mobility, efficiency, and service reliability, reduce congestion, and support multimodal connectivity under PM-Gati Shakti. It will connect important destinations like Deoghar (Baba Baidyanath Dham) and Tarapith (Shakti Peeth), benefitting 441 villages and 28.72 lakh people including three Aspirational Districts (Banka, Godda, Dumka). The project will enable 15 MTPA additional freight traffic, reduce oil imports by 5 crore litres, and cut 24 crore kg of CO2 emissions, equivalent to planting 1 crore trees.

- The CCEA approved the construction of the Mokama-Munger 4-lane greenfield access-controlled section (82.4 km) of the Buxar-Bhagalpur High-Speed Corridor in Bihar on Hybrid Annuity Mode (HAM) with an outlay of Rs.4,447.38 crore. The corridor will connect Mokama, Barahiya, Lakhisarai, Jamalpur, Munger, and Bhagalpur, boosting regional industries such as ordnance factories, locomotive workshops, food processing, logistics hubs, and Bhagalpuri silk textiles. With design speeds of 100 km/h, the project will reduce travel time to 1.5 hours, while enhancing safety and freight movement. It is expected to generate 14.83 lakh man-days of direct employment and 18.46 lakh man-days of indirect jobs, further driving economic growth in Eastern Bihar.
- The Union Cabinet approved Phase-III of the Centrally Sponsored Scheme (CSS) to add 5,000 PG seats and 5,023 MBBS seats in government medical institutions with a cost ceiling of ₹1.50 crore per seat, involving a total outlay of ₹15,034.50 crore (Centre: ₹10,303.20 crore, States: ₹4,731.30 crore). This move will increase doctors and specialists, improve healthcare access in underserved areas, generate employment, and enhance India's health system resilience.
- The Cabinet approved the Department of Scientific and Industrial Research (DSIR) / CSIR Scheme on Capacity Building and Human Resource Development with an outlay of ₹2,277.397 crore for 2021-26. The scheme will support R&D institutions, universities, and national labs, nurturing young researchers in STEMM fields. It strengthens India's innovation ecosystem, boosts research publications, and aids progress towards Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).
- The Cabinet approved Productivity Linked Bonus (PLB) equivalent to 78 days' wages worth ₹1,865.68 crore for 10.91 lakh non-gazetted railway employees before Durga Puja/Dussehra. The bonus, with a maximum amount of ₹17,951 per employee, recognizes the excellent performance of Railways, which achieved record 1614.90 MT freight loading and carried 7.3 billion passengers in 2024-25.
- The Cabinet approved the construction of a 78.94 km four-lane Sahebganj—Areraj—Bettiah section of NH-139W in Bihar under the Hybrid Annuity Mode (HAM) at a cost of ₹3,822.31 crore. The project will improve connectivity from Patna to Bettiah, boost cross-border trade with Nepal, support agriculture and tourism, and reduce travel time from 2.5 hours to 1 hour. It will generate 14.22 lakh direct and 17.69 lakh indirect man-days of employment.
- The Cabinet approved the doubling of the 104 km Bakhtiyarpur–Rajgir–Tilaiya railway section in Bihar at a cost of ₹2,192 crore. Covering four districts and connecting Rajgir, Nalanda, Pawapuri, the project will enhance passenger and freight capacity (26 MTPA), benefit 13.46 lakh people across 1,434 villages, and reduce CO2 emissions by 24 crore kg. It supports the PM Gati Shakti Master Plan, improving multi-modal connectivity and regional development.

Safety is one of the most crucial factors in determining a city's livability, and in 2025, India's urban safety map has shown some interesting patterns. According to the mid-2025 Numbeo Safety Index, India ranked 67th globally with a safety score of 55.8. While the overall national ranking leaves room for improvement, some cities have emerged as beacons of safety, offering their residents a secure and peaceful environment.

The latest report places Mangalore at the top of the list as India's safest city, followed closely by Vadodara, Ahmedabad, and Surat—showcasing Gujarat's strong presence in safety rankings. On the flip side, cities in the National Capital Region (NCR) like Delhi, Noida, and Ghaziabad continue to face major safety challenges.

How the Safety Rankings Were Calculated

The Numbeo Safety Index is based on public perceptions of safety in daily life, both during the daytime and at night. Respondents rate their cities based on experiences and concerns related to,

- **Personal safety:** Risk of mugging, robbery, car theft, physical attacks by strangers, and harassment in public places.
- Discrimination: Based on factors like skin colour, ethnicity, gender, or religion.
- **Property crimes:** Including vandalism, burglary, and theft.
- Violent crimes: Such as assault and homicide.

These inputs are then converted into a Safety Index (higher scores mean safer cities) and a Crime Index (higher scores mean less safe).

Revised Income Tax Bill, 2025: What Taxpayers and Investors **Need to Know**

Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman has formally withdrawn the old draft of the Income Tax Bill, 2025, from the Lok Sabha and introduced a revised version in Parliament. This new draft is the result of extensive feedback and scrutiny, including around 285 recommendations from a Select Committee, aiming to modernize and simplify India's direct tax framework, replacing the existing Income Tax Act, 1961.

Why Was the Earlier Bill Withdrawn?

The original bill, introduced during the Parliament's Budget session in February 2025, was immediately referred to a Select Committee for thorough review. Major reasons for withdrawal:

- Drafting inconsistencies and technical errors needed correction.
- Terminology clarifications and improved legal language were necessary to convey the correct legislative intent.
- Stakeholder and committee feedback was extensive, demanding a consolidated, clearer bill that avoids confusion between multiple versions.

Structure and Key Features of the New Bill

Simplified Language: The bill's legal terminology has been rewritten for clarity. Provisions that were ambiguous or contradictory have been removed to reduce disputes—a common issue under the old law.

- Organized Provisions: There are now 536 sections and 16 schedules organized for easy navigation, compared to the older act's 298 sections.
- Introduction of "Tax Year": The new bill attempts to eliminate the dual system of "Previous Year" and "Assessment Year," introducing the concept of a single "Tax Year" for better clarity and administration.
- Digital-first Approach: The Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT) gets enhanced powers to make rules promoting digital administration and automation, including faceless processes to reduce the scope for corruption and unnecessary litigation.
- No Immediate Tax Slab Changes: The revised bill does not change tax rates or income categories at this stage but focuses on simplifying processes and paperwork.

Major Select Committee Recommendations

The Select Committee's detailed 4,500-page report suggested significant reforms. Key recommendations now likely included in the revised bill:

Taxpayer Benefits & Relief

- **Refunds on Late Returns:** Taxpayers can now claim refunds even if their returns are filed after the deadline, helping individuals who miss filing due to genuine reasons.
- Dividend Deduction (Section 80M): Reintroduction of intercorporate dividend deductions, easing tax burden on companies receiving dividends from other domestic companies.
- NIL-TDS Facility: Taxpayers with no tax liability can obtain advance NIL-TDS (tax deducted at source) certificates, reducing compliance hassle.
- Tax Relief for Vacant Property: Additional tax burden based on deemed rent for vacant house properties is removed.
- Clear 30% Deduction for House Property: The deduction is now applicable only after subtracting municipal taxes; also, home-loan interest deduction is available for let-out (rented) properties.

Compliance & Procedural Changes

- Simplified Advance Ruling Fees: Making advance tax rulings more accessible by altering the fee structure.
- Clarifications on Penal Powers and TDS: Clear rules about when penalties apply, especially for provident fund withdrawal and other procedural aspects.
- **Definition Alignment:** MSME (Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises) definition is now linked directly to the MSME Act, reducing confusion.
- Legal Drafting Improvements: Numerous linguistic and technical errors have been corrected, including clause numbering and property terminology.
- **Expanded Pension Deduction:** Commuted pension deduction (previously only for employees) is now extended to non-employee individuals.

- Simplification and Transparency: The bill aims to make tax compliance easier, with fewer technical hurdles and clearer rules. This helps taxpayers plan their finances with more certainty and reduces disputes with tax authorities.
- Reduced Litigation: Many ambiguous provisions that often led to legal battles have been removed, and the law is now organized to reduce opportunities for misinterpretation.
- Support for Digital India: The emphasis on digital processes and automation will make tax filing and refunds quicker, improve convenience, and support a faceless, corruptionfree environment.
- **Investor Confidence:** By clearly aligning definitions (such as MSMEs and house property), the bill promotes investment by reducing uncertainties in tax rules affecting businesses and individuals.

Operation Sindoor: Gallantry Awards Announced for Armed Forces Heroes

On the eve of Independence Day 2025, the Government of India announced gallantry awards for officers of the Indian Armed Forces who played pivotal roles in Operation Sindoor—a triservices mission targeting terrorist infrastructure in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir. The awards recognise exceptional bravery, operational excellence, and distinguished service during one of India's most decisive counter-terrorism missions.

Background: Operation Sindoor

Operation Sindoor was launched in retaliation for the Pahalgam terror attack, which killed 26 civilians. The attack was claimed by The Resistance Front (TRF), a proxy for Pakistan-based Lashkare-Taiba (LeT).

The operation involved coordinated Army, Navy, and Air Force action,

- The Indian Army destroyed nine terrorist bases linked to Jaish-e-Mohammed, Lashkar-e-Taiba, and Hizbul Mujahideen in Pakistan and PoK.
- The Indian Air Force executed precision strikes on four targets inside Pakistan and five in PoK.
- The Indian Navy provided operational support from Indian soil.

RBI's FREE-AI Framework: Shaping Ethical AI in the Indian Financial Sector

Artificial Intelligence (AI) is rewiring financial services, from fraud detection to credit underwriting, but without clear guardrails, it can magnify risks. To steer this transition, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) set up a committee in December 2024 to craft the Framework for Responsible and Ethical Enablement of AI (FREE-AI) for the financial sector. The goal is simple but ambitious: enable innovation while protecting trust, fairness, and stability.

Committee, Mandate, and Methodology

Chaired by **Dr. Pushpak Bhattacharyya** (**IIT Bombay**) with members spanning policy, industry and academia, the Committee was tasked to assess adoption, review global approaches, identify risks, and recommend a governance framework tailored to India. It used a **four-pronged method**: wide **stakeholder engagements**, two **national surveys** (DoS and FTD) across banks/NBFCs/FinTechs, a scan of **global standards and laws**, and a gap analysis of **existing RBI guidelines** (IT, cybersecurity, outsourcing, digital lending, and consumer protection).

The Opportunity: Where AI Adds Value

Al promises **productivity gains** via process automation, **personalised customer experience** (multilingual chat/voice), sharper **risk analytics**, and **financial inclusion** using alternative data. India's diversity argues for **multilingual**, **domain-tuned models** (including efficient **SLMs** and LTD "trinity" models), and a **GenAl innovation sandbox** to speed safe experimentation.

The Risk Landscape: What Can Go Wrong

The report flags model and operational risks—bias, opacity, hallucinations, model drift, data poisoning, adversarial prompts, and third-party concentration. It notes systemic concerns (herding, procyclicality) and cybersecurity threats (automated phishing, deepfakes). Liability in non-deterministic systems is complex, and consumer protection requires clear disclosures and contestability of AI-led decisions.



Global Policy Context and India's Stance

Approaches vary: the **EU AI Act** uses horizontal, risk-tiered rules; **Singapore** blends toolkits (FEAT/Veritas) with guidance; **UK/US** lean principle-based; **China** regulates by AI type. India's line is **pro-innovation with safeguards**, backed by the **IndiaAI Mission** (₹10,372 crore) and the **AI Safety Institute** (**AISI**) to evaluate models and promote **safe**, **trusted AI**.

Seven Sutras (Core Principles) and Six Strategic Pillars

The Committee crystallises adoption around seven Sutras: Trust, People First, Innovation over Restraint, Fairness & Equity, Accountability, Understandable by Design, and Safety, Resilience & Sustainability. These are operationalised through six Pillars that pair enablement with risk control:

- Infrastructure: shared data/compute, Al Innovation
 Sandbox, sector models.
- **Policy:** proportional, risk-based guidance; clarity on outsourcing and vendor AI.
- Capacity: board to frontline Al literacy, Centers of Excellence, shared playbooks.
- Governance: board-approved Al policy, lifecycle controls, documentation.
- Protection: consumer disclosures, fairness testing, human-in-the-loop.
- Assurance: cybersecurity augmentation, incident reporting, independent audits.

Twenty-Six Recommendations: What RBI Wants Done (Essentials)

The report clusters actionable steps, notably: create shared compute/data rails; launch a GenAl sandbox; encourage indigenous financial-grade models; require board-approved Al policies; extend product approval and audit scopes to cover Al; strengthen Al-specific cybersecurity and incident reporting; ensure customers are told when engaging with Al; share sector best practices; and allow lighter compliance for clearly low-risk uses to spur inclusion.

Survey Insights: Current Adoption and Gaps

Adoption remains shallow: only 20.8% (127/612) supervised entities use or are developing Al. Tier-1 UCBs: 0%; Tier-2/3 UCBs <10%; among NBFCs, 27% report usage; ARCs: 0%. Typical production/POC use cases: customer support (15.6%), credit underwriting (13.7%), sales/marketing (11.8%), cybersecurity (10.6%). 35% favour the public cloud for scalability. Governance maturity is low: only ~1/3 have board-level oversight; ~1/4 have formal incident handling. On tooling and controls: SHAP/LIME 15%, audit logs 18%, bias validation 35% (mostly pre-deployment), periodic retraining 37%, drift monitoring 21%, real-time monitoring 14%. Barriers cited: talent gaps, costs/compute, data quality, and legal uncertainty.

What these numbers mean: India risks a two-speed AI economy where large banks move ahead and smaller UCBs/NBFCs lag—precisely why shared infra, clear guidance, and capacity building are central to FREE-AI.











How FREE-AI Interlocks with Existing RBI Rules

The report clarifies fitment with **outsourcing** (vendor Al still needs RE accountability, with Al-specific clauses), **IT/cybersecurity** (extend controls to models, data pipelines, access/audit trails), **digital lending** (auditable, explainable credit models; **data minimisation/consent**), and **consumer protection** (disclosures, grievance redress against Al outcomes). It also proposes model registers, lineage, and traceability to aid supervision.

Way Forward (Exam-Ready Pointers)

Priorities include: operationalising the Al Sandbox; issuing a board-policy template and incident reporting format; promoting multilingual inclusion models; scaling sector training (boards, risk, audit, tech); and enabling transparent, auditable Al with bias checks and human appeal routes. For low-risk use (e.g., FAQ chat), a proportional compliance path can accelerate adoption without diluting safety.

Online Gaming Bill 2025 Passed: E-Sports Encouraged, Real Money Gaming Banned

Lok Sabha passed the Promotion and Regulation of Online Gaming Bill, 2025, marking a transformative moment for India's digital entertainment landscape. The Bill aims to promote esports and online social games, while prohibiting harmful online money gaming platforms that have been linked to addiction, financial ruin, and even suicides. This legislation establishes a central regulatory framework to guide the development of the sector while protecting vulnerable users, particularly the youth.

Key Features of the Online Gaming Bill

Three Broad Categories

- The Bill divides online gaming into three major segments:
- E-sports, which are skill-based, competitive digital games played professionally.
- Online social games, played for recreation without monetary rewards.
- Online money games, involving stakes or deposits promising financial returns.

Encouragement and Regulation

- E-sports and social gaming are actively promoted, with the Bill calling for the creation of an Online Gaming Authority.
- The authority will provide policy coordination, regulatory oversight, and strategic development, including support for game developers and infrastructure building.

Strict Ban on Online Money Games

- A complete ban is placed on offering, operating, or facilitating real money online games, including games like Rummy, Poker, and other card-based gambling apps.
- These platforms often manipulate users with promises of easy money and are now associated with growing instances of suicide, financial distress, and fraud.

Penalties and Enforcement Mechanism

Criminal Liability

- Violation of the online money gaming provisions can result in up to three years imprisonment, a fine of ₹1 crore, or both
- Repeat offences will invite harsher penalties including three to five years' imprisonment and fines up to ₹2 crores.

National-Level Legal Framework

- The Bill establishes a uniform national framework, ending the legal ambiguity that previously allowed such platforms to proliferate.
- It empowers the central government to regulate and restrict online money games in the public interest and in alignment with national security objectives.

Why This Bill Was Necessary

Explosive Growth with Little Regulation

- The past decade of digital expansion has seen a surge in online gaming platforms, many offering real money-based games under the guise of skill gaming.
- The lack of a legal framework led to unregulated growth, creating psychological and financial harm for users.

Social Consequences

- 32 suicides in the last 31 months have been directly linked to financial losses in real money games.
- Families across the country have reported bankruptcy, debt, and mental health disorders due to these platforms.

Economic and Security Risks

 Investigations revealed the use of online money gaming platforms in money laundering and even terror financing, triggering national security alarms.

Government's Vision and Support

- Information Technology Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw emphasized that this Bill aligns with the vision of a Digital India that is safe, innovative, and responsible. He noted:
- The rise of start-ups in digital gaming must be supported with a robust regulatory environment.
- The Bill ensures that creativity and entrepreneurship in digital entertainment are encouraged without compromising public welfare.

Speaker's Endorsement

 Speaker Om Birla underlined the urgency of the law, highlighting public demands for action against online gaming abuse and urging cooperation from all parties to support this critical legislation.











List of Outcomes of PM Modi's Visit to Japan 2025

This vision will serve as a roadmap until 2035, steering joint efforts in strategic, economic, and social development.

Strengthening Defense and Security

India and Japan adopted a Joint Declaration on Security Cooperation, upgrading defense ties to address modern threats. The move strengthens the ongoing alignment under the Special Strategic and Global Partnership.

Additionally, defense collaboration will extend through the India-Japan Human Resource Exchange Plan, aiming to facilitate the movement of 500,000 personnel, including 50,000 skilled workers from India over the next five years.

Technological Collaboration and Digital Future

A defining outcome was the India-Japan Digital Partnership 2.0, backed by a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) that expands cooperation in,

- AI, semiconductors, IoT, and digital public infrastructure

During Prime Minister Narendra Modi's official visit to Japan (August 29–30, 2025) for the 15th Annual India-Japan Summit, both nations strengthened their Special Strategic and Global Partnership with a sweeping array of agreements in defense, trade, technology, and people-to-people cooperation. Hosted by Japanese Prime Minister Ishiba Shigeru, the summit marked a defining moment in bilateral relations.

A Decade of Strategic Growth

Both leaders reflected on the decade-long expansion of India-Japan ties, rooted in shared democratic values, civilizational bonds, and a common strategic outlook. With over 70 ongoing dialogue mechanisms, the relationship has evolved into one of Asia's most dynamic bilateral partnerships, encompassing areas from maritime security to clean technology.











Three Pillars of Cooperation: Defense, Economy, and Exchange The summit introduced three priority areas to shape cooperation over the next decade.

1. Defense and Security Cooperation

- Adoption of a Joint Declaration on Security Cooperation to elevate defense ties.
- Military exchanges and joint exercises like Veer Guardian, Tarang Shakti, and MILAN enhanced interoperability.
- Renewed commitment to joint defense technology development and maritime security.

2. Economic and Technological Partnership

- Launch of the India-Japan Economic Security Initiative focusing on critical goods, supply chain resilience, and cooperation in areas like semiconductors, telecom, and pharmaceuticals.
- Signing of a Memorandum on Critical Minerals, boosting industrial collaboration.
- Target set for ¥10 trillion Japanese private investment in India, doubling the previous goal.
- Upgradation of the India-Japan CEPA to foster more dynamic trade ties.

3. People-to-People and Talent Mobility

Educate Girls Wins 2025 Ramon Magsaysay Award

On August 31, 2025, Educate Girls, officially known as the Foundation to Educate Girls Globally, achieved a historic feat by becoming the first Indian organisation to win the Ramon Magsaysay Award, one of Asia's most prestigious honours. The award recognises the NGO's relentless efforts in transforming the educational landscape for out-of-school girls in India's remotest regions.

This year's other awardees include **Shaahina Ali** from the Maldives for her work in environmental conservation and **Flaviano Antonio L Villanueva** of the Philippines for supporting marginalised communities.

About Educate Girls: Vision and Achievements

Founded in **2007** by **Safeena Husain**, a graduate of the London School of Economics, Educate Girls was born out of a mission to tackle **female illiteracy** in India. Husain left her corporate career in San Francisco and returned to India with a single-minded focus: to bring every girl child into school.

Impact at Scale

Starting in the desert villages of Rajasthan, Educate Girls identified communities most resistant to girls' education. The NGO's grassroots model led to:

- Enrolment and retention of over 2 million girls
- Expansion to 30,000+ villages across India
- School retention rate exceeding 90%

Innovation: Development Impact Bond (DIB)

In **2015**, the NGO pioneered the **world's first Development Impact Bond in education**, linking investor funds to measurable educational outcomes. This model attracted global attention and catalysed scalable interventions in India's rural education sector.











Pragati: Empowering Young Women

Recognising the educational gap among adolescent girls and young women, Educate Girls launched **Pragati**, an open-schooling programme aimed at learners aged 15–29. Starting with 300 participants, the programme now supports **over 31,500 learners**, helping them resume education and access better life opportunities.

Why the Organisation Was Awarded

According to the Ramon Magsaysay Award Foundation (RMAF), Educate Girls was selected for its "commitment to addressing cultural stereotyping through the education of girls and young women, liberating them from the bondage of illiteracy and infusing them with skills, courage, and agency to achieve their full human potential."

This recognition reflects the power of grassroots movements and innovative education financing to enact long-lasting social change.

Understanding the Ramon Magsaysay Award

Origins and Prestige

Established in 1957 by the Rockefeller Brothers Fund and the Philippine government, the Ramon Magsaysay Award is often dubbed the "Asian Nobel Prize." It celebrates exemplary leadership, integrity, and public service.

Over the years, more than **300 individuals and organisations** across Asia have been honoured. Notable past Indian recipients include:

- Arvind Kejriwal (former Delhi CM, 2006)
- Ravish Kumar (journalist, 2019)
- Bezwada Wilson (activist, 2016)
- Sonam Wangchuk (environmentalist, 2018)

The Ceremony and Legacy

The award is formally presented each year on **November 7** at the **Metropolitan** Theatre in Manila, Philippines, and commemorates the birth of Ramon del Fierro Magsaysay, former President of the Philippines (born August 31, 1907). He was a WWII guerrilla leader, automobile mechanic, and a leader who rose from humble beginnings to become a symbol of people-centric governance.

His presidency was marked by anti-corruption reforms and a deep trust in the common citizen's dignity. His untimely death in a plane crash in **1957** gave rise to the award in his memory, celebrating "greatness of spirit" in public service.

Cabinet Approvals

The Union Cabinet approved four new components under the Central Sector Scheme of Special Development Packages (SDPs) for Assam and Tripura with an outlay of ₹4,250 crore, focusing on Adivasi villages (₹500 crore), Dimasa areas (₹500 crore), ULFA groups (₹3,000 crore) in Assam, and tribal development in Tripura (₹250 crore), aimed at peace, infrastructure, employment, and socioeconomic upliftment.

- The Cabinet approved the MERITE Scheme (Multidisciplinary Education and Research Improvement in Technical Education) with an outlay of ₹4,200 crore (2025-30), supported by a ₹2,100 crore World Bank loan, to improve technical education quality, equity, and governance across 275 institutions, benefitting 7.5 lakh students and strengthening research, innovation, and employability.
- The Cabinet sanctioned ₹30,000 crore compensation to Public Sector Oil Marketing Companies (IOCL, BPCL, HPCL) for domestic LPG under-recoveries, incurred due to high global LPG prices (2024-25), ensuring affordable LPG supply, financial stability of OMCs, and continued support for schemes like PM Ujjwala Yojana.
- The Cabinet approved targeted subsidy of ₹300 per 14.2 kg LPG cylinder (up to 9 refills per year) for PM Ujjwala Yojana (PMUY) consumers in FY 2025-26 with an outlay of ₹12,000 crore, benefiting 10.33 crore households, and improving LPG usage among poor households.
- The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CCEA) approved the construction of the 4-lane Marakkanam—Puducherry (NH-332A) stretch (46 km) on Hybrid Annuity Mode (HAM) with a cost of ₹2,157 crore, enhancing connectivity between Chennai, Puducherry, and Nagapattinam, boosting tourism, trade, and employment (18 lakh man-days).
- The Cabinet approved Lucknow Metro Rail Project Phase-1B (11.165 km, 12 stations) with an outlay of ₹5,801 crore, improving connectivity in Old Lucknow, linking commercial hubs, King George's Medical University, and heritage sites, reducing traffic congestion, cutting carbon emissions, and boosting economic growth and tourism.
- The Cabinet approved semiconductor manufacturing projects in Odisha, Punjab, and Andhra Pradesh worth ₹4,600 crore, including India's first commercial compound fab (SiCSem, Odisha), 3D advanced packaging unit (Odisha), ASIP facility (Andhra Pradesh), and CDIL expansion (Punjab), expected to generate 2,034 direct jobs and strengthen Atmanirbhar Bharat in electronics.
- The CCEA approved the 700 MW Tato-II Hydro Electric Project in Shi Yomi, Arunachal Pradesh with an outlay of ₹8,146.21 crore and 72 months completion time, producing 2,738 MU power annually, with benefits including 12% free power for the state, local area development fund, infrastructure upgrades, and employment generation.
- The CCEA sanctioned construction of a 6-lane Capital Region Ring Road (Bhubaneswar Bypass, 110.875 km, Odisha) under HAM mode at ₹8,307.74 crore, connecting Khordha, Bhubaneswar, Cuttack, integrating with NH-55, NH-57, NH-655, and generating over 1.67 crore man-days employment, boosting freight efficiency and regional growth.









- The Cabinet approved development of a Greenfield Airport at Kota-Bundi (Rajasthan) at ₹1,507 crore, with facilities including a 20,000 sqm terminal (2 MPPA capacity), 3,200m runway, and 7 aircraft bays, addressing traffic growth in Kota the coaching hub and industrial capital of Rajasthan, as the existing airport is inadequate.
- The Ministry of Civil Aviation also announced that the Kota-Bundi Greenfield Airport will support A-321 aircraft operations, ensuring better air connectivity for the education and industrial hub, with Rajasthan providing 440.06 hectares of land, making it a critical infrastructure project for the region.
- The Ministry of Road Transport & Highways reaffirmed the approval of the 6-lane Bhubaneswar Bypass (110.875 km, Odisha) at ₹8,307.74 crore, highlighting its role in decongesting Khordha, Bhubaneswar, and Cuttack, reducing logistics costs, linking to economic and social nodes, and creating large-scale employment opportunities.
- The Union Cabinet, chaired by PM Narendra Modi, approved India's bid to host the Commonwealth Games (CWG) 2030 in Ahmedabad, with the Gujarat Government to receive grant-in-aid if the bid is accepted. The city offers world-class stadiums, including the Narendra Modi Stadium which hosted the 2023 ICC Cricket World Cup Final, and is expected to welcome athletes from 72 countries, generating jobs, boosting tourism, and creating opportunities across sports, logistics, media, IT, and other sectors, while inspiring youth and fostering national pride.
- The Cabinet approved the restructuring and extension of the PM Street Vendor's AtmaNirbhar Nidhi (PM SVANidhi)
 Scheme till March 31, 2030, with an outlay of ₹7,332 crore to benefit 1.15 crore vendors including 50 lakh new ones. The scheme now offers higher loan amounts (₹15,000, ₹25,000, and ₹50,000), introduces UPI-linked RuPay Credit Cards, and provides digital cashback up to ₹1,600, while expanding to census and peri-urban areas, continuing its success since 2020 of disbursing ₹13,797 crore loans to 68 lakh vendors and promoting digital, financial, and entrepreneurial empowerment.
- The Cabinet cleared four railway projects worth ₹12,328 crore, including a new 145 km rail line in Kutch, Gujarat connecting the Rann of Kutch, Dholavira, Koteshwar, and Narayan Sarovar, along with multi-tracking projects: Secunderabad—Wadi (₹5,012 crore), Bhagalpur—Jamalpur (₹1,156 crore), and Furkating—New Tinsukia (₹3,634 crore). Together these projects will add 565 km of new tracks, benefit nearly 47 lakh people, generate 2.5 crore employment days, boost freight traffic by 68 MTPA, and reduce CO2 emissions, supporting the PM Gati Shakti Plan and enhancing logistics, tourism, and connectivity.

State-wise August Month Important Events

Andhra Pradesh

- The Andhra Pradesh government announced a ₹1 crore life insurance cover for regular municipal workers and ₹20 lakh for outsourced workers, with the same amounts assured in cases of permanent disability. Additionally, education support up to ₹8 lakh will be provided for their children. Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu made the announcement during the SwarnAndhra-SwachhAndhra campaign rally at Peddapuram, Kakinada district, emphasizing the government's commitment to workers' welfare and cleanliness.
- Andhra Pradesh's State Investment Promotion Board (SIPB)
 has approved 30 investment projects worth ₹53,922 crore,
 with the potential to generate 83,437 jobs; major approvals
 include HFCL, Apollo Tyres, and Dhirubhai Ambani Green
 Tech Park, as CM Chandrababu Naidu commits to
 personally monitoring project execution and boosting the
 state's ease of doing business and industrial growth.

Assam

• The Lok Sabha has passed the Indian Institutes of Management (Amendment) Bill, 2025, which seeks to establish a new IIM at Guwahati, Assam — a key educational hub in the North-Eastern region. Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan announced a financial grant of ₹550 crore for the institute, fulfilling a long-standing regional demand. He also highlighted that 21 IIMs currently operate in India and are gaining international recognition, with an IIM Dubai campus set to launch next month. The bill was passed without discussion due to opposition uproar over the SIR issue.

Bihar

• Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated and laid the foundation stone for development projects worth ₹12,000 crore in Gaya, Bihar on 22 August 2025, focusing on connectivity, energy, healthcare, urban development, and tourism. Major highlights include the Aunta-Simaria Bridge and Bakhtiyarpur-Mokama highway upgrade, the ₹6,880 crore Buxar Thermal Power Plant, the Homi Bhabha Cancer Hospital in Muzaffarpur, Namami Gange projects, and new Amrit Bharat Express and Buddhist Circuit Trains. Additionally, housing for over 16,000 PMAY beneficiaries was delivered.

Chhattisgarh

• In a landmark discovery, Deccan Gold Mining Limited found a significant Nickel–Copper–Platinum Group Elements (Ni–Cu–PGE) sulphide deposit in the Bhalukona–Jamnidih block, Chhattisgarh, marking a major step toward securing strategic minerals vital for India's clean energy and industrial future. This discovery, part of a growing critical mineral hub alongside the adjacent Vedanta block, supports the government's push for sustainable exploration and aims to boost India's position in the global strategic mineral supply chain.









Gujarat

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi launched and dedicated development projects worth over ₹5,400 crore in Gujarat, covering railways, roads, power, housing, and urban infrastructure. Key railway projects include doubling and gauge conversion of important rail lines to improve connectivity and freight movement. Modi flagged off new passenger and freight train services to boost local access and industrial logistics. Road projects like six-lane underpasses and overbridges aim to reduce congestion and support trade. Power initiatives under UGVCL focus on modernizing electricity distribution to enhance reliability.
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated green mobility initiatives in Hansalpur, Gujarat, launching Suzuki's first Made-in-India global Battery Electric Vehicle (e VITARA) for export to 100 countries, including Japan and Europe. He also announced the start of Hybrid Battery Electrode Manufacturing at the TDSG plant, a joint venture between Toshiba, Denso, and Suzuki, marking a major step toward Aatmanirbhar Bharat and Make in India.

Kerala

• Kerala's Onam celebrations began with the vibrant Athachamayam procession in Tripunithura, drawing thousands of spectators under sunny skies. The parade featured 59 traditional art forms like theyyam, kathakali, and pulikali, alongside floats on social themes, movie character imitations, and a stunning 60-feet Athapookkalam made with 1,500 kg of flowers. The event highlighted religious and communal harmony, with tight security, lively performances, and enthusiastic participation from artists, students, and tourists alike.

Maharashtra

- Mumbai is hosting the largest-ever 18th International Olympiad on Astronomy and Astrophysics, with around 300 students from 64 countries—including 12 first-time participants—competing in a 10-day event organized by the Homi Bhabha Centre for Science Education. The Olympiad promotes global friendship and learning in astronomy, featuring exams, team challenges, and sky observations, while welcoming war-affected nations and achieving a record number of women participants.
- Maharashtra has taken a significant step towards inclusive education by successfully implementing 'Disha Abhiyan', an initiative aimed at providing uniform and quality education for students with intellectual disabilities. Developed by the Jai Vakil Foundation and approved by the National Institute for the Empowerment of Persons with Intellectual Disabilities (NIEPID), this innovative curriculum is currently being implemented in 453 special schools across the state. Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis emphasized that Maharashtra is the first state in India to prioritize the needs of persons with disabilities through education.

Punjab

• Punjab is set to become the first state in India to formally empanel sign language interpreters, translators, and special educators under the Juvenile Justice Act, 2015 and the POCSO Act, 2012. This initiative will bridge communication gaps and strengthen access to justice and rights for children by supporting court proceedings with trained professionals. These experts will be deployed district-wise and compensated as per legal provisions, ensuring impartial and transparent outcomes. The state has already pioneered broadcasting Punjab Vidhan Sabha proceedings in sign language.

Rajasthan

The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, has approved the development of a Greenfield Airport at Kota-Bundi (Rajasthan) at an estimated cost of ₹1507 crore. The Airports Authority of India (AAI) will develop the airport on 440.06 hectares of land provided by the Government of Rajasthan, with facilities to support A-321 aircraft, a 20,000 sqm terminal, and capacity for 2 million passengers per annum (MPPA).

Sikkim

- Sikkim has made history as the first state in India to implement a Sabbatical Leave Scheme for government employees, offering 365 to 1,080 days of leave with 50% basic pay, while ensuring seniority and service continuity. The scheme covers both regular and temporary employees and now includes a decentralized approval system to speed up decisions, reflecting the state's commitment to progressive governance and employee empowerment.
- Sikkim Chief Minister Prem Singh Tamang launched the 'Nari Adalat' on the occasion of the first Amma Samman Diwas at Rongpo. This community-based forum is run by women to provide accessible, informal justice for minor disputes like family disagreements, domestic violence, and marital issues, especially in rural and semi-urban areas. The initiative aims to empower women by offering a supportive, non-intimidating environment that resolves conflicts locally without the need for formal court procedures.

Tamil Nadu

Tamil Nadu has unveiled its State Education Policy (SEP) as
a direct counter to the Centre's National Education Policy
(NEP), retaining the two-language system, rejecting public
exams in Classes 3, 5, and 8, and opposing common
entrance tests for UG admissions. Released by CM MK
Stalin, the SEP promotes science, AI, and English, urges
education to be moved back to the state list, and
emphasizes investment in public institutions.











Uttar Pradesh

• The Centre has approved the renaming of Uttar Pradesh's Jalalabad town to Parashurampuri, as announced by Union Minister Jitin Prasada. Locals viewed the old name as a symbol of "slavery" ("ghulami") and welcomed the change to reflect Sanatan traditions. The renaming is seen as part of a wider government effort to replace names associated with historical oppression. The official gazette notification for the change is expected soon.

West Bengal

• Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated and laid the foundation stone for multiple development projects worth over ₹5,200 crore in Kolkata, focusing on modern transport infrastructure and urban connectivity. Key highlights included the launch of 13.61 km of new metro lines, connecting areas like Noapara, Jai Hind Airport, Sealdah, and Hemanta Mukhopadhyay, as well as the foundation stone for the 6-lane elevated Kona Expressway. These developments aim to enhance the Ease of Living, port connectivity, and economic growth in West Bengal.

Jammu and Kashmir

• The Sawalkote Hydropower Project, a 2,185 MW run-ofthe-river plant on the Chenab River, is being revived by
NHPC and JKSPDC at a cost of ₹22,704 crore. As J&K's
largest hydroelectric project, it aims to generate 7,000
million units annually, making the region power-surplus
while also contributing to flood control. Its revival follows
India's decision to pause the Indus Waters Treaty, marking
a significant shift in regional water and energy policy.

Delhi

- The Delhi Legislative Assembly has become the first in India to run entirely on solar power after commissioning a 500-kilowatt rooftop solar plant, cutting electricity costs by about Rs 1.75 crore annually. Alongside this, it launched the National e-Vidhan Application (NeVA) under the Centre's "One Nation, One Application" initiative, marking a shift to paperless, digital legislative functioning. These steps reflect Delhi's move towards sustainable governance and digital transformation, with surplus power generation potential and advanced smart legislative tools set to be fully operational from the upcoming Monsoon Session.
- Delhi's economy has shown robust growth over the past decade, with an annual GSDP growth rate of 5.8% and a 7% increase in per capita income. While Delhi's contribution to India's GDP slightly declined from 3.94% in 2011-12 to 3.79% in 2024-25, the overall economic activity has rebounded beyond pre-pandemic levels. Delhi's per capita income in 2024-25 is Rs 4,93,024, which is 2.4 times higher than the national average, reflecting strong economic performance and recovery.

Delhi Chief Minister Rekha Gupta flagged off the 'U-Special' buses for college students, reviving the service after years of inactivity. The initiative, aimed at improving connectivity between homes and Delhi University, features electric, airconditioned buses equipped with CCTV cameras and panic buttons to ensure student safety. Gupta highlighted the scheme's role in boosting the university's vibrancy and promoting cleaner air in Delhi's transport.

PM Modi Receives Trinidad and Tobago's Highest Civilian Award

On July 4, 2025, Prime Minister Narendra Modi was honoured with the Order of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago, the country's highest civilian award. The ceremony took place during his two-day visit to the Caribbean nation. This award was given for his global leadership and strong connection with the Indian diaspora. It is an important moment in strengthening India's ties with Trinidad and Tobago.

A Historic First Visit

This is PM Modi's first official visit to Trinidad and Tobago as Prime Minister. It is also the first Indian Prime Ministerial-level visit to the country since 1999. The visit is part of Mr. Modi's fivenation tour, and it highlights the long-standing bond between India and the island nation.

India and Trinidad & Tobago Sign Six New Agreements to Boost Ties

On July 4, 2025, India and Trinidad & Tobago signed six key agreements in Port of Spain to improve their partnership in many areas. These include work in infrastructure, medicine, culture, and sports. The deals were signed during Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to the country. This visit is seen as a big step toward building stronger ties between the two nations.

First Prime Ministerial Visit in Over 25 Years

- 5. Diplomatic training
- 6. Sharing of official documents and research

The aim of these agreements is to create more jobs, better services, and stronger people-to-people connections between India and Trinidad & Tobago.

PM Modi also announced that people of Indian origin living in Trinidad & Tobago can now apply for OCI (Overseas Citizenship of India) cards, even if they are from the sixth generation. This will help families stay connected with their roots in India.











Meetings with National Leaders

PM Modi also met President Christine Carla Kangaloo, who recently received the Pravasi Bharatiya Samman Award for her service to the Indian community. Their meeting was friendly and respectful. PM Modi praised her for her public service and leadership. Both leaders also agreed to work together on issues that affect the Global South, such as climate problems and fair international cooperation.

PM Modi also thanked Trinidad & Tobago for its support to India after the Pahalgam terror attack and said both countries stand united against terrorism.

Modi Receives Top Honour in Namibia

During his visit to Namibia on Wednesday, PM Modi was honoured with the country's top civilian award – The Order of the Most Ancient Welwitschia Mirabilis. The ceremony took place in the capital and was led by Namibia's President Netumbo Nandi-Ndaitwah. The award is named after a rare desert plant found only in Namibia, which stands for strength, long life, and resilience.

Modi is the first Indian leader to receive this special award. In his acceptance speech, he said, "I accept this honour with deep gratitude and dedicate it to the 1.4 billion people of India and the strong friendship between India and Namibia."

Meaning and History of the Award

The Welwitschia Mirabilis Award was started in 1995. It is given to people who show great leadership and work to build strong ties between nations. The plant it is named after survives in the desert for many years, which is why it is used as a symbol of endurance and unity.

This is PM Modi's 27th international award and the fourth during his current five-nation trip. Interestingly, it is also his second award within 24 hours, showing the global appreciation he is receiving on this tour.

This honour marks a new milestone in the bond between India and Namibia. India and Namibia have worked together in areas like education, healthcare, defence, and technology. By conferring this honour upon Prime Minister Modi, Brazil has acknowledged his efforts in enhancing **India-Brazil strategic** partnership, as well as his role in advancing cooperation through international platforms like BRICS, G20, and the United Nations.

India's Maratha Forts Added to UNESCO World Heritage List

Maratha Military Landscapes of India were added to the UNESCO World Heritage List during the 47th session of the World Heritage Committee in Paris. This important recognition covers 12 historic forts built by the Maratha rulers between the 17th and 19th centuries. The listing highlights their unique military design and the rich history of India's fort architecture.

What Is the Maratha Military Landscapes?

The Maratha Military Landscapes are a group of 12 forts that show the smart planning and strength of the Maratha Empire. These forts were built across different terrains — hills, coasts, and plains — to protect the kingdom and control trade routes. They include Salher Fort, Shivneri Fort, Lohgad, Khanderi Fort, Raigad, Rajgad, Pratapgad, Suvarnadurg, Panhala Fort, Vijay Durg, Sindhudurg (all in Maharashtra) and Gingee Fort in Tamil Nadu.

These forts were known for their clever use of nature, water storage systems, and strong walls. Built mostly between the 1600s and 1800s, they show how Marathas used military skills to build powerful defense structures.

UNESCO's Decision and the Committee Meeting

The UNESCO World Heritage Committee took this decision during its 47th session in Paris. On X (formerly Twitter), UNESCO posted:

"New inscription on the @UNESCO #WorldHeritage List: Maratha Military Landscapes of India, #India."

This nomination was part of the 2024–25 UNESCO World Heritage cycle, and Indian officials had worked hard to present the historical and cultural importance of these forts to the world. The recognition gives international importance to India's fort heritage and adds value to future conservation efforts.

India's Pride and Historical Significance

The Maratha forts were not just buildings — they were symbols of resistance, planning, and unity. Leaders like Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj used them to build and protect the Maratha Empire. Some of these forts, like Raigad and Pratapgad, are especially famous in Indian history.

For example, Pratapgad Fort, located about 22 km from Mahabaleshwar, played a key role in many battles and still stands strong today.

Indian historians, heritage experts, and government officials have welcomed this decision, saying it will help promote tourism, boost local pride, and ensure better care of these monuments.

PM Modi Honored With 'Key to the City of Buenos Aires'

On July 6, 2025, Prime Minister Narendra Modi was honoured with the 'Key to the City of Buenos Aires' during his official two-day visit to Argentina. This symbolic award was given in recognition of his efforts to strengthen the relationship between India and Argentina. The visit was historic, as it was the first by an Indian Prime Minister in 57 years.

Symbolic Honour for PM Modi

PM Modi was presented with the 'Key to the City' by Jorge Macri, the Chief of the City Government of Buenos Aires. This is a ceremonial gesture of trust and friendship. Argentina will supply lithium and shale gas to help India's energy needs. Modi also requested easier entry for Indian medicines into Argentina. Union Government Notifies Transfer & Repatriation of 18 High Court Judges

To maintain the balance, efficiency, and impartiality of the judiciary in India, the Union Government on July 14, 2025, issued official orders transferring and repatriating 18 High Court judges across various states. This development follows recommendations made by the Supreme Court Collegium on May 26, 2025. These strategic appointments aim to enhance judicial functioning, promote uniformity in case disposal, and address regional imbalances in judicial staffing.

Background

The transfer and repatriation of High Court judges in India are governed by Article 222 of the Constitution, which empowers the President to transfer a judge from one High Court to another after consultation with the Chief Justice of India (CJI). The Supreme Court Collegium, headed by the CJI, plays a crucial role in suggesting such movements. The current transfer notifications are part of this long-standing administrative mechanism and reflect an effort to uphold the independence and integrity of the judiciary by rotating judges across states.











Significance of the Transfers

These judicial reshuffles are not merely administrative—they serve multiple significant purposes,

- Impartiality: By relocating judges to states other than their parent High Courts, potential local pressures and regional biases are minimized.
- Efficiency: High Courts with a heavier caseload can benefit from additional or experienced judges from other jurisdictions.
- Expertise Sharing: Transferred judges bring their diverse legal experience and judicial perspectives to the host High Court, enriching its jurisprudence.
- National Integration: These transfers foster a pan-Indian judicial culture, ensuring that judges are familiar with diverse legal interpretations across the country.

- India's average tariffs on UK goods will drop from 15% to 3%.
- Key beneficiary sectors in India: textiles, leather, footwear, marine products, engineering goods, gems and jewellery, auto parts, and organic chemicals.
- UK products like medical equipment and aerospace parts will become more affordable in India.

- Technology Security Initiative
- Climate Change Action
- Educational Collaborations

- £25.5 billion boost to bilateral trade annually.
- Thousands of new jobs expected in both countries.
- British companies such as Airbus and Rolls-Royce will begin aircraft deliveries to Indian airlines.
- Enhanced intelligence sharing and cooperation on fraud, crime, and migration issues.
- Both nations condemned terrorism and extremism, affirming shared values of security and democracy.











UK-India FTA Signed: Who Wins, What's Cheaper, and How It Impacts You!

The recently signed India-UK Free Trade Agreement (FTA) on 24 July 2025 marks a transformative moment in bilateral economic ties. With this deal, tariffs on a wide range of products will be reduced or eliminated, making numerous imported goods cheaper for Indian consumers, while simultaneously boosting Indian exports. Key items such as Scotch whisky, British luxury cars, chocolates, and cosmetics will see significant price drops over time. The agreement is expected to benefit both nations' consumers, industries, and employment landscape.

Background

Negotiations for the FTA began in January 2022, and after over three years of talks and several rounds of diplomacy, it was officially signed during PM Narendra Modi's visit to the UK in July 2025. This FTA is being hailed as India's most comprehensive trade pact and the UK's most important bilateral trade deal post-Brexit.

Significance of the Agreement

- It eliminates duties on 99% of Indian exports to the UK.
- For Indians, high-end imports like whisky, cars, chocolates, and medical devices will become more accessible.
- The agreement is forecasted to boost UK's GDP by £4.8 billion (\$6.5 billion) annually.
- Aims to double Indian exports to the UK by 2030.

Objectives

- Promote affordable and wider access to goods and services.
- Encourage investment and innovation.
- Support MSMEs and exporters in both nations.
- Facilitate temporary movement of skilled professionals.
- Reduce non-tariff barriers and improve market access.

What Will Become Cheaper for Indians?

1. Scotch Whisky & Gin

- Tariffs on Scotch whisky and gin will be reduced from 150% to 75% initially, and to 40% over the next 10 years.
- Major boost for premium liquor brands like Diageo.

2. British Luxury Cars

- Import duties on UK-made cars, currently above 100%, will reduce to 10% under a quota-based system.
- This benefits carmakers like Jaguar Land Rover and Aston Martin.

3. Chocolates, Biscuits & Salmon

Lower duties on British-made chocolates, biscuits, and salmon, bringing them to supermarket shelves at better prices.

Cosmetics & Personal Care

Reduced tariffs on cosmetics and skincare products, especially from leading British brands.

Medical Devices

Easier access to UK-manufactured medical devices and diagnostic equipment at reduced costs.

Who Benefits in India?

1. Textile & Leather Exporters

Removal of UK duties (up to 12%) on garments, home textiles, and leather goods will boost exports and create jobs.

2. Gems & Jewellery Sector

Zero tariffs on gold, diamonds, and jewellery will benefit Indian exporters and promote Indian craftsmanship.

3. Agro, Pharma & Processed Foods

- Sectors like rice, spices, shrimp, tea, and processed food will see tariff reductions.
- Indian pharma companies gain easier entry into the UK market.

Electric & Hybrid Vehicles

- Preferential access for EV and hybrid vehicle makers under a quota system.
- Companies like Tata Motors, Mahindra Electric, and Bharat Forge stand to gain.

- UK will streamline visa and work permits for Indian professionals including chefs, yoga instructors, musicians, and more.
- Social security exemption for Indian workers in the UK for up to 3 years, saving approx. ₹4,000 crore annually.

Cabinet Approvals

- The Union Cabinet chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi has approved the National Sports Policy (NSP) 2025, replacing the 2001 policy to transform India into a global sporting powerhouse with a vision toward the 2036 Olympic Games. The policy is based on five pillars -Excellence on the Global Stage, Sports for Economic Development, Sports for Social Development, Sports as a People's Movement, and Integration with Education (NEP 2020) – and focuses on grassroots to elite training, sports science & technology, sports tourism, indigenous games, mass participation, and school-level sports integration. A strategic framework with KPIs, PPP models, and a national monitoring system will guide implementation, serving as a model for States and UTs.
- The Cabinet has approved the Research Development and Innovation (RDI) Scheme with a ₹1 lakh crore corpus to promote private sector investment in sunrise and strategic sectors. Managed by the Anusandhan National Research Foundation (ANRF), the scheme offers long-term concessional loans, equity support, and a Deep-Tech Fund of Funds to boost R&D, technology acquisition, and commercialisation of innovations. It aims to enhance global competitiveness, self-reliance, and adoption of emerging technologies, with governance oversight by the Prime Minister-led ANRF Board and implementation by the Department of Science & Technology.











- The Cabinet has cleared the Employment Linked Incentive **(ELI) Scheme** with an outlay of ₹99,446 crore to create over 3.5 crore jobs in two years (Aug 2025 – Jul 2027), focusing on the manufacturing sector and first-time employees. Under Part A, first-time employees will get one month's wage up to ₹15,000 in two instalments, while under Part B, employers will receive ₹1,000–₹3,000 per month for each additional employee maintained for at least six months (extended to four years for manufacturing). All payments will be via **Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT)**, aiming to **formalise** the workforce, boost job creation, and strengthen social security coverage.
- The Union Cabinet has approved the construction of a 4lane Paramakudi-Ramanathapuram Section of NH-87 in Tamil Nadu at a cost of ₹1,853 crore under the Hybrid Annuity Mode (HAM). Covering 46.7 km, this project will decongest the existing 2-lane highway, improve traffic safety, and connect major routes such as NH-38, NH-85, NH-**36, NH-536, NH-32** and **SH-47, SH-29, SH-34**. It will enhance multi-modal connectivity Madurai to Rameshwaram & Pamban ports, and key towns like Paramakudi, Ramanathapuram, Rameshwaram. The project is expected to boost regional economic growth, promote tourism to Rameshwaram and Dhanushkodi, and generate around 8.4 lakh person-days of direct and 10.45 lakh person-days of indirect employment.
- The Union Cabinet has approved the Prime Minister Dhan-Dhaanya Krishi Yojana for six years (2025-31), targeting 100 districts to boost agriculture and allied sectors. The scheme, inspired by NITI Aayog's Aspirational District Programme, focuses on crop diversification, sustainable farming, better irrigation, enhanced post-harvest storage, and improved credit access. It will be implemented through the convergence of 36 schemes across 11 departments, in partnership with state governments and the private sector. Districts will be selected based on low productivity, low cropping intensity, and low credit disbursement, with a minimum of **one district per state**. Monitoring will be done using **117 performance indicators** via a digital dashboard. The scheme aims to increase agricultural productivity, create local livelihoods, promote organic and natural farming, and contribute to self-reliance (Atmanirbhar Bharat).
- The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs has granted NLC India Limited (NLCIL) a special exemption from investment limits applicable to Navratna CPSEs, allowing it to invest ₹7,000 crore in its subsidiary NLC India Renewables Limited (NIRL) for renewable energy projects without prior approvals. This supports NLCIL's goal to develop 10.11 GW of renewable energy capacity by 2030 and 32 GW by 2047, aligning with India's COP26 commitments to achieve Net Zero emissions by 2070. The move will accelerate India's shift to clean energy, reduce **coal imports**, ensure **24x7 power supply**, and strengthen its position as a green energy leader. Currently, NLCIL operates **2 GW** of renewable capacity, which will be transferred to

- NIRL. This investment will also generate significant direct indirect employment, supporting and sustainable economic growth and climate action goals.
- **Cabinet Approves Enhanced Delegation of Power to NTPC** for Renewable Energy Expansion - The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi has approved an enhanced delegation of investment powers to NTPC Limited from the earlier limit of ₹7,500 crore to ₹20,000 crore for its subsidiary NTPC Green Energy Limited (NGEL) to invest in NTPC Renewable Energy Limited (NREL) and other joint ventures/subsidiaries. This will accelerate renewable energy (RE) capacity addition towards NTPC's target of 60 GW RE capacity by 2032, helping India move towards its 500 GW non-fossil fuel capacity goal by 2030 and Net Zero by 2070. The initiative will strengthen power infrastructure, ensure 24×7 reliable electricity access, and create employment opportunities during both construction and operation & maintenance local suppliers, MSMEs, stages, benefiting entrepreneurs. NGEL currently holds a portfolio of around 32 GW RE capacity including 6 GW operational, 17 GW contracted/awarded, and 9 GW pipeline projects.
- Cabinet Approves 'Pradhan Mantri Dhan-Dhanya Krishi Yojana' – The Union Cabinet has approved the Pradhan Mantri Dhan-Dhanya Krishi Yojana aimed at improving agricultural productivity in low-yield districts by converging schemes from 11 central departments, state governments, and other partners. Around 100 districts will be identified, with at least one district from each state, focusing on those with low productivity or limited use of Agri Credit Cards (ACC). Each district will have a nodal officer, and NITI Aayog will track progress via a dashboard. The campaign will launch in Rabi season (October 2025) and will involve district-level committees led by Gram Panchayats/District Collectors, with state- and central-level teams ensuring effective scheme convergence. The focus will be on crops, fruit cultivation, fisheries, beekeeping, animal husbandry, and agroforestry with the goal of raising productivity to national or top-level benchmarks while promoting socioeconomic development in rural areas.

Parliament News

State-wise July Month Important Events

Andhra Pradesh

BITS Pilani will set up India's first 'AI Plus Campus' in Amaravati, Andhra Pradesh, announced on July 14, 2025. The project will cost Rs 1,000 crore, and admissions will begin in 2027. The new campus will teach AI, Data Science, Robotics, and more, with a focus on green energy and global exposure. CM Chandrababu Naidu and BITS Chancellor Kumar Mangalam Birla praised the project, calling it a key step in advanced education. The campus design will blend heritage and modern features, while **Project Vistar** will further expand BITS' existing campuses.











• The Machilipatnam Greenfield Port in Andhra Pradesh is under fast construction, with 48% work completed and plans to start operations by the end of 2026. Built by MEIL, the port will boost exports and jobs in the region. The ₹5,155 crore project has faced delays since 2007 but is now back on track under the Machilipatnam Port Development Corporation Ltd. Both Andhra Pradesh and Telangana are investing in related infrastructure, like dry ports and freight corridors. Locals are hopeful about better land prices and employment. The port is expected to handle 36 million tonnes of cargo every year and support large ships, becoming a key trade hub on the east coast.

Assam

• CM Himanta Biswa Sarma inaugurated India's first Aqua Tech Park in Sonapur, near Guwahati, Assam. Developed by Kolong Kopili NGO with support from NABARD, ICAR-CIFA, and others, the park features new technologies like biofloc, aquaponics, and ornamental fish breeding. The park aims to empower fish farmers, boost production, and create jobs. Assam has already doubled its fish output between 2019 and 2024 and is now the fourth-largest fish producer in India. The government has also launched 10 fishery clusters worth ₹8 crore to support this growth.

Bihar

- The Bihar Cabinet, chaired by CM Nitish Kumar, approved major schemes including the Mukhya Mantri Pratigya Yojana for internship support, offering up to ₹6,000/month, and the Kalakar Pension Yojana granting ₹3,000/month to senior artists. Additionally, ₹882.87 crore was sanctioned for the integrated development of the Punaura Dham temple in Sitamarhi. The Cabinet also amended the Bihar Factory Rules to enable women's participation in hazardous industries. These moves aim to boost employment, support cultural heritage, and enhance religious tourism ahead of the 2025 Assembly elections.
- On July 8, 2025, the Nitish Kumar-led Bihar government approved a significant policy shift, granting 35% reservation in government jobs exclusively for women domiciled in Bihar. Earlier available to all women, the new domicile-based policy—proposed by the General Administration Department (GAD)—restricts this horizontal reservation to native women only, across all state government cadres. Women from other states will now be considered under the general category, aiming to empower local women and boost their participation in governance and administration.
- Bihar CM Nitish Kumar has announced free electricity for domestic users up to 125 units/month, effective August 1, 2025, benefiting 16.7 million families. Under the Kutir Jyoti scheme, the state will install solar panels for poor households, aiming for 10,000 MW solar capacity in 3 years. The move offers economic relief, boosts clean energy, and aligns with inclusive governance and poll strategy.
- PM Modi inaugurated ₹7,200 crore worth of infrastructure projects in Motihari, Bihar, under the Viksit Bharat Mission.
 These developments aim to make Bihar a growth hub,

ensure **urban parity**, and provide **housing and infrastructure support**. The move highlights **increased central funding**, **NDA-led development focus**, and Bihar's inclusion in India's long-term growth vision.

Gujarat

- Gujarat Chief Minister Bhupendra Patel launched the Jan Suraksha Santrupti Abhiyan to expand the reach of key government welfare schemes such as PMJJBY, PMSBY, APY, and Jan Dhan Yojana. Running from July 1 to September 30, 2025, the campaign targets 100% coverage of eligible individuals, with added focus on KYC updates, digital fraud awareness, and financial inclusion. With 1.93 crore Jan Dhan accounts and over ₹21,000 crore disbursed in Gujarat alone, the campaign underscores a robust effort to ensure equity in public service delivery, making it a cornerstone in India's social welfare architecture.
- Gujarat has become the third state in India, after Maharashtra and Uttar Pradesh, to cross one crore stock market investors, as per NSE data. Together, these states account for 36% of India's investor base, showing rising financial participation. As of May 2025, India has nearly 11.5 crore investors, with 11 lakh new additions in May alone, reflecting renewed growth after a slowdown. North India leads regionally with 4.2 crore investors, followed by West, South, and East India.
- Gujarat has become the first state in India to officially align with the Cruise Bharat Mission, launched on September 30, 2024, by Union Minister Sarbananda Sonowal. The mission aims to boost cruise tourism tenfold by 2029. Gujarat plans to create multiple coastal cruise circuits, linking destinations like Diu, Porbandar, Dwarka, and Padala Island. This move not only supports India's tourism goals but also helps develop Gujarat's maritime economy.

Goa

Goa launched India's first RoRo ferry service on the Mandovi River, with two high-tech ferries, Gangotri and Dwarka. These vessels, built by Vijai Marine Shipyards, cut travel time between Chorao and Ribandar to just 12–13 minutes and can carry passengers and vehicles. Launched by CM Pramod Sawant, the project comes at no cost to the government and promises to improve water transport and support tourism and local travel. The ferries have modern features like AC cabins, vehicle lanes, and emergency kits, offering a safe and fast journey for all.

Himachal Pradesh

Himachal Pradesh has launched India's first Aadhaar-based
Face Authentication (FaceAuth) system for ration
distribution under the Public Distribution System (PDS) in
July 2025. The system uses a smartphone camera to verify a
person's face instead of OTP or fingerprints. This new
method, led by the Department of Digital Technologies and
Governance (DDTG) and supported by Gokul Butail, aims to
fix past issues and ensure smoother and faster service.
Himachal's initiative marks a big move toward digital and
inclusive governance.











• Himachal Pradesh government, led by CM Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu, launched the 'My Deed' NGDRS (National Generic Document Registration System) pilot project to digitize land registration and promote paperless, presence-less, and cashless governance. The system allows citizens to apply for land registration online, requiring only a single visit to the tehsil office. Initially rolled out in 10 tehsils across 10 districts, the project is supported by complementary digital revenue reforms, including a new Jamabandi format in Hindi, e-Roznamcha Vakyati (digital diary), and Kaarguzari (online attendance).

Jharkhand

 Jharkhand will soon launch India's first Mining Tourism Project, with support from Central Coalfields Limited (CCL) and oversight by Jharkhand Tourism Development Corporation (JTDC). The pilot phase includes tours to the North Urimari (Birsa) coal mine via two routes—Rajrappa and Patratu—covering mines, temples, and valleys. The initiative aims to promote alternative tourism, create employment, and preserve industrial heritage, with further plans for Eco-Mining Circuits and a Religious Circuit.

Karnataka

- The Karnataka Cabinet has decided to rename Bengaluru City University after former Prime Minister Dr. Manmohan Singh, acknowledging his significant role in the city's infrastructure development. From laying foundations for the Bengaluru Metro and Elevated Highway to inaugurating the Kempegowda International Airport, Singh's contributions to the city are deeply embedded in its progress.
- Union Minister Nitin Gadkari inaugurated the 2.44 km long Sigandur bridge in Shivamogga, Karnataka, built over the Sharavathi backwaters at a cost of over ₹470 crore. Named after Goddess Chowdeshwari Devi, the bridge connects Sagara and Marakutika, restoring links lost due to the Linganamakki dam. Gadkari also highlighted that National Highway length in Karnataka has increased significantly, with major upcoming road projects worth ₹5 lakh crore.
- In Swachh Survekshan 2024–25, Bengaluru rose to 36th among Million-Plus Cities, improving from last year's 125th, but lagged in toilet cleanliness and landfill remediation. Mysuru, meanwhile, made headlines by joining the Super Swachh League, highlighting its long-term cleanliness, community participation, and sanitation excellence. These outcomes reflect Karnataka's progress and gaps in implementing effective urban waste management, public hygiene, and the overarching goals of Swachh Bharat Mission-Urban.

Kerala

Kerala's first skin bank is opening on July 15, 2025, at the Thiruvananthapuram Government Medical College Hospital. The facility, approved by K-SOTTO and costing Rs 6.75 crore, will collect donated skin to treat burn victims. Health Minister Veena George also announced future plans to open a similar bank in Kottayam. Burn centres and plastic surgery units have already been launched in Alappuzha, Kollam, and Kannur. This new step will improve burn care services and provide relief to patients across Kerala.

- Arthunkal Police Station in Alappuzha, Kerala, became the first police station in India to receive the IS/ISO 9001:2015
 Quality Management System certification from the Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS). The award acknowledges the station's excellent service in crime control, law and order, public response, and grievance redressal. The certification is part of the Modernised Cherthala Police Programme, led by ASP Harish Jain, which aims to upgrade policing standards. Senior police officers, including State Police Chief Ravada Azad Chandrashekhar, attended the event, highlighting the importance of quality standards in public safety.
- The ambrosia beetle (Euplatypus parallelus), first reported in India in 2012, is now threatening Kerala's rubber plantations. It carries Fusarium fungi, which degrade wood and reduce latex yield. Symptoms include leaf fall, trunk drying, and latex loss. Current control methods—like traps and antifungals—have limited success. The pest also endangers other broadleaf crops like cashew, teak, and coconut. Experts recommend localized strategies, use of antagonistic fungi, and policy-level intervention for sustainable management.

Maharashtra

- Mumbai's Carnac Bridge, originally built in 1868, has been rebuilt and renamed as Sindoor Bridge to honour Operation Sindoor, a military strike on terror camps in Pakistan. The new name also reflects an effort to erase the colonial legacy of Governor Carnac, who was linked to atrocities against Indians. The new 328-metre-long bridge, inaugurated on July 10, 2025, by Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis, will improve traffic in South Mumbai.
- Maharashtra has become the first Indian state to grant agricultural status to livestock and poultry farming, allowing over 37 million farmers to access subsidised electricity, agricultural credit, tax relief, and solar equipment subsidies. This decision will benefit the poultry, dairy, fisheries, and small ruminant sectors, potentially adding over ₹7,000 crore annually to the rural economy, while aligning with national goals for scientific livestock development.
- Maharashtra has unveiled Vidarbha's first integrated steel
 plant by LMEL in Gadchiroli, featuring a 4.5 MnTPA steel
 facility, a 5 MnTPA iron ore grinding plant, and the state's
 inaugural 10 MnTPA slurry pipeline. This initiative promises
 major advancements in industrial growth, green logistics,
 job generation, and puts Vidarbha on the map as a rising
 manufacturing and infrastructure hub in India.
- The launch of the Indian Institute of Creative Technology (IICT) in Mumbai by Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw and Maharashtra CM Devendra Fadnavis signals a transformative shift in India's creative tech economy. The institute will provide industry-aligned education in VFX, XR, animation, and gaming, in partnership with global leaders like Google, Meta, Microsoft, and Apple. Aimed at nurturing skilled professionals, IICT is expected to catalyze growth in the AVGC-XR sector, positioning India as a global digital content hub.











Madhya Pradesh

- The **Central Government** has announced that a new Akashvani Kendra will be set up in Ujjain, Madhya Pradesh, under the BIND scheme. The decision was made during a meeting on July 8, 2025, between Union Minister L. Murugan and Chief Minister Mohan Yadav. The goal is to improve regional broadcasting, reach more people with reliable information, and boost media infrastructure in the state. Akashvani Ujjain will help share news, education, culture, and government messages more effectively with the public.
- The Madhya Pradesh government has introduced a new monthly stipend scheme offering ₹6,000 to unemployed women and ₹5,000 to men, tied to internships in registered industries. It builds upon the Ladli Behna Yojana, aims to enhance skill development, and supports local job creation via industrial expansion in areas like Acharpura. Over 1,600 jobs are expected initially. This initiative blends social welfare with industrial growth, with a focus on gender inclusion. economic self-reliance, and vouth empowerment.

Odisha

Puri will become the sixth municipal corporation in Odisha, as announced by Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi on July 5, 2025, ahead of the Bahuda Yatra. The decision is aimed at providing better services in the city, which welcomes lakhs of visitors every year. Areas around Puri city will be added to the corporation, and the government has also planned a Jagannath Museum, Library, and Research **Centre** to promote **Odia culture**. This move supports the state's vision to make Puri a major tourist and spiritual centre by 2036.

Tamil Nadu

- The Union Cabinet's approval of the ₹1,853 crore project to upgrade the Paramakudi-Ramanathapuram road in Tamil Nadu marks a significant step toward infrastructure modernization. Developed under the Hybrid Annuity Mode (HAM), the project will convert 46.7 km of NH-87 into a four-lane corridor, improving connectivity between key towns and religious destinations like Rameshwaram. This initiative is expected to decongest traffic, boost tourism, enhance road safety, and generate over 18 lakh employment person-days, making it a cornerstone for regional development and economic integration in the state.
- The **PM MITRA Textile Park** in **Virudhunagar**, Tamil Nadu, is a landmark initiative under India's textile growth strategy. With a ₹1,900 crore investment from the Central Government, this 1,052-acre facility will offer advanced infrastructure, including ZLD effluent treatment, worker dormitories, and industrial workspaces. Expected to attract ₹10,000 crore in private investments and generate over one lakh jobs by 2026, the park will significantly enhance exportoriented and sustainable textile manufacturing in the region.

- Gingee Fort, located in Villupuram district of Tamil Nadu, was declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site on July 11, 2025, as part of the Maratha Military Landscapes. The decision was made during the 47th session of the World Heritage Committee in Paris. Known as the "Troy of the East", the fort stands out for its unique architecture, strong military design, and deep historical roots. The recognition brings global attention, expected tourism boost, and preservation support to one of India's iconic heritage sites.
- The Tamil Nadu government has approved a Centre of Excellence for Hornbill Conservation at the Anamalai Tiger Reserve with ₹1 crore funding from the Endangered Species Conservation Corpus Fund. The project targets four hornbill species and includes population monitoring, habitat restoration, community-based nest adoption, and collaborative research. It also introduces citizen science tools and educational support to promote conservation awareness. This initiative addresses key issues like habitat loss, climate change, and biodiversity decline in the Western Ghats.

Uttarakhand

Uttarakhand Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami announced the launch of 'Operation Kalanemi', a police campaign to catch fake saints and religious impersonators in the state. The operation is named after Kalanemi, a demon from Hindu mythology who disguised himself as a saint to mislead others. Dhami said these individuals cheat people, especially women, and harm the image of Sanatana Dharma.

Uttar Pradesh

- President of India, Smt. Droupadi Murmu, visited Gorakhpur, Uttar Pradesh, to inaugurate and lay foundation stones for several major projects at Mahayogi Gorakhnath University. She opened a new Auditorium, Academic Block, and Panchkarma Kendra, and laid the foundation stone for a Girls' Hostel, aimed at boosting women's education. Praising the University's efforts to integrate modern Allopathy and traditional Ayurveda, she highlighted its role in holistic medical education.
- The 75th Pradhan Mantri Divyasha Kendra (PMDK) will be inaugurated on July 15, 2025, at Badaun, Uttar Pradesh, by Union Minister Shri B.L. Verma. This centre will help persons with disabilities and senior citizens by giving them free aids like wheelchairs, tricycles, and hearing aids under the ADIP Scheme and Rashtriya Vayoshri Yojana (RVY). With this new centre, 75 PMDKs are now working across India, having already supported over 1.40 lakh people. This move shows the government's strong focus on inclusive growth and last-mile service delivery.











Union Territories

- The Government of India is poised to transform Jammu and Kashmir's fisheries and livestock sectors with a proposed ₹100-crore Integrated Aqua Park under PMMSY Phase-II. Union Minister Rajiv Ranjan Singh also inaugurated a 50,000-litre UHT Milk Plant in Jammu, underscoring the focus on rural income generation, cold-water aquaculture, and dairy productivity. The region has seen 800% growth in trout production and substantial increases in milk output, aided by strategic investments and seed imports from Denmark.
- The Delhi Transport Corporation (DTC) will soon replace its pink ticket system with a new 'Saheli Smart Card' for free bus travel. Only women and transgender persons living in Delhi will be able to get the card, using Aadhaar and address proof. The card aims to stop misuse, ensure the benefit goes to the right people, and support a modern, cashless, and connected transport system. The Saheli Card, along with Zero KYC and Full KYC Cards, is part of a larger digital plan that includes QR-based tickets, NCMC integration, and mobile apps for smoother travel across Delhi's public transport network.
- NeVA Seva Centre was inaugurated by Speaker Vijender Gupta at the Delhi Legislative Assembly to promote paperless governance. The first phase of the NeVA project was completed, offering digital tools, training, and smartphones to MLAs. The initiative supports Digital India, aims for transparency, and enhances legislative efficiency through technology-driven solutions.
- Puducherry's One-Time Regularisation Scheme 2025 aims to legalise unauthorised constructions made between May 1, 1987 July 16, 2025. Applications are accepted online via OBPS, with fixed fees and scrutiny charges. Government buildings are exempt, while aided schools receive 50% fee relief. Encroachments and plots without legal ownership are excluded. This move will improve urban planning compliance and offer legal protection to existing property owners.
- The Delhi Government has hiked cash rewards for Olympic and Paralympic medalists under the Mukhyamantri Khel Protsahan Yojana, offering ₹7 crore for Gold, ₹5 crore for Silver, and ₹3 crore for Bronze, along with Grade A jobs for top Olympic winners. The scheme also includes ₹3 crore for Asian Games Gold, and introduces the Mukhyamantri Digital Education Scheme to provide laptops to 1,200 meritorious students and upgrade computer labs in government schools.

July Month Launches & Inaugurations:

• Union Home Minister Amit Shah inaugurated the National Turmeric Board Headquarters in Nizamabad, Telangana, on June 30, 2025. This move fulfills a long-pending demand of turmeric farmers and aligns with the Centre's ambitious goal of reaching \$1 billion in turmeric exports by 2030. The board will focus on research, branding, marketing, and ensuring fair prices for farmers. Backed by ₹200 crore in funding, it holds significant value for agriculture, exports, and rural livelihoods.

- The Government of India has introduced Model Rules for Felling of Trees in Agricultural Lands to promote agroforestry, streamline tree harvesting permissions, and support sustainable agricultural practices. The upcoming National Timber Management System (NTMS) Portal will facilitate online registration of plantations using geo-tagged data and enable ease of doing business in rural areas. This initiative, guided by State Level Committees and monitored by Divisional Forest Officers, will enhance timber production, empower farmers, and support climate resilience.
- The C-FLOOD Unified Inundation Forecasting System, launched by Union Jal Shakti Minister C.R. Patil, is a webbased platform offering advanced flood predictions up to the village level. Developed jointly by C-DAC, CWC, and NRSC, the system integrates hydrodynamic modelling, HPC simulations, and satellite data under the National Supercomputing Mission (NSM). It currently covers three major river basins—Mahanadi, Godavari, and Tapi—with plans for wider rollout. The initiative enhances disaster management capabilities, enabling timely evacuations and reducing risks from flood disasters through scientific forecasting and inter-agency coordination.
- The Ministry of Coal will launch the RECLAIM Framework to promote inclusive and sustainable mine closures in India. Designed with field-tested tools and methodologies, the framework emphasizes community engagement, gender equity, and representation of vulnerable groups. It aligns with Panchayati Raj Institutions to ensure local relevance and foster long-term livelihood security and repurposing of mining lands. With this, India takes a progressive step toward just transitions in the mining sector.
- Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan and Minister of State Jayant Chaudhary inaugurated the Uttar Pradesh Agritech Innovation Hub and Agritech Startup & Technology Showcase at SVPUAT, Meerut, marking a major step in digitally transforming agriculture. The initiative connects farmers, startups, technologists, and academia to develop sustainable, region-specific solutions. Equipped with IoT-enabled sensors, smart irrigation, automation tools, and real-time analytics, the Agritech Hub promotes precision farming and climate-resilient agriculture.
- The Indian Army has launched Operation SHIVA 2025 to ensure the safe conduct of the Amarnath Yatra in Jammu and Kashmir. The operation began on July 12, 2025, and includes the deployment of 8,500+ troops, anti-drone systems, medical facilities, and engineering support. With coordination from CAPFs and civil administration, the operation addresses security threats from Pakistan-backed groups. The Army's efforts include surveillance, disaster readiness, and emergency response, reflecting its dedication to the safety of pilgrims during this sacred journey.
- The Mahila Aarogyam Kaksh, inaugurated by Shri Arjun Ram Meghwal in July 2025, is a women-exclusive wellness space launched by the Department of Legal Affairs. Located at Shastri Bhawan, it includes a gym and lactation room, promoting fitness, mental well-being, and inclusive workplace culture under the Fit India Movement and Viksit Bharat vision.











Important Festival

- Ladakh recently concluded its first Astro Tourism Festival, held in Leh and organized by the Tourism Department in collaboration with the Indian Institute of Astrophysics. The two-day event featured night sky observations, expert-led sessions, and educational outreach programs, aiming to transform Ladakh into a hub for astro tourism. With ideal conditions like clear skies, high altitude, and low light pollution, this initiative not only promotes scientific awareness but also aligns with sustainable tourism development.
- The Maharashtra government, on July 10, 2025, declared Sarvajanik Ganeshotsav as a state festival, as announced by Cultural Affairs Minister Ashish Shelar in the Legislative Assembly. The festival, started by Lokmanya Tilak in 1893, is a symbol of unity, culture, and pride in Maharashtra. The government will now fund and promote the grand celebrations across the state. This step aims to support traditional community spirit, enhance cultural heritage, and involve more people in the joyful occasion.
- The Behdeinkhlam Festival was celebrated with energy and joy in Jowai, Meghalaya, in July 2025. The festival is important to the Pnars, a sub-tribe of the Jaintia community, and is a prayer for health and a good harvest. Rituals include carrying the Symbud Khnong, dancing, food offerings by women, and playing the unique game Dadlawakor. It also spreads messages on drug-free living, climate awareness, and tradition preservation. The festival plays a big role in keeping the Niamtre faith alive and in uniting the community.
- The Saaral Vizha 2025, held in Courtallam, Tamil Nadu, is a vibrant monsoon festival that celebrates culture, tradition, and community welfare. Inaugurated by Revenue Minister K.K.S.S.R. Ramachandran, the event featured cultural performances, a flower exhibition, and public competitions, blending nature with heritage. With strong government support, participation from local officials, and engagement through traditional arts and youth events, the festival underscores Tamil Nadu's focus on inclusive cultural development.
- The Aadi Thiruvathirai Festival (23–27 July 2025) at Gangaikonda Cholapuram honors Rajendra Chola I's birth anniversary, marking 1,000 years of his maritime expedition and temple construction. The event includes Bharatanatyam, Devaram chanting, ASI exhibitions, and a performance by Ilaiyaraaja, with PM Modi as Chief Guest. The festival promotes Shaiva Siddhanta, Tamil Bhakti tradition, and Chola heritage, highlighting the ruler's visionary cultural and political impact.
- Uttarakhand will celebrate the Harela festival on July 16, 2025, by planting over 5 lakh saplings across the Garhwal and Kumaon regions. The event, guided by Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami, will focus on the themes "Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam" and "Harela Ka Tyohar Manao, Dharti Maa Ka Rin Chukao." The plantation drive will involve students,

villagers, and government bodies. This green initiative aims to break the previous record and highlight the state's commitment to environmental protection and community participation.

Miscellaneous National News

- In a significant step toward digital transformation in railway services, Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw launched the 'RailOne' mobile application on July 2, 2025. Developed as a comprehensive, one-stop platform, the app provides passengers with unified access to services such as ticket booking, PNR enquiry, journey planning, meal booking, and freight enquiries, enhancing the convenience and digital experience for millions of users.
- From August 2025, all post offices in India will begin accepting digital payments using dynamic QR codes linked to the UPI system, as part of the Department of Posts' IT 2.0 upgrade. The move follows a successful pilot in Karnataka and aims to promote financial inclusion, especially in rural and semi-urban areas. Replacing static QR codes, the new real-time dynamic system ensures secure, seamless, and cashless transactions at postal counters, aligning with the goals of Digital India and a cashless economy.
- On Statistics Day 2025, the National Sample Survey Office (NSO) under MoSPI launched the GolStats mobile app, a digital tool offering real-time, on-the-go access to official government statistics like GDP, inflation, and employment. With features such as interactive dashboards, infographics, CSV downloads, and a user-friendly design, the app promotes data transparency, citizen empowerment, and supports Digital India and Viksit Bharat missions.
- In a sweeping reform move, the Election Commission of India (ECI) is de-listing 345 Registered Unrecognised Political Parties (RUPPs) that have not contested elections since 2019 and are untraceable. While registered under Section 29A of the RP Act, 1951, many RUPPs exploit benefits like tax exemptions, common symbols, and star campaigners despite being inactive. The ECI lacks explicit de-registration powers, but parties are being removed for non-compliance and non-existence. Legal and electoral reform bodies like the Law Commission and the ECI's 2016 Memorandum have recommended amending the RP Act to empower de-registration. This clean-up drive supports electoral transparency and curbs misuse of public provisions.
- India's first wooden Gurdwara, Sri Nanak Niwas, constructed in Fazilka, Punjab, is a remarkable fusion of spirituality, architectural brilliance, and personal devotion. Made from Finnish Deodhar wood, it was conceptualized and built by SSP Bhupinder Singh Sidhu in just three months, making it a beacon of faith and an example of inclusive, sustainable religious architecture. With its daily rituals, global devotees, and community role, the shrine stands as a testament to seva, resilience, and unity.











- The Ministry of Women and Child Development has officially renamed NIPCCD as the Savitribai Phule National Institute of Women and Child Development, paying tribute to the legendary reformer. Along with this, a new Regional Centre in Ranchi will be launched on July 4, 2025, aimed at strengthening training and outreach for key schemes like Mission Shakti, Mission Vatsalya, and Poshan 2.0 in Jharkhand, Bihar, Odisha, and West Bengal.
- The Digital House Address Project by the Indore Municipal Corporation marks a major step in India's smart city evolution. By using QR codes linked to GPS and integrating with the Digipin system, Indore has created a modern, efficient, and scalable address solution. This digital transformation ensures real-time service access, enhances emergency responses, and lays the groundwork for data-driven urban planning. With low-cost digital plates and user-friendly systems, this initiative holds the potential to be replicated across Indian cities, supporting the vision of Digital India and urban inclusivity.
- With rising life expectancy but increasing age-related diseases like Parkinson's and dementia, the Indian Institute of Science (IISc), Bengaluru launched BHARAT in 2023 a research project under the Longevity India Program. BHARAT (Biomarkers of Healthy Aging, Resilience, Adversity, and Transitions) aims to build a scientific health baseline specific to Indians, addressing the problem of misdiagnosis caused by using Western biomarkers. The project collects extensive data, including genomic, proteomic, metabolic, environmental, and socio-economic indicators, to understand how Indians age and why some age healthier than others. The ultimate goal is to establish the Bharat Baseline, enabling personalized healthcare and early disease detection tailored to India's diverse population.
- On July 2, 2025, the Ministry of Road Transport and Highways (MoRTH) revised its toll rule to cut charges by up to 50% on National Highway sections with tunnels, bridges, flyovers, and elevated roads. The new formula bases toll on the lesser of two values, easing the cost for drivers. A senior NHAI official confirmed that this will help both the public and the infrastructure system. The change is set to lower travel costs and promote the use of highways with big structures.
- The Haryana government will build Asia's largest jungle safari in the Aravalli Hills, as announced on July 6, 2025. The safari will be spread over 10,000 acres and will focus on wildlife protection, green tourism, and job creation. Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini and other top leaders are working hard to make this project a success. The plan will not only bring tourists but also help in saving nature. The safari is expected to be a model of eco-friendly tourism and conservation in India.
- On July 8, 2025, NTPC Simhadri celebrated its 28th Raising
 Day at its Parawada campus in Anakapalli district, Andhra
 Pradesh, marking nearly three decades of service,
 innovation, and community development. Executive
 Director Sameer Sharma led the celebrations by hoisting the

- NTPC flag and highlighting Simhadri's journey since its establishment in 1997 as NTPC's first coastal-based power station. Beyond power generation, the plant has achieved 100% ash utilization, showcasing its commitment to sustainability, environmental conservation, and social responsibility through green initiatives and community outreach programs.
- PM Narendra Modi, during his state visit to Brazil, set a target to raise India—Brazil trade to \$20 billion by 2030. He proposed expanding the Mercosur trade agreement and announced Brazil's adoption of India's UPI digital payment system. Modi received Brazil's highest civilian honour, the Grand Collar of the National Order of the Southern Cross. Key deals included cooperation in biofuels, renewable energy, intelligence sharing, pharmaceuticals, and rare earth minerals, marking a stronger strategic partnership between the two Global South nations.
- A commemorative postage stamp was released on July 9, 2025, by the Department of Posts to mark the 125th Birth Anniversary of Syama Prasad Mookerjee. The event was held at Siri Fort Auditorium, Delhi, and featured cultural performances, an exhibition, and a short documentary. The stamp, designed by Smt. Nenu Gupta, reflects Mookerjee's work in education, national unity, and constitutional development. The launch was attended by Union Ministers and other top officials.
- Union Minister Piyush Goyal announced at India Energy Storage Week (IESW) in New Delhi that India's solar capacity has grown by 4,000%, with total renewable energy capacity now at 227 GW. He spoke about major schemes like PM Surya Ghar Yojana and PM Kusum Yojana, and introduced a ₹1 lakh crore Innovation Fund to support next-generation battery technologies. The government also stressed the need for strong supply chains and energy storage systems to support India's clean energy goals
- National Education Society for Tribal Students (NESTS) and UNICEF India launched TALASH, a digital program aimed at helping tribal students in Eklavya Model Residential Schools (EMRSs) across 28 states and 8 union territories. TALASH includes aptitude tests, career counselling, life skills training, and support for teachers. Over 1.38 lakh students are expected to benefit. The program supports the goals of NEP 2020 and will be fully rolled out by the end of 2025, making it a big step towards inclusive and holistic education for tribal youth.
- President Droupadi Murmu has nominated four new members—Ujjwal Nikam, C. Sadanandan Master, Harsh Vardhan Shringla, and Dr. Meenakshi Jain—to the Rajya Sabha on July 12, 2025, based on the Council of Ministers' advice. The announcement was made under Article 80 of the Constitution. Prime Minister Narendra Modi congratulated them and praised their contributions in fields such as law, education, foreign policy, and history. These nominations aim to ensure that the Rajya Sabha includes experts from diverse fields who can offer unique and informed viewpoints during discussions.











- Yakten village in Sikkim became India's first digital nomad village under the 'Nomad Sikkim' project. With strong internet, power backup, and homestays run by locals, it gives remote workers a peaceful and connected place to live and work. This move supports rural income, promotes sustainable tourism, and shows how India's villages can grow with the digital economy.
- Gujarat has emerged as the top state in India for processed potato production, with Banaskantha leading the way, followed by Sabarkantha and Aravalli. The state produced 48.59 lakh tonnes of potatoes in 2024–25, with more than 25% used for processing. With strong government support, high-quality varieties, and cold storage systems, Gujarat is now meeting domestic needs and entering global markets. The success shows how modern farming and smart policies can help rural economies grow.
- Health Ministry of India started a new Snack Nutrition Awareness Campaign at AllMS Nagpur. The campaign includes posters beside food stalls showing how much sugar, fat, and trans fat is in common snacks like samosas and biscuits. It warns about health risks and promotes moderation. The Health Secretary asked all government offices to join by sharing health messages and offering healthier food. A The Lancet study says India may have 450 million obese people by 2050. This campaign is part of a larger plan to fight obesity and lifestyle diseases by helping people make informed food choices.
- India is set to be the first country outside Japan to launch the latest E10 Shinkansen bullet trains, beginning with the Mumbai-Ahmedabad High-Speed Rail (MAHSR) in the early 2030s. Until then, two E5 trains, arriving in 2026, will be used for trial runs and testing under Indian conditions. The E10, also called Alfa-X, is capable of 400 kmph and offers advanced safety and comfort. The ₹1.1-lakh-crore MAHSR project has made strong construction progress, with 310 km of viaducts, 15 bridges, and 5 stations completed so far. This major step highlights India-Japan collaboration in building world-class railway infrastructure.
- Gujarat launches India's first Tribal Genome Sequencing Project, sequencing 2,000 individuals across 17 districts to detect genetic diseases like sickle cell anaemia. Led by GBRC, the project creates a reference genome database, enabling personalised healthcare. Approved under the 2025–26 budget, it bridges science and tribal welfare, setting a national example in genomic medicine.
- NSCSTI 2.0, launched on July 18, 2025 by Dr. Jitendra Singh, is a revamped framework developed by the Capacity Building Commission under Mission Karmayogi. It simplifies evaluation metrics, incorporates digital tools and AI, and aligns with models like KCM and AGK. Adaptable across all government levels, the framework supports outcomebased assessments, cross-learning, and institutional excellence, positioning India as a leader in civil services reform.

- At the International Mathematical Olympiad (IMO) 2025, India ranked 7th globally out of 110 countries, winning three golds, two silvers, and one bronze, while setting a national score record of 193/252. With strong support from HBCSE, and under the guidance of expert leaders like Prof. Shanta Laishram, India's performance highlights the growing success of its Olympiad ecosystem, and the country's consistent rise in global mathematics competitions.
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi will undertake a two-nation tour to the United Kingdom and the Maldives from July 23–26, 2025, focusing on strengthening the India-UK Comprehensive Strategic Partnership and advancing the India-Maldives Maritime Security Partnership. In the UK, Modi will hold talks with PM Keir Starmer and meet King Charles III, covering areas such as trade, technology, defence, and climate action. In the Maldives, he will be the Guest of Honour at the 60th Independence Day celebrations and review bilateral progress under Vision MAHASAGAR. The visit reflects India's emphasis on Neighbourhood First, strategic engagement, and regional leadership.
- Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar's resignation on July 21, 2025, has temporarily transferred the Rajya Sabha chairmanship to Deputy Chairperson Harivansh under Article 91. The Vice Presidential election, mandated under Articles 63–71 and the Vice-President (Election) Rules, 1974, must occur within 60 days, involving 788 MPs as the electoral college. The next Vice President must be an Indian citizen, 35+ years old, and Rajya Sabha eligible. Dhankhar's resignation not only initiates a crucial election but also reflects the evolving dynamics within the executive-legislature framework.
- The Election Commission of India (ECI) has asserted that Aadhaar, voter ID, and ration cards are not valid standalone documents for establishing voter eligibility during the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) in Bihar. Citing powers under Article 324, the ECI emphasized its authority to manage elections independently. The exercise aims to purify electoral rolls, and as of July 18, over 7.11 crore electors had submitted forms. The Commission stated that citizenship, not mere possession of ID, is the key eligibility criterion, and denial of registration does not affect one's citizenship status.
- India's IP filings rose by 44%, led by major reforms in patent laws, fee concessions for startups/MSMEs, digitized IP offices, and awareness through NIPAM. The 380% growth in GI applications, AI tools, IP Dashboard, and SIPP scheme reflect a modern and inclusive IP ecosystem aimed at encouraging innovation, ease of filing, and economic value creation.











- Article 67(a) of the Indian Constitution enables the Vice
 President to resign by writing to the President. Along with
 clauses (b) and (c), it ensures a well-defined exit mechanism
 for the office. If the Vice President resigns or is removed,
 Article 68(2) mandates an election within 60 days. The Vice
 President is elected by an electoral college of both Lok
 Sabha and Rajya Sabha members. The recent resignation of
 Jagdeep Dhankhar highlights the working of these
 provisions in practice.
- The Agriculture Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan has warned ICAR scientists and senior officials over the rampant sale of fake biostimulants in India. These unregulated products, which claim to improve plant productivity, have come under scrutiny due to numerous farmer complaints. The minister called for tougher regulations, scientific review, and accountability, stating that farmers must not be misled by corporate interests. The issue gained prominence after his Viksit Krishi Sankalp Abhiyan tour, where he personally engaged with affected farmers.
- The World's Largest Grain Storage Plan in Cooperative Sector focuses on creating agri-infrastructure at PACS level, such as godowns, processing units, and Fair Price Shops, with support from NABARD and governments. Over 500 PACS have been identified under this scheme, aiming for universal coverage across villages. With a financial outlay of ₹2,925 crore for computerization, the plan enhances grain storage, farmer empowerment, and supply chain resilience in India.
- Under the National Sickle Cell Anemia Elimination Mission, 6 crore individuals have been screened using POCT kits, with 2.15 lakh diagnosed, and 2.6 crore health cards distributed. The mission, launched in July 2023, aims to eliminate sickle cell anemia by 2047 through universal screening, awareness, and counselling. States like Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat, and Odisha are leading the initiative. A digital portal consolidates nationwide data and tracks mission progress.
- The National Cooperation Policy 2025 aims to triple GDP contribution, bring in 50 crore active members, and promote grassroots-led development through at least one cooperative per village and five model villages per tehsil. It prioritizes technology-enabled, transparent, and youth-driven cooperatives in new sectors like insurance, tourism, taxi services, and green energy. With White Revolution 2.0, Sahkar Taxi, and a dedicated cooperative university, the policy seeks to build an inclusive, self-reliant, and future-ready cooperative ecosystem.
- The India-UK Vision 2035 is a strategic blueprint to transform India-UK ties through enhanced cooperation in trade (CETA, BIT), defence (10-year roadmap, joint R&D), technology (AI, biotech, semiconductors), climate (green

- finance, clean energy, SMRs), and education (transnational degrees, youth exchange). It supports people-to-people links, reinforces a rules-based international order, and promotes multilateral reform. The partnership is guided by annual reviews and high-level dialogues, ensuring dynamic, inclusive, and future-ready collaboration.
- India has achieved 20% ethanol blending in petrol in 2025, five years ahead of the 2030 target, marking a major step in its clean energy transition. The blending level rose from 1.5% in 2014 to 20% in 2025, saving ₹1.36 lakh crore in foreign exchange, reducing CO₂ emissions by 698 lakh tonnes, and providing ₹1.18 lakh crore to farmers. Derived mainly from sugarcane, ethanol production has boosted the biofuel industry, rural incomes, and supported India's climate goals and energy security.
- Narendra Modi has officially become India's second-longest serving Prime Minister, completing 4,078 consecutive days in office on July 25, 2025, surpassing Indira Gandhi's record. He is the first non-Congress PM to serve two full terms, the longest-serving leader from a non-Hindi-speaking state, and the first post-independence born PM to achieve this feat, marking a historic moment in Indian political history.
- India has successfully tested its first hydrogen-powered train coach at ICF Chennai, marking its entry into the group of nations using hydrogen rail technology. Under the Hydrogen for Heritage initiative, Indian Railways plans to run 35 hydrogen trains, each costing ₹80 crore, with ₹70 crore for supporting infrastructure. A pilot project on the Jind-Sonipat section is also underway. The 1,200 HP hydrogen train in development reinforces India's vision of net-zero emissions and green transport innovation.
- The 60th anniversary of India-Maldives diplomatic ties was marked by the release of commemorative stamps by PM Modi and President Muizzu. The stamps showcased the Indian Uru boat and Maldivian Vadhu Dhoni, representing the shared maritime culture, historical Indian Ocean trade, and the deep bilateral relationship established since 1965. India was one of the first nations to recognize Maldives' independence. These stamps symbolize the mutual heritage, regional cooperation, and strengthening of people-to-people ties.
- PM Modi gifted a Sonoma dove tree sapling to King Charles III at Sandringham Estate under the initiative 'Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam', promoting environmental awareness and India-UK green diplomacy. The tree, known for its early and beautiful flowering, will be planted in autumn. This initiative aims to encourage tree plantation, honour mothers, and strengthen bilateral ties on shared ecological values. Other key topics discussed included CETA, Yoga, Ayurveda, and people-to-people connections through sports.

India to Conduct Population Census 2027 in Two Phases with **Caste Enumeration**

After a 16-year gap since the last official population count, the Government of India has announced the Population Census 2027, to be conducted in two phases along with caste enumeration. The reference date for most regions will be 00:00 hours on March 1, 2027, while for the Union Territory of Ladakh, and snow-bound areas of Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, and Uttarakhand, the reference date will be October 1, 2026. This marks a significant step in reviving the decadal census process, which was postponed in 2021 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Why in News?

The Ministry of Home Affairs recently announced that the Population Census 2027 will include caste enumeration and will be conducted in two phases, reaffirming the government's intent to modernize and update demographic data crucial for governance, planning, and social welfare schemes. The notification of the census will be published in the Official Gazette on June 16, 2025, under Section 3 of the Census Act, 1948.

Background of Census in India

- The Census of India is governed by the Census Act, 1948 and Census Rules, 1990.
- The last full population census was conducted in 2011, with over 1.2 billion people enumerated.

Why in News?

It seeks to address longstanding data gaps, particularly in income, wage patterns, and technology's influence on earnings, which are crucial for welfare and economic policies.

Shubhanshu Shukla Pilots Axiom-4 on SpaceX Falcon 9 to ISS

On 25 June 2025 at 12:01 pm IST, Group Captain Shubhanshu Shukla began his ascent to the International Space Station on board SpaceX's Falcon 9 Block 5 from Launch Complex 39A, Kennedy Space Center. This marks the second time an Indian has ventured into space and the first Indian to live and work onboard the ISS.

Who Is Shubhanshu Shukla? A Pilot Turned Astronaut

Born on **10 October 1985** in **Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh**, Shukla graduated from the **National Defence Academy** in 2005 and was commissioned into the IAF's Fighter Stream in **June 2006**. By **March 2024**, he had risen to the rank of **Group Captain**, accruing over **2,000 hours of flight time** in combat aircraft like Su-30 MKI, MiG-21/29, Jaguar, and Hawk. He joined **ISRO's Gaganyaan astronaut cadre in 2019**, trained in Russia and Bengaluru, and was named to the **Ax-4 mission crew** in early 2024.

Falcon 9 Block 5 & Crew Dragon: A Trusted Pair

The Falcon 9 Block 5, certified by NASA in November 2020, is a reusable, medium-lift rocket noted for its 100% crewed mission success rate and redundant systems. The mission uses a new Crew Dragon capsule, piloted autonomously, ferrying a four-member international crew to the ISS.

A Global Crew and Mission Objectives

Axiom-4's command structure includes former NASA astronaut Peggy Whitson and mission specialists from Poland and Hungary, alongside pilot Shukla. Over 14 days, the crew will conduct around 60 scientific experiments, seven of which are Indian-designed, spanning microgravity, biology, and materials science.

A Milestone for India's Space Odyssey

This mission represents India's first government-backed presence on the ISS and the nation's long-awaited return to human spaceflight since Rakesh Sharma's 1984 mission. It also complements the Gaganyaan programme, positioning India alongside global spacefaring nations.

Technical Delays and Final Countdown

The launch was postponed multiple times due to weather, technical, and safety checks including a liquid oxygen leak in early June. Ultimately, the team resolved all issues, and the final launch window opened on 25 June.

10 Years of AMRUT: Transforming Urban India

India celebrates 10 years of the Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation (AMRUT), launched on June 25, 2015, as a flagship scheme to improve urban living standards by ensuring water supply, sewerage, green spaces, and urban mobility. With more than 2 crore tap connections, 1.5 crore sewer links, and ₹2.73 lakh crore worth of projects sanctioned, AMRUT has become a cornerstone of India's urban transformation story.

Why in News?

The Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA) marked a decade of AMRUT and AMRUT 2.0 on June 25, 2025, showcasing key milestones and outcomes in improving water supply, sanitation, stormwater drainage, and urban mobility across Indian cities. The scheme's success demonstrates India's progress towards sustainable and inclusive urban development.

- Provide tap water and sewerage connections to every urban household.
- Create green spaces and parks to enhance livability.
- Promote non-motorized transport and reduce urban pollution.

India's Strategic Autonomy on Display at SCO 2025

At the 2025 Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) Summit in Qingdao, China, India's Defence Minister made headlines by refusing to sign the joint statement at the Defence Ministers' meeting. The draft omitted any reference to the Pahalgam terror attack, despite highlighting the Jaffar Express hijacking in Pakistan, prompting India to reject the final statement. This firm stance underscored India's unwavering commitment to fighting terrorism and maintaining strategic autonomy, sending a strong signal to the international community.

Why in News?

India's refusal to sign the SCO joint statement in June 2025 marks a significant diplomatic shift. The action spotlights India's consistent zero-tolerance stance on terrorism and its readiness to stand alone within multilateral frameworks when core security concerns are diluted or ignored.

Cabinet Approvals

- Cabinet Approves Two Railway Multitracking Projects: The Cabinet has approved two multitracking railway projects costing ₹6,405 crore—Koderma—Barkakana (133 km) in Jharkhand and Ballari—Chikjajur (185 km) in Karnataka and Andhra Pradesh—adding 318 km to the rail network. These will ease travel, lower logistics cost, reduce CO₂ emissions (264 crore kg), and oil imports (52 crore litres). The projects cover 7 districts, benefit 1,408 villages (population ~28.19 lakh), and generate 108 lakh human-days of employment. These strategic projects are aligned with the PM Gati Shakti Master Plan.
- years of the Emergency (1975–77), the Union Cabinet paid tribute to those who resisted the curtailment of democratic rights, observing a two-minute silence. The resolution reaffirmed India's commitment to constitutional values and democratic resilience, calling for renewed efforts to protect the Constitution and federal spirit.











- Cabinet Approves International Potato Centre in Agra: A
 South Asia Regional Centre of the International Potato
 Centre (CIP) will be set up in Singna, Agra, Uttar Pradesh, to
 boost food security, farmer income, and employment. It will
 develop high-yielding, climate-resilient potato and
 sweetpotato varieties and improve post-harvest and value
 chain systems across India and South Asia.
- Pune Metro Rail Phase-2 Approved: The Cabinet has cleared Pune Metro Phase-2—Corridor 2A (Vanaz—Chandani Chowk) and 2B (Ramwadi—Wagholi)—covering 12.75 km with 13 stations at a cost of ₹3,626.24 crore. These extensions will connect major IT hubs and suburbs, ease traffic on key roads, integrate with other metro lines, and boost ridership to 3.49 lakh daily by 2057.
- Revised Jharia Master Plan Cleared: A revised plan worth ₹5,940.47 crore has been approved to tackle fire, subsidence, and rehabilitation in Jharia Coalfield. It includes relocation from vulnerable sites, livelihood grants of ₹1 lakh, credit up to ₹3 lakh, and development of roads, electricity, water, schools, and hospitals. A dedicated fund and skill training will ensure sustainable livelihood for affected families.

Parliament News

State-wise October Month Important Events

Andhra Pradesh

• Google inaugurated its first Asia-Pacific Safety Engineering Centre (GSEC) in Hyderabad on June 18, 2025, solidifying India's role in global cybersecurity and responsible AI development. Inaugurated by CM A Revanth Reddy, the centre will combat online fraud, ensure infrastructure safety, and develop AI-driven security solutions like real-time scam alerts and SynthID watermarking. With its Hyderabad operations since 2007, Google reaffirmed its commitment to user safety, job creation, and skilling. The launch aligns with India's AI transformation strategy and Telangana's vision of becoming a \$1 trillion economy by 2035.

Assam

• Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma has announced two landmark reforms aimed at gender inclusion and grassroots empowerment. The transgender community will now be classified under the Other Backward Classes (OBC) category, enabling access to education, jobs, and welfare benefits. Additionally, Anganwadi workers will receive 50% reservation in supervisor-level positions within the Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS), recognizing their contributions in nutrition and child care. These initiatives, unveiled during a ceremonial event in Guwahati, mark a progressive shift in Assam's welfare and recruitment policy.

Bihar

- On June 10, 2025, Bihar CM Nitish Kumar inaugurated the Bikram Lock Canal Solar Project, a 2 MW green energy plant built at no cost to the state. Developed under the Jal-Jeevan-Hariyali Abhiyan, the project utilizes canal-side land to produce clean energy at ₹3.10 per unit for 25 years. It not only boosts renewable energy generation, but also reduces carbon emissions, ensures affordable rural electrification, and strengthens sustainable development in the state.
- In a historic move, Bihar becomes the first Indian state to implement mobile-based e-voting, set to launch during the 28th June municipal elections. Developed by C-DAC and the Bihar State Election Commission, the Android-based system aims to boost inclusive voting by enabling migrant workers, senior citizens, pregnant women, and Divyang voters to vote remotely. With features like blockchain technology, live face scan, biometric verification, and audit trails, the system ensures digital security, transparency, and tamper-proof voting, revolutionizing India's democratic process.
- In a pre-election welfare boost, Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar has raised social security pensions from ₹400 to ₹1,100 per month, benefiting over 1 crore elderly, widows, and disabled citizens starting July 2025. The hike, the first since 2005, coincides with Assembly elections later this year and is aimed at strengthening NDA's political positioning amid Opposition welfare promises. Additional decisions, such as higher allowances for panchayat leaders and enhanced financial powers, further demonstrate Nitish's strategy to secure support in rural Bihar.
- In a landmark move, Union Power Minister Manohar Lal Khattar announced that Bihar will get its first nuclear power plant, based on Small Modular Reactor (SMR) technology, making it one of six states selected under India's ₹20,000 crore Nuclear Energy Mission. Aimed at tackling Bihar's power deficit, this cost-effective, compact, and scalable SMR system will boost energy security, industrial growth, and sustainability. Complementing this, a 1,000 MW battery storage project has been approved, alongside praise for Bihar's reforms like 8 million smart meters and a sharp drop in power losses.
- In a bold blend of politics and infrastructure, Bihar CM Nitish Kumar inaugurated a 4.57 km six-lane bridge over the Ganges, linking Patna to Raghopur—the political bastion of his rival Lalu Prasad and his son Tejashwi Yadav. The move, just ahead of elections, signals Kumar's strategic outreach into opposition territory, where he was warmly received, highlighting his confidence and the bridge's potential to boost connectivity, regional development, and his political narrative of progress and inclusion.











The Bihar government has constituted a nine-member trust named Shree Janaki Janm Bhumi Punaura Dham Mandir Nyas Samiti to oversee the construction of a grand Maa Janaki temple at Punaura Dham, Sitamarhi, believed to be the birthplace of Goddess Sita. Chaired by the Chief Secretary, the trust includes top officials and religious representatives. Announced after Chief Minister Nitish Kumar unveiled the temple's final design on June 22, the project aims to boost religious tourism, enhance infrastructure, and position Sitamarhi as a major spiritual destination modeled on the Ram temple in Ayodhya.

Gujarat

• Justice Neranahalli Srinivasan Sanjay Gowda officially took charge as a judge of the Gujarat High Court on June 9, 2025, after his transfer from the Karnataka High Court. The oath was administered by Chief Justice Sunita Agrawal during a ceremony in Vadodara. At 58 years old, Justice Gowda has had a distinguished legal career since 1989, and was appointed a permanent judge in Karnataka in 2021. His transfer is part of a Supreme Court Collegium initiative to promote diversity and judicial efficiency by redistributing experienced judges across High Courts.

Himachal Pradesh

• The Government of India has approved a ₹2,006.40 crore relief package for Himachal Pradesh under the National Disaster Response Fund (NDRF) to support recovery and reconstruction following the 2023 monsoon disasters. Over 550 people died during the floods and landslides. The decision, made by a high-level committee led by Union Home Minister Amit Shah, includes ₹1,504.80 crore as the Centre's share. The state had earlier sought ₹9,042 crore under PDNA. This move reflects a national commitment to disaster resilience and follows similar packages to Uttarakhand and Sikkim.

Karnataka

• Karnataka has tightened its **tobacco regulations** by enacting the **COTPA** (Karnataka Amendment) Act, 2024, which raises the legal age for purchasing tobacco to 21, imposes a statewide ban on hookah bars, prohibits the sale of loose cigarettes, and increases the fine for public smoking to ₹1,000. The High Court upheld the ban, citing Article 47 of the Constitution. These reforms are intended to reduce tobacco addiction and improve public health standards across the state.

The Karnataka Cabinet has approved a 15% housing reservation for religious minorities, increasing it from the earlier 10%, as part of state housing schemes. Chief Minister Siddaramaiah and DCM DK Shivakumar defended the move as a social welfare measure aimed at addressing minority housing shortages and reducing the number of vacant homes. However, the BJP criticized the decision as votebank politics and termed it unconstitutional. The Cabinet made decisions regarding mango also farmer compensation, scheduling a cabinet meet at Nandi Hills, and declaring Apsarakonda-Mughali a new marine wildlife sanctuary.

Kerala

- In a landmark conservation effort, Kerala has inaugurated India's first butterfly sanctuary by officially renaming the Aralam Wildlife Sanctuary. Located in the Western Ghats, the sanctuary now harbours over 266 species of butterflies, including several rare, endemic, and endangered varieties. This initiative follows 25 years of persistent efforts by forest officials, researchers, and nature lovers. Featuring seasonal butterfly migrations, active research partnerships, and ongoing species discoveries, the Aralam Butterfly Sanctuary is poised to become a cornerstone of biodiversity conservation and eco-tourism in India.
- Kerala has secured the top rank in the Management Effectiveness Evaluation (MEE) 2020–2025, becoming the only state rated "Very Good" with a score of 76.22%. Eravikulam National Park emerged as the best-managed protected area in India with a 92.97% score, followed closely by Mathikettan Shola NP. The evaluation covered 438 National Parks and Sanctuaries, assessing their biodiversity conservation, management performance, and ecological sustainability. The recognition underscores Kerala's leadership in wildlife protection, habitat management, and community-led conservation efforts.

Maharashtra

• The Government of Maharashtra has rolled out a new digital initiative assigning a geo-tagged 13-digit unique ID to all infrastructure projects in the state. Launched through the Infra ID portal, the system will enhance transparency, facilitate inter-departmental coordination, and prevent project duplication. Beginning with Wardha district and key development departments, the full rollout will start October 1, 2025, with registration of projects from the last five years to be completed by March 2026. This move leverages the MRSAC platform for real-time tracking and ensures each public asset has a traceable digital identity.











The Maharashtra government's new directive under the State Curriculum Framework 2024 declares Hindi as the default third language from Classes 1 to 5 in Marathi and English medium schools, with the option to study another Indian language if 20 students per class request it. While aligned with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, the move has been criticized by the opposition and language activists as a veiled attempt to reimpose Hindi despite earlier assurances that it wouldn't be mandatory.

Mizoram

- Squadron Leader Manisha Padhi has become the first female Aide-De-Camp (ADC) in Indian history to be appointed to a **Governor**, marking a significant moment in the **Indian Armed Forces**. Appointed to serve the **Governor** of Mizoram, this landmark posting reflects India's growing commitment to gender inclusivity in military ceremonial roles. With prior experience across multiple Air Force stations, Padhi's achievement sets a new precedent for women officers aspiring to serve at high-ranking, prestigious posts.
- In a historic stride towards educational equity, Tripura has been declared fully literate under the ULLAS - Nav Bharat Saaksharta Karyakram, joining Mizoram and Goa in achieving over 95% literacy among individuals aged 15 and above. The success is attributed to robust community participation, widespread door-to-door mobilization, and digital tools like the ULLAS app. Launched in 2022, the ULLAS scheme aligns with NEP 2020 and supports Viksit Bharat @2047 by empowering youth and adults with foundational skills and lifelong learning opportunities.

Meghalaya

The Indian Institute of Corporate Affairs (IICA) is establishing its first regional campus in Shillong, Meghalaya, with funding under the PM-DevINE scheme. The ₹100.95 crore investment aims to transform the region into a policy and training hub, promoting corporate governance, entrepreneurship, and capacity building. Situated within the **Knowledge City cluster**, the new campus will support national missions like Atmanirbhar Bharat and Vikshit Bharat @2047, while fulfilling the government's vision of inclusive and decentralized development in the North East region.

Madhya Pradesh

The Madhya Pradesh government has made digital attendance mandatory for all government school teachers starting 1 July 2025 via the 'Humare Shikshak' platform. Integrated with the **Education 3.0 portal**, the system

ensures real-time tracking, with penalties such as casual leave deductions for non-compliance. Aimed at improving transparency, record-keeping, and administrative efficiency, this move impacts lakhs of education department employees across the state.

Odisha

On June 20, 2025, PM Modi launched multiple rail projects worth ₹2,750 crore in Odisha, marking a significant push toward regional connectivity and development. The inauguration of the Sonepur-Purunakatak rail line connected Boudh district to India's rail network for the first time. Other highlights include freight facilities, road over bridges, and new weekly train services.

Punjab

Punjab has recorded a 20% surge in cotton cultivation in 2025, expanding to 2.98 lakh acres across the state. This increase aligns with the government's crop diversification agenda aimed at reducing reliance on water-guzzling paddy. The state is offering a 33% subsidy on cotton seeds, and over 49,000 farmers have registered under the initiative. With Fazilka, Mansa, Bathinda, and Sri Muktsar Sahib leading in cultivation, Punjab's focus on sustainable agriculture and digital farmer outreach is showing tangible results.

Tamil Nadu

- An ancient Shiva temple, dating back to the later Pandya period, was recently discovered in Udampatti village, Tamil Nadu. The foundation and inscriptions from 1217-1218 CE confirm the site's historical significance. The temple, named Thennavanisvaram, was once financially self-sustained and located in a village then known as Attur. The detailed sale deeds on the stone base shed light on land ownership, water resource management, and temple endowments during Pandya rule. This archaeological finding is a critical window into medieval Tamil heritage, Pandya dynasty administration, and temple economy systems.
- Tamil Nadu government declared Dhanushkodi as a Greater Flamingo Sanctuary to protect migratory birds, particularly Greater and Lesser Flamingos, along the Central Asian Flyway. Covering 524.7 hectares, the sanctuary includes mangroves, mudflats, and marshes, forming a rich ecosystem within the Gulf of Mannar Biosphere Reserve. With over 10,700 birds from 128 species recorded, the sanctuary plays a crucial role in wetland conservation, ecotourism, and climate resilience. The move was inaugurated by Chief Minister M.K. Stalin during the World Environment Day celebration.











• The Prayoga Institute of Education Research, in collaboration with the SBI Foundation and SBI Funds Management, launched the Kriya programme in 12 government schools of Raichur district on June 17, 2025. Aligned with NEP 2020, the initiative aims to provide experiential science learning for students from Classes 6 to 10, encouraging critical thinking and inquiry-based education. Having already impacted over 11,000 students in Karnataka, the programme marks a key milestone in Prayoga's mission to transform rural STEM education through scalable, research-backed methods.

Uttar Pradesh

- The Uttar Pradesh Cabinet, led by CM Yogi Adityanath, has approved 20% horizontal reservation for former Agniveers in various police recruitment posts including Constables and Firemen. The move aligns with the Agneepath scheme, offering age relaxation and inclusive benefits across categories like SC, ST, OBC, and General. Starting in 2026, this policy ensures continued employment and recognition for Agniveers, promoting both security and youth welfare.
- Uttar Pradesh has topped the nation in digital public procurement, registering a cumulative ₹65,227.68 crore worth of orders on the Government e-Marketplace (GeM) between FY 2020 and FY 2025. In FY 2024–25 alone, the state processed 72 lakh orders worth ₹5.43 lakh crore, showcasing its commitment to e-governance, transparency, and efficient public service delivery. The November 2024 reforms, aligning with GFR 2017, enabled 100% GeM adoption, setting an example for other states under the Digital India initiative.
- On June 20, 2025, U.P. Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath inaugurated the 91.35 km Gorakhpur Link Expressway, built at a cost of ₹7,283 crore, highlighting the state's transformation from BIMARU status to an 'Expressway State'. Connecting Azamgarh, Gorakhpur, Sant Kabir Nagar, and Ambedkar Nagar, the expressway strengthens infrastructure, boosts trade, and paves the way for investment and regional upliftment. The initiative reflects the double-engine government's focus on inclusive development, positioning U.P. as a national growth engine.
- Salkhan Fossils Park in Sonbhadra, Uttar Pradesh, has been added to UNESCO's Tentative List of World Heritage Sites, recognizing its 1.4 billion-year-old stromatolite and algae fossils—some of the oldest known evidence of life on Earth. The park's nomination was backed by a scientific study conducted by the Birbal Sahni Institute of Palaeosciences and is supported by the UP eco-tourism board under CM Yogi Adityanath. This move is expected to significantly enhance the state's eco-tourism potential, bring international recognition, and contribute to scientific research.

West Bengal

- The Calcutta High Court has permitted a 15-year-old boy to adopt his stepfather's surname, upholding the rights of custodial parents and recognizing modern family dynamics. Though the Kolkata Municipal Corporation (KMC) opposed the change, the court ruled that surname falls within the scope of Section 454 of the Kolkata Municipal Corporation Act, which allows for name alterations. However, the court denied the plea to change the biological father's name due to the lack of a legal adoption order. Justice Kaushik Chanda emphasized that statutory time limits can be interpreted flexibly when justified by circumstances.
- In a landmark decision, the Calcutta High Court has ordered the Centre to resume MGNREGA operations in West Bengal starting August 1, 2025, after a three-year suspension due to alleged irregularities. The court stressed the need to separate past misconduct from the future right to livelihood, restoring work opportunities to over 25 million rural workers. The scheme's revival is seen as a victory for civil rights, with advocates hailing it as a turning point for rural employment, economic justice, and public accountability in India's flagship social welfare programme.

Union Terriorties:

- In a historic decision, President Droupadi Murmu promulgated three major regulations for Ladakh on June 3, 2025. The Ladakh Reservation (Amendment) Regulation ensures 85% reservation in public jobs for locals. The Ladakh Official Languages Regulation recognizes English, Hindi, Urdu, Bhoti, and Purgi as official languages, while promoting native tongues like Shina, Brokskat, and Balti. Additionally, the Hill Councils Amendment mandates 33% reservation for women in Leh and Kargil. These steps enhance local empowerment, promote linguistic and cultural heritage, and boost women's representation in governance.
- On June 9, 2025, Puducherry became the 19th legislature in India to adopt the National e-Vidhan Application (NeVA), a digital platform for paperless legislative functioning, inaugurated by Union Minister Dr. L. Murugan. The initiative supports the Digital India vision, enabling real-time legislative transparency, livestreaming, and saving paper, with 100% central funding. NeVA represents a step toward "One Nation, One Application", furthering ecofriendly governance, citizen access, and institutional efficiency.











• The Delhi Government is set to begin cloud-seeding trials by late June 2025, marking a significant move in weather modification technology to potentially combat pollution and water scarcity. The ₹3.21 crore pilot project, involving five aerial trials with seeding agents like silver iodide and salts, is being conducted with support from IIT Kanpur, IMD, and multiple national agencies. The trials will assess rainfall induction efficiency, and environmental safety, while avoiding restricted air zones in the city.

June Month Launches & Inaugurations:

- The Government of India has launched the SPMEPCI scheme to accelerate the growth of the domestic electric vehicle industry by offering import duty concessions and supporting local manufacturing. By allowing brownfield investments and capping imports with rollover provisions, the government aims to attract major global players and bolster India's clean mobility agenda. However, Union Minister H.D. Kumaraswamy confirmed that Tesla is not planning to manufacture cars in India, underlining the challenge of securing foreign investment in the EV space.
- The DHRUVA policy, launched by India's Department of Posts, introduces a nationwide, geo-coded digital address system designed to modernize how address data is used, stored, and shared. Recognising address information as foundational public infrastructure, DHRUVA ensures secure, standardised, and consent-based address management. It leverages the Address-as-a-Service (AaaS) model to benefit sectors ranging from governance to logistics. By integrating this digital approach, India strengthens its digital public infrastructure to support inclusive growth, user privacy, and service innovation.
- On June 6, 2025, Amit Shah inaugurated the Bharatiya Bhasha Anubhag (BBA) to integrate Indian languages into administrative and governance processes, minimizing the dominance of English. Backed by ₹56 crore in funding and supported by C-DAC, this platform will ensure real-time translation and allow communication in mother tongues, especially with Region C States. The initiative resonates with the NEP 2020 vision and strengthens linguistic inclusivity and national unity.
- The Election Commission of India has introduced a technology-based system to automate the creation of Index Cards and Statistical Reports, replacing earlier manual methods. This change, under the guidance of CEC Gyanesh Kumar, will significantly accelerate post-poll data dissemination, offering detailed insights into electoral demographics, voting patterns, and party performance. Aimed at researchers and policymakers, this initiative

- reinforces **transparency**, **data accessibility**, and **academic engagement** with India's democratic processes.
- On World Environment Day 2025, PM Narendra Modilaunched the 'Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam 2.0' campaign in Delhi, aiming to plant 10 crore trees across India by September 30. The initiative, blending environmental consciousness with cultural values, encourages individuals to plant a tree in their mother's name. Additionally, the Prime Minister flagged off 200 electric buses in the capital to promote clean urban transport and tackle air pollution. These actions reflect India's strengthened commitment to sustainable development, climate action, and green mobility.
- The Delhi government has announced India's first electronic waste (e-waste) eco park in Holambi Kalan, North Delhi, aiming to promote a circular economy and sustainable urban living, with Environment Minister Manjinder Singh Sirsa confirming plans to issue a global tender for advanced green technology partnerships.
- The Government of India has launched the Ayush Nivesh Saarthi Portal, a digital platform developed by the Ministry of Ayush and Invest India to attract and assist domestic and international investors in the Ayush sector—covering Ayurveda, Yoga, Unani, Siddha, and Homeopathy. The portal provides investment policies, project listings, benefits, and real-time support, aiming to boost FDI, support startups, and capitalize on the sector's 17% annual growth between 2014 and 2020.
- The National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) has introduced a cap of 10 projects per Engineer for consultancy firms working on national highway construction and maintenance projects. This move aims to improve supervision quality, prevent overburdening of engineers, and ensure contract compliance under project modes like HAM and EPC. Effective after 60 days, the rule mandates monthly site visits and inputs into progress reports, significantly boosting the quality and safety of India's highway infrastructure.
- The DhartiAaba Janbhagidari Abhiyan, launched by the Ministry of Tribal Affairs, is India's largest tribal empowerment campaign, covering over 549 tribal districts, 2,900+ blocks, and 1 lakh villages. The campaign ensures benefit saturation by delivering key services such as Aadhaar enrolment, Ayushman Bharat cards, PM-Kisan registration, Jan Dhan accounts, pensions, and skill development at the doorstep of tribal households. Implemented as part of Janjatiya Gaurav Varsh, and supported by programs like PM-JANMAN and DAJGUA, the initiative marks a major step in inclusive governance and last-mile delivery.











- Maruti Suzuki India has inaugurated India's largest automobile in-plant railway siding at its Manesar plant, marking a major step towards green logistics. Aligned with the PM Gati Shakti Master Plan, the ₹452 crore facility is part of the 126 km Haryana Orbital Rail Corridor. It will dispatch 4.5 lakh vehicles annually, cut 1.75 lakh tonnes of CO₂ emissions, and save 60 million litres of fuel per year. With this, MSIL aims to increase rail-based dispatches to 35% by FY2030-31, supporting India's vision of a net-zero emission economy by 2070.
- The Government of India has introduced a ₹3,000 FASTag Annual Pass, starting August 15, 2025, for private vehicles like cars, jeeps, and vans. Valid for one year or 200 trips, this initiative aims to reduce toll-related disputes, especially where plazas are closely spaced, and encourage a digital-first tolling system. The pass can be activated through the Rajmarg Yatra App or official NHAI/MoRTH platforms, offering an affordable, hassle-free travel experience across National Highways.
- On June 18, 2025, the Election Commission of India (ECI) unveiled a new SOP to deliver Elector Photo Identity Cards (EPICs) within 15 days of any electoral roll update. Powered by the ECINet platform and integrated with the Department of Posts, the system provides real-time tracking and SMS notifications to voters. This tech-driven step aims to improve voter convenience, ensure timely delivery, and bolster digital transparency in India's electoral services.
- To mark World Sickle Cell Day on June 19, 2025, AIIMS Mangalagiri organized an awareness rally in collaboration with the Departments of Health and Tribal Welfare. The event featured participation from students, tribal members, and medical professionals, aiming to boost awareness about sickle cell disease, a hereditary blood disorder that disproportionately affects tribal populations in India.
- The Union Public Service Commission (UPSC) has launched "Pratibha Setu", a revamped platform that allows employers to access details of non-recommended candidates who cleared all stages of UPSC exams but were not on the final merit list. This move provides career alternatives to top-tier aspirants and strengthens the interface between government-selected talent and private sector demand. With secure login access for verified recruiters and opt-in participation from candidates, Pratibha Setu represents a forward-looking employment reform initiative.

- During his visit to Bhubaneswar on June 20, 2025, Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated ₹18,600 crore worth of development projects, flagged off new rail and bus services, and launched the Odisha Vision Document, aiming for a \$1.5 trillion economy by 2047. Emphasizing cultural revival, women empowerment, and infrastructure growth, the PM also rolled out the Baraputra Aitihya Gram Yojana and felicitated Lakhpati Didis under the SHG initiative. The event signaled the government's commitment to holistic, inclusive progress in Odisha.
- The Ministry of Women and Child Development, under Annpurna Devi, launched the Gender Budgeting Knowledge Hub on June 20, 2025, during a national consultation in New Delhi. The platform will act as a digital repository for gender budgeting resources, aiding ministries, states, and policymakers in integrating gender equality in planning and budgeting. The Centre's allocation for FY 2025–26 stands at ₹4.49 lakh crore, a 4.5x increase from 2014–15. The consultation reviewed 20 years of gender budgeting in India and proposed training manuals and sector-specific strategies to further strengthen inclusive fiscal governance.
- Yoga Sangam 2025, an initiative by the Ministry of Ayush, marks a transformative celebration of the 11th International Day of Yoga (IDY) with the theme "Unity Through Breath". This nationwide event will mobilize participation at over one lakh locations, including schools, offices, villages, and metros, symbolizing a collective movement for health and harmony. Emphasizing synchronized breathing and community connection, it redefines yoga as both a wellness practice and a national unifier.
- In a historic move to promote educational equity, IIT-Delhi has introduced a special PhD admission drive for Scheduled Caste (SC) and Scheduled Tribe (ST) candidates. This initiative, which runs until June 30, 2025, addresses a persistent shortfall in reserved seat intake at the doctoral level, as revealed to a parliamentary committee. Despite relaxed eligibility norms, the institute has received fewer applications, prompting department-wide changes to encourage supernumerary admissions.
- The Government of India launched Dharti Aaba Janbhagidari Abhiyan (DAJA) on June 15, 2025, marking the largest tribal empowerment campaign in India's history, aiming to reach over 5.5 crore tribal citizens across 31 states/UTs. Named after Birsa Munda, this initiative honors tribal heritage while delivering on PM Modi's vision of inclusive governance. In just nine days, DAJA enabled 1.68 lakh Ayushman cards, 1.38 lakh Aadhaar enrolments, and 22,000+ Ujjwala Yojana connections.











Important Festival

- The Bonalu festival 2025 began with great fervour and tradition at Golconda Fort in Hyderabad, where devotees gathered at the Sri Jagadamba Mahankali temple to offer Bonams and participate in age-old rituals. The Telangana government actively supported the event with a ₹20 crore fund for 2,783 temples, while prominent political leaders and thousands of devotees celebrated the region's folk heritage. The festival will continue across Secunderabad and Old City in the coming weeks, reflecting Telangana's deeprooted cultural pride.
- The Ambubachi Mela 2025, held at Kamakhya Temple in Assam, commemorated the menstrual cycle of Goddess Kamakhya from June 22 to June 25, with temple doors reopening on June 26. This unique festival challenges menstrual taboos by celebrating womanhood and promoting menstrual hygiene awareness. Considered one of the 51 Shakti Peethas, the temple has deep mythological roots, and its rituals reflect Assam's progressive approach to menstruation. With massive turnout and government support, the event strengthens both spiritual devotion and social messaging around feminine power and dignity.
- The 3rd Lavender Festival at Bhaderwah, Jammu & Kashmir, showcased the growing success of the CSIR-Aroma Mission. Held from June 1–2, 2025, and attended by over 1,200 participants, the event featured field visits, live distillation demonstrations, and success stories of farmers and startups. With over ₹10.5 crore in turnover from lavender-based products and more than 9,000 trained individuals, the festival underscored the socio-economic upliftment, women entrepreneurship, and industrial development spurred by lavender farming.
- Sri Lanka is celebrating the revered Poson Poya festival, marking over 2,000 years since the arrival of Buddhism with Arahat Mahinda's first sermon to King Devanampiyatissa. Devotees have gathered at Mihintale and Anuradhapura, where the festivities are marked with lanterns, almsgiving, and cultural programs. President Anura Kumara Dissanayake emphasized national unity and moral revival, while the Indian High Commission joined the occasion with an exhibition on Buddhist heritage. Free and special train services are also aiding pilgrim movement during the sacred week.
- The Kataragama Esala Festival 2025 began in Sri Lanka with a flag hoisting ceremony, welcoming devotees from various faiths and regions. Celebrated around the Maha Devala temple dedicated to Lord Skanda, the festival honors

interfaith traditions, drawing Hindus, Buddhists, and Muslims alike. A central aspect of the festival is the Pada Yatra, a 500-km pilgrimage on foot. Key events include the fire-walking ceremony on July 7 and the grand Maha Perahera procession on July 10, highlighting the festival's spiritual intensity and cultural richness.

Miscellaneous National News

- The Government of India commemorated 60 years of Integral Humanism, a philosophy by Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya, with a national symposium addressed by Shri Shivraj Singh Chouhan. The Minister emphasized agriculture as the backbone of the Indian economy, advocated for environmental consciousness through a tree plantation drive, and promoted women's empowerment via schemes like Lakhpati Didi Yojana. He reiterated that Deendayal Ji's ideology offers a uniquely Indian framework for development grounded in cultural ethos, balanced economics, and social harmony.
- The Government of India has permitted Central Government employees who retired under the National Pension System (NPS) with a minimum of 10 years of service to claim additional pension benefits under the Unified Pension Scheme (UPS). The scheme, introduced in January 2025, offers a 50% assured pension, a lump sum payout, and monthly top-ups to bridge the gap between UPS and NPS returns. The last date to apply is June 30, 2025. This move benefits nearly 23 lakh employees and enhances social security for NPS retirees.
- The Ministry of Coal, under the leadership of Shri G. Kishan Reddy, launched C CARES Version 2.0, a digital platform by CMPFO for coal workers' Provident Fund and pension services. Developed by C-DAC in collaboration with SBI, it includes real-time tracking, direct benefit transfers, and a mobile app for member access. Initially deployed in five regional offices, it will expand nationwide from July 2025. The portal advances transparency, efficiency, and aligns with Digital India and worker welfare goals.
- At Urban Adda 2025, held in New Delhi, a powerful collective of policymakers, activists, and urban planners advocated for gender-inclusive urban design. The event illuminated the daily challenges women face in Indian cities from unsafe commutes to infrastructure exclusion and highlighted success stories like the training of women as ferry pilots and public bus drivers. Speakers emphasized that urban mobility systems must intentionally include women, and that only a structural shift from intent to action will ensure equity in city design and livelihood access for all.











- The Department of Biotechnology (DBT) successfully observed Swachhata Pakhwada 2025 between May 1–15, conducting 188 activities across its headquarters and affiliated organizations. The campaign emphasized cleanliness, health awareness, waste management, and community participation, aligning with the Swachh Bharat Mission. Key activities included the installation of e-waste and sanitary facilities, CPR training, cleanliness drives, and Nukkad Nataks.
- India's water management system is under immense strain from pollution, climate change, and governance gaps, necessitating a transition to the Source to Sea (S2S) approach. In 2025, the UN spotlighted glacier preservation and ocean science, emphasizing integrated water policies that consider the full water continuum from mountains to oceans. Despite early global momentum, India has not fully embraced S2S, although some pilot initiatives are emerging. Experts urge alignment of SDG Goals 6.5 and 14.1, stakeholder participation, and nested governance to ensure sustainable and climate-resilient water futures.
- The long-awaited Udhampur-Srinagar-Baramulla Rail Link (USBRL) project, envisioned nearly three decades ago, has reached completion with the operationalisation of its final segment — the Sangaldan to Katra stretch. This milestone marks the full integration of the Kashmir Valley into India's rail network, highlighted by iconic engineering feats like the Chenab and Anji bridges and the longest railway tunnel in the country.
- India has pledged \$20 billion to advance its maritime infrastructure, with a focus on building three Green Hydrogen Hub Ports, enhancing global trade corridor connectivity, and promoting multimodal logistics. Union Minister Sarbananda Sonowal made the announcement at the Nor-Shipping Conference, highlighting India's commitment to a green maritime future, stronger seafarer partnerships, and sustainable port development.



- India's digital public infrastructure continues to expand as
 UIDAI reported over 211 crore Aadhaar authentication
 transactions in May 2025, with 15.49 crore via face
 authentication and 37 crore e-KYC verifications. These
 figures underscore Aadhaar's central role in government
 welfare, financial services, and citizen-centric governance.
 Leveraging Al/ML technologies, Aadhaar's authentication
 capabilities are enabling seamless, secure, and real-time
 identity verification, driving forward the goals of Digital
 India and inclusive development.
- A new climate study warns that India's urban centres are on track to face twice as many heatwave days by 2030, especially in Mumbai, Delhi, and Chennai. Released during a key climate symposium in New Delhi, the study links these projections to climate change, urban heat islands, and landuse changes. It highlights a 43% surge in extreme rainfall intensity, affecting nearly 80% of Indian districts. Experts urge the formation of Climate Risk Observatories (CROs), risk financing tools, and district-level climate champions to combat the worsening climate crisis.
- The Digital India Bhashini Division (DIBD) and Centre for Railway Information Systems (CRIS) signed an MoU in New Delhi to integrate multilingual AI solutions into Indian Railways' digital services, using BHASHINI's language technologies like ASR, TTS, Text Translation, and OCR to make platforms like NTES and RailMadad accessible in 22 Indian languages, enhancing linguistic inclusion and AIdriven public service transformation.
- Bengaluru has been officially recognized as the 'Leopard Capital' of India, with an estimated 80–85 wild leopards found across Bannerghatta National Park and surrounding zones, surpassing Mumbai's 54. A year-long camera trap survey by Holématthi Nature Foundation, led by Dr. Sanjay Gubbi, also recorded 34 mammal species, many listed as Endangered or Schedule I under Indian law. The study recommends expanding conservation reserves, safeguarding wildlife corridors, and minimizing human-wildlife conflict. This highlights Bengaluru's unique position as an urban wildlife haven and calls for proactive ecological stewardship.
- The ESIC Sanath Nagar Campus in Hyderabad has evolved into a national Centre of Excellence, offering advanced medical services, super-specialty care, and medical education under the Modi government's eleven-year governance. Accredited by NABH, NABL, and ISO, the campus delivers digital diagnostics, cutting-edge surgeries, and innovative IT-enabled patient services. With over 1,000 beds, including ICU and dialysis units, and robust educational infrastructure, it stands as a beacon of accessible, high-quality public healthcare in India.









- India has initiated a strategic shift in its rare earth export policy by asking IREL to suspend a 2012 export agreement with Japan, aiming to develop domestic processing and reduce dependence on China. With rising demand for neodymium in electric vehicles and China's tightening grip on the market, India is investing in local capacity building, infrastructure, and incentives to create a self-reliant rare earth ecosystem. The move is also crucial for safeguarding national interests in defence, renewable energy, and critical technology sectors.
- The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs has approved two strategic multitracking projects under Indian Railways, totaling ₹6,405 crore, to enhance connectivity and freight movement across Jharkhand, Karnataka, and Andhra Pradesh. Spanning 318 km, the Koderma—Barkakana and Ballari—Chikjajur doubling lines will improve logistics efficiency, benefit over 28 lakh people, and cut carbon emissions, aligning with India's sustainability goals and economic self-reliance vision.
- India took a major step toward strengthening its textile exports with the first meeting of the Task Force on Textiles Exports, chaired by Commerce Secretary Sunil Barthwal on June 10, 2025. The meeting addressed issues across the textile value chain, from ESG infrastructure and ecommerce expansion to fibre innovation and regulatory simplification. Stakeholders unanimously supported forming issue-specific sub-task forces to craft actionable strategies. The initiative is a cornerstone of India's export and sustainability goals under the Viksit Bharat 2047 roadmap.
- Visakhapatnam will host the 11th International Day of Yoga (IDY 2025) on June 21, celebrating 10 years of this global wellness event. Senior officials from the Ministry of Ayush and the Andhra Pradesh Government recently reviewed preparations at key venues. The state's ambitious "Yogandhra" initiative targets yoga outreach to 2 crore people and aims to train 20 lakh certified practitioners. With more than 1 lakh locations participating across the state and 5 lakh attendees expected in Visakhapatnam alone, IDY 2025 promises to exemplify India's commitment to "Yoga for One Earth, One Health."
- At the Institutional Arbitration Conference held in New Delhi on June 14, 2025, Law Minister Arjun Ram Meghwal emphasized India's ambition to become a global arbitration hub. Highlighting the need for alternative dispute resolution (ADR) methods such as arbitration, mediation, and conciliation, the Minister stressed reduced court burden and investor convenience. ONGC Chairman Arun Kumar Singh and other stakeholders underlined the importance of time-bound, corporate-style arbitration.

- PM Narendra Modi's visit to Cyprus in June 2025 marks a strategic recalibration in India's foreign policy. As Turkey strengthens its alliance with Pakistan, India's outreach to Cyprus a nation that has consistently backed India on the global stage is both symbolic and strategic. Cyprus' role in the India-Middle East-Europe Economic Corridor (IMEC), its geographical proximity to West Asia, and its upcoming presidency of the EU Council in 2026 amplify its significance. The visit underscores India's commitment to counter-terror diplomacy, multilateral engagement, and trade connectivity in a rapidly evolving global order.
- India has initiated Operation Sindhu to evacuate its nationals from Iran amid the growing threat of conflict with Israel. Over 100 Indian students have already been safely evacuated via Armenia, reflecting the government's swift and well-coordinated response. The operation emphasizes India's commitment to the safety of its citizens abroad, effective diplomacy, and robust crisis management strategies.
- Anantha Chandrakasan, a Chennai-born academic and MIT's School of Engineering Dean, has been appointed as the first Indian-born Provost of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT). Taking office on July 1, 2025, he will oversee MIT's academic and financial strategy. A renowned engineer and researcher, Chandrakasan leads MIT's Energy-Efficient Circuits and Systems Group, and has been instrumental in promoting innovation, entrepreneurship, and inclusion through programs like SuperUROP and Rising Stars.
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi's first visit to Croatia signals a strategic shift in India's foreign policy, emphasizing deeper connectivity with Central and Eastern Europe. With its Adriatic Sea access, membership in EU and NATO, and involvement in initiatives like 3SI and IMEC, Croatia offers India key trade and geopolitical advantages. The visit also revived historic cultural ties, notably through the Sanskrit grammar work of Croatian scholar Filip Vezdin. This outreach reinforces India's presence in the region and counters rival global influences like the BRI, while enhancing prospects for UNSC support.
- The Election Commission of India (ECI) has rolled out transformative reforms during the June 2025 bye-polls, introducing innovations like mobile deposit facilities, realtime VTR updates, and 100% webcasting. These initiatives, implemented across five Assembly Constituencies, enhance voter convenience, transparency, and polling efficiency. With the Special Summary Revision of electoral rolls also carried out for the first time in two decades, these reforms set a precedent for future state elections, especially the upcoming Bihar Assembly Elections.











- India is set to export its first-ever locally manufactured locomotive to Guinea, with PM Narendra Modi inaugurating the flag-off ceremony from Marhowrah, Bihar, on June 20, 2025. The deal includes 150 high-tech locomotives worth ₹3,000 crore, made for Guinea's SimFer Simandou mining project. Manufactured under the Make in India initiative, these locomotives feature world-class safety, comfort, and performance. The project, awarded through global competitive bidding, highlights India's rising capabilities in railway manufacturing, its diplomatic outreach to Africa, and the realization of the Atmanirbhar Bharat vision.
- The Government of India is set to notify the Legal Metrology (Indian Standard Time) Rules, 2025, mandating the use of Indian Standard Time (IST) across all legal, commercial, and digital activities. This initiative, backed by the Department of Consumer Affairs, CSIR-NPL, and ISRO, aims to enhance digital security, traceability, and operational efficiency by eliminating reliance on foreign time sources. It includes setting up five Regional Reference Standard Laboratories (RRSLs) with atomic clocks and secure synchronization protocols. The move is a major leap towards One Nation, One Time, securing national digital infrastructure under a trusted, standardized ecosystem.
- In a major step towards uniting the world through the ancient practice of yoga, the Morarji Desai National Institute of Yoga (MDNIY) launched 'Yoga Bandhan', a flagship international program under the Ministry of Ayush. As a Signature Event leading up to the International Day of Yoga (IDY) 2025, the initiative brought together yoga ambassadors from 15 countries to strengthen global partnerships in yoga education, diplomacy, and wellness, reflecting India's continued leadership in promoting cultural unity and holistic health worldwide.
- The Centre has notified the schedule for the 2027 decennial census, which will include caste enumeration. This will be India's first caste-based census in 16 years, since the last socio-economic caste data was gathered in 2011. The announcement follows a high-level review chaired by Union Home Minister Amit Shah.
- In a major step toward mitigating human-wildlife conflict, Union Minister Bhupendra Yadav announced the creation of a Centre of Excellence at WII–SACON, focusing on the use of Al-driven solutions, public sensitisation, and rapid response mechanisms. Backed by previous advisories (2021) and detailed guidelines (2022), the initiative comes amid rising fatalities due to tiger and elephant attacks, particularly in states like Maharashtra, Odisha, and Uttar Pradesh.

- India is set to integrate its Rare Donor Registry with the e-Rakt Kosh national blood platform to ensure quicker, safer, and more cost-effective access to rare blood groups like Bombay, Rh-null, and P-null. Developed by ICMR-NIIH, the registry contains over 4,000 rare donors, screened using advanced DNA testing kits. The integration will benefit patients with thalassemia, hemophilia, and sickle cell disease, while upgraded point-of-care tests have significantly reduced diagnosis costs. The move marks a milestone in India's goal toward a digitally connected, self-reliant blood management system.
- In a landmark move to boost the circular economy, CSIR-NIIST and NECTAR have signed an MoU to establish vegan leather manufacturing units in Meghalaya and the Northeast region, utilizing agro-waste such as rice straw and fruit residues. This initiative aligns with Atmanirbhar Bharat, Make in India, and Swachh Bharat, focusing on sustainable production, women empowerment, and MSME support. Additionally, CSIR-NIIST's partnership with GIZ India will launch a Centre of Excellence for Building Integrated Photovoltaics (BIPV), accelerating India's clean energy transformation.
- In a landmark move to enhance the Rath Yatra 2025 experience, East Coast Railway (ECoR) launched the 'ECoR Yatra' mobile app, offering real-time train info, special Rath Yatra train schedules, accommodation details, and ticket booking options. Available on the Google Play Store, the app—featuring multilingual support and linked to NTES and IRCTC—caters to lakhs of Puri-bound pilgrims, ensuring smooth navigation, live updates, and access to passenger amenities, marking a significant leap in digital railway services during mass events.
- In a significant reform aligning with NEP 2020, the CBSE will allow Class 10 students to take board exams twice a year starting from 2026-27. The first exam is mandatory, while the second is optional for those wishing to improve scores in up to three academic subjects. This move aims to reduce exam stress, offer flexibility, and facilitate smoother Class 11 admissions. New provisions also cover compartment students, sports quota, and snow-bound areas, making the system more inclusive and progressive.
- The National e-Governance Division (NeGD) has rolled out a 2-day 'Al in Governance' training programme at IIT Delhi, aiming to boost the digital capacity of 59 government officials. Conducted under CB Phase III of Digital India, the programme includes interactive sessions, policy discussions, and group exercises to foster responsible Al adoption in governance. The initiative reflects India's strategic push for tech-driven governance reforms and Al integration in public administration.











- The Union Environment Ministry held a review of Project Elephant, confirming the completion of Phase-I elephant census in Northeast India, where over 16,500 dung samples were collected. In efforts to reduce elephant deaths due to railway accidents, 3,452 km of tracks were surveyed and 77 high-risk areas identified. The meeting also highlighted progress in DNA profiling of captive elephants and announced the inclusion of sloth bear and gharial in the Species Recovery Programme, showing a broader commitment to wildlife conservation and conflict mitigation.
- India has successfully integrated wildlife conservation into infrastructure through the construction of its first animal overpass corridor on the Delhi-Mumbai Expressway. Built by the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI), the corridor features multiple overpasses and underpasses tailored to the natural terrain, enabling the safe movement of species like tigers and leopards. The project sets a national precedent in eco-sensitive development, with other states like Punjab and Maharashtra adopting similar models.
- In an effort to close the gap between tribal welfare policies and their on-ground implementation, the Ministry of Tribal Affairs has launched the Adi Karmyogi programme.
 Announced during the Adi Anveshan conference, the

- initiative aims to train over 20 lakh stakeholders and build a motivated cadre of officials across India. The move addresses the key insight that the real obstacle in tribal development lies in poor implementation, not the absence of schemes.
- The Indian government has approved the setting up of the CIP-South Asia Regional Center in Agra to advance research and innovation in potato and sweet potato cultivation.
 With India being the world's second-largest producer and consumer of potatoes, the center will focus on improving yields, developing climate-resilient varieties, reducing import dependence on seeds, and boosting exports.
- The Emergency was imposed exactly 50 years ago on June 25, 1975, marking the beginning of what historians consider one of the darkest chapters in the history of the Indian republic. This 21-month period witnessed the unprecedented suspension of democratic institutions, fundamental rights, and constitutional governance that had defined India since independence. Indira Gandhi had initially risen to power on an electoral landslide in 1971, but her administration soon faced mounting challenges that would ultimately lead to the constitutional crisis. The convergence of economic hardship, political opposition, and judicial scrutiny created a perfect storm that pushed Gandhi toward authoritarian measures.

- India Re-elected to UN Postal Councils: Country secures
 positions in Council of Administration and Postal Operations
 Council at 28th Universal Postal Congress in Dubai, reflecting
 global confidence in India Post's leadership.











- India-Brazil Launch Agricultural Innovation Partnership:
 Maitri 2.0 cross-incubation programme launched to strengthen agritech cooperation and sustainable agriculture development between both nations.
- India Gains Strategic Position in Interpol: India elected to Interpol Asian Committee during 25th Asian Regional Conference in Singapore, enhancing regional security cooperation against organized crime and terrorism.
- Historic Ocean Conservation Treaty Takes Effect: BBNJ treaty reaches 60 ratifications and will enter force January 17, 2026, aiming to protect marine biodiversity beyond 200 nautical miles from coastal countries.
- China Launches K Visa to Attract Global Talent: New K visa launching October 1, 2025, targets young STEM professionals amid US H-1B restrictions, offering flexible entry and participation in academic activities.
- India-Australia Organic MRA: India and Australia signed Mutual Recognition Arrangement for Organic Products on September 24, 2025, strengthening strategic partnership under ECTA.
- Super Typhoon Devastates Asia: Super Typhoon Ragasa, 2025's strongest storm, causes 17 deaths in Taiwan, 4 in Philippines with nearly 2 million evacuated in southern China.
- IIT-Madras Nominated for UN AI Centre: India nominates
 IIT-Madras as UN Centre of Excellence for AI capacity
 building under ODET initiative, aiming to skill 10 million
 people annually through India AI Mission.
- US-Turkey Nuclear Deal: United States and Turkey sign comprehensive nuclear cooperation agreement for building large power plants and small modular reactors.
- Dubai's Driverless Transport Revolution: Dubai launches 15-kilometer autonomous transport corridor featuring RoboTaxis, buses and bots, targeting 25% autonomous trips by 2030.
- India-Bhutan Approve First Rail Projects: India and Bhutan have approved historic rail connectivity projects worth ₹4,033 crore—Kokrajhar-Gelephu and Banarhat-Samtse lines—to boost bilateral trade and enhance Bhutan's access to Indian ports under India's ₹10,000 crore support commitment.
- India's EFTA Free Trade Agreement Effective October 1:
 Union Minister Piyush Goyal announced that the FTA with EFTA countries (Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway, Switzerland) will be operational from October 1, 2025, as India continues negotiations with US, EU, and other nations while rising as the 4th largest economy.

International Current Affairs of August 2025

- The Krasheninnikov Volcano in Russia's Kamchatka Peninsula erupted today for the first time in 600 years, sending an ash plume 4 km high. Authorities issued an orange aviation warning, citing risks to aircraft. The eruption is believed to be linked to a recent 8.7 magnitude earthquake and subsequent aftershocks in the region. Though no populated areas are at risk, officials have urged residents and tourists to avoid traveling near active volcanoes. The eruption, last seen around 1463, is being closely monitored as a historic geological event.
- Hong Kong has launched a stablecoin regulatory framework requiring full reserves and selective licensing, reinforcing its ambition to become a leader in digital finance. The move ensures stability, transparency, and innovation, while aligning with global standards like the U.S. GENIUS Act and EU's MiCA, marking a new era for programmable finance and asset tokenization.
- A high-level delegation from the Philippines, led by Secretary of Agriculture Francisco P. Tiu Laurel Jr., met with Indian trade bodies including APEDA and the Indian Rice Exporters Federation (IREF) to boost food imports from India. The Philippines agreed to import more rice, buffalo meat, vegetables, fruits, and peanuts, while also committing to remove restrictions on Basmati rice imports. This move aims to reduce reliance on Chinese products, diversify supply chains, and strengthen Indo-Philippine relations, promoting food security and economic growth.
- Moldova has become the 107th member of the International Solar Alliance (ISA), a global initiative launched by India and France in 2015 at COP21. The ISA aims to boost solar energy investments by 2030 and reduce technology and financing costs. It promotes solar use across sectors like agriculture, health, transport, and power generation. Moldova's ratification was formalized in a meeting between its ambassador to India and ISA officials, highlighting ongoing global cooperation to advance renewable energy.
- India and Russia signed a key protocol to boost industrial cooperation during the 11th Working Group session held at Vanijya Bhawan, New Delhi. Co-chaired by DPIIT Secretary Amardeep Singh Bhatia and Russian Deputy Minister Alexey Gruzdev, the meeting focused on collaboration in aluminium, fertilizers, railways, mining, and emerging areas like aerospace, carbon fibre, 3D printing, and critical minerals. Discussions included joint development of small aircraft engines, a wind tunnel facility, and underground coal gasification, reaffirming both countries' commitment to strategic industrial ties and technology transfer.











- In a landmark move, Illinois has become the first U.S. state to ban AI platforms like ChatGPT from providing therapy services without human oversight, under the Wellness and Oversight for Psychological Resources Act. Signed by Governor JB Pritzker, the law prohibits AI from performing core therapeutic functions like diagnosis, treatment planning, or emotional assessments unless supervised by a licensed professional. This comes amid rising concerns over Al's misuse in mental health, echoing warnings from the American Psychological Association.
- The World Health Organization (WHO) has officially classified **Hepatitis D (HDV)** as a cancer-causing virus, citing its strong link to liver cancer when co-infected with Hepatitis B (HBV). Since HDV requires HBV to replicate, the Hepatitis B vaccine becomes the most effective shield against this dangerous coinfection. HDV significantly accelerates liver cirrhosis, increases cancer risk by up to six times, and is spreading through blood, sexual contact, and childbirth. With vaccine coverage in India still around 50%, experts urge stronger prevention, screening, and public awareness to curb HDV transmission and protect vulnerable
- In a historic peace deal brokered at the White House, Azerbaijan and Armenia officially agreed to end decades of conflict over Nagorno-Karabakh, with President Donald **Trump** hosting the summit. The agreement includes reopening transport routes, establishing diplomatic and business ties, and constructing a new Trump Route for International Peace and Prosperity linking Azerbaijan to its Nakhchivan exclave.
- Aadhaar face authentication recorded a historic 19.36 crore transactions in July 2025, up from 5.77 crore in July 2024, showing rapid adoption across banking, telecom, oil, and government services. The month saw a 22% increase over June and a record 1.22 crore transactions on 1 July alone. Over 150 entities now use the Al-driven technology for secure, contactless verification, including integration with NSAP, NMC medical colleges, and recruitment bodies like SSC and RRB.
- The Government e Marketplace (GeM) celebrated its 9th anniversary in 2025, achieving a remarkable Rs 5.4 trillion Gross Merchandise Value (GMV) in FY 2024-25. Since its launch in 2016, GeM has onboarded 1.5 lakh women-led enterprises, startups, self-help groups (SHGs), artisans, and micro small enterprises (MSEs), transparent, inclusive, and efficient public procurement. Recent reforms include the removal of caution money, rationalization of vendor fees, and transaction charge reductions, benefiting 97% of orders.

- Cambodia and Thailand have reached a consensus on ceasefire details and signed an agreement during the General Border Committee meeting in Kuala Lumpur, with third-party observers from the US, China, and Malaysia. Both countries pledged to cease all types of firing, maintain current troop levels without reinforcements along the border, and ensure humane treatment of captured soldiers as per international humanitarian law.
- Australia will formally recognise the State of Palestine at the UN General Assembly in September, Prime Minister Anthony Albanese announced, aiming to support a twostate solution, promote a ceasefire in Gaza, and isolate Hamas. The decision follows similar moves by France, Britain, and Canada, and responds to Israel's actions in Gaza and expansion of illegal settlements. Albanese emphasized that recognition depends on Palestinian Authority reforms and Hamas's exclusion from future governance, signaling growing international pressure on Israel for a political
- Nepal is offering climbers the chance to scale 97 Himalayan peaks free of charge for the next two years to boost tourism in its lesser-known and underdeveloped regions of Karnali and Sudurpaschim provinces. These peaks, ranging from **5,970 to 7,132 meters**, aim to attract visitors and promote unexplored the country's mountain destinations. supporting local economies through mountaineering tourism.
- India and Singapore held the 3rd India-Singapore Ministerial Roundtable (ISMR) in New Delhi, led by senior ministers including Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman and Singapore's Deputy PM Gan Kim Yong, to deepen their Comprehensive Strategic Partnership. The discussions focused on six key pillars: Digitalization, Skill Development, Sustainability, Healthcare, Advanced Manufacturing, and Connectivity. Emphasizing synergy between government and industry, the Roundtable also engaged with the India-Singapore Business Roundtable (ISBR) to explore nextphase opportunities in trade, investment, and regional cooperation in line with India's Act East and Indo-Pacific
- The U.S. national debt has surged past a historic \$37 trillion, reaching this milestone years earlier than expected, driven by pandemic-related borrowing and recent government spending. The Treasury Department's latest report highlights the growing fiscal burden on taxpayers. Earlier this year, former President **Donald Trump** signed a Republican tax cut and spending bill projected to add \$4.1 trillion to the debt over the next decade, according to the Congressional **Budget Office.**











- The Putin-Trump summit in Alaska ended without a deal on the Ukraine conflict after nearly three hours of talks at the Elmendorf-Richardson military base. While both leaders called the meeting productive and expressed hope for future progress, no agreement was reached. Putin emphasized ending the conflict by addressing its root causes and warned against sabotage, while Trump highlighted the potential for dialogue and said final agreements depend on Ukraine and NATO. The brief joint press conference signaled cautious optimism but no immediate resolution.
- The WHO has declared Kenya free of sleeping sickness (human African trypanosomiasis), making it the 10th country to eliminate this neglected tropical disease. This achievement follows Kenya's earlier success in eradicating Guinea worm disease in 2018, marking significant progress toward a Africa free of neglected tropical diseases. Sleeping sickness, caused by parasites transmitted by tsetse flies, affects neurological health in advanced stages.
- The World Meteorological Organization (WMO) has issued a warning that extreme heat is impacting millions globally, stressing the urgent need for early warning systems and heat-health action plans. Key points include Frequent heatwaves and record-high temperatures are being recorded worldwide. July saw prolonged heatwave conditions in Europe, notably Sweden and Finland with temperatures above 30°C. Maximum temperatures exceeded 42°C in regions like West Asia, southern Central Asia, North Africa, southern Pakistan, and southwestern USA. Extreme heat has contributed to devastating wildfires, causing casualties and deteriorating air quality.
- In August, India's Russian oil imports surged to 2 million barrels per day (bpd), making up 38% of its total crude oil imports of 5.2 million bpd. This marks an increase from 1.6 million bpd in July, as Indian refiners prioritized economic factors in sourcing. Meanwhile, imports from Iraq and Saudi Arabia declined, with Iraq falling to 730,000 bpd from 907,000 bpd and Saudi Arabia dropping to 526,000 bpd from 700,000 bpd in July.



- Dubai has launched the "One Freezone Passport," a unified business licensing system allowing companies to operate across all Dubai free zones with a single license, eliminating the need for multiple permits. This initiative, announced by the Dubai Free Zones Council, reduces costs and simplifies operations, supporting the Dubai Economic Agenda D33 to double GDP by 2033. It offers benefits like tax exemptions, full foreign ownership, and faster market entry, attracting global firms and startups while boosting Dubai's position as a competitive global business hub.
- India and Saudi Arabia have agreed to deepen maritime relations by forming a Joint Working Group (JWG) focused on cooperation in shipping and logistics. This strategic partnership builds on their strong economic and sociocultural ties and aligns with India's Maritime India Vision 2030, Saudi Arabia's Vision 2030, and India's Amrit Kaal Vision 2047. The collaboration aims to boost investment in India's port and shipping ecosystem, including projects like Vadhavan Port and the Outer Harbour Project at VO Chidambaranar Port, leveraging a USD 3 billion Maritime Development Fund.
- India and the Eurasian Economic Union (EAEU) comprising Armenia, Belarus, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyz Republic, and Russia signed the Terms of Reference (ToR) in Moscow to initiate Free Trade Agreement (FTA) negotiations. The ToR, signed by officials from both sides, aims to boost exports, support MSMEs, and diversify market access. In 2024, India-EAEU trade reached \$69 billion, a 7% increase over 2023. The agreement is expected to unlock untapped trade potential, attract investments, and create a long-term trade partnership.
- Fiji Prime Minister Sitiveni Rabuka will visit India from August 24–26, 2025, accompanied by his wife and key officials, including Health Minister Ratu Atonio Lalabalavu. During the visit, he will hold bilateral talks with Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who will also host an official lunch in his honour, and call on President Droupadi Murmu. Rabuka is also scheduled to deliver a lecture titled 'Ocean of Peace' at the Indian Council of World Affairs (ICWA). The visit aims to strengthen bilateral cooperation and expand people-to-people ties between India and Fiji.
- Iran has launched a two-day missile drill titled "Sustainable Power 1404" in the Gulf of Oman and northern Indian Ocean, marking its first major military exercise since the 12-day war in June. The drills showcased cruise missiles like Nasir and Qadir, and involved surface/subsurface warships, air units, and electronic warfare brigades. Iran's IRIS Sabalan and IRIS Ganaveh warships successfully hit sea targets.











- Over 500 humanoid robots from 16 countries competed at the World Humanoid Robot Games in Beijing. The four-day event featured 26 competitions including track and field, soccer, dancing, and kickboxing. Highlights included a robot completing the 100-meter sprint in 21.5 seconds and impressive agility in kickboxing. However, some challenges surfaced, such as robots collapsing during soccer and relay races, highlighting both the progress and limitations in humanoid robotics.
- Dubai International Airport (DXB) has launched an Alpowered passenger corridor that enables travelers to clear immigration in seconds without showing documents, using facial recognition and pre-registered biometric data. Part of the "Travel Without Borders" initiative, this system can process up to 10 passengers simultaneously in just 14 seconds, eliminating traditional passport controls. Initially deployed in Terminal 3's First and Business Class lounges, it builds on Dubai's 2020 "smart tunnel" and aims to create a frictionless, secure travel experience.
- Due to the U.S. Executive Order No. 14324, which ends the duty-free exemption for goods under USD 800 from 29th August 2025, the Department of Posts has announced a temporary suspension of postal services to the USA from 25th August 2025, except for letters/documents and gift items under USD 100. The decision follows operational issues and lack of clarity from U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) on duty collection procedures, affecting U.S.-bound air carriers' ability to process shipments. Customers can claim refunds for undeliverable items. The department is working to restore services as soon as possible.
- During Fijian Prime Minister Sitiveni Rabuka's visit to India, both nations signed multiple bilateral agreements including a pact to build a super-specialty hospital in Fiji and supply of Janaushadhi medicines. Key announcements included Fiji joining the Indo-Pacific Oceans Initiative (IPOI), establishment of a Cyber Security Training Cell, gifting of ambulances, and support for agriculture through drones and soil testing labs. Cultural, educational, and people-to-people ties were strengthened with the deputation of a Hindi-Sanskrit teacher, training for Fijian Pundits, and a second Jaipur Foot Camp.
- India and Japan have reinforced their energy partnership through a Ministerial-level India-Japan Energy Dialogue focused on energy security, clean energy transition, and climate change. Co-chaired by India's Minister of Power and Housing & Urban Affairs and Japan's Minister of Economy, Trade and Industry, the dialogue highlighted progress in energy efficiency, clean hydrogen, ammonia, renewable energy, and agreed to expand cooperation in carbon capture, biofuels, green chemicals, and other advanced energy technologies, strengthening their commitment to sustainable and inclusive growth.

- Oman has set an ambitious goal to attract one million Indian tourists annually, up from 700,000 in 2024, as part of its broader economic diversification and tourism expansion strategy. Targeting high-value segments like luxury travel, destination weddings, MICE events, and adventure tourism, the country is leveraging its cultural ties with India, diverse landscapes, and enhanced air connectivity. Campaigns like the 'Focus Oman' roadshow in Jaipur aim to engage Indian travelers, while visitor-friendly visa policies support the initiative. India remains a priority market, reflecting strong bilateral relations and tourism growth potential.
- Russia is set to welcome 1 million Indian workers by the end of 2025 to address a severe workforce shortage in sectors like construction, machinery, electronics, and textiles, especially in industrial hubs like Sverdlovsk. The Indian ambassador confirmed rising consular demand as more Indians take up these opportunities. Russia plans to increase its foreign worker quota by 1.5 times in 2025 to tackle a projected 3.1 million worker deficit by 2030, making it a new major destination for Indian skilled labor beyond traditional countries.
- The Lithuanian parliament has approved Inga Ruginiene, current Minister of Social Security and Labour, as the country's new Prime Minister. A member of the Social Democrats, Ruginiene must now present a proposed cabinet list within 15 days for parliamentary approval. She will formally assume office after the President's decree. Elected to parliament in 2024, she previously served as chair of the Lithuanian Trade Union Confederation.
- South Korea has passed a bill to ban mobile phones and digital devices in school classrooms starting March 2026, aiming to tackle social media addiction among youth. With 99% internet penetration and 98% smartphone ownership, the ban reflects growing concerns about students' mental health and focus. The law, supported across parties, exempts use for students with disabilities and educational purposes. Critics warn it may infringe on children's rights.
- India-Africa trade has surpassed USD 100 billion in 2024-25, marking significant growth from USD 56 billion in 2019-20, with India emerging as one of the top-five investors in Africa. India has extended over USD 12 billion in concessional loans and USD 700 million in grants for African projects, along with offering 50,000 scholarships to African youth. The partnership theme has evolved to "Co-creating a Shared Future", emphasizing mutual trust and collaboration.











International Current Affairs of July 2025

- India has restricted jute imports from Bangladesh through all land and sea ports except Nhava Sheva to protect its domestic industry from subsidized and dumped products. The move follows growing concerns over rural unemployment, depressed prices, and underutilized jute mills. India also blocked any re-export routes via Nepal or Bhutan, ensuring that unfair trade practices cannot harm Indian economic interests. This is the second such action after similar apparel restrictions in May 2025.
- The G7's decision to exempt U.S. multinational companies from the global minimum tax marks a pivotal shift in international tax diplomacy. This "side-by-side" taxation model, driven by President Trump's legislative push, allows American corporations to be taxed solely by the U.S., insulating them from external levies. While this benefits domestic businesses, it raises concerns over OECD consensus, potential retaliatory taxes, and uneven competition in the global economy. The deal's final acceptance now hinges on OECD's approval, making it a key development in international economic governance.
- The QUAD nations—India, Japan, the US, and Australia—have launched their first-ever 'At Sea Observer Mission', marking a strategic leap in maritime cooperation under the Wilmington Declaration. The mission, carried out aboard the USCGC Stratton, features cross-deck participation of officers, including women, from each country. It aims to enhance interoperability, promote a rules-based Indo-Pacific, and align with India's SAGAR vision and Indo-Pacific Oceans Initiative. As maritime challenges intensify, this initiative strengthens collective readiness, fosters mutual trust, and sets a blueprint for future QUAD coast guard collaborations.
- India and the UAE have initiated strategic cooperation in the production of green steel and high-grade aluminium under the India-UAE CEPA framework. The meeting between Union Minister H.D. Kumaraswamy and UAE Economy Minister Abdulla Bin Touq Al Marri highlighted joint goals in sustainable manufacturing, resource security, and expanding trade in automotive and strategic sectors. Key Indian CPSEs like SAIL, NMDC, and MECON are set to anchor this partnership, with plans for a joint working group to streamline collaboration and contribute to India's \$5 trillion economic vision.
- Pakistan has assumed the Presidency of the United Nations Security Council (UNSC) for July 2025 as part of its nonpermanent membership. Ambassador Asim Iftikhar Ahmad and Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar will lead key debates focused on multilateralism, peaceful dispute resolution, and OIC cooperation. The presidency aligns with Pakistan's additional leadership of the Taliban Sanctions Committee and comes at a crucial time of global instability, positioning Pakistan to play a central role in fostering peace, dialogue, and inclusive diplomacy.

- Zohran Mamdani's victory in the NYC Democratic Mayoral Primary marks a major political upset, defeating former Governor Andrew Cuomo by a 12-point margin after a ranked choice vote. His progressive platform, including free public services, rent freeze, and higher taxation on the wealthy, resonated with working-class voters.
- On Tuesday, July 1, 2025, Pakistan assumed the role of President of the United Nations Security Council (UNSC) for the month of July. This rotating presidency is a key responsibility, as the UNSC is the primary body for maintaining global peace and security. Pakistan stated it will lead with "purpose, humility, and conviction", focusing on fairness and cooperation. As a non-permanent member of the Council since January 2025, Pakistan was elected with strong support—182 out of 193 votes.
- In a major diplomatic shift, Russia has become the first country to officially recognise the Taliban government in Afghanistan since it took power in August 2021. On July 3, 2025, Russia removed the Taliban from its list of banned organisations and accepted the credentials of Afghan Ambassador Gul Hassan Hassan. The move aims to boost bilateral cooperation. The Taliban hailed the recognition as a historic step and urged other nations to follow Russia's example.
- The European Union (EU) on July 2, 2025, shared its 2040 climate goal to cut greenhouse gas emissions by 90%, aiming for carbon neutrality by 2050. To gain wider support, the plan allows using international carbon credits from 2036, up to 3%. This has raised concerns among climate groups about weakening the effort. Key EU leaders like Wopke Hoekstra and Ursula von der Leyen defended the plan as ambitious yet flexible. The final decision will come after discussions in July and a vote in September, with hopes of passing it before COP30 in Brazil.
- On July 6, 2025, Jennifer Geerlings-Simons was elected as Suriname's first female President. She will take office on July 16 and faces the huge task of fixing the country's troubled economy. The previous government had taken help from the IMF and reduced subsidies, which caused protests. Simons plans to improve tax collection and manage the country's debt. Suriname is also waiting for its offshore oil production to begin in 2028, which could bring economic relief. The country hopes her leadership will bring stability and progress.
- The Mauna Loa Observatory in Hawaii, which has been measuring atmospheric CO₂ for over 65 years, may soon shut down due to a lack of U.S. government funding. Known for producing the iconic Keeling Curve, this observatory has provided crucial evidence of human-caused climate change by showing a steady rise in carbon dioxide levels—mainly from burning fossil fuels. Its long-term data is vital for tracking global warming and guiding climate action worldwide.











- Elon Musk has announced the formation of a new US political group called the America Party, aiming to change the country's traditional two-party system. This move comes after a major public argument with former President Donald Trump, where Musk criticized Trump's financial plans and left his role in the government. Musk wants the America Party to fight waste and give people more power. So far, the party has not been officially registered, and it's not clear who will lead it.
- United Nations General Assembly passed a resolution with 116 votes urging Afghanistan's Taliban rulers to stop their oppression of women and girls and to remove terrorist groups from the country. While Germany led the effort, the United States and Israel voted against it, and 12 countries including India, China, and Iran abstained. The resolution also asked for more economic support for Afghanistan and suggested that UN Secretary-General António Guterres appoint a coordinator to lead global actions. The resolution is not legally binding, but it shows strong world opinion and concern about human rights and terrorism in Afghanistan.
- Colombia and Uzbekistan have joined the New Development Bank (NDB), taking the total number of members to 11. This announcement comes ahead of the 17th BRICS Summit. The NDB, led by Dilma Rousseff and based in Shanghai, funds projects in infrastructure, clean energy, and digital development. The bank aims to support the Global South and help countries keep pace with modern technology.
- On July 7, 2025, Trinidad and Tobago became the eighth country and the first in the Caribbean to adopt UPI (Unified Payments Interface) for Indian travelers. The move was announced during Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit, and it allows Indian visitors to pay in rupees by scanning QR codes at partner stores using UPI-enabled apps. Other countries with UPI access include UAE, Singapore, France, Bhutan, Nepal, Sri Lanka, and Mauritius. To use UPI abroad, travelers need a linked UPI app, international roaming, and UPI Global access. The conversion fees are minimal, making UPI a low-cost and simple way to pay while traveling.
- EU finance ministers approved Bulgaria's adoption of the euro, making it the 21st member of the eurozone starting January 1, 2026. Bulgaria will shift from the lev to the euro at a fixed rate of 1.95583 lev per euro. Prime Minister Rossen Jeliazkov called it a "landmark moment", while top EU leaders like Ursula von der Leyen, Christine Lagarde, and Valdis Dombrovskis praised the move. Though economic criteria have been met, the transition faces domestic opposition, with protests in Sofia over inflation and loss of purchasing power.

- The United States has imposed sanctions on Francesca Albanese, the UN Special Rapporteur on human rights in the occupied Palestinian territories, accusing her of anti-Israel bias and links to extremism, which she denies. The move, announced amid the Gaza conflict, has drawn condemnation from the UN, NGOs, and legal experts for threatening the independence of UN investigators. Albanese, a seasoned international human rights lawyer, has accused Israel of genocide and apartheid and supported ICC arrest warrants against Israeli leaders.
- On July 9, 2025, during the 47th session in Paris, UNESCO removed three African sites—the Rainforests of Atsinanana in Madagascar, Abu Mena in Egypt, and the Old Town of Ghadames in Libya—from the World Heritage in Danger List. These sites had faced serious threats such as illegal logging, rising water levels, and war damage. UNESCO's Director-General Audrey Azoulay praised the countries for restoring their sites and noted that Africa is receiving special support. This success shows the positive results of ongoing global efforts to protect cultural and natural heritage.
- UNESCO added three sites in Cambodia—Tuol Sleng Genocide Museum, M-13 prison, and Choeung Ek Killing Fields—to its World Heritage List on July 11, 2025 during its 47th committee session in Paris. These places were once used by the Khmer Rouge regime (1975–1979) for torture and executions. The move comes on the 50th anniversary of the regime's rise to power. Prime Minister Hun Manet and several leaders welcomed the recognition. This marks Cambodia's first modern historical nomination and aims to educate youth, honor victims, and promote peace.
- India became the first country to launch the Traditional Knowledge Digital Library (TKDL), earning praise from the World Health Organization (WHO). The platform uses AI to protect and expand India's traditional medicine systems like Ayurveda and Unani. The WHO's report highlighted India's success in merging ancient knowledge with modern technology, mentioning innovations like Ayurgenomics, AI diagnostics, and digital health platforms. These efforts support PM Modi's vision of AI for all and make India a leader in digital health and traditional medicine integration.
- France announced a new agreement with New Caledonia that would make the territory a state within the French Republic, giving it more freedom while staying under French control. The plan must be approved by both the French Parliament and New Caledonian voters. The move comes after 2024 protests over voting rights and aims to ease tensions between Indigenous Kanak people and French authorities. The agreement introduces New Caledonian nationality, dual citizenship, and plans for a new referendum. It highlights President Emmanuel Macron's effort to balance unity and respect for local identity.











- US Department of Defense (DoD) gave \$200 million contracts to OpenAI, Google, Anthropic, and xAI to boost national security with advanced AI systems. These companies will develop autonomous software tools for military use, guided by the Pentagon's Chief Digital and Artificial Intelligence Office (CDAO). The goal is to stay ahead in global defence by using safe, smart, and mission-ready AI. This move also follows recent White House guidance to build a strong and innovative AI ecosystem in the United States.
- In 2024, South Asia reached a record high in childhood immunisation, as reported by UNICEF and WHO. The region saw 92% DTP3 vaccine coverage, a 27% drop in zero-dose children, and a 39% decline in measles cases. India and Nepal showed significant progress, while Bangladesh and Sri Lanka expanded HPV vaccinations. This success is driven by government leadership, community health workers, and global partnerships. However, with over 2.9 million children still un- or under-vaccinated, continued efforts are needed to ensure universal vaccine access across South Asia.
- Yuliia Svyrydenko, a seasoned economist and diplomatic negotiator, has been appointed the Prime Minister of Ukraine, replacing Denys Shmyhal, who now serves as Defence Minister. Her appointment amid the ongoing Russia-Ukraine war marks a critical moment in Ukraine's political landscape, reflecting President Volodymyr Zelenskyy's strategy to reinforce trusted leadership, economic recovery, and international partnerships. Known for her role in securing a mineral deal with the US, Svyrydenko brings both competence and loyalty to one of Ukraine's most challenging leadership roles during wartime.
- India's UN Voting Pattern has experienced a significant transformation, with abstentions hitting a record 44% in 2025, reflecting a shift towards strategic autonomy amid a polarised global order. This change underscores India's role as a middle power, opting for nuanced diplomacy over alignment. By abstaining on contentious resolutions involving issues like Russia-Ukraine, Myanmar, and Israel-Palestine, India maintains bilateral relations and avoids global power blocs, thereby strengthening its non-aligned yet assertive foreign policy.
- Gita Gopinath, the First Deputy Managing Director of the IMF, will step down in August 2025 to return to Harvard University as an economics professor. Known for her role during the pandemic and global economic disruptions, she advanced the IMF's work in fiscal policy, international trade, and debt analysis. Her resignation offers the U.S. Treasury a chance to name a successor amid changing global economic dynamics. Gopinath leaves a lasting legacy of intellectual leadership, with her next chapter focused on research and training future economists.

- A replica of the Ashoka Pillar was unveiled at Waskaduwa Sri Subhuthi Viharaya, Sri Lanka. Sponsored by Kyabje Ling Rinpoche and supported by the Government of India, the project honors Emperor Ashoka's role in spreading Buddhism to Sri Lanka. This act reinforces India-Sri Lanka Buddhist ties, complementing India's other initiatives such as Pali language promotion, solar support for temples, and preservation of Buddha relics. The temple's housing of Kapilavastu relics further enhances its spiritual value, making it a symbol of bilateral cultural unity.
- The India-UK Free Trade Agreement (FTA) 2025, formally called CETA, aims to boost trade to USD 120 billion by 2030 by removing tariffs on key exports like textiles, leather, and reducing import duties on UK goods. It includes provisions on services, innovation, social security, and IPR, with ratification pending from the UK Parliament. The Double Contribution Convention Agreement further supports Indian professionals abroad. This deal reinforces India's global economic engagement and sets the stage for future FTAs with major economies.
- The United States, under President Donald Trump, has withdrawn from UNESCO for the second time, citing "woke" and anti-Israel biases. This aligns with the America First policy and mirrors the 2017 decision, later reversed by Joe Biden. UNESCO's recognition of Palestine, alleged politicization, and ideological conflicts were key reasons. The move has been welcomed by Israel, criticized by UNESCO officials, and may reduce US influence in global education and heritage policy while enhancing China's role within the agency.
- A series of earthquakes hit Russia's Kamchatka Peninsula, the strongest at 7.4 magnitude, highlighting the region's location along the Pacific Ring of Fire. The peninsula is a tectonic meeting point between the Pacific and North American plates, prone to frequent seismic activity. Despite an initial tsunami alert, no major wave threat emerged. Kamchatka's unique geography, with its UNESCO-listed volcanoes and mountain ranges, makes it both scientifically significant and disaster-prone.
- China has started building the Motuo Hydropower Station on the Yarlung Tsangpo River, aiming to create the world's largest dam, triggering geopolitical and environmental concerns in India and Bangladesh. The project, costing \$167 billion, involves diverting river flow through tunnels to power five cascading stations. While it aligns with China's energy strategy, it raises fears over river control, livelihood impacts, biodiversity loss, and seismic vulnerability, making it a key geo-environmental issue in the region.
- India has resumed tourist visas for Chinese citizens after a
 five-year suspension caused by COVID-19 and diplomatic
 tensions. Chinese nationals can apply online and visit Indian
 consulates in Beijing, Shanghai, and Guangzhou for
 processing. The move comes soon after the Kailash
 Mansarovar Yatra resumed, reflecting efforts to boost
 people-to-people ties, improve bilateral relations, and
 revitalize India's tourism sector.











- France will formally recognise the State of Palestine in September 2025, becoming the first G7 nation to do so. This move aims to push for a ceasefire, rebuild Gaza, and promote a two-state solution. It has been welcomed by Palestine, condemned by Israel, and rejected by the US. The recognition carries symbolic and diplomatic weight but faces several geopolitical challenges.
- India extended a ₹4,850 crore Line of Credit to the Maldives during PM Modi's state visit in July 2025, reinforcing the Neighbourhood First and MAHASAGAR vision. Talks for a Free Trade Agreement (FTA) and Bilateral Investment Treaty (BIT) were launched. A key development was the restructuring of earlier credit terms, reducing the Maldives' debt repayment burden by 40%. This outreach reflects India's role as a development partner, aiding infrastructure and regional security in the face of geopolitical competition with China.

International Current Affairs of June 2025

- Luís Montenegro has been reappointed as Portugal's Prime Minister following the final general election results. His centre-right alliance will form a minority government. Despite the rise of the far-right Chega party, Montenegro ruled out any immediate constitutional reforms. His priorities include economic growth, healthcare transformation, and enhancing public services. This development marks a notable shift in Portugal's political landscape toward pragmatic governance.
- In 2024, Germany surpassed Japan to become the world's largest creditor, ending Japan's 34-year reign. Although Japan hit a record in external assets, Germany's strong trade surplus, robust euro, and effective investment strategies gave it the edge. Japan's decline is linked to an ageing population, weaker yen, and conservative foreign investments. However, wage growth, the NISA investment scheme, and gradual rate hikes may help Japan recover.
- Annalena Baerbock was elected President of the 80th United Nations General Assembly on June 2, 2025, with 167 votes. A former German Foreign Minister, she becomes the first woman from the Western European group and the fifth woman overall to hold the post. She aims to serve as an "honest broker", focusing on UN efficiency, the 2030 Agenda, and global inclusivity, especially under the framework of the 2022 Veto Initiative.
- Lee Jae-myung, a liberal opposition figure, was elected President of South Korea on June 4, 2025, after the removal of Yoon Suk Yeol. Lee, known for reformist and populist policies, promised economic reform, pragmatic diplomacy, and peaceful engagement with North Korea. Despite concerns over his alleged pro-China stance, he reaffirmed ties with the U.S.-South Korea alliance. His leadership follows a phase of political instability.

- Karol Nawrocki, backed by Donald Trump, won Poland's presidential election with 50.89% of the vote, narrowly defeating Rafal Trzaskowski. A conservative nationalist and former head of the Institute of National Remembrance, he symbolizes the Law and Justice party's political comeback. Nawrocki's stance is shaped by patriotism, anticommunism, and traditional values, with potential friction ahead in EU relations.
- Nicaragua has become the 101st nation to accept the WTO
 Agreement on Fisheries Subsidies, bringing the pact closer
 to enforcement. The deal aims to eliminate subsidies
 promoting illegal, unreported, and unregulated (IUU)
 fishing and promotes marine sustainability. It includes the
 creation of a Fish Fund for developing countries and was
 adopted at the MC12 meeting in Geneva.
- Bangladesh's interim government introduced new Taka banknotes excluding the image of Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, replacing it with visuals of natural and cultural heritage sites. The redesigned Taka 1000, 50, and 20 notes aim to depoliticize currency amidst ongoing political tension and legal actions against Sheikh Hasina. The new notes will circulate alongside the existing ones, promoting an inclusive national identity.
- India has won the Presidency of the International Institute of Administrative Sciences (IIAS) for the 2025–2028 term, with V. Srinivas, Secretary of DARPG, elected as head. India defeated Austria, receiving 87 of 141 votes. This milestone advances India's leadership in global public administration reform. The IIAS is based in Brussels and comprises 31 member countries and institutions.
- On June 3, 2025, the UN General Assembly elected Bahrain, Colombia, DRC, Liberia, and Latvia as non-permanent members of the UN Security Council for 2026–2027. Latvia entered the Council for the first time ever, while Colombia secured its seventh term. The elections showcased a commitment to regional balance and global peacekeeping inclusivity.
- The Bangladesh interim regime dropped the title "Father of the Nation" for Sheikh Mujibur Rahman in the revised Liberation War Act 2025, announced on June 3. The law also excludes the Mujib Bahini from official freedom fighter status. A new category called "Associates of Liberation War" has been introduced to recognize broader support during the 1971 independence movement.
- On June 9, 2025, U.S. President Donald Trump announced a new travel ban targeting 12 countries like Afghanistan, Iran, and Libya, with partial restrictions on 8 more, including Cuba and Venezuela. This followed a visa overstay-related attack and was justified on national security grounds, citing inadequate background verification systems.











- Iran confirmed that Russia will build eight nuclear power plants, including four in Bushehr, under a pre-existing deal.
 The agreement supports Iran's goal to triple its nuclear capacity, reinforcing energy cooperation with Russia and the aim of clean energy self-reliance.
- Israel launched the second phase of Operation Rising Lion, striking Iran's Natanz uranium enrichment site, escalating Middle East tensions. While PM Netanyahu vowed continued action, the U.S. distanced itself, labeling it a unilateral move. The attack raises serious concerns about nuclear diplomacy and regional stability.
- The UK government named Blaise Metreweli as the firstever female chief of MI6, announced during the G7 Summit.
 With 25 years in intelligence, she leads MI6's technology and innovation wing. Her appointment comes amid growing cybersecurity threats and rising tensions with countries like Russia and China.
- OpenAI secured a \$200 million contract from the U.S.
 Department of Defense to develop AI tools for national security, with a completion target of July 2026. The deal focuses on frontier AI prototypes for military and enterprise applications, reflecting AI's growing defense role.
- The UN has declared 2026 as the International Year of the Woman Farmer to recognize the crucial role women play in global agriculture. Despite contributing significantly, women face issues like land insecurity, lack of credit, and climate vulnerability. Indian programs like Mahila Kisan Sashaktikaran Pariyojana and ENACT are seen as model initiatives.
- In retaliation to Israeli attacks, Iran launched Operation
 True Promise 3, using Al-guided missiles, decoy saturation,
 and tactics to disrupt Israel's Iron Dome. This marks a shift
 toward cyber-kinetic warfare and exposes the
 vulnerabilities of urban defense systems.

- On June 18, 2025, India and Ukraine held their first Joint
 Working Group meeting on agriculture to enhance
 cooperation in digital farming, food processing, and
 climate-resilient agriculture. India presented platforms like
 e-NAM and the National Mission on Edible Oils, while
 Ukraine sought technology transfer and market access.
- Pakistan finalized a \$1 billion syndicated finance deal, supported by the Asian Development Bank (ADB). Signed on June 18, 2025, it blends Islamic and conventional finance and represents Pakistan's return to Middle East financial markets, signaling trust in its economic reforms.
- In a major cybersecurity breach, 16 billion credentials were leaked from 30 datasets, impacting platforms like Apple, Google, and Telegram. This is not a recycled breach and increases risks of phishing, BEC, and account takeovers.
 Google urged a shift to passkeys for stronger protection.
- Gold has become the second-largest global reserve asset after the U.S. dollar, with a 19% share in 2024, overtaking the euro (16%), according to the ECB. Central banks, especially in emerging markets, increased gold reserves due to inflation fears, geopolitical risks, and currency sanctions.
- In a historic move, South Korea's President Lee Jae Myung appointed Ahn Gyu-back as the country's first civilian Defence Minister in 64 years, amid a sweeping Cabinet overhaul following the impeachment of Yoon Suk Yeol for attempting martial law.
- Starting June 24, 2025, the IAEA and Romania launched ConvEx-3, the largest-ever international nuclear emergency drill, simulating a disaster at Cernavodă Nuclear Plant. With 75+ countries and agencies like WHO and INTERPOL, the 36-hour exercise tested emergency protocols and global coordination.
- In response to U.S. airstrikes, Iran's Parliament suspended cooperation with the IAEA, despite Iran's membership in the NPT. The Iranian Embassy in India thanked Indian civil society for their support during the 12-day war with Israel, marking a turning point in Iran's nuclear diplomacy.

Other Important Banking Related Current Affairs

- Indian public sector banks will raise around ₹45,000 crore in FY26 through Qualified Institutional Placement (QIP) of shares, starting with SBI. The government also plans to complete its stake sale in IDBI Bank by October 2025 and sell shares in several other PSU banks. These moves are part of the government's ₹47,000 crore disinvestment plan announced in the Union Budget 2025–26, aimed at strengthening banks and encouraging private investment.
- Taiwan's largest private bank, CTBC Bank, has applied to set up an IFSC Banking Unit (IBU) in GIFT City, Gujarat. The application was filed with the IFSCA and proposes using 3,100 sq ft of office space in Brigade Towers. The bank already operates in New Delhi and now plans to expand its services through GIFT City. Other banks from Taiwan, UAE, and France have also made similar moves. As of March 2025, 31 IBUs have been set up in GIFT City, showing strong international interest.
- The UPI-PayNow linkage, expanded by NPCI International on July 17, 2025, now includes 19 Indian banks, aiming to boost real-time cross-border remittances between India and Singapore. Supported by the RBI and Monetary Authority of Singapore, this initiative enhances financial inclusion, especially for migrant workers and students, and showcases India's progress in global digital payment innovation.
- EximPe, a leading fintech startup, has secured RBI's in-principle PA-CB licence, enabling it to facilitate cross-border payments for e-commerce, digital services, and B2B trade. The firm plans to expand 10X by FY26, with over \$450 million in processed transactions and support from \$3.5 million in equity funding. This milestone enhances India's presence in the Asian cross-border payment corridor, and strengthens the role of regulated fintech solutions for SMEs.
- HSBC's withdrawal from the NZBA makes it the first UK bank to quit the coalition, following a trend set by major US and Canadian lenders. The exit has sparked widespread criticism from climate campaigners and investors, raising doubts about HSBC's climate priorities and signalling potential risks for global climate coordination within the banking sector. While HSBC reaffirms its net zero 2050 target, the move has exposed deepening divides in how banks handle climate risks, disclosures, and sector-wide accountability.
- Public Sector Banks (PSBs) have identified 1,629 wilful defaulters with outstanding dues of ₹1.62 trillion as of March 31, 2025, as per the Union Finance Ministry. The government has implemented several legal and administrative measures to recover NPAs, including action through SARFAESI, IBC, and public disclosure via credit bureaus like CIBIL and Experian. This issue remains a major concern for the health of the banking sector, especially given the slowing deposit growth and rising credit risk.

- The Investor Education and Protection Fund Authority (IEPFA) and SEBI launched the first Niveshak Shivir in Pune on June 1, 2025, focusing on helping investors reclaim unclaimed dividends and shares, update KYC and nominations, and learn about the IEPF claim process. Over 450 participants benefited from personalized assistance, including a search facility, form filling support, and awareness of common errors. A special NSDL brochure was also released to guide investors. The initiative reflects a commitment to transparent, investor-centric governance, with more city-wide events to follow.
- The SBI Economic Research Report forecasts a rise in household net financial savings to ₹22 lakh crore in FY25, making up 6.5% of GNDI—a sign of economic strengthening. It also highlights the RBI's record surplus transfer of ₹2.69 lakh crore and the resilience of India's financial system despite challenges like rising fraud amounts. The report paints a picture of robust financial fundamentals and transformative shifts in savings, governance, and institutional efficiency.
- In May 2025, credit card spending in India jumped by 14.5% year-on-year, reaching ₹1.89 trillion, as per RBI data. The increase was driven by the issuance of 760,000 new credit cards, with HDFC Bank and SBI Cards leading the growth. The total number of cards in circulation rose to 111.19 million, indicating enhanced consumer confidence, a growing shift toward digital payments, and rising retail credit penetration. This trend reinforces the role of private banks in driving the country's digital consumption economy.

- The Income Tax Department has awarded the ₹811.5 crore PAN 2.0 project to LTIMindtree Ltd, aiming to digitally transform PAN and TAN management. Cleared in November 2024 and scheduled to go live in 18 months, the project will enhance security, efficiency, and taxpayer convenience, handling services like Aadhaar-PAN linking, allotment, reissuance, and validation on a unified digital platform.
- India has uncovered ₹7 trillion in GST evasion across 91,000 cases between April 2020 and March 2025, according to Minister of State for Finance Pankaj Chaudhary. Of this, only ₹1.29 trillion has been voluntarily paid back by taxpayers. Notably, ₹1.78 trillion is linked to fake input tax credit (ITC), with just 7% recovery. The rise in evasion coincides with the government's deployment of advanced tech tools—including e-invoicing, risk-based audits, facial recognition, and E-way bill tracking—which have significantly strengthened GST compliance and fraud detection.
- India's services sector surged to an 11-month high in July 2025, with the HSBC India Services PMI rising to 60.5, up from 60.4 in June, according to S&P Global. This marks the 48th straight month of growth, driven by robust international demand and steady domestic sales. The finance and insurance sectors led the growth, while real estate and business services lagged due to cautious spending.
- Deloitte India has forecasted India's economic growth to range between 6.4% and 6.7% for the fiscal year 2025-26, building on a solid growth rate of 6.5% in 2024-25. This optimistic outlook is anchored by resilient domestic demand, easing inflation, and strategic global trade initiatives. A dynamic consumer base, resilient capital markets, and a globally competitive workforce. Ongoing and upcoming trade talks with the UK, US, and European Union are expected to enhance market access, income, and employment opportunities.
- Goldman Sachs has trimmed India's GDP growth forecast to 6.5% for 2025 and 6.4% for 2026, citing concerns over US-India trade tensions after President Trump's 25% tariffs on Indian goods. While the investment bank expects some tariffs may be negotiated, it warns that the main risk lies in policy uncertainty, which could hurt investor confidence. On inflation, forecasts have been lowered to 3.0%, driven by easing vegetable prices, though Goldman cautions that such low inflation is rare in India and remains vulnerable to shocks.











ECONOMY NEWS

- Karnataka's GST evasion surged to ₹39,577 crore in FY25, over five times higher than the previous year, with 1,254 cases and 9 arrests. Voluntary tax payments totaled ₹1,623 crore. Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman clarified that CGST authorities did not issue notices based solely on UPI transactions, which were sent by state GST offices affecting mainly small traders. This marks a sharp rise in tax evasion detection compared to ₹7,202 crore in FY24 and ₹25,839 crore in FY23, highlighting increased efforts to curb evasion while addressing traders' concerns.
- India is poised to become the world's most sought-after consumer market, according to Morgan Stanley, driven by a major energy transition, rising credit-to-GDP ratio, and increased manufacturing share in GDP. Key factors include lower oil intensity, growing exports (especially services), fiscal consolidation, and declining inflation volatility, all contributing to macro stability, lower real interest rates, and a shift in household investments toward equities. Catalysts for further growth include a potential US trade deal, capex boosts, loan acceleration, and improving trade with China.
- The Centre has proposed a two-slab GST overhaul with 5% and 18% rates, alongside a 40% tax on sin goods like tobacco and pan masala, aiming to simplify the tax structure, boost consumption, and ease compliance. Key changes include shifting most common-use goods from 12% to 5%, and aspirational items like TVs from 28% to 18%. The reform also includes structural fixes like correcting inverted duty structures, streamlining classifications, faster registrations, and automated refunds, with implementation likely by Q3 FY 2025-26.
- India's merchandise exports rose 7.3% to \$37.24 billion in July 2025, driven by growth in engineering goods, gems and jewellery, electronics, pharmaceuticals, and chemicals. Notably, electronics exports surged 34% to \$3.77 billion. However, imports increased by 8.6% to \$64.59 billion, pushing the trade deficit to an eight-month high of \$27.35 billion. From April to July, exports grew to \$149.20 billion, imports to \$244.01 billion, and total goods and services exports reached \$277.63 billion, up 5.23% year-on-year.
- Bank credit growth has slowed to 1.4% in FY26, down from 2.3% last year, while deposit growth remains steady at 3.4%. According to RBI data, year-on-year, deposits rose 10.2% and advances 10% by July 25. The slowdown in credit is mainly due to weaker corporate demand, as companies shift toward market instruments like bonds. Despite rate cuts, housing loan demand hasn't picked up significantly, though overall financial flows to the commercial sector have increased.

- India's foreign exchange reserves rose by \$4.74 billion to reach \$693.62 billion as of August 8, 2025, driven by increases in foreign currency assets (\$2.37 billion), gold reserves (\$2.16 billion), special drawing rights (\$169 million), and the country's IMF reserve position (\$45 million). Despite a recent dip from a record high of \$704.885 billion in September 2024, the Reserve Bank of India continues to monitor and manage the forex market to maintain exchange rate stability and prevent sharp rupee depreciation.
- India's net direct tax collection for FY26 fell 3.95% to ₹6.64 lakh crore, mainly due to a 10% rise in refunds totaling ₹1.35 lakh crore, despite a smaller 1.87% dip in gross collections. Key components include corporate tax (₹2.29 lakh crore), non-corporate tax (₹4.12 lakh crore), and Securities Transaction Tax (₹22,362 crore), with the government targeting a 12.7% increase in total direct tax collections to ₹25.20 lakh crore.
- India's retail inflation dropped to an 8-year low of 1.55% in July 2025, mainly due to a sharp fall in food prices (food inflation at -1.76%). This is the first time inflation fell below the RBI's target band in over six years. Despite a recent rise in fuel prices (2.67%), the RBI kept the repo rate steady at 5.50%, maintaining a neutral stance with an FY26 inflation projection of 3.1%. The decline offers the RBI flexibility to support growth amid global trade tensions and economic challenges.
- S&P Global Ratings upgraded the long-term credit ratings of 10 Indian financial institutions—seven banks and three finance companies—following India's first sovereign rating upgrade in 18 years to 'BBB/Stable/A-2'. Citing India's strong economic growth, improved inflation management, and structural reforms like the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code (IBC), S&P highlighted enhanced credit culture, faster bad loan recovery, and reduced systemic risk. India's GDP growth averaged 8.8% (2022-24), with projections of 6.8% annually for the next three years, supporting a positive outlook for the financial sector.
- India's WPI inflation remained in the negative zone for the second consecutive month, registering -0.58% in July, largely due to falling prices of food articles, mineral oils, crude petroleum, and basic metals, as per the Ministry of Commerce and Industry. The WPI food index dropped by -2.15%, while deflation in primary articles and fuel & power stood at -4.95% and -2.43% respectively. However, manufactured products saw inflation rise to 2.05%. The drop aligns with a cooling retail inflation (CPI), which also hit an eight-year low of 1.55% in July.











- India's GDP growth is projected at 6.7% in Q1 FY2026, surpassing the RBI's target of 6.5%, according to ICRA. While overall growth slows from 7.4% in Q4 FY2025, the services sector leads with an 8.3% rise, offsetting declines in industry (4.0%) and agriculture (4.5%). Strong government spending, including a 52% surge in central capital expenditure and rising state outlays, along with robust project activity, support the growth. Improved monetary transmission and potential GST rationalisation are expected to boost urban consumption ahead.
- India's eight core industries grew by 2% in July 2025 compared to last year, driven by higher production of steel (12.8%), cement (11.7%), fertilisers (2%), and electricity (0.5%), according to the Commerce and Industry Ministry. These industries, including coal, crude oil, natural gas, petroleum refinery products, together form 40.27% of the Index of Industrial Production (IIP). While coal (-12.3%), crude oil (-1.3%), natural gas (-3.2%), and petroleum refinery output (-1%) declined due to monsoon effects, the overall steady growth reflects robust demand from infrastructure projects and a good kharif sowing season. Cumulative growth for April-July 2025 stood at 1.6%.
- India's growth momentum remains strong despite US tariff hikes, says S&P Global Ratings, which upgraded India's sovereign credit rating to "BBB" with a stable outlook the first upgrade in 18 years. Citing robust domestic demand, fiscal consolidation, and infrastructure reforms, S&P projects 6.8% average GDP growth over the next three years. India's low trade dependence shields it from global shocks. The upgrade also raised ratings for major banks and NBFCs, reflecting broad economic resilience and policy continuity.
- India suspends 11% cotton import duty until September 30, signaling willingness to address U.S. tariff hike on Indian goods. The move aims to ease pressure on India's garment industry, which faces nearly 60% tariffs on exports to the U.S., and helps maintain competitiveness against China and Bangladesh. The waiver may be extended depending on future negotiations.
- India's economy is projected to grow at a robust 6.7% in Q1 FY26, driven by strong government capital expenditure (up 52% YoY), reviving rural demand, and a resilient services sector including finance, IT, and transport. While construction and agriculture showed solid performance, concerns persist due to slower industrial output (IIP growth at 2%) and climate/trade disruptions. Despite these headwinds, the RBI's 6.5% growth forecast suggests steady momentum, with official NSO GDP data due on August 29 expected to confirm this trend.

- Fitch Ratings has affirmed India's Long-Term Foreign-Currency Issuer Default Rating (IDR) at 'BBB-' with a stable outlook, citing the country's robust economic growth and strong external finances. Projected GDP growth remains strong at 6.5% for 2025-26, well above peers, supported by solid domestic demand, public capex, and steady private consumption. While US tariff risks pose moderate downside concerns, Fitch expects limited direct impact on GDP but notes potential effects on business sentiment.
- Goldman Sachs projects India's household savings will generate \$9.5 trillion inflows into financial assets over the next decade, driven by a shift from physical assets like real estate and gold to long-term savings products, equities, and bank deposits. This rise in financial savings (around 13% of GDP) will support corporate investments, long-duration bond markets, and expand retail participation in capital markets, marking a significant deepening of India's financialization trend.
- India's Index of Industrial Production (IIP) grew by 3.5% in July 2025, driven primarily by a 5.4% rise in manufacturing, as per Quick Estimates released on 28th August 2025. Sector-wise, Mining contracted by 7.2%, Electricity grew 0.6%, and Manufacturing led the surge with 14 of 23 industries showing positive growth. Major contributors include basic metals (12.7%), electrical equipment (15.9%), and non-metallic mineral products (9.5%). Under use-based classification, highest growth was seen in Infrastructure/Construction goods (11.9%), Intermediate goods (5.8%), and Consumer durables (7.7%), positioning these as the top positive contributors to overall IIP growth.

BUSINESS NEWS

- India's UPI platform reached an all-time high in July 2025 with 1,947 crore transactions worth ₹25.1 lakh crore, showing a 35% rise in volume and a 22% growth in value year-on-year. With 62.8 crore daily transactions and deeper reach into Tier-2 and Tier-3 cities, UPI continues to dominate India's cashless economy, driven by innovations like credit on UPI, recurring payments, and strong government support.
- The India Post Payments Bank (IPPB) has rolled out Aadhaar-based face authentication nationwide, allowing customers to conduct banking transactions using facial recognition without fingerprints or OTPs. Developed under UIDAI, the feature enhances financial inclusion and digital security, especially benefiting the elderly, differently-abled, and those with worn fingerprints, while ensuring safe banking during health emergencies.











- Following the resignation of MD & CEO Girsh Kousgi, PNB Housing Finance has appointed Jatul Anand as Executive Director and Valli Sekar as Chief Business Officer Affordable Business. While Kousgi will step down officially on October 28, 2025, he will assist with the transition. Despite an 18% fall in share price, the company reaffirmed its focus on growth, asset quality, and margins, even as it faces the challenge of multiple senior-level exits.
- The US decision to impose a 25% tariff on Indian goods is projected by SBI Research to reduce India's FY26 GDP growth by 25–30 bps. The tariff will mainly affect electronics, gems and jewelry, pharmaceuticals, and machinery, which together make up nearly half of India's exports to the US. While this creates deflationary pressures, India's diversified export base and support from PLI schemes and GST reforms may cushion the impact. Experts believe that the US economy faces higher risks than India due to this move.
- India's palm oil imports fell 10% in July 2025, totaling 858,000 tons, due to contract cancellations, while soyoil imports surged 38% to 495,000 tons, the highest in three years, aided by delayed shipments and competitive prices. With sunflower oil imports down 7%, India's total edible oil imports still rose 1.5% to 1.53 million tons, the highest since November.
- India's tea production dropped 9% in June 2025 to 133.5 million kg, compared to 146.72 million kg in June 2024, due to adverse weather and pest infestations. Output from both North and South India fell, impacting big planters and small growers alike. The fall was evident across all major tea types, including CTC, orthodox, and green tea, raising concerns for the industry.
- In a strategic move to boost its value-added product portfolio, JSW Steel Limited has committed ₹5,845 crore to expand Cold Rolled Grain-Oriented (CRGO) steel manufacturing in collaboration with JFE Steel Corporation of Japan. This expansion includes increasing the Nashik facility's capacity from 50,000 TPA to 250,000 TPA at a cost of ₹4,300 crore, and upgrading the Vijayanagar unit in Karnataka from 62,000 TPA to 100,000 TPA with ₹1,545 crore investment.
- The Business Confidence Index (BCI) surged to 149.4 in the first quarter of fiscal year 2025-26 (April-June), up from 139.3 in the previous quarter, according to the National Council of Applied Economic Research (NCAER). This jump reflects strong optimism among Indian businesses about the near-term economic outlook. Positive expectations across key indicators, 78.7% of firms expect production to increase. 79.1% anticipate higher domestic sales. 66.5% foresee growth in exports of final products. 54.3% expect increased imports of raw materials, signaling growth in domestic production. Nearly 61% expect pre-tax profits to rise.

- In a major international expansion move, Tata Motors has announced its largest acquisition since Jaguar Land Rover (2008) by agreeing to acquire Italian commercial vehicle manufacturer Iveco for €3.8 billion (excluding its defence business). This also marks the Tata Group's biggest deal since acquiring Corus in 2007. The acquisition aims to merge the complementary capabilities of both companies, with minimal overlap in geographies or industrial assets, resulting in a diversified commercial vehicle giant with combined sales of over 540,000 units annually and revenues of €22 billion. The deal gives Tata Motors a stronghold across Europe (50%), India (35%), and the Americas (15%), and strengthens its position in emerging markets in Asia and Africa.
- India's electronics exports soared over 47% year-on-year to \$12.4 billion in Q1 FY26, driven largely by a 55% surge in mobile phone exports, according to the India Cellular and Electronics Association (ICEA). Non-mobile electronics, including solar modules, networking equipment, and chargers, also grew by 37%. With momentum building, ICEA projects FY26 exports to hit \$46–50 billion, up from \$38.6 billion in FY25. Chairman Pankaj Mohindroo emphasized the need for a domestic supply chain and globally competitive Indian brands to ensure long-term electronic sector sovereignty and value addition.
- Tata AutoComp Systems has signed an agreement to fully acquire the Slovakia-based IAC Group through its British subsidiary, Artifex Interior Systems Limited. While the company has not revealed the financial details, the acquisition involves a conditional agreement to purchase 100% of IAC Group's share capital, expanding Tata AutoComp's global footprint in the auto components sector.

- India's soyoil imports are set to rise by 60% in 2024/25 to a record 5.5 million tons, driven by cheaper prices compared to palm oil. Meanwhile, palm oil imports are expected to drop 13.5% to a five-year low of 7.8 million tons, and sunflower oil imports may fall 20% to 2.8 million tons. This shift will increase India's total edible oil imports by about 1% to 16.1 million tons, impacting global vegetable oil markets by boosting soyoil prices while pressuring palm oil futures.
- The Department of Investment and Public Asset Management (DIPAM) has appointed merchant bankers and legal advisers for three years to manage minority stake sales in LIC, public sector banks (PSBs), and insurance firms at suitable times. This move supports the government's aim to meet SEBI's minimum public shareholding (MPS) norm of 10%, especially for LIC, which currently has only 3.5% public float. The Centre may sell small stakes in LIC and up to five PSBs, and plans to make LIC eligible for benchmark indices by increasing its public float, boosting long-term investment potential.
- Jio Financial Services (JFSL) has launched a paid tax planning and filing feature on its JioFinance app, developed in partnership with TaxBuddy. The module offers both self-service (starting at ₹24) and expert-assisted (from ₹999) tax filing options, aiming to simplify ITR filing and improve deduction accuracy. Key tools include a tax planner for projecting and reducing future liabilities, regime comparisons, and guidance on deductions under sections like 80C and 80D, helping users save money and avoid dependence on costly intermediaries.

- BEML Limited, a state-owned Indian company, has secured its first overseas rail-metro contract from Malaysia, valued at USD 1 million, for the retrofit and reconditioning of their Mass Rapid Transport System. This milestone coincides with BEML's expansion, including a new warehousing facility in Bengaluru supporting aerospace growth. BEML, under the Ministry of Defence, operates across defence, rail and metro, mining, and construction sectors, with advanced manufacturing and R&D facilities across India.
- India's exports to the US rose 19.94% to \$8.01 billion in July 2025, while imports increased 13.78% to \$4.55 billion, making the US India's top trading partner during April–July FY26, with exports reaching \$33.53 billion (↑21.64%) and imports \$17.41 billion (↑12.33%). India also recorded strong export growth to China (↑27.39% in July), while trade declined with countries like the Netherlands, Singapore, and Australia. A bilateral trade agreement with the US is under negotiation, with the 6th round of talks scheduled for August 25.
- The International Finance Corporation (IFC) has committed \$150 million to the H-DREAM Fund managed by HDFC Capital Advisors to develop 25,000 green-certified affordable and mid-income homes in India. This investment aims to mobilize up to \$850 million from institutional investors, supporting sustainable housing projects certified under EDGE standards. The fund targets India's significant affordable housing gap, estimated at 18 million units in Tier-I and Tier-II cities, promoting energy efficiency and bridging the real estate shortfall.
- At the 19th China Brand Festival held in Shenzhen, the TopBrand 2025 "Top 500 Global Brands" list was unveiled. Microsoft claimed the top spot with a brand value of \$1,062.5 billion, followed closely by NVIDIA (\$1,046.8B) and Apple (\$997.7B). The rest of the top 10 includes Amazon, Alphabet (Google), Saudi Aramco, Walmart, Meta (Facebook), Berkshire Hathaway, and Broadcom. PetroChina emerged as the highest-ranked Chinese brand, placing 14th.
- To combat rising UPI fraud, the NPCI has directed all banks and apps to discontinue peer-to-peer (P2P) 'collect requests' on UPI by October 1, 2025. This change, affecting platforms like PhonePe, Google Pay, and Paytm, will ensure all P2P transactions are payer-initiated, eliminating a highrisk feature often exploited in scams. With Rs 2,000 per transaction caps proving insufficient to curb fraud, this move enhances user control, security, and transparency in India's digital payment ecosystem.











- Foxconn has begun iPhone 17 production at its newly operational Bengaluru factory, making it the company's second-largest iPhone manufacturing unit globally after China. The Devanahalli-based facility, built with a \$2.8 billion (₹25,000 crore) investment, is now producing devices on a small scale, supplementing output from Foxconn's Chennai unit. This marks a major boost for India's electronics manufacturing and Apple's diversification beyond China.
- India's electronics exports surged 47% in Q1 of FY 2025-26, reaching \$12.4 billion, driven by the 'Make in India' initiative, Union Minister Piyush Goyal announced. Electronics production soared from \$31 billion to \$133 billion since 2014-15, with mobile phone manufacturing playing a central role—99.2% of phones sold in India are now made domestically, up from just 26% in 2014. India now hosts 300+ mobile factories, transforming from an importer to the world's second-largest phone maker, with exports rising eightfold to ₹3.27 lakh crore in 2024-25.
- India's Infrastructure Investment Trust (InvIT) market is set to grow 3.5 times from \$73 billion in FY2025 to \$258 billion by 2030, driven by rising investments from institutional investors, pension and insurance funds, foreign participation, and greater retail awareness, according to Knight Frank. The rapid expansion in infrastructure spending—central government outlay rising from \$12 billion in FY2015 to \$75 billion in FY2025—is fueling this surge.
- India's eight core industries grew by 2% in July 2025 compared to last year, driven by higher production of steel (12.8%), cement (11.7%), fertilisers (2%), and electricity (0.5%), according to the Commerce and Industry Ministry. These industries, including coal, crude oil, natural gas, petroleum refinery products, together form 40.27% of the Index of Industrial Production (IIP). - India's marine fish production surged to 44.95 lakh tonnes in 2023-24, growing at 8.9% annually, with 91.1% sustainable fish stocks reported by ICAR-CMFRI. The government's Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana (PMMSY) drives climate-resilient strategies, funding fishing harbours, cold storage, and post-harvest facilities. Research under NICRA and training via MPEDA's NETFISH program support sustainable fishing, improve seafood quality, and boost fisher incomes, strengthening India's marine fisheries sector amid climate challenges.
- India's interest payments on government debt are projected to reach ₹12.76 trillion in FY26, nearly tripling from a decade ago, driven by high borrowing costs, especially from pandemic-era loans. While bond yields have eased since FY24, repayments on earlier bonds are pushing costs higher. The total government debt surged from ₹71 trillion (51.5% of GDP) in FY16 to a projected ₹200 trillion

- (56.1% of GDP) by FY26. The government is using buybacks and bond switches to smooth out repayments and reduce rollover risks.
- India's pharmaceutical exports rose 5.21% to \$7.57 billion in Q1 FY26, driven by formulations and biologics, according to Pharmexcil. Growth was seen in NAFTA, Oceania, Latin America, and Africa, though US pricing pressures dented earnings. Imports also increased 4.21% to \$786 million, mainly in bulk drugs and intermediaries, though this segment shows a declining trend due to the PLI scheme. In FY25, pharma exports had grown 9.39% to \$30.47 billion, but future growth may face tariff and pricing challenges.
- India's seafood exports remained steady at USD 7.45 billion in 2024-25, despite a drop in shipment volume to 16.98 lakh tonnes. Frozen shrimp dominated exports, accounting for nearly 70% of earnings, with the US and China as the largest importers—US imports valued at USD 2.71 billion. Other key markets include the EU, Southeast Asia, and Japan. Major export ports were Vizag and JNPT.
- India's outbound investments surged 67.7% to USD 41.6 billion in FY 2024-25, driven by a focus on ESG priorities, the rise of GIFT City as a strategic investment hub, and global tax reforms, according to an EY report. Indian companies are diversifying globally, expanding beyond traditional hubs like Singapore and Mauritius to countries such as the UAE, Luxembourg, and Switzerland. Sectors like IT, energy, pharma, and automotive are key contributors. GIFT City's role has doubled, offering tax benefits and regulatory clarity, aiding Indian multinationals in managing overseas investments efficiently.
- Japan's Sumitomo Mitsui Banking Corporation (SMBC) has received RBI approval to acquire up to 24.99% stake in Yes Bank, marking a major cross-border M&A deal in India's financial sector. The initial \$1.6 billion investment for a 20% stake is SMBC's largest in India, and the RBI has clarified that SMBC will not be classified as a promoter, easing regulatory requirements. This move strengthens foreign investor confidence and deepens SMBC's presence in India's banking sector.
- India's crude oil imports fell by 8.7% in July to 18.56 million tons, marking an 18-month low since February 2024, amid a 4.3% drop in fuel demand and U.S. tariff threats over India's purchase of Russian oil. Year-on-year, crude imports declined by 4.3% and product imports by 12.8%, while India plans to engage the U.S. with an open mind on trade ties despite ongoing discounted Russian oil buys by state refiners.
- India's coal imports rose marginally by 1.5% to 76.40 million tonnes in the April-June quarter of 2025 compared to last year, despite government efforts to boost domestic production. June imports increased to 23.91 million tonnes, while state-owned Coal India Limited's (CIL) production dropped 8.5% due to monsoon-related challenges. The government assures adequate coal supply for the monsoon season, emphasizing sustainable growth and reduced import dependence.











- Suzuki Motor Corporation has announced a massive ₹70,000 crore investment in India over the next 5–6 years to expand production, launch new models, and strengthen its position in the world's third-largest automobile market. The announcement was made during the launch of the e-Vitara, Suzuki's first electric SUV, at the Hansalpur plant in Gujarat, flagged off by Prime Minister Narendra Modi.
- National Aluminium Company (NALCO) will invest ₹300 billion (\$3.43 billion) over the next five years to build a new aluminium smelter in Odisha and a coal power plant, according to CMD Brijendra Pratap Singh. About ₹180 billion will go toward the smelter, while ₹120 billion is earmarked for the power plant, for which NALCO is in talks with Coal India and NTPC. The project will be funded through a mix of debt and internal accruals.
- India's Index of Industrial Production (IIP) grew by 3.5% in July 2025, driven primarily by a 5.4% rise in manufacturing, as per Quick Estimates released on 28th August 2025. Sector-wise, Mining contracted by 7.2%, Electricity grew 0.6%, and Manufacturing led the surge with 14 of 23 industries showing positive growth. Major contributors include basic metals (12.7%), electrical equipment (15.9%), and non-metallic mineral products (9.5%). Under use-based classification, highest growth seen was Infrastructure/Construction goods (11.9%), Intermediate goods (5.8%), and Consumer durables (7.7%), positioning these as the top positive contributors to overall IIP growth.
- Mastercard has partnered with Infosys to integrate
 Mastercard Move's cross-border payment capabilities into
 Infosys Finacle, enabling faster, secure, and seamless global
 transactions for financial institutions across 200+ countries
 and 150+ currencies, ultimately enhancing digital payment
 experiences, customer loyalty, and operational efficiency.
- At the 48th AGM of Reliance Industries, Anant Ambani announced that Jamnagar and Kutch will become major clean energy hubs, with massive projects like the Dhirubhai Ambani Giga Energy Complex and a 5.5 lakh-acre solar site in Kutch—three times the size of Singapore. The projects include solar, battery storage, and green hydrogen production, aiming to supply 10% of India's electricity in the next decade. By 2026, Reliance will operationalize battery (100 GWh) and electrolyser gigafactories (3 GW), producing green ammonia, green methanol, and sustainable aviation fuel, establishing India as a global clean energy leader.
- India's foreign exchange reserves fell by \$4.38 billion to \$690.72 billion for the week ending August 22, 2025, after a previous rise, per RBI data. The decline was driven mainly by a \$3.65 billion drop in foreign currency assets, while gold reserves rose by \$665 million. Reserves with the IMF and Special Drawing Rights (SDRs) also slightly decreased. The RBI often intervenes in forex markets to stabilize the rupee, focusing on market orderliness rather than specific exchange rates.

Economy/Business Current Affairs of July 2025

GDP & GROWTH RATE as per July 2025

- India's external debt rose to \$736.3 billion in FY25, registering a 10% growth over the previous year, with the external debt-to-GDP ratio climbing to 19.1%. Major contributors include non-financial corporations and government borrowings, while US dollar-denominated loans dominate the composition. Despite a decline in the short-term debt share, its ratio to forex reserves increased, raising questions about vulnerability to external shocks. The RBI also noted a valuation effect of \$5.3 billion due to currency movements.
- In FY25, India added \$297 billion to the global economy, making up 6.7% of global GDP growth, according to SBI Research. Out of this, the State Bank of India (SBI) contributed \$44 billion, which is 1.1% of global growth and 16% of India's total. SBI also added ₹1.38 lakh crore in value to India's financial services. This highlights the growing importance of India and its key institutions in the world economy.
- India's retail inflation fell to 2.1% in June 2025, the lowest in 77 months, thanks to cheaper vegetables and pulses. Wholesale inflation also turned slightly negative. While food prices dropped, costs in healthcare, transport, and gold stayed high. The RBI has already cut rates this year and may wait before making more changes. Economists expect inflation to remain low, but global trends and local price changes will decide what happens next.
- India aims to raise the tourism sector's contribution to GDP to 10% by 2047, from the current 5–6%, aligning with its vision of a \$32 trillion economy. Key types include spiritual, adventure, medical, and cultural tourism. Challenges such as infrastructure gaps, environmental concerns, and lack of standardization are being addressed through initiatives like Swadesh Darshan, PRASHAD, and medical tourism promotion. The government also focuses on employment generation, e-visa facilitation, and sustainable practices to ensure inclusive and resilient tourism growth.
- India's core sector grew 1.7% in June 2025, marking a three-month high. Positive growth was seen in steel (9.3%), cement (9.2%), and refinery products (3.4%), while coal (-6.8%), electricity (-2.8%), and natural gas (-2.8%) saw declines. The April–June growth stood at 1.3%, reflecting an overall sluggish industrial trend. The Index of Core Industries, which represents 40.27% of the IIP, remains a key indicator for economic planning and assessment.
- Between March 2021 and March 2025, Gross NPAs dropped from 9.11% to 2.58%, thanks to IBC reforms, amendments to SARFAESI & DRT Acts, RBI's prudential framework, and specialized bank mechanisms. Use of e-auctions, valuation norms, and penalties for misvaluation have increased transparency and efficiency in NPA recovery.











ECONOMY NEWS

- India's gross GST collections surged to a record ₹22.08 lakh crore in FY25, marking a 9.4% growth from the previous year and doubling the revenue seen in FY21. With average monthly collections rising and the taxpayer base expanding to over 1.51 crore, the GST system has significantly contributed to fiscal consolidation and tax transparency. Celebrating eight years of GST, this achievement showcases India's success in building an efficient, unified tax framework that supports its economic ambitions.
- India's state-wise GST collection for June 2025 saw Maharashtra leading with ₹30,553 crore, followed by Karnataka (₹13,409 crore) and Gujarat (₹11,404 crore), reflecting strong industrial, commercial, and service sector activities. Southern states like Tamil Nadu, Telangana, and Andhra Pradesh showed robust contributions, while Delhi, West Bengal, and Odisha drove revenues in the east and north. Smaller and northeastern states had modest collections, underlining their developing economic bases but highlighting strategic potential in logistics, tourism, and regional consumption.
- Over the past 11 years, India's income tax refunds have grown by 474%, touching ₹4.77 lakh crore in 2024–25. This is mainly due to digital improvements that cut refund time from 93 to 17 days. More people are filing returns, and the share of refunds in tax collections has also increased. The government's online systems and reforms have helped build a faster, more transparent tax system, making life easier for taxpayers.
- Between FY16 and FY25, Public Sector Banks (PSBs) wrote off ₹12.08 lakh crore in non-performing assets (NPAs), following RBI guidelines, yet continued loan recovery efforts via DRT, SARFAESI, and IBC routes. While 10 PSBs reduced write-offs, SBI and Canara Bank saw an increase. As of March 2025, 1,629 wilful defaulters owed over ₹1.62 lakh crore, with assets worth ₹25,000+ crore recovered under PMLA and FEOA. Moreover, 48,570 employees are being recruited, as PSBs maintain 96% staff coverage, reflecting focused efforts in both asset recovery and human resource management.
- The Asian Development Bank (ADB) forecasts India's GDP to grow at 6.5% in 2025 and 6.7% in 2026, driven by strong domestic demand, a normal monsoon, and monetary easing. Inflation is projected to stay within RBI's target range, with CPI at a six-year low in June. While the broader Asia-Pacific outlook has weakened due to trade tensions and geopolitical risks, India remains the world's fastest-growing major economy, according to the Asian Development Outlook 2025.

BUSINESS NEWS

- Adani Green Energy Ltd has made history by becoming the first Indian company to cross 15 GW of installed renewable energy capacity, marking a key achievement in India's clean energy journey. With flagship projects like Khavda, the world's largest renewable plant under development, and plans to touch 50 GW by 2030, AGEL is setting the pace for a sustainable energy transition. In FY25 alone, it added 3,309 MW, a national record. The company's progress reflects India's broader ambition to be a global green energy leader.
- India's farm sector has demonstrated strong economic growth, with its Gross Value of Output (GVO) rising to ₹29.49 lakh crore in FY24, a 54.6% increase since FY12, as per the NSO report released on June 27, 2025. This reflects the resilience of Indian agriculture, supported by various government schemes and a diversified rural economy. The data offers critical insight for policymakers, economists, and agricultural planners, reinforcing the importance of sustained agri-investment and reform-oriented planning.
- Reliance Defence and Coastal Mechanics Inc. have announced a strategic joint venture to set up a defence MRO facility in Nagpur, targeting India's ₹20,000 crore upgrade market. The venture aims to modernize critical air and land platforms like Jaguar, MiG-29, Apache helicopters, and L-70 guns, enhancing asset longevity. With India's defence production hitting ₹1.46 trillion in FY25 and exports touching ₹24,000 crore, this initiative supports the Atmanirbhar Bharat vision and may offer future US defence contract access through the FMS route.
- The Indian commercial vehicle industry is expected to register 3–5% growth in FY26, as per ICRA, driven by a revival in construction, infrastructure, and mining activity. While M&HCV and LCV truck sales may see moderate improvement, the bus segment is forecasted to post the strongest gains at 8–10%. However, high inventory levels, geopolitical issues, and a shift toward pre-owned vehicles are restraining factors. The outlook suggests gradual recovery but with sector-specific risks.
- India's UPI ecosystem recorded 18.40 billion transactions worth ₹24.04 lakh crore in June 2025, reflecting a minor monthly dip but strong yearly growth. Experts attribute this moderation to seasonal effects and believe UPI is now reaching a mature scale, preparing for its next expansion through innovative use cases like IoT-based payments, embedded credit, and B2B transactions. With an average of 613 million daily transactions, UPI remains a cornerstone of India's digital economy.
- The Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT) has increased the Cost Inflation Index (CII) to 376 for FY2025–26, allowing for higher tax relief on long-term capital gains (LTCG). While the Finance Act 2024 reduced the availability of indexation benefits, a grandfathering clause allows continued relief for taxpayers selling assets bought before July 23, 2024. Eligible individuals and Hindu Undivided Families (HUFs) can choose between a 20% indexed tax or a 12.5% flat tax.











- Reliance Jio has achieved a significant milestone by becoming the world's largest Fixed Wireless Access (FWA) provider, surpassing T-Mobile. Through its affordable Jio AirFiber broadband, launched in September 2023, and rapid 5G expansion, Jio now serves over 20 million users. This has revolutionized internet accessibility across India, especially in rural and underserved regions, promoting digital inclusion, and laying a blueprint for global telecoms seeking to expand in developing markets.
- SAIL has inaugurated its first international Representative Office in Dubai, UAE, marking a key step in its global expansion. The move aims to strengthen India's steel exports and enhance trade ties with the Middle East and North Africa (MENA) region. Union Minister H.D. Kumaraswamy and top officials attended the event. Dubai was chosen for its strategic location, strong infrastructure, and access to emerging steel markets, supporting SAIL's goal to become a globally competitive steelmaker.
- The Unique Identification Authority of India (UIDAI) recorded 229.33 crore Aadhaar authentication transactions in June 2025, a 7.8% increase from last year, signaling Aadhaar's growing role in digital identity verification. Cumulatively, Aadhaar has now enabled over 15,452 crore transactions since launch. A notable highlight is the rise in AI-powered Face Authentication, which hit 15.87 crore transactions in June 2025, up from 4.61 crore in June 2024. This secure, real-time modality, developed by UIDAI, has now crossed 175 crore face authentications, driving digital inclusion and ease of access to public services.
- Microsoft has closed its Pakistan office after 25 years as part of its global restructuring plan. The decision was made on July 4, 2025, and came along with 9,100 job cuts worldwide. The company is moving to a cloud-based model and depending more on local partners. Experts like Jawwad Rehman and leaders like Arif Alvi called the move a troubling sign for Pakistan's economy and blamed instability for losing business opportunities to countries like Vietnam.
- Mashreq, a top UAE bank, has received IFSCA's in-principle approval to open an International Banking Unit (IBU) in GIFT City, Gujarat, becoming the first UAE-based bank to do so. The branch, expected to start by Q4 of 2025, will offer foreign currency loans, trade finance, and risk management services. With support from the UAE Central Bank and Indian SEZ bodies, this step will boost UAE-India financial relations, improve international banking services, and show confidence in India's financial hub.
- On July 4, 2025, the liquidity surplus in India's banking system rose to ₹4.04 trillion, its highest since May 2022, thanks to increased government spending and a ₹2.69 trillion surplus transfer by the RBI. A 7-day VRRR auction saw bids of ₹1.7 trillion, with ₹1 trillion accepted at 5.47%. The RBI's 0.50% CRR cut earlier had also added ₹1.16 trillion to the system. These developments show strong bank liquidity, likely leading to cheaper loans and more credit flow in the economy.

- Adani Power Ltd has acquired the 600 MW Vidarbha Industries Power Ltd in Butibori, Nagpur for ₹4,000 crore, increasing its total capacity to 18,150 MW. The deal was approved by the NCLT and completed on July 7, 2025. The company is building several new brownfield and greenfield power plants and aims to reach 30,670 MW by 2029-30. CEO SB Khyalia said the company remains focused on providing reliable, affordable electricity to support India's development goals.
- Nvidia became the first publicly traded company to reach a \$4 trillion market value, thanks to a 1,350% rise in its stock since October 2022. The company now has the largest share in the S&P 500, showing its growing power in the stock market. Other tech giants like Microsoft, Apple, and Amazon are also close behind, with the technology sector now making up one-third of the S&P 500. This event proves how important Nvidia and other tech companies have become to the global economy.
- Indian government extended the tax exemption for Sovereign Wealth Funds (SWFs) and Pension Funds on their investments in India until March 31, 2030. This policy covers dividends, interest, and long-term capital gains and aims to attract long-term foreign investment in sectors like telecom, logistics, and energy. The rule was first introduced in 2020 under Section 10(23FE) of the Income Tax Act, and the latest extension was officially notified by the Department of Revenue. According to NSDL, assets held by SWFs in Indian companies have grown by 60% year-on-year, reaching ₹4.7 lakh crore by April 2024, showing strong investor confidence.
- PhonePe led the UPI market in June 2025, handling over 8.54 billion transactions and securing 46.46% of the market, as per data from the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI). It was followed by Google Pay (35.56%) and Paytm (6.90%). While total UPI transactions slightly fell to 18.39 billion, new apps like Navi and Super.money showed steady growth. State-wise, Maharashtra, Karnataka, and Uttar Pradesh contributed the most to UPI volume.
- ACKO has been chosen as the official insurance partner for Tesla in India, ahead of the electric car giant's market launch. The partnership will offer digital insurance services that are smooth, quick, and made especially for Tesla owners. This deal reflects both companies' shared goal of using technology to simplify vehicle ownership, promote clean mobility, and help grow the electric vehicle market in India.
- Tesla has inaugurated its first India showroom at Mumbai's BKC, debuting the Model Y at a starting price of ₹59.89 lakh. With imported variants, rapid charging solutions, and robust safety features, Tesla aims to catalyze India's electric vehicle ecosystem despite high import tariffs and regulatory challenges. The move reinforces Mumbai's position as an automotive innovation hub and signals broader opportunities for clean mobility in India's future.











- In July 2025, HSBC exited the Net-Zero Banking Alliance (NZBA), sparking backlash from green clients like Ecotricity, who questioned the bank's climate credibility. The move, prompted by internal concerns over bias against carbon sectors, contrasts sharply with growing global expectations for **sustainable finance**. This development puts HSBC at the center of a critical debate on the future of **net-zero banking**, ethical investing, and the financial sector's role in climate
- India's tea exports rose by 2.85% in FY 2024-25 to 257.88 million kg, led by North India's 8.15% growth. South India saw a 4.92% decline. The average export price increased by 12.65% to Rs 290.97 per kg, boosting value realization. In calendar year 2024, total exports stood at 256.17 million kg. a 10.57% rise
- India's net FDI inflows dropped by 98% YoY to \$35 million in May 2025, due to 24% rise in repatriation and 11% fall in gross inflows, as per the RBI Bulletin. Singapore, Mauritius, UAE, and USA were major sources, with inflows into manufacturing, financial, and IT services. Outward FDI rose to \$2.1 billion, mainly into transport and business services. Despite this dip, India's FX reserves stood at \$696.7 billion, covering 11 months of imports and 95% of external debt.

Economy/Business Current Affairs of June 2025

ECONOMY NEWS

- India's unemployment rate rose to 5.6% in May 2025, attributed largely to a seasonal drop in rural farm employment after the harvest. Data showed that youth and women were particularly affected, with female labour force participation falling to 27.8%. The trend underscores persistent structural challenges in creating adequate and inclusive employment, especially in rural regions. Both urban and rural youth unemployment surged, drawing attention to the need for focused employment generation strategies.
- India's core sector growth slowed sharply to 0.7% in May 2025, marking a nine-month low. The fall was driven by a decline in the output of crude oil, natural gas, fertilisers, and electricity. This marked the second consecutive month of core sector weakness, reflecting pressure on industrial production. However, cement (+9.2%) and steel (+6.7%) continued to show strength. The figures point to a need for targeted policy support in key infrastructure and energy sectors to maintain momentum.
- India's **net direct tax collection** declined by **1.39%** to ₹4.59 lakh crore in Q1 FY26, mainly due to slower advance tax growth and a drop in corporate tax receipts. While gross direct tax collection rose 4.86%, a sharp 58% increase in tax refunds significantly reduced the net collection base. Corporate advance tax saw modest growth of **5.86%**, while

- non-corporate advance tax declined by 2.68%. These developments point to early fiscal pressure and the importance of monitoring tax compliance and the pace of economic recovery.
- In Q4 FY25, India recorded a current account surplus of \$13.5 billion, a sharp turnaround from the previous quarter's deficit. According to RBI data, this surplus was driven by strong services exports, especially in IT and business services, and an increase in remittances from abroad. A narrower merchandise trade deficit and a fall in net primary income outflows also contributed to the surplus. Despite some moderation in FDI inflows, the improvement reflects a boost in external sector stability and overall economic fundamentals.
- India's retail inflation declined sharply to 2.82% in May 2025, marking its lowest level since February 2019. The fall was largely driven by a significant drop in **food inflation**, which eased to 0.99%. Prices of essential food items such as vegetables, pulses, and meat fell, aided by a favourable base effect and government measures like import duty cuts. Among states, Kerala recorded the highest inflation, while Telangana reported the lowest. Looking ahead, analysts expect the Consumer Price Index (CPI) to average around 4% in FY26, though they caution that monsoon performance and geopolitical developments could influence price dynamics. The current data supports the RBI's strategy to frontload rate cuts, but it also indicates limited scope for further easing unless economic growth weakens considerably.
- In line with the trend in retail inflation, India's wholesale price inflation (WPI) also fell to 0.39% in May 2025, down from 0.85% in April, reflecting declining prices in food, fuel, and manufactured goods. A key contributor to the drop was the steep deflation in vegetable prices, which plunged by 21.62%. This simultaneous fall in both WPI and CPI sends encouraging signals for price stability, reinforcing a more accommodative monetary policy stance and giving the RBI more flexibility, especially amid external uncertainties.
- Additionally, India is planning a significant revamp of its CPI framework, with a proposal to update the base year to 2024 and expand the CPI basket to better reflect current consumption patterns. This revision is being informed by the Household Consumption Expenditure Survey (HCES) 2023-24, which analyzed data from around 407 consumption items. The updated CPI series is expected to be launched by early 2026, replacing the existing 2012based index. Furthermore, the Economic Survey 2023-24 has recommended a review of the role of food prices in the inflation targeting mechanism, suggesting that food may be excluded due to its volatile supply-side behavior. This indicates a shift toward more structural and targeted inflation management going forward.











BUSINESS NEWS

- GST collections for May 2025 rose 16.4% year-on-year to Rs 2.01 lakh crore, showing strong momentum despite being lower than April's record Rs 2.37 lakh crore. While domestic GST grew 13.7% to Rs 1.50 lakh crore, it slowed due to reduced year-end transactions and shifting consumer behavior. In contrast, import GST surged 25.2%, indicating strong import demand. After refunds, net GST rose 20.4% to Rs 1.74 lakh crore, signaling economic recovery, as highlighted by experts from KPMG and EY India.
- UPI transactions in May 2025 hit a record high with 18.68 billion transactions worth ₹25.14 trillion, showing 4% M-o-M and 33% Y-o-Y growth in volume. This surge surpasses March 2025's previous record, highlighting India's rapid digital payment adoption. Daily transactions rose to 602 million, with daily value reaching ₹81,106 crore, underscoring the UPI ecosystem's expanding scale and deepening usage intensity.
- on 1 June 2025, the Asian Development Bank (ADB) unveiled a \$10 billion initiative for urban transformation in India. This 5-year plan aims to revamp metro networks, launch new RRTS corridors, and improve urban infrastructure and services across over 100 cities. Backed by sovereign loans, private capital, and the Urban Challenge Fund (UCF), the project also includes \$3 million in technical assistance for project planning. ADB emphasized skill development, women's empowerment, and inclusive urban growth as part of India's Viksit Bharat @ 2047 mission. The announcement follows meetings with PM Modi, FM Nirmala Sitharaman, and Housing Minister Manohar Lal.
- India has officially granted Starlink, the satellite internet venture by Elon Musk's SpaceX, the much-awaited GMPCS licence, paving the way for the company to offer satellite communication services across the country. This makes Starlink the third operator in India's satellite internet market, alongside OneWeb and Jio Satellite, and it is expected to receive trial spectrum soon to prove its technical and security readiness.



- Public sector general insurance companies (PSGICs) have achieved a notable growth milestone by collecting ₹1.06 lakh crore in premium income during FY2024–25, up from ₹80,000 crore in FY19. This performance was highlighted during a review meeting chaired by Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman, focusing on insurance penetration, density, and digital transformation. The sector witnessed a turnaround in profitability, with firms like NIACL, NICL, OICL, and UIICL returning to profits.
- Thomas Cook (India) Ltd. has partnered with Muthoot Forex to expand access to its Borderless Travel Card and Study Buddy Card via Muthoot's 7,000+ branch network, aiming to serve international travelers and students abroad across metro to Tier 4 cities, with features like multicurrency support, emergency cash, free SIM, Rs.7.5 lakh insurance, and reward points for forex loads.
- SEBI has launched a settlement scheme for stock brokers involved in algo trading violations, open from June 16 to September 16, 2025. Over 100 brokers, including top firms like Zerodha and 5Paisa, were found collaborating with unregulated algo platforms offering assured returns—a direct breach of SEBI norms. The scheme provides a way to resolve cases with a low settlement cost, while SEBI continues to strengthen regulations for algorithmic trading, emphasizing retail investor protection, empanelment of algo providers, and broker accountability.
- Scapia, in collaboration with Federal Bank, has launched India's first dual-network credit card combining Visa and RuPay, known as the Scapia Federal RuPay Credit Card. With UPI compatibility, zero forex markup, Scapia Coins, and airport lounge benefits, the card offers a unified credit experience for domestic and international use. The launch is aligned with Scapia's broader platform upgrades under its 2025 Summer Release, including AI recommendations, tailored fare options, and reward enhancements marking a key milestone in India's fintech evolution.
- The Asian Development Bank (ADB) has approved a \$109.97 million loan to support Gujarat's Skills **Development Program**, a forward-looking initiative designed to enhance technical education, promote inclusive employment, and drive industrial competitiveness. By upgrading training infrastructure, launching **industry-aligned courses**, and improving governance at institutions like Kaushalya: The Skill University, the program will create a future-ready workforce.
- Apna.co has launched Al Job Prep, an innovative Alpowered interview preparation tool aimed at bridging the confidence gap in India's job market. With over 7.6 lakh simulations completed across 900+ cities, the platform provides realistic interview experiences, real-time feedback, and personalized tips using its proprietary Agentic Al technology. Metro cities like Delhi and Mumbai lead in adoption, but usage is rapidly growing in non-metro areas. This tool reflects a larger trend of tech-enabled skilling and is expected to significantly boost employability and digital empowerment.









- India's GIFT City has witnessed a surge in global interest, with banks from France and the UAE applying to set up IFSC Banking Units (IBUs). The International Financial Services Centres Authority (IFSCA) has approved Natixis and Credit Agricole, while other foreign and domestic banks await clearances. The total number of IBUs has doubled from 15 in 2022 to 31 in 2025, with \$88.5 billion in assets. This reflects global trust in India's economic reforms, and supports the country's ambition to make GIFT City a world-class financial centre.
- The Indian Renewable Energy Development Agency (IREDA) has raised ₹2,005.90 crore through a QIP issue, attracting strong participation from domestic and international institutional investors. The funds will enhance IREDA's Tier-I capital and enable expanded green energy financing. This development follows IREDA's IPO in 2023 and reaffirms the agency's growing significance in India's clean energy transition, strengthening its ability to support renewable energy initiatives across the country.
- UPI transactions are now set to be completed in just 10–15 seconds, starting June 16, 2025, as per NPCI's latest directive. In addition to this, users will have a 50-times daily limit for checking their account balance via UPI apps. To increase transaction transparency and reduce fraud, apps will display only the final beneficiary's name, and users will no longer be able to edit it. With UPI usage surging across India, these upgrades aim to boost the efficiency, speed, and trust in the country's digital payment ecosystem.
- Tata Consultancy Services (TCS) has partnered with the Council of Europe Development Bank (CEB) in Paris to automate and optimise its financial reconciliation process. The implementation of TCS BaNCS™ for Reconciliations will enable end-to-end automation, real-time insights, and Aldriven exception management. This will lead to reduced manual intervention, improved operational efficiency, and enhanced control and transparency in daily transactions.
- India has granted operating license to Starlink, the satellite internet service by SpaceX, paving the way for widespread rural and remote broadband access. Following this, Jio Platforms and Bharti Airtel partnered with SpaceX to retail Starlink kits and offer support services, aiming to connect schools, hospitals, and businesses. While the move aligns with the Digital India vision, spectrum allocation disputes between Elon Musk and Mukesh Ambani highlight ongoing regulatory challenges.
- TVS Motor Company has entered Indonesia's electric two-wheeler market with the launch of the TVS iQube, an electric scooter offering a 115 km range and 78 kmph top speed. Priced at IDR 29.9 million, the scooter will be assembled locally in East Karawang and aligns with the Indonesian government's EV adoption goals. As Indonesia's EV market grows at 101% CAGR, this marks a major milestone for TVS's global EV expansion, with the iQube already boasting a 6 lakh global customer base.

- Jio Financial Services (JFSL) has acquired State Bank of India's 17.8% stake in Jio Payments Bank for ₹104.54 crore, resulting in full ownership of the digital bank. Approved by the Reserve Bank of India, the move marks a significant milestone in Jio's fintech expansion. Alongside, Jio BlackRock Mutual Fund introduced Aladdin, a global risk analytics platform, to the Indian market. While JFSL shares dipped 1%, the company is rapidly strengthening its digital finance ecosystem through strategic collaborations and acquisitions.
- India has secured the 13th spot globally in terms of online investment curiosity, according to a recent study by BrokerChooser. The country logged 2,629 monthly searches per million people, showing strong interest in stocks, followed by crypto and forex. While India still trails nations like Australia, Singapore, and Kenya, the findings reflect a rapid shift in investment behavior, especially among techsavvy youth. The rise of mobile trading apps, SIPs, and digital financial influencers is redefining how Indians engage with the market.
- India's financial presence in Swiss banks has sharply increased in 2024, with total holdings reaching CHF 3.5 billion (₹37,600 crore) a threefold jump over the previous year. The surge is largely driven by institutional investments, while personal deposits remain a minor share. Despite regular tax data exchange between India and Switzerland, the issue of black money remains under scrutiny. India also improved its global rank among foreign clients of Swiss banks, moving from 67th to 48th in just one year.
- NPCI's New Real-Time PAN-Bank Account Validation API aims to enhance accuracy and efficiency in tax-related processes by enabling instant verification of PAN, bank account status, and account holder identity via a secure API interface. Integrated with Core Banking Systems (CBS), this facility ensures real-time validation on the Income Tax efiling portal, reducing delays and manual errors. Though targeted at government departments, taxpayers benefit from faster PAN-bank linking, improved refund processing, and greater data security, marking a major step toward streamlined digital governance.
- From July 2025, the National Automated Clearing House (NACH) will transition to NACH 3.0, offering a more secure, efficient, and transparent framework for recurring financial transactions such as salary credits, SIPs, EMIs, and utility payments. With improved features like PGP encryption, real-time alerts, and optimized file handling, the new system by NPCI is poised to enhance customer experience, minimize errors, and handle increased transaction volumes. For both banks and consumers, NACH 3.0 marks a significant leap in digital financial infrastructure.











- The private sector in India saw a significant surge in economic activity in June 2025, with the Flash Composite PMI reaching 61, the highest in over a year. This growth was led by manufacturing, supported by new domestic and international orders, rising employment, and increased tech investments. While input and output prices continued to rise, they did so at a moderated pace, indicating improved cost management. Capacity pressures and backlogs remained high, prompting companies to hire more, particularly in the manufacturing sector.
- India's state capital expenditure is set to reach a record ₹10.2 lakh crore in FY26, with Uttar Pradesh, Gujarat, Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, and Karnataka leading the charge. Together, they are expected to contribute nearly 50% of total state capex, marking a significant shift towards infrastructure-led growth. The report highlights improved revenue receipts, fiscal discipline, and a clear focus on asset creation, making India's regional economies key players in driving national development during uncertain global conditions.
- In May 2025, credit card spending in India jumped by 14.5% year-on-year, reaching ₹1.89 trillion, as per RBI data. The increase was driven by the issuance of 760,000 new credit cards, with HDFC Bank and SBI Cards leading the growth. The total number of cards in circulation rose to 111.19 million, indicating enhanced consumer confidence, a growing shift toward digital payments, and rising retail credit penetration. This trend reinforces the role of private banks in driving the country's digital consumption economy.
- In a major boost to Brand India, the Tata Group has become the first Indian brand to cross the \$30-billion mark in brand value, as per Brand Finance 2025 rankings. It is followed by Infosys and HDFC, while Adani Group has emerged as the fastest-growing brand. Taj Hotels remains the strongest brand with an AAA+ rating. The rankings reflect India's expanding global presence, with new entrants like Zomato and Birla Opus making their mark.
- The National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI) has posted a 42% rise in surplus to ₹1,552 crore and a 19% increase in revenue to ₹3,270 crore in FY25, marking a strong financial performance. Despite challenges like UPI outages and the absence of Merchant Discount Rate (MDR), NPCI continues to lead India's digital payments ecosystem, managing platforms such as UPI, RuPay, and IMPS. With over 18 billion UPI transactions in May 2025 alone, NPCI is on track to surpass global giants like Visa in daily volume.
- India's Unified Payments Interface (UPI) has emerged as a model digital payment system, as acknowledged in a recent IMF report. The study underscores how interoperability, supported by low mobile data costs, widespread banking access, and the Aadhaar-based digital identity system, helped the platform scale rapidly. The IMF recommends

- **other nations** seeking a similar transition to adopt a **holistic digital ecosystem**, not just standalone payment platforms. This recognition places **India's fintech leadership** on the global stage and encourages further investment in **inclusive digital infrastructure**.
- The National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD) and ICAR-NIRCA have initiated a training program for farmers and FPOs in East Godavari, focusing on post-harvest technologies for turmeric and chilli. The initiative, launched on June 25, 2025, highlights the need for moisture and microbial control in spice crops and aims to enhance value, reduce losses, and improve export readiness through scientific practices and technology adoption.
- In a strategic move to expand their fuel retail presence, Adani Total Gas Ltd (ATGL) and Reliance BP Mobility Ltd (Jio-bp) have agreed to dispense each other's fuels at select retail outlets. The initiative aims to enhance infrastructure usage and customer convenience while increasing the market share of private players in a sector largely led by public oil companies. This partnership builds upon their earlier collaboration and reflects the growing synergy between India's corporate giants in the energy sector.
- IFFCO, India's leading fertiliser cooperative, is set to launch its first overseas nano fertiliser plant in Brazil through a joint venture with NANOFERT. The facility will produce 4.5 million litres of nano nutrients annually, helping boost yields of crops like corn, soybean, and sugarcane. With field trials confirming 7–10% yield increases and 20% fertiliser use reduction, this initiative strengthens India's global agritech leadership and promotes sustainable farming. Future expansions include nano zinc and copper variants.
- India has launched its first maritime sector NBFC, the Sagarmala Finance Corporation Limited (SMFCL), inaugurated by Union Minister Sarbananda Sonowal. Aimed at bridging financial gaps in the maritime ecosystem, SMFCL will finance ports, MSMEs, and startups. The minister also unveiled the SAGAR SETU platform for operational efficiency, a standardised tariff template for major ports, and the Gateway to Green report to advance green hydrogen adoption. An MoU with CDAC was signed to set up a Digital Centre of Excellence, reinforcing India's push for digital maritime transformation.
- JioBlackRock Broking Pvt. Ltd. has received SEBI approval to start operations as a brokerage firm, marking a significant milestone in the joint venture between Jio Financial Services Ltd. and BlackRock Inc. The brokerage arm complements the group's existing asset management and investment advisory services, furthering its mission to democratise investing in India. Through technology-led, cost-efficient, and digital-first platforms, JioBlackRock aims to serve retail and self-directed investors, delivering a full spectrum of financial solutions under one roof.











- The Insurance Regulatory and Development Authority of India (IRDAI) has levied a ₹1 crore penalty on Edelweiss Life **Insurance** for violating **corporate governance** standards. The violations include improper outsourcing oversight and failure to obtain mandatory bank account details of policyholders. IRDAI's action emphasizes the importance of regulatory compliance, policyholder protection, and adherence to the Companies Act, 2013. This move sends a strong signal to the insurance sector about maintaining transparency, due diligence, and accountability in business operations.
- India has exported its first consignment of rose-scented litchi from Pathankot, Punjab, to Qatar and the UAE, demonstrating its rising presence in the **premium**
- horticulture market. Supported by APEDA and the Punjab Horticulture Department, this initiative showcases India's growing agricultural export capabilities. With exports of fruits and vegetables touching USD 3.87 billion in FY 2024-25, this move reinforces India's ambition to lead in highquality fresh produce globally.
- India's coffee export sector has grown 125% over the past decade, reaching \$1.8 billion in 2024–25, fueled by initiatives from the Coffee Board of India. The board introduced digital export permits, offered financial incentives for value-added and specialty coffee, and encouraged shade-grown, sustainable coffee farming. India is now the 5th largest exporter, with top markets in Europe, Japan, and the Middle East.

TESTING

DRDO successfully conducted maiden flight-tests of the Integrated Air Defence Weapon System (IADWS) on 23 August 2025 off
Odisha's coast. This multi-layered air defence system, featuring indigenous QRSAM, VSHORADS missiles, and a laser-based
Directed Energy Weapon (DEW), demonstrated its capability by simultaneously destroying multiple aerial targets, including
UAVs and drones. Controlled by a Centralised Command Centre, the system's performance was flawless.

DEAL & MoU's

- India received the final Airbus C-295MW transport aircraft from Spain, completing the delivery of the first 16 planes under the 2021 contract. The aircraft, capable of carrying 5–10 tonnes with 11-hour endurance, will replace the ageing Avro fleet of the IAF. The remaining 40 aircraft will be manufactured in India at the TATA Aircraft Complex, Vadodara, India's first private Final Assembly Line for military aircraft. This programme strengthens India's defence self-reliance under the Make in India initiative and marks a historic milestone in aviation manufacturing.
- The Defence Acquisition Council (DAC), chaired by Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, has approved proposals worth ₹67,000 crore to bolster India's military capabilities. For the Indian Army, Thermal Imager-based Driver Night Sights for BMPs were cleared to enhance night mobility. The Indian Navy will procure Compact Autonomous Surface Craft, BrahMos Fire Control Systems, and upgrade the BARAK-1 Missile System. The Indian Air Force will get Mountain Radars and upgrades to SAKSHAM and SPYDER Weapon Systems.
- The Border Security Force (BSF) has launched Operation Alert, a high-intensity security drive along the Rajasthan border from August 11 to 17, 2025, ahead of Independence Day. The operation focuses on strengthening border security, rehearsing Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs), and countering potential threats through intensified patrols, technology-driven surveillance, and full force deployment on August 15.











- India has cleared a ₹62,000 crore deal for 97 Tejas Mark 1A fighter jets for the Indian Air Force (IAF), significantly boosting indigenous defence manufacturing under the Make in India and Atmanirbhar Bharat missions. The jets, with over 65% indigenous components, will replace ageing MiG-21s, raising the total IAF Tejas Mark 1A fleet to 180 aircraft. Developed by Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL), the aircraft features advanced avionics and radar systems.
- India is partnering with France's Safran to domestically manufacture advanced jet engines for the Advanced Medium Combat Aircraft (AMCA), a fifth-generation fighter jet designed indigenously. Announced by Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, this collaboration aims to develop a new engine with a powerful 110 Kilo Newton thrust, surpassing current global standards. The project, approved by the Cabinet Committee on Security and backed by DRDO, is a decade-long effort and part of the Rs 15,000-crore plan to boost India's defense technology and self-reliance in aerospace manufacturing.



- India successfully test-fired the Agni-5 Intermediate Range Ballistic Missile (IRBM) on August 20, 2025 from Chandipur, Odisha, under the Strategic Forces Command, validating its operational readiness and enhancing India's nuclear deterrence. The three-stage, solid-fuelled, canisterised missile has a range of over 5,000 km and can carry nuclear or conventional warheads, reinforcing India's No First Use (NFU) policy and strengthening its nuclear triad.
- The Defence Ministry has signed an MoU with the Quality Council of India (QCI) to improve pension, healthcare, resettlement, and welfare services for over 63 lakh veterans and their families. Under the agreement, QCI will assist the Department of Ex-Servicemen Welfare (DESW) with digital evaluations, impact assessments, and evidence-based policy recommendations. The initiative aims to enhance healthcare delivery, boost employment and entrepreneurship opportunities, and strengthen State and District Sainik Boards.

ARMY, NAVY & AIR FORCE NEWS

The Indian Navy will commission two advanced Project 17A stealth frigates, Udaygiri and Himgiri, on 26 August 2025 at Visakhapatnam, presided over by Raksha Mantri Rajnath Singh. These frigates, built by Mazagon Dock Shipbuilders Ltd. (MDL) and Garden Reach Shipbuilders & Engineers (GRSE), feature significant improvements in design, stealth, weapons, and sensors, with around 75% indigenous content, supporting the Aatmanirbhar Bharat vision. Notably, Udaygiri is the 100th ship designed by the Navy's Warship Design Bureau.

This is part of the Army's 'Year of Tech Absorption' initiative, aiming to use more Indian-made technology in defence. The demonstration showed how these tools can improve the speed, power, and safety of soldiers in complex missions, supporting the Army's goal of becoming more future-ready and self-reliant.

The drill uses modern weaponry, real-time simulations, and advanced communication systems, reinforcing defence cooperation under India's Act East Policy. This exercise showcases growing regional strategic synergy and highlights the importance of coordinated action in complex battlefield scenarios.

TESTING

- India has successfully completed user trials of the Extended Range Anti-Submarine Rocket (ERASR), a fully indigenous naval weapon designed to detect and destroy enemy submarines, boosting India's maritime defence and self-reliance in defence technology. Conducted from INS Kavaratti between June 23 and July 7, 2025, the trials involved 17 rocket launches across multiple ranges. Defence Minister Rajnath Singh hailed the DRDO, Indian Navy, and domestic defence industry for the achievement, stating it will enhance the Navy's striking power.
- DRDO and Indian Air Force successfully conducted flight tests of the Astra Beyond Visual Range Air-to-Air Missile (BVRAAM) from a Su-30 MKI fighter jet off the Odisha coast. The missile, equipped with an indigenous Radio Frequency (RF) Seeker, accurately hit high-speed aerial targets in both tests. This success boosts India's defense strength, supports the 'Make in India' initiative, and reduces reliance on foreign technology.
- The Indian Army's successful trial of Akash Prime at 15,000 feet in Ladakh showcases a major step in enhancing India's indigenous air defence capabilities. With its improved seeker, high-altitude operability, and proven combat role in Operation Sindoor, Akash Prime strengthens India's self-reliance and border defence readiness. The system is poised for future induction and will play a key role in securing India's skies against modern aerial threats.
- India's test-firing of the nuclear-capable Prithvi-II and Agni-I missiles at the Chandipur range validated key operational parameters and boosted its deterrence capability. Developed by the DRDO, both missiles enhance India's nuclear arsenal with their reliable, indigenous design and proven effectiveness, maintaining high standards of military preparedness and strategic
- India's DRDO has successfully test-fired the UAV-Launched Precision Guided Missile (ULPGM)-V3 at Kurnool, marking a major boost in drone-launched precision strike capabilities. The 12.5 kg missile, powered by a dual-thrust solid motor, uses infrared imaging for day-night targeting, supports two-way datalink, and offers multiple warhead options. Developed with support from MSMEs, startups, and major firms like Adani and BDL, the ULPGM programme has three variants, with V3 (ULM-ER) being the most advanced. This achievement enhances India's defence preparedness and aligns with Aatmanirbhar Bharat goals.

DEAL & MoU's

LCA Tejas Mk 1A, powered by GE F404 engines, is vital for IAF's modernisation, with 12 jets to be delivered by end-2025. HAL plans 16 aircraft per year, pending timely engine delivery. Features include AESA radar, EW suite, and BVR missiles like ASTRA. The ₹5,375 crore engine deal and upcoming ₹67,000 crore order highlight the strategic importance of this indigenous programme.











ARMY, NAVY & AIR FORCE NEWS

- Rear Admiral V Ganapathy has taken over as the new Commandant of the Military Institute of Technology (MILIT), Pune, India's
 top tri-services training institute. His appointment is significant in light of the armed forces' modernization, the push for
 jointness, and the growing need for cutting-edge defence technology education.
- INS Udaygiri, India's latest stealth frigate, was inducted into the Indian Navy on July 1, 2025. Built in a record 37 months under Project 17A, the warship showcases advanced stealth design, indigenous weapon systems, and multi-mission capabilities suited for blue-water operations. With contributions from over 200 MSMEs, this induction highlights India's push for defence indigenisation and the growing strength of its naval shipbuilding ecosystem.
- India has commissioned INS Tamal, a state-of-the-art stealth guided missile frigate, in Russia, representing the last foreign-built major warship for the Indian Navy. Built under Project 1135.6, Tamal underscores the shift toward defence indigenisation, integrating systems like BrahMos missiles and HUMSA-NG sonar. The vessel enhances India's blue-water capabilities and reinforces the Indo-Russian defence partnership, having become the 51st ship built under the collaboration. The Western Fleet now gains a powerful asset, while future warships will be constructed domestically, propelling India closer to its Aatmanirbhar Bharat vision.
- Sub Lieutenant Aastha Poonia, from Meerut, has become the first woman to be trained as a fighter pilot in the Indian Navy. She received the "Wings of Gold" at a ceremony on July 3, 2025, in Visakhapatnam. She will now train to fly fighter jets like the MiG-29K and Rafale M from aircraft carriers like INS Vikramaditya and INS Vikrant. This achievement reflects the Indian Navy's push for gender equality, and its aim to promote women's roles in defense and combat aviation.
- On July 9, 2025, the Indian Navy received INS Nistar, its first indigenously designed and built Diving Support Vessel (DSV), from
 Hindustan Shipyard Limited (HSL) in Visakhapatnam. With 75% indigenous content, INS Nistar can perform deep sea diving up
 to 300 metres, rescue trapped submariners using DSRV, and carry ROVs for operations up to 1000 metres. This modern ship
 supports the Navy's underwater missions and reflects the goals of Aatmanirbhar Bharat and Make in India.
- INS Nistar, commissioned on July 18, 2025, is India's first indigenous Diving Support Vessel, designed and built by Hindustan Shipyard Limited. It supports deep-sea diving, submarine rescue up to 300m, and acts as a mother ship for DSRVs. With 80% indigenous content, over 120 MSMEs involved, and advanced technologies, it strengthens India's underwater maritime capabilities and aligns with the Aatmanirbhar Bharat mission.
- India is enhancing military surveillance by sourcing high-resolution satellite imagery from global players like Maxar, following China's support to Pakistan during Operation Sindoor. The SBS-III programme aims to launch 52 satellites by 2029, operated by the Defence Space Agency, with a \$3.2 billion budget. This move ensures real-time monitoring, improved border surveillance, and strategic preparedness, while challenges like data security and external dependency remain.
- The Indian Air Force will retire MiG-21 fighter jets by September 2025, ending 60 years of service. These Soviet-origin supersonic aircraft, inducted in 1963, played major roles in wars including 1971 and Kargil. Their replacement with the indigenous LCA Tejas Mark 1A signifies a move towards modernization, despite challenges like delays in jet engine supply. The shift supports the Atmanirbhar Bharat initiative and strengthens IAF's air defense capability.
- The Indian Army has received its first Apache AH-64E helicopters from the United States, aimed at boosting firepower in challenging terrains. These state-of-the-art attack helicopters feature advanced targeting systems, precision strike capabilities, and night operation functionality. The move enhances Army Aviation Corps' autonomy, supports defense modernization, and fortifies India's tactical strength along borders.
- The Indian Coast Guard's new vessel 'Samudra Prachet', launched on July 23, 2025, is the final Pollution Control Vessel (PCV) constructed by Goa Shipyard Ltd (GSL) to enhance India's oil spill response and maritime pollution control capabilities within its Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ). With a displacement of 4,170 tonnes and cutting-edge response equipment, it supports Atmanirbhar Bharat, aligns with MARPOL obligations, and represents a milestone in indigenous shipbuilding and coastal environmental protection.

- The Indian Army has successfully conducted trials of Rudrastra, an indigenously developed VTOL drone by Solar Aerospace and Defence Limited (SDAL). The trials, held at the Pokhran range, validated the drone's ability to execute deep-cross border strikes with precision-guided airburst munitions. With a total range of 170 km, 1.5-hour endurance, and real-time live video relay, Rudrastra enhances India's stand-off strike capability.
- India is developing next-generation variants of the Pinaka rocket system, with ranges up to 300 km, to boost its artillery strength and achieve defence self-reliance. Developed by DRDO, the Pinaka-3 and Pinaka-4 systems will support precision strikes, rapid deployment, and high-volume firepower. With the successful trials of the Guided Pinaka and the Army planning to induct 22 regiments by 2030, these developments reinforce India's commitment to indigenization, modernization, and enhanced national security.

DEAL & MoU's

ARMY, NAVY & AIR FORCE NEWS

- In a historic first visit, European Union Naval Force (EUNAVFOR) ships ESPS Reina Sofia and ITS Antonio Marceglia docked in Mumbai from 26 May to 1 June 2025. The port call featured Subject Matter Expert Exchanges (SMEEs), a Table Top Exercise, and discussions with the Indian Navy on boosting maritime security cooperation. These engagements serve to enhance interoperability, reflect the outcomes of the 4th India-EU Maritime Security Dialogue, and underscore shared interests in tackling piracy, smuggling, and IUU fishing in the Indian Ocean Region (IOR).
- Air Marshal Jasvir Singh Mann has assumed the role of Senior Air Staff Officer in the Western Air Command of the Indian Air
 Force, bringing with him a vast range of operational and strategic experience, having served in several critical commands and
 earned prestigious honours during his decades-long career in the armed forces.
- On June 1, 2025, Shailendra Nath Gupta, a seasoned officer from the Indian Defence Estates Service (IDES), took charge as the
 Director General of Defence Estates (DGDE). Having held various leadership positions across Cantonment Boards, Defence
 Estates Circles, and Commands, Gupta now oversees 18 lakh acres of defence land. The DGDE, through its six regional commands,
 plays a crucial role in land management, urban governance in cantonments, and coordination with the Ministry of Defence.











- The Tri-Services All-Women Sailing Expedition Team completed a historic 1,800-nautical-mile international voyage to Seychelles, marking the first of its kind by the Indian Armed Forces. The mission, conducted aboard 'Triveni', not only showcased the resilience and operational capability of women officers from the Army, Navy, and Air Force, but also contributed to India's maritime diplomacy. Their return on June 4, 2025, is a tribute to Nari Shakti, Tri-services synergy, and India's strategic vision for gender inclusion and oceanic outreach.
- The Indian Coast Guard (ICG) has commissioned a dedicated jetty at Vizhinjam Harbour, Kerala, marking a vital development in India's maritime security network. Inaugurated on June 7, 2025, by DG Paramesh Sivamani, this 76.7-metre jetty lies just 10 nautical miles from key international shipping lanes and aims to strengthen operations related to coastal surveillance, antismuggling, and search & rescue. The event was attended by high-ranking officials from various defense and maritime bodies. The initiative underscores India's strategic efforts to secure its southwestern coastline and bolster integrated coastal management.
- Army Chief General Upendra Dwivedi visited Uttarakhand's Garhwal region to evaluate the readiness of deployed troops and
 to boost morale. During this visit, he launched Ibex Tarana 88.4 FM, a community radio station in Jyotirmath envisioned to
 promote local culture, education, and disaster awareness. The station aims to empower youth voices and connect the people
 with their cultural roots. Additionally, the Army Chief honoured veterans for their nation-building contributions, marking a
 notable blend of military vigilance and community development.
- Lieutenant General Rajiv Ghai has been appointed as the new Deputy Chief of Army Staff (Strategy), a key role overseeing
 Operations and Intelligence Directorates, while continuing as DGMO, marking a major move in the Indian Army's strategic
 leadership to strengthen threat anticipation, integrated command, and inter-departmental synergy through a unified
 operational oversight structure.
- The Indian Coast Guard (ICG) chaired the 137th Offshore Security Coordination Committee (OSCC) meeting in New Delhi on June 12, 2025, to reinforce the security of India's offshore installations. Senior representatives from the armed forces, ministries, ONGC, and state police discussed enhancing joint response frameworks and inter-agency coordination. Established in 1978, OSCC plays a pivotal role in safeguarding India's strategic energy infrastructure, making the meeting a crucial step toward energy security and maritime safety.
- In a proud moment for India, a 10-member NCC team, including five girls and five boys, successfully summited Mount Everest on May 18, 2025, marking NCC's third successful expedition to the world's highest peak. The team was felicitated by Defence Minister Rajnath Singh on June 12, 2025, and awarded a ₹10 lakh reward. The expedition showcased courage, discipline, and patriotism, reinforcing the NCC's role in developing resilient, confident youth.
- A major marine emergency has unfolded off Kerala's coast as the Singaporean vessel MV Wan Hai 503, engulfed in flames since
 June 9, 2025, continues to drift with a dangerous cargo of fuel and hazardous containers. The Indian Coast Guard has deployed
 multiple ships, aircraft, and salvage teams to control the fire and tow the ship away from the shore. Despite reducing the visible
 flames, internal fires still pose significant risks, underscoring the urgent need for continued aerial, sea, and technical operations
 to avert an environmental and maritime crisis.
- On 13 June 2025, the Indian Navy executed a daring aerial insertion of a salvage team aboard the burning cargo ship MV Wan
 Hai 503 using a Seaking helicopter from INS Garuda. The operation involved connecting the vessel to the salvage tug Offshore
 Warrior and successfully extracting the team post-mission. Supported by INS Sharda, MV Triton Liberty, and Indian Coast Guard,
 the mission highlighted India's maritime emergency response capabilities, ensuring the vessel could be safely towed and
 maritime safety maintained.
- INS Arnala, the first of the Anti-Submarine Warfare Shallow Water Craft (ASW-SWC) series, was commissioned by the Indian Navy at Visakhapatnam on June 18, 2025, in a ceremony led by CDS General Anil Chauhan. Built by GRSE in partnership with L&T Shipbuilders, the vessel showcases 80% indigenous content, aligning with the Aatmanirbhar Bharat initiative. Designed for coastal and littoral warfare, it enhances India's anti-submarine capabilities and secures the nation's interests in the Indian Ocean Region.
- INS Tamal, a stealth multi-role frigate, will be commissioned on July 1, 2025, in Kaliningrad, Russia, becoming the last imported warship of the Indian Navy. Built at Yantar Shipyard, the vessel features BrahMos missiles, advanced stealth design, and increased indigenous systems. It is part of the Krivak class and will serve with the Western Fleet. With two sister ships under construction in Goa Shipyard, India now pivots firmly toward Atmanirbhar Bharat and Make in India in the defence sector.
- The **Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO)** has taken a strategic step by offering **28 indigenous weapon systems** for **emergency procurement** by the Indian armed forces. These include advanced **missiles, rockets, grenades**, and **antidrone technologies**, which were critical in **Operation Sindoor**—India's military response to the **Pahalgam terror attack**. The systems have been categorized for the **Army (14)**, **Navy (8)**, and **Air Force (6)**. Backed by a list of approved vendors from both **PSUs and private firms**, this move supports the **Atmanirbhar Bharat** mission and ensures swift **operational readiness** under geopolitical stress.



Sports Current Affairs of July 2025

CRICKET

• India achieved a historic Test victory at Edgbaston on July 6, 2025, beating England by a record 336-run margin, the biggest overseas win for India in terms of runs. Akash Deep stood out with 10 wickets, the best Test figures by an Indian in England. This was also India's first Test win at Edgbaston after seven losses. The match saw several records broken, including the highest total runs in a Test between the two nations. India has now leveled the series 1-1, marking a proud moment in Indian cricket history.

- The IPL's total value rose to \$18.5 billion in 2025, showing its growing status as a top sports league. RCB became the most valued franchise at \$269 million after winning the 2025 title. Mumbai Indians and CSK followed behind. Sponsorships and viewership also broke records—JioHotstar and Star Sports saw historic numbers. Tata Group extended its sponsorship deal, and PBKS showed the highest growth in brand value. The league's success shows that the IPL is now a global sports business, combining cricket, entertainment, and media in a way few other events do.
- On July 10, 2025, Sachin Tendulkar's portrait was officially unveiled at the MCC Museum at Lord's Cricket Ground in London, a place known as the Home of Cricket. The painting was created by Stuart Pearson Wright, and Tendulkar also rang the bell to begin the day's India vs. England Test match. He shared memories of his early days in England and said the portrait was a special moment in his journey. He also praised Shubman Gill, India's new captain, for his calm leadership and good form.
- On July 11, 2025, both Italy and the Netherlands confirmed their spots in the ICC Men's T20 World Cup 2026 after the final matches of the Europe Qualifiers. This will be Italy's first appearance at the global event. Despite losing to the Netherlands, Italy ensured qualification by holding their opponents till the 17th over, maintaining a better net run rate. The Netherlands chased down 134/7 with strong performances from Roelof van der Merwe and Michael Levitt. A total of 15 teams have qualified so far, with more to be confirmed through upcoming qualifiers. The World Cup will take place in India and Sri Lanka in 2026.
- MI New York defeated Washington Freedom by 5 runs to win the 2025 Major League Cricket (MLC) title at the Grand Prairie Stadium in Dallas on July 14. After a poor start to the season, MI New York made a strong comeback with help from players like Quinton de Kock, Nicholas Pooran, Trent Boult, and Rushil Ugarkar. De Kock scored 77 runs, while Ugarkar bowled a brilliant last over to stop Freedom from reaching the target of 181. This is MI New York's second MLC title, making their journey from bottom of the table to champions truly inspirational.
- The International Cricket Council (ICC) awarded the June 2025 Player of the Month titles to South Africa's Aiden Markram and West Indies captain Hayley Matthews. Markram scored a match-winning 136 runs in the WTC Final against Australia, helping South Africa win their first ICC title since 1998. Matthews impressed with 104 runs and 4 wickets in ODIs, followed by 147 runs and 2 wickets in the T20I series against South Africa. This is Matthews' fourth ICC award, making her the second-most awarded female cricketer in the monthly rankings. Both players expressed pride in their performances and focus on future goals.











- Andre Russell retires from international cricket, ending a
 15-year career marked by two T20 World Cups, 84 T20Is
 (1,078 runs & 61 wickets), and a strong global franchise
 record. His farewell matches are on July 20 & 22, 2025,
 against Australia in Jamaica. He follows Nicholas Pooran
 into retirement ahead of the 2026 ICC T20 World Cup,
 leaving behind a legacy of power, performance, and pride.
- The England and Wales Cricket Board (ECB) has been awarded hosting rights for the 2027, 2029, and 2031 ICC World Test Championship Finals, following its successful execution of the 2021, 2023, and 2025 finals. The announcement came during the ICC Annual Conference 2025 in Singapore. This decision, underpinned by England's rich cricketing legacy and strong infrastructure, is set to reinforce the global standing of Test cricket, enhance fan engagement, and ensure continuity in staging this prestigious event.
- Joe Root has become the second-highest run-getter in Test cricket, surpassing Dravid, Kallis, and Ponting in a single innings at Old Trafford. With 38 centuries (equal to Sangakkara) and 104 fifties, he is second only to Tendulkar in both major milestones. Root also became the first batter to score 1,000+ Test runs at Old Trafford, solidifying his status as a modern legend of the game. His form has been particularly dominant in the last five years, marked by consistency and big hundreds.

BADMINTON & TENNIS

- Jannik Sinner won his first Wimbledon title on July 13, 2025, by defeating two-time defending champion Carlos Alcaraz in the final. The match ended with a score of 4-6, 6-4, 6-4. This win gave Sinner his fourth Grand Slam title and stopped Alcaraz's 24-match winning streak. The two players, now the top stars in men's tennis, have shared the last seven major titles, showing a growing rivalry. Sinner's victory also came after losing to Alcaraz at the French Open, making this a sweet comeback.
- lga Swiatek won her first Wimbledon title on July 12, 2025, defeating Amanda Anisimova with a rare 6-0, 6-0 scoreline in just 57 minutes. The victory was Swiatek's sixth Grand Slam title and made her the only active women's player to win on all three surfaces. Anisimova, playing her first major final, couldn't match Swiatek's level. Despite recent struggles and a brief doping ban, Swiatek proved her strength and determination. Kate, the Princess of Wales, attended the final, making the event even more special. This win marks a major comeback and historic moment in women's tennis.

- The Japan Open Badminton 2025, a key BWF World Tour event, saw Shi Yuqi of China win the men's singles title, while South Korea's An Se-young claimed her sixth championship of the year in the women's singles. China emerged as the top-performing nation, winning three gold medals in total, while South Korea and Malaysia also registered strong finishes. The tournament reinforced the dominance of Asian countries in global badminton, showcasing world-class talent and resilience across all events.
- India made history at the Badminton Asia Junior Championships 2025 as Tanvi Sharma and Vennala Kalagotla became the first Indian women's singles duo to win medals at the same edition. Tanvi, the junior World No. 1, showcased dominance with straight-game victories, while Vennala, ranked World No. 103, showed resilience in tight matches. This unprecedented feat highlights India's rising stature in junior women's badminton and marks a significant milestone in the nation's sporting achievements.

Chess

- Indian Grandmaster D Gukesh won the rapid title at the SuperUnited Rapid & Blitz 2025 in Zagreb, Croatia, on July 4, scoring 14 points. He now leads the Grand Chess Tour ahead of Jan-Krzysztof Duda (11 points) and Magnus Carlsen (10 points). The blitz section begins on July 5, and the overall winner will be decided by the combined scores of both formats.
- Magnus Carlsen won the SuperUnited Rapid and Blitz 2025 chess tournament in Zagreb, Croatia on July 7, finishing with 22.5/36. He secured the title one round early. Wesley So of the USA came second with 20/36, and India's D Gukesh took third with 19.5/36. This Grand Chess Tour event tested players in Rapid and Blitz formats. Gukesh, despite challenges in Blitz, showed strong progress. The next event will be held in Saint Louis, Missouri in August 2025.
- Harikrishnan A. Ra., a 23-year-old from Chennai, became India's 87th Grandmaster after earning his third GM norm at the La Plagne International Chess Festival in France on July 11, 2025. Coached by Shyam Sundar, Harikrishnan had previously earned GM norms in Switzerland (2023) and Spain (June 2025). His final performance, including a draw with P. Iniyan and a win over Jules Moussard, secured the title. Harikrishnan, who recently finished his M.Com from SRM, plans to compete in Spain and Portugal before pursuing an MBA in the USA. His next goal is to reach an Elo rating of 2600.
- The FIDE World Cup 2025 will be held in India from October 30–November 27 with 206 players in a knockout format. The event offers 3 qualification spots for the 2026 Candidates Tournament. India's strong performance in recent international events and its chess culture make it an ideal host. Qualification routes include champions, ratings, continental events, and nominations. With stars like Gukesh, Praggnanandhaa, and Erigaisi, India is cementing its role as a chess powerhouse.











Grand Prix

• Lando Norris won the British Grand Prix at Silverstone on July 6, 2025, in a wet and exciting race. He took the lead after Oscar Piastri received a 10-second penalty, which helped Norris reduce the points gap in the Formula 1 championship. It was McLaren's first win at Silverstone since 2008. Nico Hülkenberg finished third, and Max Verstappen came fifth after a spin. Many rookie drivers crashed out due to the rain. Norris called the win a dream come true in front of his home fans.

ATHLETIC & FOOTBALL

- India will place a strategic bid to host the 2029 or 2031 World Athletics Championships, according to AFI official Adille Sumariwalla on July 6, 2025 in Bengaluru. The bidding process starts this year, and final decisions will be made in September 2026. Since Tokyo (2025) and Beijing (2027) are already hosting, India may have a better chance at 2031. India has also shown interest in hosting the 2028 Junior World Championships and future Athletics Relay events. These efforts are part of India's goal to bring the Olympics to the country in 2036.
- Mexico defeated the United States 2-1 in the CONCACAF Gold Cup 2025 final held at NRG Stadium, Houston. Chris Richards scored early for the US, but Raul Jimenez and Edson Alvarez scored for Mexico to seal the win. This victory gives Mexico a record 10th Gold Cup title. The match saw dramatic moments, strong performances, and emotional tributes, making it a memorable final for football fans across the region.
- Neeraj Chopra won the inaugural Neeraj Chopra Classic 2025 in Bengaluru with a best javelin throw of 86.18 metres. The event was held at the Sree Kanteerava Stadium as part of the World Athletics Gold-level series. Kenya's Julius Yego finished second with 84.51 metres, while Sri Lanka's Rumesh Pathirage came third with 84.34 metres. Neeraj impressed the crowd with a strong third throw, keeping his top form ahead of upcoming global competitions. This new event also marks India's growing presence in international athletics.
- The Indian men's football team has dropped six places to 133rd in the FIFA rankings, marking its worst ranking since December 2016. The decline follows recent defeats to Thailand and Hong Kong in June 2025, which also led to coach Manolo Marquez's exit. India's performance under him saw just one win in eight matches. With the team struggling and qualification for the 2027 Asian Cup at risk, India's next chance to bounce back will come in October against Singapore.

• Chelsea FC won the FIFA Club World Cup 2025 by beating PSG 3-0 on July 13, 2025, at MetLife Stadium in New Jersey. Cole Palmer was the standout player, scoring two goals and assisting Joao Pedro for the third. Chelsea's tactical game plan, led by manager Enzo Maresca, completely outplayed the Champions League winners PSG. The match also saw Joao Neves get sent off for PSG, adding to their poor night. With this win, Chelsea took home the champion's prize of \$40 million, and Palmer received the Golden Ball as the best player of the tournament.

OTHER SPORTS NEWS

- On July 1, 2025, the Union Cabinet approved the National Sports Policy to transform India into a global sports powerhouse. The policy emphasizes athlete-centric development, mass fitness participation, sports tourism, and transparent governance. It envisions a robust ecosystem driven by education integration, corporate involvement, and the manufacture of sports goods, aligning sports with economic growth and social well-being.
- India made history at the World Boxing Cup 2025 in Astana by winning 11 medals, including 3 gold, 5 silver, and 3 bronze. Sakshi, Jaismine, and Nupur were the gold medal winners who led the team to success. Their wins against strong opponents from the USA, Brazil, and Kazakhstan brought pride to the country. This was India's best medal haul ever at this event and shows the growing power of Indian women boxers on the global stage.
- Deepika Sehrawat, 21, became the first Indian to win the Poligras Magic Skill Award for her solo field goal against the Netherlands in the 2024–25 FIH Hockey Pro League. Her rise began in Hisar with national-level success and culminated in global recognition. The goal was a turning point, leading India to a draw and shootout win. Her win is a milestone for Indian hockey, reflecting growing global respect for the sport in India. Key terms: Deepika Sehrawat, Poligras Magic Skill Award, FIH Hockey Pro League, Netherlands match, Hisar, Women's Hockey India.
- Bihar won the U18 Boys' title at the 10th Junior National Rugby 7s Championship 2025, defeating Odisha 17–15 and completing a historic double victory after claiming the U18 Girls' title earlier. With standout performances from players like Goldan Kumar and Sunny Kumar, Bihar remained undefeated and displayed national dominance alongside top teams like Maharashtra and Delhi. The competition serves as a key talent pipeline for India's future in senior rugby.
- At the World University Games 2025 in Germany, Srihari Nataraj set a new Best Indian Performance in 200m freestyle with 1:48.22, while B. Benediction Rohit became the first Indian man to swim the 50m butterfly in under 24 seconds (23.96s), breaking a 7-year-old national mark. These achievements mark a turning point in Indian swimming history.











- The Fit India Sundays on Cycle program, under the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, is a national-level campaign promoting fitness, youth empowerment, and a drug-free lifestyle. With large-scale participation, including events like the one held at BHU Varanasi, the initiative integrates cycling, yoga, games, and public awareness to support the vision of Viksit Bharat. It fosters healthy habits, encourages community involvement, and delivers a strong social message, making it a cornerstone of India's public health and youth development strategy.
- The MRF MMSC FMSCI Indian National Car Racing Championship 2025 began at Kari Motor Speedway, featuring top performances by teen drivers like Ishaan Madesh, Arjun Chheda, Bhuvan Bonu, and others across F2000, F1600, and Touring Cars. Key names included Biren Pithawalla, Arjun Balu, and Rithwik Thomas. The event marked the rising dominance of youth in Indian motorsport and highlighted India's growing presence in competitive racing circuits.
- Riley Powell, a 16-year-old Welsh cueist, defeated Pankaj Advani in the final of the IBSF World 6-Red Snooker Championship 2025 held in Manama, Bahrain, with a 5-4 victory. Advani, on his 40th birthday, was denied his 29th world title. The win is a major milestone for Powell and reflects the rise of young global talent in snooker.
- India won its first gold medal at the FISU World University Games 2025 as Parneet Kaur and Kushal Dalal triumphed in the compound mixed team archery event. India also secured a silver in compound men's team and a bronze in compound women's team. This performance boosts India's prospects ahead of the LA 2028 Olympics, where compound archery will debut. The event underscores the rising standards in university-level sports, especially for women athletes and non-mainstream sports.

SATELLITE LAUNCHES

- ISRO is preparing to launch the 6,500 kg BlueBird communications satellite, developed by AST SpaceMobile (USA), aboard the LVM3 from Sriharikota in late 2025. This mission follows the successful NISAR launch and reflects the strengthening Indo-U.S. space collaboration. It also aligns with India's broader space goals, including the Gaganyaan human spaceflight programme and the target to establish the Bharatiya Antariksh Station by 2035.
- ISRO successfully conducted the first Integrated Air Drop Test (IADT-01) for the showcasing the parachute-based deceleration system for human spaceflight. This milestone, achieved with support from the Indian Air Force, DRDO, Indian Navy, and Coast Guard, follows the completion of the Human Rated Launch Vehicle (HLVM3) and other critical systems like the Crew Module, Service Module, and Crew Escape System (CES). The mission is part of India's broader space vision, aiming for the Bharatiya Antariksha Station by 2035 and a Moon landing by 2040.

ISRO conducted a 10-day high-altitude space simulation at 14,000 feet in Ladakh under its Gaganyaan programme. Held at the newly inaugurated **HOPE** (Himalayan Outpost for **Planetary Exploration)** facility by **Protoplanet**, the study focused on isolation, cold stress, and mental health impacts. Two participants, Rahul Mogalapalli and Yaman Akot, were

- selected from 135 applicants, mimicking astronaut routines.
- To improve agricultural resilience, **ICRISAT**, in collaboration with ICAR and under the Monsoon Mission III, launched an Al-powered climate advisory in Maharashtra. Using an Alenabled WhatsApp bot, the service provides hyper-local weather insights to smallholder farmers, with plans for a national and international rollout.
- The IndiaAI and National Cancer Grid (NCG) launched the CATCH Grant Program, offering pilot grants up to ₹50 lakh and scale-up funding up to ₹1 crore. The program, open until September 2, 2025, supports Al-driven solutions in cancer screening, diagnosis, and treatment, encouraging responsible AI development and clinical validation.
- BharatGen AI, under the Department of Science and Technology (DST), will support all 22 languages of the Eighth **Schedule** by **June 2026**. This initiative, part of the **National** Mission on Interdisciplinary Cyber-Physical Systems, aims to ensure digital inclusivity and promote multilingual AI ecosystems across India.
- Dr. Jitendra Singh inaugurated India's first Animal Stem Cell Biobank and Laboratory at NIAB, Hyderabad, marking a major leap in veterinary biotechnology. He also laid the foundation for new infrastructure worth ₹19.98 crore to support research. The lab, built at ₹1.85 crore, will focus on regenerative medicine and cellular therapies for livestock. He also launched five innovative veterinary diagnostic tools to combat antimicrobial resistance and support the 'One Health' approach. Praising PM Modi's BioE3 policy, the minister emphasized India's leadership in biotechdriven growth, aiming for an Evergreen Revolution in animal husbandry and agriculture.
- Rare Blue Pinkgill mushroom, native to New Zealand, discovered in Telangana's Kagaznagar forest, showcasing its striking sky-blue colour due to rare azulene pigments. Additionally, the shuttlecock mushroom spotted for the first time in Eastern Ghats (Kawal Tiger Reserve), highlighting the region's rich fungal diversity and unique ecological conditions.
- ISRO has inaugurated a cutting-edge space laboratory at Mechuka Government Higher Secondary School in Shi-Yomi district, Arunachal Pradesh. Opened by Education Minister Pasang Dorjee Sona, the lab—established in collaboration with ISRO and Muskaan Foundation—aims to spark interest in space science among students through handson learning. Named Pasang Wangchuk Sona ISRO Space **Laboratory** after the minister's father, the initiative honors his belief in the power of education to transform lives.
- Deep Ocean Mission Record: Aquanaut Jatinder Pal Singh descended 5,002 metres in the North Atlantic, marking India's deepest dive under the **Deep Ocean Mission**. Supports the indigenous Matsya 6000 (trials by Dec 2027).
- India's 6G Roadmap: Govt unveiled a 6G rollout plan by 2030, guided by the Bharat 6G Vision Document and ITU-R M.2160. Initiatives include 100 5G labs, the TTDF Scheme (₹275.88 Cr for 104 projects), Bharat 6G Alliance, and a Tech Hub at IIIT Bangalore.

- ISRO Gaganyaan Update: First manned mission test flight in Dec 2025; 80% of tests completed. ISRO achieved 196 milestones, including GLEX-2025 propulsion system and a 6,500 kg US comm satellite launch.
- Bharatiya Antariksh Station & Moon Mission: India targets space station by 2035 and crewed lunar mission by 2040.
 Minister Dr. Jitendra Singh hailed IAF Group Captain Subhanshu Shukla's ISS mission.
- India has become ground zero in the global AI race, with OpenAI leading the charge by launching ChatGPT Go at just ₹399/month and announcing its first India office in New Delhi. This move, aligned with the IndiaAI Mission, intensifies competition with Google, Microsoft, Perplexity, and xAI, sparking a price war in a rapidly expanding market. OpenAI's localisation—UPI integration, Indic languages, and education tools—caters to India's massive student base and developer ecosystem. While this surge offers users affordable AI access, it also challenges Indian startups, forcing them to collaborate or adapt in a capital-heavy landscape.

INTERNATIONAL

- India, in collaboration with UK scientists, has identified the
 world's rarest blood group CRIB, in a 38-year-old woman
 from Bengaluru. Part of the Cromer blood group system, the
 blood lacks a common antigen, making transfusions
 extremely difficult. The discovery may revolutionize critical
 care, prenatal diagnostics, and rare blood donation systems
 globally.
- To combat hidden hunger, India is introducing iron-enriched bio-fortified potatoes with support from the International Potato Center (CIP). The initiative complements efforts for Vitamin A-rich sweet potatoes, all part of ICAR's biofortification programme covering 61 crops. It strengthens nutrition security and showcases India's leadership in climate-smart agriculture.
- Russia's Venera-D Mission: Russia to launch Venus exploration mission (2034–2036) with lander, balloon probe, and orbiter. Preliminary design starts Jan 2026 under IKI & Lavochkin Association.
- Parag Agrawal's Startup: Ex-Twitter CEO launched Parallel Web Systems, an Al startup building a "web for machines."
 Its APIs outperform OpenAl's GPT-5 in benchmarks like BrowseComp & DeepResearch Bench.
- SpaceX completed its 10th successful Starship test launch from Starbase, Texas, showcasing progress toward the world's first fully reusable rocket. The Super Heavy booster achieved a controlled splashdown in the Gulf of Mexico, while Starship's upper stage performed a reignition in space and soft-landed in the Indian Ocean. Notably, it also demonstrated payload deployment using Starlink simulators, meeting all key objectives and aiding future missions like NASA's Artemis III in 2027.

- The UN General Assembly has launched two major initiatives the Independent International Scientific Panel on AI and the Global Dialogue on AI Governance to promote global cooperation on AI governance. UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres hailed the move as a "significant step" toward balancing AI's benefits and risks. The Scientific Panel will offer independent assessments to guide policy, while the Dialogue will serve as an inclusive platform for global stakeholders. These efforts support the Global Digital Compact under the Pact for the Future (2024).
- Nano Banana is the code name for Google's new Alpowered photo-editing tool, officially launched as Gemini 2.5 Flash Image, developed by Google DeepMind. It allows users to blend multiple images, maintain character consistency, and make creative edits like changing hairstyles, adding costumes, or altering backgrounds using natural language prompts. A standout feature, "Design Mixing," lets users transfer textures or styles from one image to another for unique effects.

Science & Technology of July 2025

SATELLITES LAUNCHES

- Hyderabad-based Ananth Technologies will launch India's first private satellite broadband service by 2028. It has received approval from IN-SPACe, India's space regulator. The company will send a satellite to geostationary orbit over 35,000 km above Earth to provide broadband internet directly from space. This ₹3,000-crore project aims to improve internet access, especially in remote areas, and will compete with international players like Starlink, OneWeb, and Amazon Kuiper. This marks a big change in India's space and telecom sectors, allowing private companies to grow and serve more people.
- The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) successfully conducted two hot tests of the Gaganyaan Service Module Propulsion System (SMPS) on July 3, 2025, at its Propulsion Complex in Mahendragiri, Tamil Nadu, marking a crucial step for India's first crewed space mission under the Gaganyaan Programme. The SMPS, featuring 5 Liquid Apogee Motors (LAMs) and 16 Reaction Control System (RCS) thrusters, is key for orbital maneuvers, trajectory corrections, and crew safety.
- NISAR, to be launched on July 30, 2025 by ISRO's GSLV-F16, is the first joint satellite between ISRO and NASA, featuring dual-frequency SAR (L-band & S-band). Weighing 2392 kg, it will operate from a Sun-synchronous orbit (743 km) and use SweepSAR technology for 12-day global coverage. Key applications include disaster management, climate monitoring, soil moisture tracking, and ice sheet movement, reinforcing its global scientific importance.











NASA has launched the TRACERS Mission with two satellites to study magnetic reconnection in Earth's polar cusp, protecting the planet from solar storms. The satellites will provide real-time data on how space weather affects satellites, communication systems, and power grids. It launched alongside Athena EPIC, PExT, and REAL satellites on a SpaceX Falcon 9 rocket, and is significant for global space research, including for countries like India.

NATIONAL

- In a strategic step towards enhancing India's sovereign space capabilities, SatSure and Dhruva Space have joined hands to offer end-to-end Earth Observation (EO) solutions. This collaboration will unify upstream and downstream segments of the space value chain, integrating KaleidEO's payloads with Dhruva Space's satellite platform infrastructure. With a focus on indigenous innovation, the alliance will provide full-stack space solutions, addressing the demands of commercial and strategic users alike.
- Indian researchers have engineered a next-generation energy storage material using lanthanum-doped silver niobate nanoparticles, showing superior performance in supercapacitor devices. The material demonstrated 118% energy retention and 100% coulombic efficiency, making it a promising solution for clean energy storage. This ecofriendly innovation, led by Dr. Kavita Pandey's team at CeNS, Bengaluru, paves the way for future high-density, fast-charging supercapacitors in portable electronics and renewable energy systems.
- On July 6, 2025, Union Minister Dr. Jitendra Singh opened the National Biobank at CSIR-IGIB, New Delhi. This project will collect data from 10,000 Indians to support personalized medicine and better disease treatment. It is part of the Phenome India project. The minister also highlighted India's work in genomics, CRISPR technology, and healthcare innovation. Experts like Dr. N. Kalaiselvi and Dr. Souvik Maiti praised the move as a major step toward healthcare self-reliance and global leadership in science.
- India became the fourth-largest biofuel consumer in the world in 2024, moving ahead of China for the second year in a row, according to the Statistical Review of World Energy 2025. India consumed 77 kbbloe/d, a 40% rise from last year, while China consumed 60 kbbloe/d. However, in biofuel production, India made 70 kbbloe/d, still behind China's 106 kbbloe/d. The report also showed that global demand for biofuels rose, especially in the Asia Pacific and North America regions. While biofuels help cut pollution, overall global emissions from energy rose by 1% in 2024, marking another record high.

- The Ministry of Information and Broadcasting (MIB) has launched the Kalaa Setu Real-Time Language Tech for Bharat Challenge via its WaveX Startup Accelerator Platform. The challenge calls on AI startups across India to build tools that turn text into audio, video, or graphics in various Indian languages. Applications can be submitted on the WaveX portal by July 30, while the Bhasha Setu translation challenge closes on July 22. This effort is part of the WAVES initiative, aiming to boost innovation in media and language tech.
- The Government of Andhra Pradesh has introduced the Smart Mosquito Surveillance System (SMoSS) to fight mosquito-borne diseases like dengue and malaria. This Alpowered project will start in 66 places across six major cities including Vijayawada and Visakhapatnam. It will use smart sensors, drones, apps, and hospital data to track and control mosquito breeding. The system will help officials take quick action by sending alerts and mapping problem areas. This is a big step toward tech-based public health and can serve as a model for other states in India.
- A new species, Garcinia kusumae, has been discovered in Baksa district, Assam, by botanist Jatindra Sarma, who named it in honour of his late mother, Kusum Devi. The discovery was made in April 2025 and published in the global journal Feddes Repertorium. This evergreen tree has unique flowers and fruits and is used in traditional food and medicine. With this, Assam adds to its record of 12 Garcinia species. The new finding boosts India's botanical diversity and shows how much more is still to be discovered in the country's rich forests.
- A new butterfly species, Zographetus mathewi, has been discovered in the Western Ghats of Kerala, adding to the region's already rich biodiversity. The species was confirmed after careful study by researchers from the Travancore Nature History Society, Zoological Survey of India, and others. It is named after George Mathew, a well-known Indian entomologist. This butterfly, also called the Sahyadri Spotted Flitter, is found in forests below 600 metres, and its larvae feed on the vine Aganope thyrsiflora. The discovery, published in Entomon, highlights the importance of conservation and continued field research in biodiversity hotspots like the Western Ghats.
- IIM Kozhikode has launched Gyanodaya, a Centre for Pedagogical Innovation and Publishing, to transform management education through peer-reviewed content, indigenous knowledge, and collaborative pedagogy. It uses Pandulipi, an in-house platform, and is aligned with Vision 2047 and NEP goals, aiming to build a global knowledge commons.











- A new lichen species, Allographa effusosoredica, was discovered in the Western Ghats by scientists at MACS-Agharkar Institute, marking the first Indian Allographa supported by DNA sequencing. It features rare chemical traits, a Trentepohlia algal partner, and mimics other Graphidaceae species morphologically. Backed by the ANRF, this research emphasizes the role of integrative taxonomy, symbiotic diversity, and the need for molecular studies in documenting India's rich lichen biodiversity.
- A Martian meteorite named NWA 16788, weighing 54 pounds, was discovered in Niger in 2023 and sold at Sotheby's for a record \$5.3 million in July 2025. The rock, ejected from Mars about 5 million years ago, traveled 140 million miles to Earth and is now the largest known Martian meteorite found. Its journey and discovery highlight key areas of space science, geology, and global interest in extraterrestrial artifacts.
- Indian scientists from Bose Institute have identified and overexpressed the AcSERK3 gene in pineapple to enhance resistance against Fusariosis, caused by Fusarium moniliforme. This is the first documented case of such a native gene's overexpression in pineapple, resulting in stronger stress response, better survival, and potential multi-fungal tolerance. The genetically modified plants showed increased levels of stress-fighting enzymes and may offer a sustainable disease-resistant crop for future farming.

INTERNATIONAL

- Nvidia has become the world's most valuable company, reaching a market capitalisation of \$3.92 trillion, surpassing Apple's previous record. Fueled by the Al boom, Nvidia's dominance in Al chip technology has driven massive growth, with its stock rising 68% since April. Its value now exceeds the entire stock markets of Canada, Mexico, and even the UK, highlighting investor confidence in Nvidia and the future of artificial intelligence.
- HCL Software, the software arm of HCL Tech, has launched Domino 14.5, an advanced platform focused on data sovereignty and enhanced privacy for governments and regulated organisations. Its key feature, Domino IQ, is a sovereign AI solution designed to safeguard sensitive national and enterprise data from foreign surveillance. Richard Jefts, Executive VP, emphasized the importance of local digital control, especially as nations tighten data protection frameworks.
- Switzerland's health authority, Swissmedic, has given its first approval to a malaria medicine for infants, made by Novartis. The approval came on July 9, 2025, and applies to babies weighing 2 to 5 kilograms. The decision is important because malaria kills thousands of children, especially in Africa, where 95% of global malaria deaths occurred in 2023. Experts say the new medicine is safe and effective, and it will be offered on a not-for-profit basis in malaria-hit countries. This move could help protect the youngest lives in the fight against one of the world's deadliest diseases.

- A new study led by scientists, including Edward Doddridge from the University of Tasmania, has found that Antarctica's summer sea ice is at record low levels. The research team used satellite data, robotic ocean sensors, and computer models to study the effects. Their findings show rising ocean temperatures, damage to marine ecosystems, and growing global risks. This worrying trend began in 2016 and is continuing. The scientists call for faster climate action to protect the planet from long-term harm.
- Chinese scientists at the Beijing Institute of Technology announced the creation of the world's lightest mind-controller, weighing just 74 milligrams. This device is used to control bees, turning them into cyborgs that can follow commands during military missions, urban combat, drug searches, and disaster rescue. The controller sends signals through three tiny needles inserted into the bee's brain, successfully guiding their flight paths. Professor Zhao Jieliang, who led the team, said insect cyborgs offer better movement, stealth, and endurance than machines. While battery life remains a problem, the team plans to make future upgrades.
- Israel successfully launched its Dror-1 communications satellite on July 13, 2025, using a SpaceX Falcon 9 rocket from Cape Canaveral. Built by Israel Aerospace Industries (IAI), Dror-1 weighs 4.5 tons and is equipped with large antennas and solar panels. It will serve Israel's communication needs for 15 years. The launch highlights Israel's efforts to strengthen its space program, ensure self-reliance, expand technological and communication networks using advanced satellite systems. Google is offering free Gemini Al Pro access to eligible Indian students until September 15, 2025. It includes tools like Gemini 2.5 Pro, Deep Research, Gemini for Workspace, and 2TB cloud storage. The offer supports exam prep, digital creativity, and empowerment. Visit gemini.google/students to apply with student ID and get one year free.













Science & Technology of June 2025

SATELLITES LAUNCHES

- Research Vessel (PRV) through an MoU signed between GRSE and Norway's Kongsberg. This vessel, to be used by NCPOR, will enhance India's role in polar research and reflect its Make in India prowess. Union Minister Sarbananda Sonowal, attending the Nor-Shipping 2025 event in Norway, also promoted India's MAHASAGAR vision, encouraged sustainable maritime investments, and highlighted opportunities in shipbuilding and green logistics. This development marks a critical step in India's maritime transformation and global collaboration.
- Shubhanshu Shukla, an Indian Air Force officer, became the 634th astronaut to enter space, marking a significant chapter in India's space journey. Part of the Axiom-4 mission, he successfully docked at the ISS on June 26, 2025, alongside astronauts from the USA, Poland, and Hungary. The 14-day mission will focus on scientific research, international collaboration, and showcasing India's growing contribution to human spaceflight.

NATIONAL

- India is taking a major step in AI infrastructure by launching its first AI-focused Special Economic Zone (SEZ) in Nava Raipur, Chhattisgarh, with a ₹1,000 crore investment by RackBank Datacenters. This carbon-neutral data hub aims to foster AI research, development, and employment, offering incentives under the SEZ framework. It is expected to attract global tech giants like Google, Microsoft, and OpenAI, and will provide job opportunities to local youth while supporting digital transformation nationwide.
- For the first time in Kerala, the State Public Health Laboratory has confirmed the presence of Acanthamoeba spp.—a fatal brain-infecting amoeba—in a human sample using in-house developed molecular diagnostic kits. This scientific advancement allows Kerala to carry out its own confirmatory testing for amoebic encephalitis, bypassing national labs and enabling early, effective treatment.
- Union Minister Kamlesh Paswan inaugurated Garuda Aerospace's Agri-Drone Indigenization Facility in Chennai, launching 300 Centres of Excellence (CoEs) and the DGCA-approved Train the Trainer (TTT) programme. The 35,000 sq. ft. facility is equipped to manufacture 1 lakh drones by 2026, aligning with Prime Minister Modi's vision of making India a Global Drone Hub. Live demonstrations by Drone Didis, collaboration with the Bharat Drone Association, and a focus on self-reliance, skilling, and innovation marked a transformative moment for the country's drone industry.

- India has marked a significant milestone in cancer research by developing a one-step synthesis method for PEGylated nano-cups, offering a non-toxic, efficient alternative for photothermal therapy (PTT). Spearheaded by INST Mohali with contributions from IIT Bombay and ACTREC, this breakthrough utilizes ZIF-8 MOF and ascorbic acid to create semi-shells that can precisely target and destroy cancerous tumors, especially in advanced breast cancer. The innovation not only enhances therapeutic efficacy but also opens pathways for biosensing and chemo-photothermal treatments, making it a game-changer in minimally invasive oncology.
- India's participation in international commercial spaceflight has reached new heights as the Axiom Mission 4 launch, featuring Indian astronaut Shubhanshu Shukla, has been rescheduled to June 22 due to safety checks in the Zvezda module of the ISS. The mission, led by NASA astronaut Peggy Whitson and operated by Axiom Space, includes astronauts from India, Poland, and Hungary, and will fly aboard the SpaceX Falcon 9 using the Dragon capsule. With ISRO's support, this mission reflects India's evolving space ambitions and boosts its role in low-Earth orbit (LEO) scientific operations.
- Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman has laid the foundation stone for a Mini Planetarium and Astro Globe at the Hanle Dark Sky Reserve in Ladakh, with a project outlay of ₹276.65 lakh under the Special Development Package. The initiative supports astro-tourism, public astronomy education, and local employment, complementing the work of advanced observatories like MACE. The Minister also engaged with nomadic communities, distributing goat-shearing machines, and allocated ₹50 lakh under SBI's CSR for constructing community tents.
- In a move set to accelerate India's entry into the commercial space launch market, HAL has secured a ₹511 crore deal to manufacture and operate SSLVs under ISRO's technology transfer programme. The process will include two years of support and training, after which HAL will independently handle SSLV production. This milestone reflects India's strategic intent to empower its public sector units in space commercialisation, foster private collaboration, and position the country as a global launch service provider for small satellites.
- Bharti Space Ltd has invested ₹313 crore in Eutelsat's €1.35 billion capital raise, signaling a major move in the global satellite internet race. As the French government becomes the largest shareholder, Eutelsat plans to expand its hybrid satellite fleet—including 600+ LEO satellites—to build a sovereign European space network. Bharti's stake will dilute, but it remains invested in both Eutelsat-OneWeb and Starlink ventures in India.











- Dangeti Jahnavi, a young space enthusiast from Palakollu, Andhra Pradesh, has made history as the first Indian to complete NASA's International Air and Space Program, marking a breakthrough for India in global space missions and for women in STEM. Selected for the upcoming 2029 Titan's Orbital Port Space Station mission, she will be among the first Indians to join commercial space operations. Backed by a strong academic foundation in Electronics and Communication Engineering, Jahnavi is also a passionate STEM educator, ISRO outreach speaker, and analog mission trainee, reflecting her deep commitment to space research, education, and global collaboration.
- India's quantum revolution is taking shape with the announcement of the Amaravati Quantum Valley, the country's first quantum computing hub, set to launch by January 2026. Spearheaded by the ITE&C Department of Andhra Pradesh, the initiative aims to foster research, innovation, and job creation across critical sectors like healthcare, logistics, agri-tech, and cybersecurity. In collaboration with major players like IBM, LTIMindtree, and TCS, and aligned with the National Quantum Mission, the project will integrate quantum AI, secure communication (QNu Project), and advanced computing to drive national productivity and future-ready skills.

INTERNATIONAL

- China launched the Tianwen-2 mission on May 30, 2025, targeting asteroid 2016HO3 for sample collection and later exploring comet 311P. Led by CNSA, the mission is designed to yield scientific insights about the solar system's origins, particularly Earth's water sources. The mission represents China's growing role in deep-space exploration, further advancing its space technology after previous successes like Tianwen-1 and its lunar missions.
- Snap Inc. has announced the launch of its first consumerready smart glasses, called Specs, in 2026, marking its

- serious entry into the wearable augmented reality (AR) market. This move challenges Meta, whose Ray-Ban smart glasses are gaining popularity. Snap's new product will be lightweight, AR-integrated, and supported by the Lens Studio platform in collaboration with Niantic Spatial. With over \$3 billion invested and five previous developer-only versions, Snap aims to expand its ecosystem and reduce dependence on digital ads.
- A new COVID-19 variant, NB.1.8.1 (Nimbus), first identified in January 2025, is drawing global concern due to its rapid spread and a distinct symptom described as "razor blade throat". Classified by the WHO as a variant under monitoring, Nimbus, a descendant of Omicron, has been detected in 22 countries including the US, UK, China, and parts of Asia, accounting for 10.7% of sequenced cases in late April.
- The US FDA has approved Lenacapavir (Yeztugo), a twice-yearly injectable drug for HIV prevention, showing 99.9% efficacy in Phase 3 trials. This breakthrough offers a low-maintenance, long-acting alternative to current PrEP options, with potential to boost global compliance and reduce stigma. Though not widely used in India due to high costs and absence in national HIV programmes, experts say the drug could transform global public health outcomes if supported by WHO and donor agencies.
- A new scientific study from Yunnan, China has revealed the existence of two novel henipaviruses in bat populations, raising concerns due to their genetic similarity to the deadly Nipah and Hendra viruses. Found in the kidneys of bats, the viruses could spread to humans through urine-contaminated fruits or water, potentially triggering neurological or respiratory diseases. Experts have flagged this discovery as a public health warning, urging for heightened surveillance of zoonotic pathogens, especially in rural regions where human-wildlife interactions are more frequent.

Today, challenges like climate change, low R&D funding, and lack of institutional autonomy threaten progress, emphasizing the need for closer engagement between scientists and policymakers to secure India's agricultural future.

- Warren Buffett, the legendary investor and CEO of Berkshire Hathaway, has donated \$6 billion in Class B stock to five major philanthropic foundations, including the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation Trust. The move brings his total charitable contributions since 2006 to around \$60 billion. This donation highlights his ongoing commitment to giving away 99.5% of his fortune. The foundations receiving the donations are known for their work in global health, education, poverty reduction, and social equity, making this announcement a significant event in the world of philanthropy and social impact.
- In a pioneering step towards eradicating tuberculosis (TB), Puducherry has become the first Union Territory in India to link TB screening with the Family Adoption Programme. Under this National Medical Commission initiative, medical students adopt 3–5 families and monitor their health over three years. In Puducherry, this outreach now includes routine TB checks for all family members. If symptoms are detected, students help with diagnosis and treatment, enhancing early detection and access to care.











- In a landmark breakthrough in archaeology and genetics, scientists have successfully sequenced the first complete genome of an ancient Egyptian, marking a major step in understanding early human populations. Published on July 2, 2025, in the journal Nature, the study details DNA extracted from a man buried in Nuwayrat, around 4,500 years ago during Egypt's Old Kingdom period. The individual, likely a physically laboring male aged 44–64 years, had brown eyes, brown hair, dark skin, and lived a relatively affluent life, as suggested by the tomb style.
- Sundar Pichai, CEO of Alphabet Inc., has reached a net worth of \$1.1 billion, driven by Alphabet's soaring stock and heavy Al investments. His rise—from a modest background in Tamil Nadu to leading one of the world's biggest tech companies—illustrates the power of strategic leadership and innovation. With only 0.02% stock ownership, Pichai's wealth stems largely from stock sales and compensation, alongside his pivotal role in Alphabet's Al infrastructure boom. DeepMind's acquisition, a 120% stock rise, and \$50 billion Al investment in 2024 were key factors.
