
## National News

Cabinet Approvals

- The **Union Cabinet**, chaired by **Prime Minister Narendra Modi**, has approved the **National Scheme for Industrial Training Institute (ITI) Upgradation** and the setting up of **five National Centres of Excellence for Skilling** as a **Centrally Sponsored Scheme**. Announced under **Budget 2024–25 and 2025–26**, the scheme has a total outlay of **₹60,000 crore**, with contributions from the **Centre, States, and industry**, and co-financing from the **Asian Development Bank** and the **World Bank**. The scheme aims to upgrade **1,000 government ITIs** using a **hub-and-spoke model** and to strengthen **five National Skill Training Institutes (NSTIs)** located in **Bhubaneswar, Chennai, Hyderabad, Kanpur, and Ludhiana**. It also involves setting up **five National Centres of Excellence** within these NSTIs and training **50,000 trainers**. Over a five-year period, the initiative will skill **20 lakh youth** in sectors like **electronics, automotive, and renewable energy**. It introduces a **need-based investment model** and a **Special Purpose Vehicle (SPV) structure** for **outcome-driven implementation**. The goal is to make ITIs aspirational and support the vision of **Viksit Bharat 2047**.
- The **Union Cabinet**, chaired by **Prime Minister Narendra Modi**, has approved the **expansion of academic and infrastructure capacity (Phase-B construction)** for five new **Indian Institutes of Technology (IITs)** in **Andhra Pradesh (IIT Tirupati)**, **Kerala (IIT Palakkad)**, **Chhattisgarh (IIT Bhilai)**, **Jammu & Kashmir (IIT Jammu)**, and **Karnataka (IIT Dharwad)**. The expansion from **2025-26 to 2028-29** involves an investment of **₹11,828.79 crore**. It includes creation of **130 faculty posts** and development of **five research parks**. Student capacity will increase by **6,500**, reaching **13,687** from **7,111**. The initiative supports **higher education access, employment generation, and local economic stimulation**, while benefiting students across India through **pan-India admissions**. As per **Budget 2025-26**, student capacity across **all 23 IITs** has doubled from **65,000 to 1.35 lakh** over the last decade.
- The **Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs**, chaired by **Prime Minister Narendra Modi**, has approved fresh **coal linkages to Thermal Power Plants (TPPs)** under the **Revised SHAKTI policy**. Two new windows have been introduced: **Window-I** (coal at **notified prices** for central/state sector plants) and **Window-II** (coal at **premium price** through auction, without **PPA requirement**, for up to **25 years**). The policy enhances **flexibility in coal procurement**, encourages **new capacity**, and promotes **domestic coal use**. It will be implemented by **Coal India Limited (CIL)** and **Singareni Collieries Company Limited (SCCL)**. Benefits include **streamlined procedures, pithead plant promotion, coal source rationalization, and increased market participation**.

An **Empowered Committee** will oversee implementation. The policy involves **no extra cost** to coal companies and supports the goals of **ease of doing business** and **energy security**.

- The **Union Cabinet**, chaired by **Prime Minister Narendra Modi**, has approved the establishment of a **sixth semiconductor unit** under the **India Semiconductor Mission**. This joint venture between **HCL and Foxconn** will be set up near **Jewar airport** in the **YEIDA region**. The plant will manufacture **display driver chips** for **mobile phones, laptops, automobiles, and other devices**. It is designed for **20,000 wafers per month**, with an output of **36 million units per month** and an investment of **₹3,700 crore**. Five other semiconductor units are already under construction. India's **semiconductor ecosystem** is growing, with companies like **Applied Materials** and **Lam Research** now operating in India. Major suppliers like **Merck, Linde, Air Liquide, and Inox** are also preparing to support the industry. **270 academic institutions** and **70 startups** are working on chip design, with **20 products taped out** by **SCL Mohali**. This initiative supports **Atmanirbhar Bharat** and meets the rising demand for semiconductors in India's expanding **electronics manufacturing sector**.
- The **Union Cabinet**, led by **Prime Minister Narendra Modi**, has greenlit two major initiatives aimed at strengthening India's technological and agricultural sectors. First, under the **India Semiconductor Mission**, a **sixth semiconductor manufacturing unit** will be established as a joint venture between **HCL and Foxconn** near **Jewar airport in Uttar Pradesh's YEIDA region**. The **₹3,700 crore** plant will produce **display driver chips** for **mobile phones, laptops, and vehicles**, with a design capacity of **36 million units per month**. This move supports India's push toward **semiconductor self-reliance**, backed by innovation from academic institutions, startups, and global supply chain partners.



- In parallel, the Cabinet approved the continuation of the **Interest Subvention (IS) component** under the **Modified Interest Subvention Scheme (MISS)** for **FY 2025–26**. The scheme provides **affordable short-term credit** to farmers through **Kisan Credit Cards (KCC)** with subsidized interest rates. Loans up to ₹3 lakh are offered at 7%, with a **1.5% subvention** to banks and an additional **3% Prompt Repayment Incentive** for timely repayments, effectively lowering the rate to **4%**. Covering over **7.75 crore farmers**, the scheme remains vital to ensuring **inclusive agricultural growth**, especially with enhancements like the **Kisan Rin Portal** driving digital transparency and efficiency.
- The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, has approved two key multitracking **railway infrastructure projects** — the **Ratlam-Nagda 3rd & 4th lines** and **Wardha-Balharshah 4th line** — to boost capacity and speed across Indian Railways. With a combined investment of around ₹3,399 crore, the projects will span about **176 km** across Madhya Pradesh and Maharashtra, enhancing connectivity for over **19.74 lakh people** in **784 villages**. These **PM Gati Shakti-aligned projects** will significantly increase freight movement (by 18.40 MTPA), reduce logistics costs, and cut oil imports by 20 crore litres, thereby avoiding 99 crore kg of CO<sub>2</sub> emissions — equivalent to planting 4 crore trees. The construction phase will also generate around **74 lakh human-days of employment**, aligning with the **Atmanirbhar Bharat** vision by improving regional development, self-employment, and operational efficiency in the rail network.
- The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, has approved the development of a **4-lane Badvel-Nellore highway** spanning **108.134 km** in Andhra Pradesh at a cost of **₹3,653.10 crore** under the **DBFOT model**. This strategic corridor will enhance connectivity between key industrial nodes like **Kopparthy (VCIC)**, **Orvakal (HBIC)**, and **Krishnapatnam (CBIC)**, while significantly improving logistics and access to **Krishnapatnam Port**. The project will reduce travel distance by **33.9 km**, cut travel time by an hour, and lower both fuel use and vehicle operating costs. It is also set to generate around **43 lakh man-days of employment**, spurring **economic growth and job creation** in the region, and aligning with the government's **infrastructure and Atmanirbhar Bharat vision**.

#### Most Important News of the Month

#### **Operation Sindoos: India Strikes Back in Pakistan and PoK**

In a significant military development, the Indian Armed Forces on **Wednesday** launched '**Operation Sindoos**', a series of precision strikes on terrorist camps located in **Pakistan** and **Pakistan-occupied Jammu and Kashmir (PoJK)**. The operation comes in the wake of the **Pahalgam terror attack**, which claimed the lives of **25 Indian nationals and one Nepali citizen**, triggering widespread outrage and demands for decisive action.

**Nine Terror Sites Targeted: Precision and Restraint Emphasized**  
According to a formal release by the **Press Information Bureau (PIB)**, the strikes targeted a total of **nine locations** believed to house **active terrorist infrastructure** involved in **planning and executing attacks against India**. These include:

- A former **Lashkar-e-Taiba** base near **Muzaffarabad** in **PoK**
- A **Jaish-e-Mohammad-linked seminary** in **Bahawalpur, Punjab Province**
- A key infiltration hub in **Kotli, PoK**

The Indian government emphasized that **no Pakistani military installations were targeted**, and that the strikes were **measured, focused, and non-escalatory** in nature.

**Objective: Neutralize Terror Infrastructure and Re-establish Deterrence**

#### **Restoring Strategic Deterrence Post-Balakot**

Sources close to the Indian security establishment said that '**Operation Sindoos**' is part of a broader strategy to **restore deterrence** that has been gradually **eroded since the 2019 Balakot air strikes**. A senior official stated that recent events made it evident that Pakistan-based terror groups had **recalibrated their activities**, believing India's **threshold for response** had lowered.

The **barbaric attack in Pahalgam** served as a flashpoint. The attack, attributed to **The Resistance Force (TRF)**—a **proxy group of Lashkar-e-Taiba**—claimed **26 lives**, including **pilgrims and local civilians**, and provoked immediate calls for action from the Indian public and leadership.

#### **Top-Level Military Coordination and Strategic Planning**

#### **Prime Minister Modi Leads Consultations with Defence Chiefs**

The operation was launched following **days of high-level meetings** between **Prime Minister Narendra Modi**, **National Security Advisor Ajit Doval**, and the **top brass of the Indian Armed Forces**, including:

- **Navy Chief Admiral Dinesh K Tripathi**
- **Air Force Chief Air Chief Marshal A P Singh**
- **Defence Secretary R K Singh**

These meetings focused on reviewing **retaliatory options, combat readiness, and intelligence assessments**. The **Army** had already reinforced **forward positions** along the **Line of Control (LoC)** in anticipation of **possible Pakistani retaliation**.

#### **Ground-Level Execution and Strategic Messaging**

#### **No Escalation—Only Accountability**

Military officials have clarified that the operation was not intended to provoke a **broader military confrontation**, but to **send an unambiguous message** to terror networks and their sponsors.

#### **Air and Ground Coordination Involved**

Unconfirmed reports from **Reuters** and the **New York Times** suggest that **Indian Air Force jets** were seen over **PoK**, and **multiple explosions** were heard near **Muzaffarabad** and **Kotli**. These areas have long been known as **hubs of terrorist activity**, protected under Pakistan's strategic depth doctrine.

### Pakistan's Response: Vows to Retaliate

In its first official response, the **Pakistan military**, speaking through broadcaster **ARY**, confirmed that India had launched **missile attacks at three separate locations** and warned that **Pakistan would respond at a time and place of its choosing**. No casualties or damage reports have been officially released by Islamabad yet.

### Public and Political Reaction in India

The strikes have been met with **approval and relief** across much of India, particularly from families of the Pahalgam victims and from security analysts who have long advocated for a **proactive doctrine against state-sponsored terror**.

Political leaders across party lines have commended the **Indian Armed Forces** and **Prime Minister Modi's leadership**. Social media has seen a surge of support under hashtags like **#OperationSindoor**, **#JusticeForPahalgam**, and **#IndiaStrikesBack**.

### What Lies Ahead: Strategic Calculations Continue

A more detailed **briefing on Operation Sindoor** is expected later in the day, where the **Ministry of Defence** and **Ministry of External Affairs** will likely address operational outcomes, regional implications, and diplomatic messaging.

### Maintaining Vigilance

Indian forces remain on **high alert** along the **western front**, with increased **surveillance operations** and **cross-border intelligence gathering**. Analysts caution that while the operation is a significant tactical success, it may trigger **short-term escalation** in the region.

### India Set to Become 4th Largest Economy in 2025, Says IMF

India is projected to become the world's fourth largest economy in 2025, overtaking Japan, according to the April 2025 Outlook released by the International Monetary Fund (IMF). The IMF estimates India's GDP to reach \$4.187 trillion, slightly ahead of Japan's \$4.186 trillion, placing India behind only the U.S., China, and Germany. This projection highlights the country's rising economic trajectory and robust growth momentum driven by consumption and investment.

### Why in News?

The IMF's April 2025 World Economic Outlook has brought India into the global spotlight by forecasting its rise to the fourth largest economy by nominal GDP. This achievement is a significant milestone in India's ambition to reach the \$5 trillion economy mark by 2027 and reflects sustained economic performance in a challenging global environment.

### The New York Times Wins Four Pulitzer Prizes

The **New York Times (NYT)** led the field with **four Pulitzer Prize wins** in 2025. Among the highlights was an award for **Breaking News Photography**, credited to veteran photojournalist **Doug Mills**.

#### Doug Mills Captures a Defining Moment

Doug Mills won for his dramatic image capturing the **assassination attempt on Donald Trump** during a campaign event on **July 13, 2024**, in **Butler, Pennsylvania**. The photograph showed the bullet missing Trump by inches as he stood at the podium, an image that stunned the world.

Apart from this, the **NYT** was honored for its **international and national coverage**, including its extensive reporting on the **Gaza conflict**. The details of the remaining three awards were not fully disclosed in the initial announcement but reflect the paper's **broad editorial strength**.

#### The Washington Post Recognized for Breaking News Reporting

The **Washington Post** staff received the **Pulitzer Prize for Breaking News Reporting** for their **comprehensive and swift coverage** of the **Trump assassination attempt**. Judges praised the work for its use of **audio and visual forensics**, combining speed with **accuracy and clarity** in a high-stakes situation.

#### Wall Street Journal Wins for Investigating Elon Musk

In the **National Reporting** category, the **Wall Street Journal** stood out with its deep dive into **Elon Musk's personal and professional life**. The reporting explored:

#### Reuters Awarded for Fentanyl Crisis Investigation

Reuters received the **Pulitzer for Investigative Reporting** for its explosive series titled "**Fentanyl Express**." This seven-part investigation exposed how:

### Lakkundi Group of Monuments Proposed for UNESCO Tentative List

In a significant development for India's cultural heritage, the ancient group of temples and monuments in Lakkundi and surrounding areas in Karnataka, built during the Kalyana Chalukya period (10th–12th century CE), are being finalized for inclusion in UNESCO's tentative list of World Heritage Sites. The State government has partnered with INTACH to prepare and refine the proposal, aiming to secure international recognition for these architectural marvels.

#### Why in News?

The Karnataka government, with assistance from the Indian National Trust for Art and Cultural Heritage (INTACH), is in the final stages of submitting a proposal to list the Lakkundi group of monuments and associated temples from the Western Chalukyan period on UNESCO's tentative list of World Heritage Sites. The monuments fulfil key UNESCO criteria for architectural and cultural significance.

#### Location & Historical Context

- Located in Gadag district, Karnataka.
- Temples built between 10th–12th centuries CE during the Kalyana Chalukya (Western Chalukya) reign.

**UNESCO Tentative Listing Criteria Me**

- **Cultural Exchange:** Illustrates architectural interchange between Nagara, Dravida, and Bhumija styles forming the Vesara style.
- **Historical Significance:** Represents a significant stage in temple architecture and technological advancement through features like stepwells.

**Important Structures in the Proposal**

- **Lakkundi Monuments:** Kasi Visvesvara, Manikesvara, Nanneswara, Brahma Jinalaya (1007 CE), Musukina Bavi.

**Surrounding Temples**

- Doddabasappa temple, Japada Bavi (Dambal)
- Trikuteshwara temple (Gadag)
- Mahadeva temple (Itagi)
- Sri Mallikarjuna temple (Kuruvatti)
- Someshwara temple (Lakshmeshwara)
- Tarakeshwara temple (Hangal)

**Architectural Importance**

- Showcases Vesara hybrid style.

**President Murmu Invokes Article 143 Over Governors' Bill Assent Powers**

In a rare constitutional move, President Droupadi Murmu has invoked Article 143 of the Constitution to seek the Supreme Court's advisory opinion on a range of legal questions concerning the powers and conduct of Governors and the President in relation to State legislation under Articles 200 and 201. This Presidential Reference stems from a recent Supreme Court judgment criticizing delays by the Tamil Nadu Governor in granting assent to Bills passed by the State Legislature.

**Why in News?**

On May 13, 2025, President Murmu referred 14 constitutional questions to the Supreme Court after a two-judge Bench judgment (April 8, 2025) deemed the Tamil Nadu Governor's delay in Bill assent as unconstitutional. The move is significant as it seeks to resolve long-standing ambiguities regarding the discretionary powers of Governors and the President, and the limits of judicial intervention under Article 142.

**Key Questions Raised in the Presidential Reference**

1. What are the Constitutional options before a Governor when a Bill is presented to him under Article 200 for assent?
2. Is the Governor bound by the aid and advice tendered by the Council of Ministers?
3. Is the exercise of Constitutional discretion by the Governor under Article 200 justiciable?
4. Is Article 361 of the Constitution (immunity given to President and Governors from legal action while in office) an absolute bar to judicial review in relation to the actions of a Governor under Article 200?
5. In the absence of any Constitutionally prescribed time limit or manner of exercise of powers by a Governor, can time limits be imposed and manner of exercise of powers be prescribed through judicial orders?
6. Is the exercise of Constitutional discretion by the President under Article 201 (dealing with Bills reserved by a Governor for consideration by the President) justiciable?
7. Can judicial orders impose timelines and manner of exercise of powers by the President under Article 201?
8. Is the President required to take advice from the Supreme Court when a Bill is reserved by a Governor for the President's assent?
9. Are decisions of the Governor and the President under Articles 200 and 201, respectively, justiciable at a stage prior to even the Bill in question becoming a law. Is it permissible for the courts to undertake judicial adjudication over the contents of a Bill, in any manner, before it becomes law?
10. Can the Constitutional powers of the President/Governors be substituted by a judicial order exercising Article 142?
11. Is a law made by the State Legislature a law in force without the assent of the Governor?
12. Is it not mandatory for a Supreme Court Bench to examine if a case involved substantial questions of law regarding interpretation of the Constitution and refer the case to a Bench of a minimum five judges under Article 145(3)?
13. Is Article 142 limited to matters of procedural law or does it extend to issuing directions "contrary to or inconsistent with existing substantive or procedural provisions of the Constitution"?
14. Is there a bar on the Supreme Court from deciding between the Centre and States other than by way of filing an original suit under Article 131?

**Background and Trigger**

- The issue arises from a petition by the Tamil Nadu government against Governor R.N. Ravi's delay in acting on 10 re-passed Bills.
- The Supreme Court, invoking Article 142, held the Governor's inaction illegal and deemed the Bills to have received assent.
- This verdict prompted the Presidential Reference to test the validity and scope of Article 142 and assess the boundaries of judicial overreach.

**Static & Legal Provisions Discussed**

- **Article 200:** Governor's options on State Bills — assent, withhold assent, or reserve for President.
- **Article 201:** Bills reserved for the President's consideration.
- **Article 143:** President's power to refer legal questions to SC for advisory opinion.
- **Article 142:** Supreme Court's power to do complete justice.
- **Article 145(3):** Cases involving interpretation of the Constitution must be heard by at least a 5-judge Bench.
- **Article 361:** Immunity to President and Governors from legal proceedings during tenure.

**Significance of the Reference**

The treaty marks a major milestone in global health governance, even as the United States remains absent, having withdrawn from WHO earlier in 2025.

**Supreme Court Mandates Three Years of Legal Practice for Judicial Service Entry**

In a landmark judgment delivered on May 20, 2025, the Supreme Court of India mandated a minimum of three years of legal practice as a prerequisite for applying to the Civil Judge (Junior Division) post. The ruling, led by a bench headed by Chief Justice of India B.R. Gavai, aims to enhance the quality of the judiciary by ensuring that candidates have hands-on experience in litigation before assuming judicial roles.

**Why in News?**

The decision is significant because it restores a legal practice requirement that had been waived by several High Courts, allowing fresh law graduates with no courtroom experience to become judges. The Supreme Court found this practice ineffective over the past two decades and deemed it detrimental to judicial efficiency and public trust.

**Background**

- Earlier, several High Courts permitted direct recruitment of fresh law graduates into the judiciary.
- The SC reviewed affidavits submitted by High Courts, which reported negative outcomes of appointing inexperienced candidates.

**Key Judgments and Directions**

- All High Courts and State Governments must amend service rules.
- Minimum three years of practice as an advocate is now mandatory for applying to the Civil Judge (Junior Division) post.
- The period of practice will be counted from the date of provisional enrollment with the Bar Council.

**Certification Requirements**

Candidates must provide proof of practice certified by,

- Principal Judicial Officer of the court, or
- Advocate with at least 10 years' experience, endorsed by a judicial officer.

**Additional Considerations**

- Experience as a law clerk to a judge or judicial officer will be counted toward the three-year requirement.
- The rule will apply to future recruitment cycles only and not those already underway.

**Objectives and Significance**

- Ensures that newly appointed judges have practical exposure to court proceedings.
- Strengthens the judiciary by appointing officers who understand the realities of litigation.
- Aims to reduce errors and inefficiencies stemming from inexperience.

## From 7,516 km to 11,099 km: India's New Coastal Length Explained

In a landmark update to its geographical metrics, the Government of India has revised the length of its coastline from 7,516.6 km to 11,098.8 km — a nearly 50% increase — without gaining any new land. This revision, announced in the Ministry of Home Affairs' 2023–2024 annual report, stems not from any territorial expansion but from enhanced mapping technologies that now allow for far more accurate measurement of coastal features. The update marks a significant evolution in India's geospatial understanding and has major implications for coastal security, climate planning, and economic zone regulation.

### Why in News?

The Union Ministry of Home Affairs in December 2024 announced a revision in the official length of India's coastline. No new land added — the revision is purely due to improved measurement techniques. The updated figures will now be reviewed every 10 years using advanced mapping tools. Old coastline length is about 7,516.6 km and New coastline length 11,098.8 km.

#### RBI Annual Report 2024–25: A Comprehensive Overview of India's Central Banking Landscape

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has released its Annual Report for the financial year 2024–25, as required by Section 53(2) of the **RBI Act, 1934**. This comprehensive document outlines the state of the Indian economy, RBI's financial performance, key trends in banking and digital payments, and its policy plans for the coming year. It reflects the central bank's continuing efforts to ensure economic stability, encourage digital transformation, and manage risks in an increasingly volatile global environment.

- RBI's Financial Performance and Balance Sheet**
- The RBI's balance sheet showed solid growth this year. As of **March 31, 2025**, it stood at **₹76.25 lakh crore**, up from **₹70.47 lakh crore** a year ago. This represents an increase of **8.21%**, showing the central bank's expanding role in managing the economy.

#### Assets Growth:

- A 52.09% increase in gold holdings** played a major role in this expansion.
- Domestic investments** also rose by **14.32%**, reflecting strong policy support.
- Foreign investments** grew more modestly at **1.70%**, affected by global uncertainties.

#### Liabilities Side:

- The increase came largely from a rise in **currency in circulation**, higher balances in **revaluation accounts**, and market-related operations.

#### Income and Expenditure:

- RBI's **total income** reached **₹3.38 lakh crore**, a **22.77% increase** from the previous year's **₹2.76 lakh crore**.
- Expenditure** also rose, reaching **₹69,714 crore**, which is **7.76% more** than last year.
- Despite this, the RBI transferred a **record surplus** of **₹2.69 lakh crore** to the Central Government, showcasing effective financial management.
- It also added **₹44,861 crore** to its **Contingency Fund**, which is used during financial emergencies.

#### 2. Currency Circulation and the Shift to Digital Payments

One of the key changes in India's economy is the increasing shift from cash to **digital modes of payment**.

#### Cash Trends:

- The **currency-to-GDP ratio** declined to **11.2%**, down from earlier levels. This means a smaller share of the economy now uses physical cash.
- However, **currency in circulation** still grew by **5.8%**, suggesting continued demand for cash, especially in rural areas.
- The **₹500 note** continued to be the most used, both in volume and value.

#### Digital Payment Growth:

- Retail digital payments** increased by **17.9% in value** and **35% in volume**, showing wider usage of apps like **UPI**.
- The **Digital Rupee (CBDC)** also made strong progress. Its circulation value grew by **334%**, reaching **₹1,016.5 crore**.

This shows that while cash is still important, more people and businesses are turning to **digital transactions**.

#### 3. Foreign Investment and Corporate Bond Markets

The RBI also monitors **foreign investment** in India's financial markets.

- In FY25, **Foreign Portfolio Investment (FPI)** in **corporate bonds** rose by **11.4%**, totaling **₹1.21 lakh crore**.
- However, the percentage of limit used declined slightly to **15.8%** (from 16.2%), not because of reduced interest but due to a higher investment cap.

This indicates that **foreign investors remain confident**, and there is **room for further investment**.

#### 4. Currency Printing and Counterfeit Notes

As part of managing the currency supply, the RBI prints banknotes every year.

- In FY25, **₹6,373 crore** was spent on **currency printing**, a **25% increase** from the previous year.
- The increase was driven by higher demand for new notes and replacement of old ones.

#### Fake Notes Concern:

- A rise in **counterfeit ₹500 notes** was recorded, with cases increasing by **37.3%**.
- Fake ₹200 notes** also saw a **13.9% rise**.
- Other denominations saw a drop, but **overall counterfeiting remains a concern**, pushing the RBI to strengthen security features.

## 5. Economic Growth and Inflation Outlook

The RBI is optimistic about India's economic growth.

- **Real GDP growth** for FY26 is projected at **6.5%**, supported by:
  1. Higher consumer spending,
  2. Strong government capital expenditure, and
  3. A growing services sector.
- India's **banking and corporate sectors** are also in good health, contributing to this growth.

### Inflation Expectations:

- The RBI aims to keep **inflation at around 4%**.
- This depends on **normal monsoons**, strong food supply, and stable global oil prices.
- However, the report warns of risks from **climate change, geopolitical tensions, and global trade disruptions**.

## 6. Cybersecurity and Digital Banking Reforms

As digital banking grows, the RBI is working to improve **online safety**.

- In February 2025, it proposed a new internet domain: '**bank.in**', to ensure that users only access **verified banking websites**.
- This aims to reduce **phishing, identity theft**, and fraud.

### UPI Advancements:

- The '**UPI Circle**' feature lets trusted individuals make payments from your account.
- **Small Finance Banks** are now allowed to offer **pre-approved credit lines** via UPI, helping people access short-term loans easily.
- RBI is also working to **connect UPI with international payment systems**, which will simplify foreign remittances.

## 7. Gold Reserves and Exchange Rate Management

- The RBI increased its **gold holdings** by **54.13 metric tonnes**, and the total value rose to **₹4.32 lakh crore**, a **57.12% rise**.
- This was due to new purchases, higher global gold prices, and a weaker Indian rupee.

The RBI will continue managing the **rupee exchange rate** through foreign exchange market interventions to avoid sharp volatility.

## 8. Banking Sector Health and Frauds

### Fraud Cases:

- Although the **number of bank frauds** fell, the **total value of frauds tripled** to **₹36,014 crore**.
- This was due to **reporting of old frauds** (legacy cases), including 122 frauds worth over ₹18,000 crore that were not recorded earlier.

### Urban Cooperative Banks (UCBs):

- UCBs showed improvement:
  1. **Credit growth** increased,
  2. **Capital strength** improved,
  3. **Non-performing assets (bad loans)** fell.

- The RBI extended **Risk-Based Supervision** and **Prompt Corrective Action (PCA)** frameworks to cover more UCBs, boosting transparency.

## 9. Household Savings and Capital Market Activity

### Household Financial Savings:

- **Gross financial savings** rose to **11.2% of income**, from 10.7% last year.
- **Net savings** rose to **5.1%**, indicating better personal money management.

### Stock Market Trends:

- Companies raised **₹2.2 lakh crore** via **Qualified Institutional Placements (QIPs)** and **preferential shares**.
- Another **₹2.1 lakh crore** came from **IPOs, FPOs, and rights issues**.
- This shows high **investor confidence** and growing **corporate expansion**.

## 10. Promoting INR in Global Trade

To make the Indian Rupee more important in international trade, the RBI has taken several steps:

- **NRIs and foreigners** can now hold **INR accounts abroad**.
- RBI signed **Local Currency Settlement (LCS)** agreements with:
  1. **UAE**
  2. **Indonesia**
  3. **Maldives**
  4. **Mauritius**
- These deals allow trade to happen directly in **local currencies**, reducing reliance on the US dollar.
- The RBI also plans to connect its **forex platform FX-Retail** with **NPCI's Bharat Connect** for easier access to forex trading.

## 11. India's International Trade Outlook

Despite global challenges like:

- **Rising geopolitical tensions**
- **Protectionist trade policies**
- **Tariff uncertainties**

India's trade position is supported by:

- **14 Free Trade Agreements (FTAs)**
- **6 Preferential Trade Agreements (PTAs)**
- Ongoing talks with the **USA, EU, Oman, and Peru** for new trade deals.

This may help protect Indian exports and support economic growth.



- The United Nations has cut India's 2025 GDP growth forecast to 6.3%, down from 7.1% in 2024, while still recognizing India as one of the fastest-growing large economies. Key drivers include strong private consumption, public investment, and services exports. The UN report also warns of global headwinds like trade tensions, tariff hikes, and investment uncertainty, affecting overall global growth. Inflation in India is projected to remain within the RBI's target range, enabling monetary easing. Despite global risks, India's macroeconomic fundamentals remain strong. - Morgan Stanley has increased India's GDP growth forecast to 6.2% for FY26 and 6.5% for FY27, driven by robust domestic demand, rising urban and rural consumption, and strong public capital expenditure. The report highlights the stability of macroeconomic fundamentals, expected policy easing by the RBI, and the positive impact of reduced global trade tensions on India's external outlook. - Morgan Stanley has reaffirmed its optimistic view on India's long-term equity prospects, citing solid macro fundamentals, low inflation, and domestic demand as key drivers. It recommends focusing on domestic sectors like financials and industrials, while encouraging a patient, long-term approach amidst global uncertainties. The brokerage views India as a resilient and relatively insulated market, capable of delivering in the face of worldwide economic volatility.
- Moody's has revised India's GDP growth projection for 2025 to 6.3%, citing heightened policy uncertainty, geopolitical tensions, and global trade disruptions as the primary challenges. Despite global headwinds, the forecast for 2026 remains at 6.5%, reflecting expectations of stabilization. The agency also noted the Reserve Bank of India may continue to lower interest rates to support economic activity. The broader outlook for the US, China, and global markets also shows slowing momentum amid evolving tariff policies, market volatility, and investment risks.
- Headline inflation dropped to 3.16% in April 2025, the lowest since July 2019, while food inflation fell sharply to 1.78%, largely due to a decline in vegetable, fruit, and cereal prices. Both rural and urban areas witnessed easing price trends, supporting macroeconomic stability and consumer reliefs. ([Click here to read article](#))
- India's outward FDI in April 2025 nearly doubled to \$6.8 billion, up from \$3.58 billion a year earlier, driven by substantial growth in equity investments, loans, and guarantees, according to the Reserve Bank of India. India's Total Fertility Rate (TFR) stood at 2.0 in 2021, the same as in 2020, as per the Sample Registration System (SRS) report 2021 released by the Registrar General of India (RGI). The report provides vital insights into the country's changing demographic patterns, including fertility, ageing population, and marriage trends. Notably, Bihar reported the highest TFR at 3.0, while Delhi and West Bengal recorded the lowest at 1.4.

#### Why in News?

The SRS 2021 report, released on May 7, 2025, provides updated demographic estimates at the national and state levels, a crucial resource in the absence of the 2021 Census, which has been delayed. The report gains added relevance amid the announcement in the 2024 interim budget regarding a high-power committee to address population growth and demographic shifts in India.

The **IJR 2025** evaluates the justice system using five key pillars: **police, prisons, judiciary, legal aid, and human rights commissions**. These pillars are measured using a mix of indicators related to **human resources, infrastructure, budgetary allocations, workload, and diversity**.

Unlike qualitative assessments or opinion-based rankings, the IJR is rooted in **hard statistics**. This makes it a vital tool not just for policymakers, but also for **UPSC aspirants**, civil society groups, and legal practitioners aiming to understand the practical strengths and weaknesses in India's justice infrastructure.

**State Rankings: Karnataka Leads, UP and WB Languish**

In the **overall ranking of large and mid-sized states**, **Karnataka retained its first position**, followed by **Andhra Pradesh**, which jumped from 5th to 2nd. **Telangana** and **Kerala** follow closely.

**India and the Rule of Law Index 2024**

In a related development, the **World Justice Project (WJP)** released the **Rule of Law Index 2024**, in which **India ranks 79 out of 142 countries**. The index assesses countries across **eight dimensions**:

- Constraints on government powers
- Absence of corruption
- Open government
- Fundamental rights
- Order and security
- Regulatory enforcement
- Civil justice
- Criminal justice

India's **criminal justice system** ranks **89th**, indicating weak mechanisms to prosecute offenses and deliver fair outcomes. Its **civil justice system** performs even worse, at **111th**, largely due to issues such as **accessibility, delays, corruption, and lack of impartial dispute resolution**.

**Human Development Index 2025: A Detailed Analysis**

India improved its rank to **130 out of 193 countries** on the **Human Development Index (HDI)** in 2023, according to the **UNDP Human Development Report 2025**. This marks a three-place rise from its 2022 rank of 133. India also demonstrated notable improvement in reducing gender inequality, climbing from 108 (out of 166 countries) in 2022 to **102 out of 193 countries** in 2023 on the **Gender Inequality Index (GII)**. The theme of the Human Development Report "A matter of choice: People and possibilities in the age of AI".

Despite this progress, India scored **0.874 on the Gender Development Index (GDI)**, placing it among Group 5 countries which are considered to have **low success in closing the gender gap**. On the HDI front, with a value of **0.685**, India remains in the **medium human development category**, but is inching closer to the threshold of high human development, set at **0.700**.

Although technological solutions and international pledges exist, their **implementation is weak**, and **satellite data continues to expose hidden emissions**. The report urges immediate action to **enhance monitoring, enforce policies, and unlock energy security benefits** by reducing leaks and flaring.
- NITI Aayog's "**Designing a Policy for Medium Enterprises**" report marks a critical step toward enhancing the competitiveness of a largely untapped segment of the MSME sector. Despite representing just **0.3%** of MSMEs, medium enterprises contribute significantly to exports, showcasing immense potential. The report presents a policy framework centered on **financial support, Industry 4.0, R&D, testing infrastructure, custom skilling, and a centralized digital portal** to strengthen their capabilities. These measures aim to position medium enterprises as the **backbone of industrial growth**, aligning with the **Viksit Bharat @2047** vision.

- The Indian Navy has inducted **Arnala**, the first indigenously designed **Anti-Submarine Warfare Shallow Water Craft (ASW SWC)**, developed through a **Public-Private Partnership (PPP)** between **GRSE** and **L&T Shipyard**. With **over 80% indigenous content**, this 77-meter warship boosts

coastal defence, especially for **low intensity maritime operations** and **mine laying**. The delivery supports the vision of **Aatmanirbhar Bharat** and strengthens India's maritime security architecture.

- India's **Bhargavastra** represents a groundbreaking **indigenous anti-drone system** that effectively counters the growing menace of **drone swarms** using a mix of **hard-kill micro rockets, soft-kill jamming, and advanced sensors**. Developed by **Solar Defence and Aerospace Limited (SDAL)**, it can operate across diverse terrains and integrates seamlessly with India's **network-centric warfare** infrastructure. This innovation is pivotal in enhancing **national security** amid evolving **aerial threats** and recent hostile drone incursions near India's borders.
- The **Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO)** has successfully designed a **high-pressure nanoporous polymeric membrane** for **sea water desalination**, marking a breakthrough in India's drive for **self-reliance** in defence and marine technology. Developed by **DMSRDE** in just **eight months**, the membrane was successfully tested on an **Offshore Patrolling Vessel (OPV)** of the **Indian Coast Guard (ICG)**. The innovation addresses challenges posed by **chloride ions in saline water** and is a critical step under the **Aatmanirbhar Bharat** initiative. After 500 hours of testing, it is set to be operationally deployed, with future scope for civilian coastal use.

- The Indo-Tibetan Border Police (ITBP) accomplished a major milestone by scaling Mt. Makalu, the world's fifth highest mountain, as part of a historic twin expedition. While the Mt. Annapurna attempt was halted near the summit due to a blizzard, the Makalu team achieved an 83% success rate. Led by Anoop Kumar Negi, the climbers also contributed to environmental sustainability by collecting 150 kg of waste under the 'Clean Himalaya – Save Glacier' campaign.
- India has finalized a \$131 million agreement with the US for HawkEye 360 satellite-based RF surveillance technology, significantly enhancing its ability to monitor maritime activity and detect dark ships. The deal supports QUAD goals and boosts India's coastal security infrastructure, especially in its Exclusive Economic Zone. Integrated with existing systems like P-8I aircraft and IFC-IOR, the tech offers 24/7 real-time, weather-proof monitoring. This development

marks a new chapter in US-India strategic defense cooperation in the Indo-Pacific region.

- Lt Cdr Roopa A and Lt Cdr Dilna K of the Indian Navy have completed a historic circumnavigation under Navika Sagar Parikrama II, covering 25,400 nautical miles aboard INS Tarini in eight months. The voyage exemplified Nari Shakti, endured cyclonic seas, and fostered global maritime diplomacy. Their mission culminates on May 29, 2025, at Mormugao Port, led by Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, marking a proud moment in India's naval and gender-inclusive legacy. - China's Tianwen-2 mission will attempt to explore and collect samples from 469219 Kamo'alewa, a rare quasi-satellite that could hold answers to the Moon's origin and orbital dynamics. The mission employs innovative sampling techniques and, if successful, will solidify China's position in the global space race. The scientific significance and technical challenges of this mission mark it as a major step forward in planetary exploration and asteroid science. ([Click here to read article](#))
- On May 18, 2025, ISRO faced a rare launch failure with its PSLV-C61/EOS-09 mission due to a fall in pressure in the third-stage motor. The Earth observation satellite EOS-09, equipped with Synthetic Aperture Radar and weighing over 1,696 kg, could not be placed into its targeted orbit. The setback is notable as it breaks ISRO's long-standing streak of successful PSLV launches, with post-failure analysis currently underway to identify the technical root cause and strengthen future mission reliability. 
