For generations, the maritime industry has been regarded as an almost exclusively male domain — a world of engine rooms, cargo decks, and navigation bridges where women were rarely seen and even more rarely celebrated. India has chosen to challenge this reality head-on. On the 18th of May 2025, coinciding with the inaugural International Day for Women in Maritime observed annually by the International Maritime Organisation, the Government of India launched the Sagar Mein Samman initiative — a landmark policy designed to build a gender-equitable maritime workforce for the future. The initiative was unveiled in Mumbai by Union Minister of Ports, Shipping and Waterways, Sarbananda Sonowal, at a ceremony that brought together senior government officials, port authorities, maritime professionals, and international bodies. The event was held under the theme "An Ocean of Opportunities

for Women," and the message was unmistakable — India's maritime sector must reflect the full talent and capability of its population, including the half that has historically been left ashore.

The numbers behind the initiative tell a compelling story of progress already underway. Between 2014 and 2024, the number of women seafarers in India grew by an extraordinary 649 percent, rising from 341 to over 2,500. Registered women seafarers surged by 739 percent during the same decade, climbing from 1,699 in 2015 to 14,255 in 2024. Nearly 3,000 women seafarers have received financial assistance since 2014. These figures represent real lives transformed — women who chose the sea as their career and found institutional support waiting for them.

The Sagar Mein Samman policy, abbreviated as SMS, covers a wide range of priorities. It addresses workplace safety, career retention, leadership development, skill training, and the systematic dismantling of gender-based barriers across both seafaring and shore-based roles. The initiative aligns with India's Maritime India Vision 2030, which has set an ambitious target of achieving twelve percent female representation in technical maritime roles by the end of the decade. It also aligns with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goal 5 on gender equality and the International Maritime Organisation's broader global mission for gender inclusion.

At the event, ten outstanding women leaders from the shipping industry were felicitated for their pioneering contributions to the sector. Their recognition sent a powerful signal to young women across the country — that a career at sea is not merely possible but honoured and celebrated.

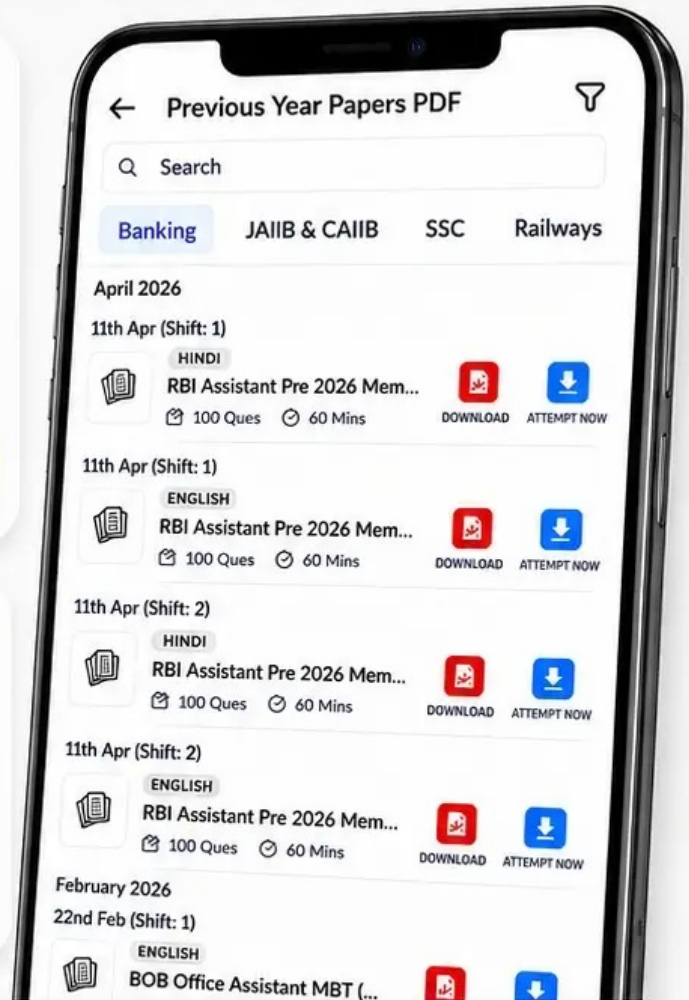
