The time for the test is 120 minutes; however, you may have to be at the venue for approximately 180 minutes including the time required for logging in, checking of the admit cards, going through the instructions etc. All tests except test of English Language & Hindi Language will be provided in English and Hindi. Tests are separately timed. Candidates can attempt questions in a particular test during the time allotted for that test only. All the questions will have multiple choices. Out of the four answers to a question only one will be the correct answer. **You have to select the most appropriate answer and 'mouse click' that alternative which you feel is appropriate/correct. The alternative/ option that you have clicked on will be treated as your answer to that question. There will be penalty for wrong answers marked by you. For every wrong answer marked by you, 1/4 of the marks assigned to that question will be deducted as penalty.**

The Scores of Online Examination will be obtained by adopting the following procedure:

- Number of questions answered correctly by a candidate in each objective test is considered for arriving at the Corrected Score after applying penalty for wrong answers.
- The Corrected Scores so obtained by a candidate are made equivalent to take care of the minor difference in difficulty level, if any, in each of the objective tests held in different sessions to arrive at the Equated Scores*

*Scores obtained by candidates on any test are equated to the base form by considering the distribution of scores of all the forms.

- Test-wise scores and scores on total is reported with decimal points up to two digits.

Note: Cutoffs may be applied in two stages:

- On scores in individual tests
- On Total Score

Please note that the types of questions in this handout are only illustrative and not exhaustive. In the actual examination you will find questions of a higher difficulty level on some or all of these types and also questions on the types not mentioned here.

Subject Knowledge

Questions in this test will be based on as per the syllabus mentioned in advertisement.

(A) Details of the Online Examination Pattern:

- (1) The examination would be conducted online i.e. on a computer.
- (2) The tests except test of English Language and Hindi Language, will be provided in English and Hindi.
- (3) All the questions will have multiple choices. Out of the four answers to a question only one will be the correct answer. **The candidate has to select the most appropriate answer and ‘mouse click’ that alternative which he/she feels is appropriate/correct. The alternative/ option that is clicked on will be treated as the answer to that question. Answer to any question will be considered for final evaluation, only when candidates have submitted the answers by clicking on “Save & Next” or “Mark for Review & Next”.**
- (4) In case a candidate wishes to report an issue in any question, an additional facility “Report Question” option (button) onscreen will be available in the examination.
- (5) The clock has been set at the server and the countdown timer at the top right corner of your screen will display the time remaining for you to complete the exam. When the clock runs out the exam ends by default - you are not required to end or submit your exam.
- (6) The Question Palette displayed on the right side of screen will show the status of each question using one of the following symbols:



You have not visited the question yet.



You have not answered the question.



You have answered the question.



You have NOT answered the question, but have marked the question for review.



The question(s) "Answered and Marked for Review" will be considered for evaluation.

The Marked for Review status for a question simply indicates that you would like to look at that question again. *If a question is answered and Marked for Review, your answer for that question will be considered in the evaluation.*

- (7) To select a question to answer, you can do one of the following:
 - (a) Click on the question number on the question palette at the right of your screen to go to that numbered question directly. Note that using this option **does NOT save your answer** to the current question.
 - (b) Click on ‘**Save & Next**’ to save answer to current question and to go to the next question in sequence.

- (c) Click on '**Mark for Review and Next**' to save answer to current question, mark it for review, and to go to the next question in sequence.
- (8) To select your answer, click on one of the option buttons.
- (9) To change your answer, click another desired option button.
- (10) To save your answer, you **MUST** click on **Save & Next**.
- (11) To deselect a chosen answer, click on the chosen option again or click on the **Clear Response** button.
- (12) To mark a question for review click on **Mark for Review & Next**. *If an answer is selected for a question that is Marked for Review, the answer will be considered in the final evaluation.*
- (13) To change an answer to a question, first select the question and then click on the new answer option followed by a click on the **Save & Next** button.
- (14) Questions that are saved or marked for review after answering will ONLY be considered for evaluation.**
- (15) The candidates are requested to follow the instructions of the "Test Administrator" carefully. If any candidate does not follow the instructions / rules, it would be treated as a case of misconduct/ adoption of unfair means and such a candidate would be liable for debarment from appearing for examinations for a period as decided by UP Cooperative Institutional Service Board (UPCISB).
- (16) Tests are separately timed. Candidates can attempt questions in a particular test during the time allotted for that test only
- (17) The candidates may ask the Test Administrator about their doubts or questions only before the commencement of the test. No query shall be entertained after the commencement of the examination.
- (18) After the expiry of 120 minutes, the candidates will not be able to attempt any question or check their answers. The answers of the candidate would be saved automatically by the computer system even if he/ she has not clicked the "Submit" button.
- (19) Please note:**
 - (a) Candidates will not be allowed to "finally submit" unless they have exhausted the actual test time.**
 - (b) Under no circumstances should a candidate click on any of the 'keyboard keys' once the exam starts as this will lock the exam.**

B] General Instructions:

- (1) Please note date, reporting time and venue address of the examination given in the admit card.
- (2) You may visit the venue one day before the Online Examination to confirm the location so that you are able to report **on time** (as printed on the admit card) on the day of the examination. Latecomers will not be allowed to appear for the examination.
- (3) The admit card should be brought with you to the examination venue along with your recent passport size photograph duly pasted on it. (Preferably the same photograph as uploaded).
- (4) You must scrupulously follow the instructions of the Test Administrator and UP Cooperative Institutional Service Board (UPCISB) Representative at the examination venue. If you violate the instructions, you will be disqualified and will be asked to leave the examination venue.
- (5) No use of calculators (separate or with watch), books, note books or written notes or any other electronic device will be allowed during the examination.
- (6) Candidates should report at the Exam centre well in advance of the reporting time indicated on the admit card to complete activities such as AADHAR linked Biometric Authentication of the candidate, capture of biometric and photo, collection of documents, announcement of instructions and logging in etc. **The candidates are required to carry Aadhaar Card to facilitate biometric Authentication.**

(7) a. Note for Person with Benchmark Disability (PwBD):

- On the day of examination, PwBD candidates are required to bring their UDID / Disability Certificate.
- PwBD candidates who avail the services of a scribe should submit the Scribe declaration form given with Admit card and copy of the Photo Identity document of the Scribe on the day of examination.

(7) b. Note for persons with specified disabilities covered under the definition of Section 2(s) of the RPwD Act, 2016 but not covered under the definition of Section 2(r) of the said Act, i.e. persons having less than 40% disability and having difficulty in writing:

- The compensatory time of twenty (20) minutes for every hour of examination may be allowed to those candidates with specified disabilities covered under the definition of Section 2(s) of the RPwD Act, 2016 but not covered under the definition of Section 2(r) of the said Act, i.e. persons having less than 40% disability and having difficulty in writing and who are eligible for getting scribe.
 - On the day of the examination, these candidates are required to submit a Medical Certificate **regarding physical limitations to write** as per proforma at **Appendix-I** and the Scribe declaration form given with Admit card along with copy of the Photo Identity document of the Scribe.
- (8) Photograph and IRIS will be captured at the examination venue. The photo captured will be matched with the photo uploaded by the candidate in the application. You must NOT change your appearance from the photo uploaded by you.

Decision of the IRIS data verification authority with regard to its status (matched or mismatched) shall be final and binding upon the candidates. Refusal to participate in the process of IRIS scanning / verification on any occasion may lead to cancellation of candidature. With regards to the same, please note the following:

- (a) 'LEFT EYE (IRIS)' will be captured for all the candidates.**
- (b) Candidates should remove Contact Lenses and Spectacles while capturing IRIS. Candidates are advised to avoid wearing contact lenses and prefer spectacles.**
- (c) There is no touch involved in IRIS scanning. Half feet distance between scanner and eye will be maintained.**

(Any failure to observe these points will result in non-admittance for the examination)

- (9) Biometric data (thumb impression) will be captured at the examination venue before the start of examination. Decision of the Biometric data verification authority with regard to its status (matched or mismatched) shall be final and binding upon the candidates. **Refusal to participate in the process of biometric data capturing / verification on any occasion may lead to cancellation of candidature.** With regards to the same, please note the following:
- (a) If fingers are coated (stamped ink/mehndi/coloured...etc.), ensure to thoroughly wash them so that coating is completely removed before the examination day.
 - (b) If fingers are dirty or dusty, ensure to wash them and dry them before the thumb impression (biometric) is captured.
 - (c) Ensure fingers of both hands are dry. If fingers are moist, wipe each finger to dry them.
 - (d) If the primary finger (thumb) to be captured is injured/damaged, immediately notify the concerned authority in the test centre.

(Any failure to observe these points will result in non- admittance for the examination)

- (10) In order to save time on frisking (Metal Detectors will be used), the candidates are advised to follow the below mentioned dress code:

- Light clothes which cannot be used for hiding any instruments or communication devices.
- Half sleeves but not having big buttons or any badge, brooches etc. which could be used to hide the communication device, Bluetooth, camera etc.
- Slippers, sandals and not the shoes/socks.
- Light Clothes without any metal items like zippers, button etc.

However, candidates coming in customary/religious dresses PwBD should report at the centre well in advance prior to reporting time for proper frisking.

- (11) Please bring the admit card with your photograph affixed thereon, currently valid Photo identity proof in original and a photocopy of the same ID proof which you bring in original - **THIS IS ESSENTIAL. Please hand over this admit card along with photocopy of photo identity proof duly stapled together to the invigilator.** Currently valid photo identity proof may be PAN Card/Passport/ Permanent Driving Licence/Voter's Card with

photograph/Bank Passbook with photograph/Photo Identity proof issued by a Gazetted Officer on official letterhead along with photograph/Photo Identity proof issued by a People's Representative on official letterhead along with photograph/Valid recent Identity Card issued by a recognized College/University/Aadhaar Card/E-Aadhaar Card with a photograph/Employee ID in original/Bar Council Identity card with photograph. **Please Note - Ration Card and Learner's Driving License will not be accepted as valid ID proof for this purpose.** Please note that your name as appearing on the admit card (provided by you during the process of registration) should exactly match the name as appearing on the photo identity proof. Female candidates who have changed first/last/middle name post marriage must take special note of this. If there is any mismatch between the name indicated in the Admit card and Photo Identity Proof you will not be allowed to appear for the exam. **In case of candidates who have changed their name will be allowed only if they produce original Gazette notification/their original marriage certificate/affidavit in original.**

- (12) Your responses (answers) will be analyzed with other candidates to detect patterns of similarity of right and wrong answers. If in the analytical procedure adopted in this regard, it is inferred/concluded that the responses have been shared and scores obtained are not genuine/valid, your candidature may be cancelled. Any candidate who is found copying or receiving or giving assistance or engaging in any behavior unbecoming of a candidate will not be considered for assessment. UP Cooperative Institutional Service Board (UPCISB) may take further action against such candidates as deemed fit by it.
- (13) You must bring a ball point pen with you. A sheet of paper will be provided which can be used for rough work or taking down the question number you would like to review at the end of the test before submitting your answers. After the test is over you MUST handover this sheet of paper along with the admit card to the Test Administrator before leaving the venue.
- (14) The possibility of occurrence of some problem in the administration of the examination cannot be ruled out completely which may impact test delivery and/or result from being generated. In that event, every effort will be made to rectify such problem, which may include movement of candidates, delay in test. Conduct of a re-exam is at the absolute discretion of test conducting body. Candidates will not have any claim for a re-test. Candidates not willing to move or not willing to participate in the delayed process of test delivery shall be summarily rejected from the process.
- (15) If the examination is held in more than one session, the scores across various sessions will be equated to adjust for slight differences in difficulty level of different test batteries used across sessions. More than one sessions are required if the nodes capacity is less or some technical disruption takes place at any centre or for any candidate.
- (16) Anyone found to be disclosing, publishing, reproducing, transmitting, storing or facilitating transmission and storage of test contents in any form or any information therein in whole or part thereof or by any means verbal or written, electronic or mechanical or taking away the papers supplied in the examination hall or found to be in unauthorized possession of test content is likely to be prosecuted.
- (17) Instances for providing incorrect information and/or process violation by a candidate detected at any stage of the selection, process will lead to disqualification of the candidate from the selection process and he/she will not be allowed to appear in any UP Cooperative Institutional Service Board (UPCISB) recruitment process in the future. If such instances go undetected during the current selection process but are detected subsequently, such disqualification will take place with retrospective effect.
- (18) Candidates are advised to take note of "The Public Examinations (Prevention of Unfair Means) Act, 2024" and The Uttar Pradesh Public Examinations (Prevention of Unfair Means) Act, 2024 (U.P. Act No. 8 of 2024), notified on 06 August 2024.
